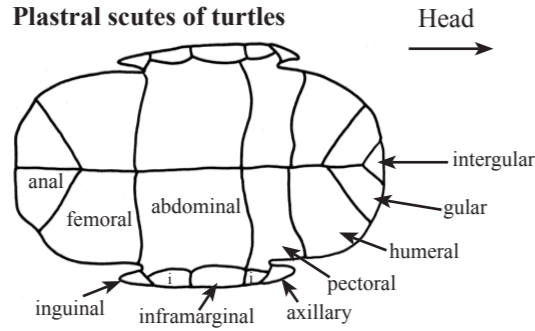
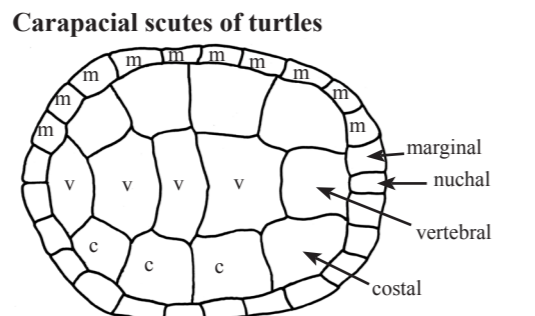

Freshwater Turtles

Madagascar Big-headed Turtle
Erymnochelys madagascariensis

1 chin barbel
Very large head

The largest freshwater turtle

4 claws

Helmeted Turtle
Pelomedusa subrufa

2 chin barbels

No plastral hinge

Yellow-bellied Mud Turtle
Pelusios castanoides

2 chin barbels (All *Pelusios*)
Large yellow scales
Plastron is pale yellow
Slight serration
5 claws

Plastral hinge for all *Pelusios*

East African Black Mud Turtle
Pelusios subniger

Small gray scales
Plastron is dark with pale yellow marking
5 claws

No plastral hinge

Seychelles Mud Turtle
Pelusios seychellensis

Unlikely to be seen

8-10 large transversally widened scales
Plastron is dark with pale yellow marking
5 claws

No plastral hinge

Small Tortoises

Spider Tortoise
Pyxis arachnoides (3 subsps)

Plastral hinge (mobility varies by subspecies). See text.

Pattern on plastron varies by subspecies

Large

Reddish-brown

5 costals

Olive Ridley Turtle
Lepidochelys olivacea

Small

Greenish-grey

7 longitudinal ridges
