Foreword

Uganda and Rwanda are some of the most species rich countries in Africa, thanks to a combination of many different habitats; from the dry semi desert on the Sudanese border, through classical East African savannas, papyrus swamps and endemic rich forests in the Albertine Rift mountains bordering the Congo, to miombo woodlands in Rwanda.

Add to this short distances and a well maintained system of national parks and you have a dream destination for any world birder. Therefore it was an easy decision when fellow birder Magnus Jäderblad mailed me and asked if I was interested in joining him on a comprehensive birding trip covering not only all the traditional birding sites, but also some seldom visited areas with a few highly sought after species.

My only problem was that Magnus had planned for a five week trip, which was more than I could take out in vacation. I therefore decided to join for the firsts 3.5 weeks, thereby missing out on a few sites in Uganda, namely Murchinson Falls NP, Budongo Forest Reserve and Semliki NP. Apart from Magnus; Eja Blomqvist and Johan Wallin joined the group after Rwanda.

This report covers the part of the trip I joined and consists of three parts; a diary, a summary with a few recommendations and finally a trip list of all the bird species recorded – all in all 624 species. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to contact me at markus.lagerqvist@usa.net

Diary

19/2 -Entebbe

I arrived late in the evening on the Brussels Airlines flight via Kigali, and was picked up at the airport by a representative from Avian Watch Uganda and driven the short distance to the Golf View Inn hotel in Entebbe, were we arranged the payment for the trip.

20/2 Entebbe-Mabamba Bay-Entebbe

My first day of birding – not only on this trip – but also in East Africa, and the first target bird was also one of my most wanted – the bizarre Shoebill.

I was picked up at the hotel at 06.45 and driven to the nearby Mabamba Bay Wetland. Mabamba Bay is supposed to be one of the most accessible and reliable sites to see this sought-after bird, but this morning luck was not on my side and after canoeing through the wetland for three hours it was time to head back to shore again. My plan had been to drive back to Entebbe, have lunch, and visit the botanical gardens in the afternoon. But, not having seen the shoebill I decided to have another go later in the afternoon. Not having brought packed lunch we drove to the village of Mpigi and had a nice meal of beans, rice and chapatti at a small local restaurant.

At 14.20 I was back at the swamp and once again boarded the canoe. The good news was that the guide had been out scouting for shoebills and had had a brief flight view of a bird, so we headed for

the area where he thought it had landed. However, my bad luck continued and in spite of another three hours searching we did not find any trace of the bird. Not a very good start of the trip!

On the bright side I did see a few other good birds like Spur-winged Goose, Lesser Jaçana, Long-toed Lapwing, Blue-headed Coucal, Blue-chested and Blue-cheeked Bee-eater, Carruther's Cisticola, Red-chested Sunbird, Slender-billed, Northern Brown-throated and Wayne's Weaver.

At 17.20 we headed back to Entebbe, where I had dinner at the rather bland hotel restaurant and met up with Magnus who arrived from Sweden late that evening.

21/2 Entebbe-Mabira Forest Reserve-Lake Bisina-Soroti

After meeting our guide, the well known Alfred Twinomujuni from Avian Watch Uganda, we left Entebbe at 06.30 and drove east to Mabira Forest Reserve. We had planned to spend a full day in Mabira later on, so today was just a two-hour teaser en route to Lake Bisina.

Although it's a small remnant forest, Mabira gives easy access to many interesting species that are often more difficult at other sites. Despite the short visit we managed to see quite a few of the main targets of the site, among these the only sight view of the trip of Yellow-billed Barbet, Greythroated Barbet, a pair of beautiful Purple-throated Cuckoo-shrikes, the localized Toro Olive-Greenbul and the skulky Jameson's Wattle-eye. We also briefly glimpsed a Green Twinspot high up in the canopy, had a quick flyover of a Forest Wood Hoopoe and Magnus saw a Red-headed Bluebill on the side of the road.

