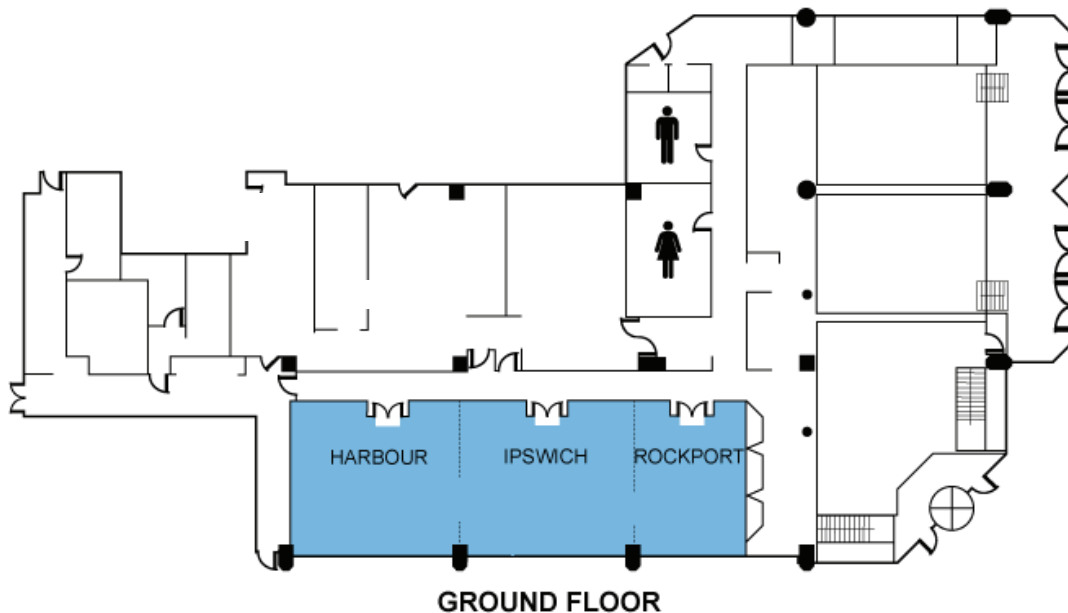
# WESTIN MEETING ROOMS

# In Memoriam

## JAMES GILBERT

To most people, Jim Gilbert seemed like an average Joe. A simple, easygoing, soft-spoken, private man who was a Civil War buff and for the last 20 years quietly taught criminal justice classes at the University of Nebraska at Kearney. But to those who knew him, Gilbert was so much more.

"He was one of the best professors we've ever had," said Peter Longo, a political science professor at UNK and Gilbert's best friend. "Jim had just a brilliant, innovative mind, and he certainly practiced what he preached."

UNK's Pratt-Heins Award winner in 1996 for outstanding scholarship and research, Gilbert wasn't only an accomplished professor, he also was a well-known author. Since 1980, he has written eight editions of a college-level textbook.

Gilbert, 60, died Saturday, October 4, 2008, at his Kearney home following a lengthy battle with cancer.

Gilbert's law enforcement career started long before he ever taught a class. He gained historical perspective for the job as a street officer with the Berkeley (Calif.) Police Department during the 1969 riot at People's Park near the University of Berkeley. Although he rarely talked about the experience later in life, he referred to the uprising in his teachings. Gilbert also had brief stints with the Santa Monica, Calif., Police Department, and served as a security guard. He also received special agent training in Florida and graduated from the FBI academy in Quantico, Va.

"He had so many examples and life situations that he had been through that he could help us relate to," said Brooke Terzi, who had numerous UNK classes with Gilbert. "He just loved the criminal justice field and wanted to share so much about it."

In 1980, Gilbert penned the first in a series of eight college textbooks titled "Criminal Investigations."

