Contract about the purchase of a slave (*synchoresis*) May/June, 14 BC (*BGU* 4.1181a)

(a) *Addressee* |² To Protarchos,

(b1) *Party 1* |² from Apion alias Hestiaios, the son of Hestiaios, of the deme of Zeus,

(b2) *Party 2* and from $|^4$ his father, Hestiaios, the son of Nikios, of the deme of Zeus.

(c) Agreement proper

Concerning the points at issue, $|{}^{5}$ they agree with one another on the following terms: Hestiaios, the father, $|{}^{6}$ agrees that, after purchasing $|{}^{7}$ a slave from his own money for up to 1,000 drachmas, he will necessarily effect the transfer of this (*slave*) to his son Apion by the 30th of Hathyr of the upcoming 17th year of Caesar (*Augustus*), $|{}^{8}$ and if by the aforementioned time Hestiaios, the father, $|{}^{9}$ does not purchase the slave and does not transfer (*him*) to Apion, $|{}^{10}$ Hestiaios agrees that he himself, $|{}^{11}$ after the 30th of Hathyr, $|{}^{12}$ will necessarily transfer within five days to his son Apion $|{}^{13}$ through the public notaries, as is proper, the slave woman Am... belonging to him $|{}^{14}$ and he will also hand over the registration containing the original sales of this (*slave woman*), $|{}^{15}$ on condition that Hestiaios pay his son for what the value of the slave woman falls short of the 1,000 silver drachmas $|{}^{16}$ and for the interest $|{}^{17-24}$...