At 11.00 we got back in our car and drove on to Mbale, two and a half hours away, for a lunch stop at the Mbale Resort Hotel. We then pushed on to Lake Bisina arriving at 16.30. We quickly arranged for a canoe to take us out on the lake for a first go at the highly localized Fox's Weaver – Uganda's only endemic bird and the main reason for visiting Lake Bisina.

To find the bird can be quite tricky though – it's not that common and you need to see it well since there are several weaver species present at the lake. We spent the last two hours of daylight searching through the vegetation on the shore and on small islands in the lake, but could not find any birds that fitted the description. We did pick up a few other good birds like **Fulvous Whistling-Duck**, **Red-knobbed Coot**, **Black Coucal** and **Marsh Tchagra**. After calling it a day we drove to our accommodation for the night – the Soroti Hotel. We arrived a 20.30 and had a quick dinner before going to bed, hoping for better luck with the weaver the following day.

22/2 Soroti-Lake Bisina-Kidepo Valley NP

Today we had a very long drive ahead of us, so we only had a few hours in the morning to bird Lake Bisina and find the weaver – we clearly needed some luck! The procedure was the same as the day before, and we did see quite a few weavers, some of which we didn't see quite well enough to positively id, although we suspected them to be Fox's Weavers, and many more which were either **Northern Brown-throated** or **Slender-billed Weavers**. After about an hour and a half of growing frustration we finally got great views of a female bird that we could positively id as a **Fox's Weaver**.

Apart from this individual we also saw a single male and a few more females that were almost certainly Fox's Weavers. We also heard a **Red-chested Flufftail** calling and added **Beaudouin's Snake-Eagle**, **African Purple Swamphen**, **Greater Painted-snipe** and **"Black-headed" Wagtail** to the trip list.

At 10.00 we left Bisina and begun our long journey to the remote and seldom visited Kidepo Valley National Park on the Sudanese border. Apart from being far away, another reason for the park getting so few visitors is the volatile situation in the Northern parts of Uganda during the last decades.

For many years parts of Northern Uganda has been living under the threat of the cruel Lord's Resistance Army (LRA). They have now been defeated by the Ugandan army and have fled to the DRC. The last years the big problem has instead been highway robberies in the Karamoja region. This problem is also being dealt with and the armed "warriors" of the region are in the process of being disarmed.

To avoid potentially dangerous areas we chose not to drive the traditional route through Moroti and Kotido, but instead take a more westerly route passing through Lira and Kitgum to Kidepo. We still wanted to avoid driving during night time and Alfred was a bit stressed over us spending too much time looking for the Fox's Weaver at Lake Bisina. By 11.00 we left Soroti and from there it was a two hour's drive to Lira, were we had to do some car maintenance. Meanwhile me and Magnus had an hour's lunch at Lillian's Towers. From Lira it was about six hours drive to Apoka Lodge were we arrived at 20.15 in the evening – a bit later than planned, but not too bad. Birds seen en route included **Pale Prinia** and **White-billed Buffalo-Weaver**.

Driving the last bit after dark actually gave us chance to get some good night birds from the car, like **Plain Nightjar** and **Greyish Eagle-Owl** along the entrance road.

You do not have a lot of choice when it comes to accommodation in Kidepo. You either have to stay in a very basic hut at the park HQ and bring in your own supplies, or you stay at the extravagant Apoka Lodge. Guests visiting the lodge are normally flown in by chartered plane to avoid the drive, but this was way over our budget – just paying for the accommodation itself was more than enough!

23/2 Kidepo Valley NP

We had planned two full days in Kidepo and after the many hours in the car the previous day we were eager to start the search for our main target in Kidepo – the impressive and rarely seen Black-breasted Barbet. The species has a fairly large distribution, but most of the range is not easily accessible or hardly ever visited by birders, stretching through the Central African Republic, Tchad and the Sudan, just barley reaching Northern Uganda. The species likes habitats by large cliffs and is not found throughout the park. One of the best spots is the area around the ruins of the old Safari Lodge, built by Idi Amin, so we headed straight there in the morning. Along the way we spotted a male lion which allowed us spectacular close-up views from our lodge's open safari-van. We also picked up(!) an abandoned African Buffalo calf with the nose full of porcupine spines but after a while it wanted out of the car and we had to leave it. From the old lodge you have a fantastic view and scanning the trees we soon found a spectacular Black-breasted Barbet. The bird was a bit far off to take any decent photos, but gave us good scope-views – bird of the trip for me!