Gilbert taught criminal justice classes at Parkland College in Champaign, Ill., at Chadron State College, and at Radford, Va. Not long after he arrived at then-Kearney State College in 1988, Gilbert met Longo, and the two quickly became close friends. "We would talk on the phone like two teenagers," Longo said with a laugh. "We thought we were the funniest guys. We appreciated each other's humor." He and Longo were known for carpooling to work nearly every weekend.

Gilbert served 13 years as the chair of UNK's criminal justice department and mentored many other professors. He became UNK's longest-serving criminal justice professor.

It was in his first year at KSC that Gilbert started the criminal justice conference. "He wanted to reach out to the public, and he thought the conference was a great opportunity to hold the department out to the rest of the state, and also bring in some fascinating speakers," Longo said. Some of those speakers included forensic experts, an FBI profiler, an anti-terrorism director, a criminal investigator in the BTK killer case, Nicole Brown Simpson, and pro football hall of famer Jim Brown.

Gilbert also wrote countless papers, spoke at various crime-related conferences, wrote numerous scholarship and research grants, and either chaired or was active on various committees. He served as a consultant for law enforcement agencies in Nebraska and other states. "He was the one we all looked to for everything," said Joe Carlson, who also taught criminal justice classes with Gilbert.

In the late 1980s, Gilbert and several students conducted a citizen survey about law enforcement in the Kearney area. He again provided insight to Kearney and Buffalo County law enforcement officials when they decided to co-locate in the 1990s. In 2005, Gilbert implemented a crime scene investigation lab for junior and senior criminal justice majors so they could get hands-on experience at solving crime. The lab is the only one in the university system, Carlson said. "All the hands-on-experience was fantastic to get before you get into the field," Terzi said.

Despite his failing health, Gilbert continued to teach through the spring semester. The remainder of this semester and Gilbert's 2009 spring classes will be taught by in-house faculty and adjunct professors. And even though he won't be able to see it, Gilbert's legend will live on when the eighth edition of his textbook is released in February and the criminal justice conference celebrates its 20th year in the spring.

He and Edi, his wife and the love of his life, always looked forward to the time they spent target shooting and riding with their motorcycle group of veterans.

William was preceded in death by his parents, Berlin and Elsie Heck, niece, Kerry Heck, and nephew, Robert Shipp. He is survived by his wife Edi, with whom he shared a home in Park Hill, OK, sons Justin Heck and Garrett Heck, and the mother of his children, Janice Feazel Downey, of Stillwell, OK, siblings: Elizabeth & Don Yielding, Charles Heck, and Kay Shipp of Monroe, LA, Berlin & Pat Heck of Broken Bow, OK, and Mary Ida Kay of Georgetown, TX.

### Certification for Academic Programs

The Academy of Criminal Justice Sciences Certification Standards for Academic Programs were approved May 2, 2005 and amended October 28, 2005 by the ACJS Executive Board. The goal of ACJS in adopting these Standards and implementing a Certification Review process is to measurably improve the quality of criminal justice education. For several years, ACJS had Minimum Standards for Criminal Justice Education and these standards were used in a peer review process through ACJS Academic Review. The new standards and process represent an evolution from "peer review" to "certification". The ACJS Certification is designed to evaluate evidence-based compliance with the Certification Standards.

What do we mean by compliance with standards? The ACJS Executive Board will Certify those programs that undergo ACJS Certification Review and that have demonstrated, through substantive, credible evidence, the program meets or exceeds all parts of every standard. *The emphasis is on evidence, not intention.* Programs are required to provide evidence of program quality & effectiveness based on program outcome assessment.

The Certification Standards are broken into nine sections, each of which has specific Standards and Recommended Indicators. The sections are:

- A: Program Mission & History
- B: Program Structure & Curriculum
- C: Faculty
- D: Admission & Articulation
- E: Resources
- F: Student Services
- G: Integrity
- H: Program Quality & Effectiveness
- I: Branch Campuses, Additional Locations, and Other Instructional Sites
