

Steve was born and raised in Illinois where he became a competitor and high school tumbling champion. Steve competed at Southern Illinois University (SIU) from 1963 to 1967, during which time the college team earned 3 NCAA championship titles.

He continued his education with graduate training in Psychology at Wayne State University in Detroit. From 1967 to 1974 he worked toward a PHD and served as an instructor in Psychology and Physical Education with an emphasis on gymnastics.

The Acronauts began their training in a junior high school gymnasium in West Bloomfield, Michigan and in 1971/72 Judy Dobransky and Mel Foster came on board as team coaches. In 1974, Steve opened one of the first private gymnastics facilities in Michigan. The home of the Acronauts was in Bloomfield Hills in a single bay with modest equipment. During the years of 1971 to 1988, the Acronauts trained many coaches and athletes at all levels.

Steve maintained a most impressive record during his Michigan coaching years. His many awards and titles include: Michigan Coach of the Year, Regional Elite Development Director, Regional Junior Olympic Development Director, Vice President of the Elite Coaches Association, and Team Coach for Sports Festival. The Acronauts dominated the State Championships for many years as indisputable winners.

Steve coached Elite athletes: Beth Shepard, Heidi Brady, Dana Dobransky, Heather Stepp, Wendy Hanafee, Ruth Aguayo, Jill Stuart, Megan Newmyer and Barrie Muzbeck.