Other good species only seen at the old lodge included **Mocking Cliffchat**, **Fan-tailed Raven**, **Egyptian Vulture** and a **Verreaux's Eagle**, the latter unfortunately seen only by the guide. We also added Rock Hyrax to the mammal list. After the successful morning we birded our way back to the lodge for lunch. From the lodge's dining area you have a splendid view of the surrounding plains and a small waterhole just outside attracts a lot of mammals, like Savanna Elephants, Burchell's Zebras and several species of antelopes.

Having seen the main target we now moved on to our second target bird, the highly range restricted Karamoja Apalis. Apart from Kidepo Valley, the species is only found at the Wembere floodplain in central Tanzania.

After lunch we drove northeast from the lodge, passing the Kidepo River to the Kanatorok plain on the South Sudanese border to the area where the Karamoja Apalis is found. The bird favours a specific kind of acacia woodland, and to find it you basically have to cover as much habitat as possible. Being our first full day in the park we birded from the car and made a lot of stops en route before we reached the habitat, so we didn't have time left to do a serious try for the apalis. Instead we continued to the Kanatorok hot springs and had a cold beer there before driving back to the lodge.

Some of the birds seen during the afternoon included Common Ostrich, Clapperton's Francolins, a pair of Four-banded Sandgrouse, a single Hartlaub's Bustard, Black-headed Lapwing, a single Black-rumped Buttonquail, White-bellied Go-away-bird, Black Scimitarbill, Red-billed Hornbill, Jackson's Hornbill, Swallow-tailed Bee-eater, Spot-flanked Barbet, d'Arnaud's Barbet, White-crested Helmetshrike, Foxy Cisticola, Rufous Chatterer, Silverbird, Pale Flycatcher, the only Purple Grenadiers of the trip and Red-rumped Waxbill.

Back at the lodge we ended the day with a tasty grilled buffet by the pool.

24/2 Kidepo Valley NP

This morning we decided to drive straight to the Kanatorok plain for a serious effort to find the Karamoja Apalis. Arriving at the habitat we parked by the track and started to walk back and forth in the habitat to cover as much ground as possible. Large parts of the habitat had been burned and it was excruciatingly dry and the sun was burning hot, but we spent the whole morning in the area until we had to head back for a well earned lunch, although we didn't see any trace of the bird.

After lunch we decided to head back for a last try and cover another part of the area. However, another half day walking the scorched habitat under the burning sun didn't help – tired and disappointed we had to call it a day and start the drive back to the lodge. Birds we did see during the day included Yellow-necked Francolin, Black-bellied and White-bellied Bustard, Little and White-fronted Bee-eater, Purple Roller, Slate-coloured Boubou, White-tailed and Red-winged Lark, Northern Crombec, Buff-bellied Warbler, Heuglin's Wheatear, Spotted Palm-Thrush and Reichenow's Seedeater. In the evening we made a short night drive getting good views of a couple of Verreaux's Eagle-Owls.

25/2 Kidepo Valley-Jinja

Today we had a very long drive ahead of us, so we had breakfast and left at 07.10. Since the president's wife was visiting Moroto the same day we were told that security would be extra tight in the area and that it should be safe for us to take the route over Moroto back. We decided to trust their advice, but Alfred was even more stressed than on the way up, and kept pushing on, avoiding any stops along the road – and meeting UN caravans with heavily armed escorts probably made him even more anxious the get out of the Karamoja province. Since we were passing through some really good looking habitat this was a bit frustrating, but we had to do with birding from the car. Good observations included large numbers of **White-rumped Shrikes** – at least 60 on my side of the road – a couple of **Heuglin's Wheatear** and a handful of **Purple Rollers**.

At 13.00 we finally made a short roadside break for lunch in the Debasien Range, were we added **Mottled Swift** to the trip list. Close to Chepsikunya we saw the only **Black Stork** of the trip.

