

2018-19 Santiago High School Local Scholarships

The following scholarships are available to current Santiago High School seniors. Apply only to those scholarships for which you are qualified. Complete the local scholarships application packet and turn it in to the Counseling Office by 3pm February 8, 2019.

California Retired Teacher Association (CalRTA) Corona-Norco Division Scholarship

Student must have a minimum 3.0 GPA, plans to become a teacher, have done community service, and will enroll full-time at a 2 or 4-year college in the fall. Interview required.

California School Employees Association (CSEA) Scholarship

Student must have a 2.0 or higher GPA and parent/guardian must be a “Classified” employee in the Corona-Norco district. **Supplemental application required.** Visit the Local Scholarships page and click on supplemental applications, or go to the College & Career Center located in the Library for more details.

Catholic Daughters of America Scholarship

Student must be a senior (male or female) who is Catholic and registered in a parish in the Corona-Norco area. Must have a 2.5 or higher GPA; have financial need; and have extra-curricular and community involvement. **Supplemental application required.** Visit the Local Scholarships page and click on supplemental applications, or go to the College & Career Center located in the Library for more details.

Cinco de Mayo Scholarship

Student should demonstrate good character traits such as citizenship, leadership, initiative, responsibility, and have definite educational goals. Must show academic potential for successful use of scholarship funds and have documented need for financial assistance. Student must have a 2.0 or higher GPA and plans to attend a 2 or 4 year college in the fall. **Supplemental application required.** Visit the Local Scholarships page and click on supplemental applications, or go to the College & Career Center located in the Library for more details.

Circle City Kiwanis Scholarship

Good citizenship, leadership in school, community and church affiliated activities; no grades lower than a “C”, and must demonstrate financial need. Interview required.

Circle City Kiwanis (Tom Wilson Memorial Scholarship) SHS Key Club member

Student must be a member of the Santiago Key Club. Good citizenship, leadership in school, community and church affiliated activities, no grades lower than a “C”, and demonstrate financial need. Interview required.

Corona Art Association Scholarship

This scholarship is offered to students who exhibit artistic talent and are able to submit a portfolio of their work. Complete a local scholarship application and be prepared to submit several pieces of art to apply.

Corona Girls Softball Association Scholarship

Applicant must be a senior and have participated with the Corona Girls Softball Association for any two seasons. Must have been a past player with CGSA, high school softball player or team manager.

Corona-Norco Management (CNMA) Association Scholarship

Student should have post-secondary education as a goal or have a career and technical education career in mind. Student should have a GPA of greater than 3.0. Student must demonstrate leadership ability and financial need. **Supplemental application required.** Visit the Local Scholarships page and click on supplemental applications, or go to the College & Career Center located in the Library for more details.

Corona Police Community Partnership (John Cleghorn Scholarship)

The Corona Police Community Partnership (CPCP) awards a minimum of two \$750.00 scholarships each year to students pursuing a career in Law Enforcement. A graduating senior in the city of Corona, who plans to pursue a career in Criminal Justice. Student must have a 2.5 or higher GPA. Submit an essay stating why they are pursuing a career in Criminal Justice. Interview is required. **Supplemental application required.** Visit the Local Scholarships page and click on supplemental applications, or go to the College & Career Center located in the Library for more details.

Applicant Requirements:

1. Must be a graduating senior at a high school in the City of Corona.
3. Submit school transcripts.
4. Submit a completed John Cleghorn Application Scholarship Application.
5. Submit a one to two page written essay stating why you are pursuing a career in Law Enforcement.
6. If selected for consideration of a 2017 John H. Cleghorn Scholarship a formal interview with the Scholarship Committee Members will be required. These formal interviews will be scheduled during Spring Break.
7. It is desirable for the scholarship applicant to have participated in a law enforcement organization such as: The Explorer Program, ROTC or Law Enforcement ROP.
8. The scholarship recipients will be required to provide proof of acceptance to the educational institution of their choice and proof of full-time enrollment by September 30, 2017, to receive scholarship funds. All scholarship funds must be picked up, in person, at the Corona Police Department.

Corona Police Officers Association Scholarship

Student must have a minimum 2.5 GPA, plans to pursue education in area of law enforcement, and demonstrate financial need.

Corona Rotary Club (Gordon H. Duncan Scholarship)

Student must be in top half of senior class and demonstrate financial need. Each applicant must write a letter to the Rotary Scholarship Committee stating reasons for applying. Students must plan to attend a 4 year university and have involvement in leadership and community service.

