Note that we will need a keyboard. John had suggested moving the meeting to St. Luke's Lutheran, our old meeting place at 1500 West Belmont in Chicago, where a harpsichord could be provided. During the workshop, Langfeld will be dealing with various pedagogical issues with regard to pitch, rhythmic, articulation, and balance. **Bach Week** returns, and for their 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary season! This year's festival features concerts Friday night April 19 at 7:30 and 10 PM (candlelight) at the Nichols Concert Hall of the Music Institute of Chicago in Evanston, Sunday April 21 at 3 PM (also at Nichols), and Sunday May 5 at 2:30 PM at Anderson Chapel of North Park University. The Music Institute is at 1490 Chicago Avenue in Evanston, an easy walk from the Davis Street stop on the Purple L train line. North Park University's chapel is at 3225 West Foster Avenue, near Foster & Kimball, a half mile walk from the Kimball L stop on the Brown line. This year's performances include two piano concerti, the cantata Himmelskoenig, sei willkommen, the Goldberg Variations, Toccata in F Major, Brandenburg Concerto #2, the Magnificat, and more. This event features a lot of old music too, but mostly played on banjos, guitars, and accordion, with an occasional cigar box violin included. Besides sea shanties (some as bawdy as anything we find from the Renaissance) take advantage of the exhibit hall and a full day of classes on topics like underwater archeology, storms on the Great Lakes, the river that flows backwards, and Confederate attempts to disrupt Union shipping on Lake Michigan and Lake Erie during the Civil War. Costumed sailors and pirates from the days of sail will appear (and sing); plenty of events for children too. A ticket for daytime events is \$14, \$20 for evening concert.