At 18.45 we finally arrived at Kingfisher Safaris Lodge on the shore of Lake Victoria in Jinja. In the lodge's garden we saw **Red-chested** and **Scarlet-chested Sunbird**s before having dinner at the busy restaurant.

26/2 Mabira Forest Reserve

This day was devoted to a lengthier visit to Mabira Forest, after only getting a taste of the site on the previous visit. We had an early breakfast and left Jinja at 06.45 for the 30 minutes drive to Mabira.

Our main target bird was **Nahan's Francolin**, a range restricted and threatened species that has recently been shown to be closely related to the New World Quails! The birds are more often heard than seen and can be very difficult to spot in the thick vegetation. We left the main road through the park and instead entered a narrow trail. We soon heard a francolin calling and positioned ourselves on the trail, waiting quietly and trying playback but could only manage glimpses of something moving on the forest floor. After another couple of equally unsuccessful attempts, we found a perfect spot at a small clearing where we could position ourselves behind a large tree log. This time we were finally successful and got good views of a bird that ventured out to the edge of the clearing as a response to playback.

Very happy with the most important target bird in the bag, we turned our focus to the remaining targets. After securing good views of a **Blue-shouldered Robin-Chat** heard calling close to the trail – the only one we saw on the trip – we turned our attention to the **Yellow-eyed Bristlebill**, a species with its main distribution within the DRC. The bird appeared to be fairly common in Mabira and we heard three or four individuals, and after some effort also got great views of this sculking species.

Another specialty for Mabira that didn't pose any resistance was **Weyns's Weaver** – small flocks seemed to be all over the place and we saw at least 50 birds during the day. This was a bit surprising since we'd heard from a group that visited Mabira only a couple of weeks earlier without seeing a single bird, despite looking hard for it!

During the morning we also saw an **Eastern Forest Robin** and I secured views of a **Red-headed Bluebill** jumping on the trail – a species only Magnus saw on our first visit.

As midday approached temperatures were rising and entering a more open, cultivated area we found both **Ayres's** and **Cassin's Hawk-Eagle** soaring above our heads. After a packed lunch we drove to another part of the forest to search for **Forest Wood Hoopoe**, a species we had so far only glimpsed flying by in the canopy a couple of times. Sure enough, we soon had lengthy views of two birds and had now seen all of our most important target birds.

We decided to try for Cassin's and Sabine's Spinetail. We walked to a small pond were they sometimes come in to drink and were you have a good overview. This turned in to be a good move since a stunning **Green Twinspot** gave us uncharacteristically good views at ground level, maybe nesting by the pond. As for the spinetails, we found two **Sabine's Spinetails** giving us a great show, flying back and forth over the water.

Other good birds seen at Mabira included Blue Yellowbill, Buff-spotted Flufftail (heard only), Streaky-throated Barbet, Brown-eared Woodpecker, a pair of Purple-throated Cuckooshrikes, Jameson's Wattle-eye, Lowland Sooty Boubou, Western Oriole, Blue-headed and Red-bellied Paradise-Flycatcher, Western Nicator, White-headed Sawwing, Yellow-browed Camaroptera, Green Hylia, Fire-crested Alethe, Green-throated and Superb Sunbird and Red-headed Malimbe.

At 17.00 we decided to head for Kampala, since Alfred wanted to avoid driving at night, arriving at the Fairway Hotel at 18.30.

27/2 Kampala-Mabamba Bay-Lake Mburo NP

Our original plan had been to drive straight to Lake Mburo NP from Kampala, but since I'd failed to see the **Shoebill** on my first day we decided make a detour to Mabamba Bay. After a 1.5 hour's drive we arrived at 07.50 for my third attempt at the bird. This time luck was finally on my side and within twenty minutes we had located two shoebills. The birds were truly magnificent and allowed us close up views. What a great experience, and also a great relief!

Unfortunately my camera, that had functioned perfectly when entering the canoe, had had it, and despite taking out the battery, restarting it, polishing the lens contacts etc. all I could get was a frustrating "Err 99" message. Texting a friend in Sweden I got the disappointing answer that he, and two friends of his, had the same error, and that there was probably nothing I could myself. Unfortunately he was right, and I had to pack away my camera for the rest of the trip!

