Two Bolivar residents indicted in MO, OK meth conspiracies

Two Bolivar residents face federal charges related to alleged methamphetamine conspiracies in Oklahoma and Missouri involving a California kingpin.

According to a news release from the Oklahoma Division of Narcotics, 46-year-old Jesus Valdez Martinez, otherwise known as Jesse Martinez and "Hostile," and 40-year-old Renee Lynn Haynes are among defendants from California, Oklahoma and Missouri indicted on various crimes.

Martinez, per online court records, is charged with felony drug conspiracy.

Haynes is charged with felony distribution of methamphetamine, possession of methamphetamine with intent to distribute and two counts interstate travel to aid racketeering, per online court records.

The indictment against Haynes was filed in June, and she's been in custody since July, per online court records. The documents in her case were unsealed last week by order of the U.S. District Court.

An unsealed superseding grand jury indictment, filed Tuesday, Sept. 21, also listed Martinez as a plaintiff, according to online court records.

Martinez is in federal custody for a related case in Montana, the release stated.

The release stated Luis Alfredo Jacobo, an alleged drug kingpin charged with directing a continuing criminal enterprise and organizing and directing at least three separate methamphetamine conspiracies in Oklahoma and Missouri, was arrested in Bakersfield, California, on Monday, Sept. 27.

"Today, a 13-count federal indictment was unsealed charging Luis Alfredo Jacobo with leading a continuing criminal

enterprise that brought an estimated 2,000 pounds of methamphetamine into the Northern District of Oklahoma and southwestern Missouri for redistribution," acting U.S. Attorney Clint Johnson said in the release on Friday, Oct. 1. "I appreciate our law enforcement partners that brought this case forward for prosecution. Assistant U.S. Attorney Tom Duncombe will seek to hold Jacobo and his co-conspirators accountable in federal court."

Also arrested were Kelly Wayne Bryan and Curtis Anthony Jones in Missouri, who were charged as part of one of Jacobo's alleged drug conspiracies,

the release stated.

The indictment also charged Martinez and Antonio Cervantes Garcia as Jacobo's co-conspirators. Garcia is in federal custody for a related case in the

Western District of Oklahoma. Jacobo, using his Mexican sources of supply and Bakersfield as a base of operations, is alleged to have directed and organized a methamphetamine enterprise that consisted of at least three distribution conspiracies with three separate groups of individuals in northeast Oklahoma and southwest Missouri, according to the release.



According to a BTC news release, the college is now offering the next level of education with its RN to BSN Completion program.

This program is designed for nurses who have completed an Associates of Science in Nursing degree and want to continue their education to earn a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree, the release stated. This program is three semesters and 100% online, so nurses can take classes anywhere, anytime and graduate in just one year.


The new program is currently approved by the Accrediting Bureau of Health Education Schools and requires a Missouri RN license to apply, the release stated.


"Our alumni have been requesting this program for years, and we are thrilled to finally offer it to them," BTC president Charlotte Gray said in the release. "We were able to use funds from our COVID-relief allowance to help build this program and online platform. The release stated there are many benefits of going back to school to earn a BSN degree, including more leadership opportunities at work, the ability to plan healthcare delivery on a larger scale, the opportunity to train the next generation as a nurse educator and more. 



Bravata is a family medicine and addiction specialist with CMH. He is addiction medicine board certified by the American Board of Preventative Medicine and is a Fellow of the American Society of Addiction Medicine. He is also board certified by the American Board of Family Medicine.

Watson is a board certified family nurse practitioner with more than 30 years of experience. She has a background in traditional and alternative pain management protocols and is trained in intervention, treatment and management of SUD.

Robinson is a licensed counselor who specializes in treating SUD, addiction, trauma and behavioral health concerns. A certified registered play therapist and eye movement desensitization and reprocessing treatment specialist, she can evaluate for mental health assessments and SUD screening. She is also certified to offer mental health therapeutic interventions for trauma issues related to substance use for individuals ages 3 and older.