Interview required. **Supplemental application required.** Visit the Local Scholarships page and click on supplemental applications, or go to the College & Career Center located in the Library for more details.

Corona-Norco Teachers Association (CNTA) Scholarship

Student must be a child of a CNUSD teacher or plans to become a teacher. Must be enrolled in college prep classes, have completed community service hours, have taken on a leadership role in school or community, have no grade lower than a “C”, and demonstrate financial need. Interview required. **Supplemental application required.** Visit the Local Scholarships page and click on supplemental applications, or go to the College & Career Center located in the Library for more details.

Eagle Glen Dental Scholarship

Students interested in pursuing a career in the medical or dental field, with plans to attend a four year university. Must demonstrate financial need. Interview required.

Goodie Randhawa Memorial Scholarship

Student must have good citizenship, leadership in school or community, participation in generous activities (i.e. volunteering, participating in charitable causes), no grades lower than a “C”, and demonstrate financial need. Applicants must write a 1-2 page essay about Lou Gehrig’s Disease, or ALS. The essay should educate the reader about what the disease is, who is effected and what is being done about it. If you can, talk about how the disease effects family member, friends and communities. You may also want to mention what you have or can do to help.

It’s Our Hope Scholarship

Student must be a high school senior and resident of Riverside or San Bernardino County. Student must be actively involved in community and have at least 30 hours of community service. Must demonstrate good citizenship in school and community. Student must write a 500 word essay on community service, explain why you chose the projects you did and how it made an impact on you and your community. **Supplemental application required.** Visit the Local Scholarships page and click on supplemental applications, or go to the College & Career Center located in the Library for more details.

Jerry Price Corona Host Lions Club Scholarship

Student must plan to enroll in a 2 or 4 year college in the fall. Have no grades lower than a “C”, involved in community service, and demonstrate financial need.

PCH Architects Scholarship

Students interested in pursuing a Bachelor of Architecture (B.Arch.) at an accredited private or public University or at a Community College with the intent to transferring to the above listed schools. They must be a graduating senior with a minimum 3.5 grade point average, with outstanding, good character and academic achievements. Scholarship amount is \$750.

Santiago High School Counseling Scholarship

The Santiago High School Counseling Department Scholarship is open to the following students who have been of service to the Santiago High School community through one of the service

Applicants Must:

- Be a senior
- Have been officially enrolled in a service class for at least 1 semester during either 11th or 12th grade

- Plan to pursue an educational program post high school (i.e. community college, four year university, career and technical education...).
- Must earn a high school diploma by the end of this academic school year

Complete a Local Scholarship Application with all supporting documentation for consideration for this scholarship.

Riverside Community College District "Community Scholars Program" Scholarship

The objective of the scholarship is to reward students who have shown excellence in scholastic achievement, community involvement and mastery of knowledge while in local high schools. The philosophy of the scholarship is to encourage outstanding students from Riverside County to pursue their collegiate studies at any college within Riverside Community College District for two years (Moreno Valley College-MVC, Norco College-NC and Riverside City College-RCC) and to meet the requirements for transfer and acceptance to California Baptist University, La Sierra University, or the University of Redlands.

The Community Scholars Program is valued at \$7,000 and is disbursed over a four-year period. The recipients will receive \$1,000 per year for two years while at any college within Riverside Community College District and \$2,500 per year for two years at one of the participating four-year institutions. Disbursements are based on continued eligibility.

The Community Scholars Program basic eligibility criteria are as follows:

- Must be a current high school senior who is a Riverside County resident and will graduate from a Riverside County high school.
- Must be a United States citizen, permanent resident, immigrant, or refugee. Students here on an F-1 Visa are not eligible.
- Must have at least a cumulative GPA of 3.0.

RIVERSIDE OPTIMIST CLUB SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The Riverside Optimist Club offers two scholarship opportunities:

They must also submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) documents with your Expected Family Contribution (EFC) and your Scholastic Assessment Test (SAT) or American College Test (ACT) scores.

- 1) Two letters of recommendation (one must be from a teacher or school official).
- 2) Attach Student Aid Report (SAR) showing your Estimated Family Contribution (EFC).
- 3) High School and/or College transcripts, and SAT or ACT score.
- 4) Essay as described in application.
- 5) Signature on Application.