Before leaving Mabamba Bay, we visited a nearby weaver nesting site where we had five different species nesting together, including **Orange**, **Black-headed** and **Golden-backed Weaver**.

At 10.20 we departed Mabamba Bay, stopping en route for a lunch break. Shortly before arriving at Lake Mburo NP, we stopped at a small pond right by the road, were we found the only **Hottentot Teal**s of the trip and a **Short-winged Cisticola**.

At 15.30 we entered the park and drove to the Lake Mburo Tented Camp. After checking in we decided to use the last hours of the afternoon looking for our two main target birds – the highly localized **Red-faced barbet** and the **Long-tailed Cisitcola**.

I didn't take us long before we found a barbet posing for us in the top of a small tree, and shortly thereafter we had a couple of the cisticolas moving low through the vegetation. Other nice additions to the trip list included **Lilac-breasted Roller**, **White-winged Black Tit** and **Lesser Masked** and **Red-headed Weaver**. As the sun was setting we also managed to attract a **Black-shouldered Nightjar** that came flying in as response to play-back.

After a very successful day we then drove back to the lodge and enjoyed a great three course dinner at the very comfortable lodge. Before falling to sleep we heard a distant lion calling.

28/2 Lake Mburo NP-Rwamagana

Today we had booked a morning boat tour on Lake Mburo, looking for herons and papyrus species. However, we begun the day with a short game drive, getting more views of a couple of **Red-faced Barbets** and **Long-tailed Cisticola**, but also adding **African Hawk-Eagle**, **Grey Penduline-tit** and a glossy-black **Southern Black-Flycatcher**, here at the northern border of its distribution, to the trip list. We also heard a **Thick-billed Cuckoo** calling, but it refused to show itself to us.

At 08.00 the boat departed and our first target, the **White-backed Night-Heron**, was soon found and we could enjoy close-up views of this splendid creature. Next we started our quest for papyrus specials. Colourful **Papyrus Gonolek**s were easily found – we saw at least five birds. The **White-winged Swamp-Warbler** proved much more difficult, but after some effort we managed to get at least brief views of one bird. Other nice birds seen during the boat tour included fantastic views of five **African Finfoots** (would have been great photos if the camera had only worked), a majestic **Goliath Heron**, a wintering **Little Bittern** and a smart **Grey-capped Warbler**. After the boat tour we drove back to the lodge for lunch and departed Lake Mburo NP at 12.45 for the drive to Rwanda.

At 16.30 we arrived at the border crossing at Kagitumba. Immigration went smoothly for us, but took some time for our car, so we spent the time birding and could add **Crimson-rumped Waxbill** to the list. At 17.50 all the papers for the car were finally cleared and we could continue, gaining one hour as we crossed the border. At 19.00 we arrived at Rwamagana, close to Akagera NP, and checked in at the Dereva Hotel.


1/3 Rwamagana-Akagera NP-Gisakura

We managed to get at nice early hotel breakfast and could depart for Akagera at 05.30, arriving at the park gate at 07.00. At the park HQ a ranger was appointed to us, but when he realized we were there for the birds, he suggested that we should go with another ranger, specialized in birding! After swapping rangers we headed out in our car telling our new ranger – James Muhizi – which our target species were. He where familiar with the species and we decided to begin searching for **Miombo Wren-Warbler**. After maybe half an hour we spotted a good candidate from the car and got out to have a closer look. Magnus soon found the bird and could confirm the id. It seemed to be constantly on the move, but after some hide and seek we all got good views of our main target.

Continuing by car we soon found our second target bird, **Crested Barbet**, and in the same spot we could also add **Black-collared Barbet** to our barbet list. We heard a **Coqui Francolin** calling close to us, but could not manage any looks of the bird.