Jacobo allegedly set prices, determined of delivery methods and payment and approved any suggestions made about the groups' operations, court documents state.

According to the indictment, bulk distributors brought the methamphetamine to Bakersfield from Mexico.

From there, Jacobo directed that the methamphetamine be sent via U.S. mail to the groups in Oklahoma and Missouri or driven there in vehicles, sometimes in quantities of 50 to 100 pounds at a time, the release stated.

Co-conspirators would drive large amounts of eteering, distribution of \$465,000 in cash, the recash back to California or would mail cash payments back to Jacobo and to others at Jacobo's direction, the release stated. The co-conspirators sometimes mailed as much as \$100,000 cash at a time to California as part of the enterprise.

Per the release and court documents, a total of 10 defendants were charged in the second superseding indictment with one or more of the following crimes: continuing criminal enterprise, drug conspiracy, maintaining a drug-involved premises, interstate travel to aid rack-

Halfway's Whistle Stop has new owners after 18 years

Even though the Whistle Stop Convenience Store in Halfway is under new ownership and management, Vaughn and Rhonda Miller intend to continue the service tradition that the previous owners, Ora and Jill Hostetler, maintained through their nearly 20 years of ownership.

Built in 2002 on property that Hostetlers bought from Tom and Lorraine Redd, the store actually opened in March of 2003. The land housed an old feed mill and a defunct church that were taken down to make way for the new and much needed convenience store. The ground was reshaped by a buildup of five to six feet on the north end and then leveled before construction on the building began.

"The whole idea of purchasing the land and building the store was born on a napkin in a restaurant in Buffalo," said Ora Hostetler, who also owns and operates his own construction company.

"I lived in the Halfway area and realized the need for a store that locals could shop at without having to travel the distance to Buffalo or Bolivar. Our Halfway neighbors, which are like family, have shown their appreciation of the store by doing business and making it successful," he said.

He also gives a lot of credit to his wife, Jill, for her experience and knowledge of how this type of business runs. Her experience with gas station stores goes back to her childhood. Her father and mother bought what is Bates Grocery, situated at Mo. Hwy. 73 and U.S. Hwy. 54 junction just south of Mack Creek, while on their honeymoon trip to Branson in 1947. The Hostetlers continue

to own and operate Bates Grocery, and Ora has the old 1952 Phillips 66 station sign hanging in his garage.

Ora's love of trains prompted him to install a G-scale model train and track suspended from the ceiling of the Whistle Stop, and inspired the name of the

business. He started collecting 1950 manufactured model trains and accumulated 30 engines and 200 cars. The track at Whistle Stop has over 900 feet of cable running alongside to keep the train from falling if it derails. The little train travels over five miles a day when it is running

from morning to night.

In August 2021, Ora and Jill Hostetler decided it was time to move on to a different phase in their lives, and so Vaughn and Rhonda Miller stepped up to the convenience store operation

plate on September 1. They look forward to serving the Halfway community in the same manner that Hostetlers did. They do have some improvements planned for the business.

Vaughn Miller was born and raised up in the Halfway area. His wife Rhonda grew up in Hartville and later moved to Pleasant Hope. The Millers have owned and operated Vaughn Miller Trucking for 20 years.

"So many have told me that they're so glad the store is staying in local hands," said Rhonda Miller, who works in the Human Resources department at Elliott Lodging in Springfield. "The town needs this store."

Hostetler already had plans drawn up to add storage space and a loading dock to the north end of the store. The Millers are going ahead with the expansion and Phillips 66 is helping out with some costs. Ora will oversee the construction, which is to start in October. According to the Hostetlers and the Millers, any future Whistle Stop customer can expect the same reliable outstanding service that has always been at the Whistle Stop.



The Bolivar and Pleasant Hope varsity volleyball teams are a month into their 2021-22 seasons, and both have been racking up more wins than losses. With one team including ties in its record and the other reaching double digits in wins, both continue to fight each week, bettering their records.