The third target bird for Akagera was Souza's Shrike, but according to James it's rare, and we didn't manage to find it. We did see some other good birds in the same area, such as Lilac-breasted Roller, Bearded and Bennett's Woodpecker, Southern Black-Flycatcher, Black-faced Waxbill and Cabanis's Bunting of the southern race, as well as more views of the Mburo specials – Red-faced Barbet and Long-tailed Cisticola.

Next we drove down to a small fishing village by Lake Ihema which was supposed to be a reliable spot for our last target bird for the day – White-headed Black-Chat. Apparently the chat didn't know this and we had to be content with **African Darter**, **Senegal** and **Spur-winged Lapwing**, **Ross's Turaco**, **Spectacled Weaver** and **Red-billed Quelea**. Before heading back we had a nice packed lunch, with possibly the best avocado I've ever tasted, at a picnic spot by the smaller Lake Birengero. The only new bird seen there was a couple of **Red-billed Oxpeckers** on the back of a hippo.

At 13.00 we dropped off James at the reception, where we also had nice views of **Green-capped Eremomela**. We continued birding the agricultural lands along the entrance road outside the park and finally found a nice male **White-headed Black-Chat**.

Since we had a long drive ahead of us, we had no more birding planned for the day. Distances in Rwanda might seem short on the map but it's easy to be deceived.

Although the roads are excellent – much better than in Uganda – the country is very hilly and you need to allocate plenty of driving time! We passed Rwamagana at 14.15, arriving at Kigali about an hour later.

After driving through town and doing a few errands we left the capital at 16.00, driving straight to Gisakura, not arriving at the guesthouse until 20.40 in the evening. Before going to bed we had a buffet style dinner in the guesthouse's rather uninspiring restaurant, accompanied by a beer. The local beer is quite good, but note that it's sold in 700 ml bottles!

2/3 Nyungwe Forest NP

Today we had high expectations, this being the first day of birding in the Albertine Rift forest. Before leaving the guesthouse we tried for **Rwenzori Nightjar** by the large trees opposite to the canteen. We heard one bird and managed brief flight views as is came in to playback. Being close to the DRC border birding in Nyungwe Forest NP is strictly regulated. You have to be accompanied by a ranger and can unfortunately only bird during daytime. In the morning you have to report to the park HQ at Uwinka, which opens at 07.00, and pick up a ranger.

Arriving at Uwinka we begun the day with a packed breakfast and picked up our first Albertine Rift endemics – **Stripe-breasted Tit,** and **Red-faced Woodland-Warbler**, as well as some other nice species like **Chestnut-throated Apalis** and very tame **White-necked Raven**s.

After breakfast we headed out with our ranger, and birder, Claver Ntoyinkima. We explained that, apart from all the other specials, we had two main target birds – Red-collared Mountain-Babbler and Kungwe Apalis, and that we wanted Claver to plan our birding to maximize our chances of seeing these two species. He said he knew the birds well and suggested that we should start looking for the babbler along the Bigugu trail. This turned out to be a good choice and we soon found a party of **Red-collared Mountain-Babbler**s moving through the forest, offering us excellent views of this rare and beautiful babbler.

Apart from the target babbler we had some spectacular birding along the trail with good birds like brief views of a single Handsome Francolin crossing the trail, flight views of Rwenzori Turaco, White-headed Wood Hoopoe, a very co-operative Barred Long-tailed Cuckoo, Rwenzori Hill-Babbler, Mountain Sooty Boubou, White-starred Robin, White-bellied Robin-Chat, Archer's Robin-Chat, Equatorial Akalat, a strange Grauer's Warbler, White-browed Crombec, Mountain Yellow Warbler, Rwenzori, Black-faced and Black-throated Apalis, Rwenzori Apalis, Chubb's Cisticola, Blue-headed and Regal Sunbird, great views of a beautiful Doherty's Bushshrike and Strange Weaver. On the way back it started to drizzle lightly but we still ran in to another gang of Mountain-Babblers, adding up to eleven birds during the morning!

Due to the rain we went back to Uwinka for a 1.5 hour lunch break until the weather improved again, before we headed out on the Karamba trail at 14.00. At the beginning of the trail you walk through low shrub, here we saw several species of sunbirds including **Rwenzori Double-collared Sunbird** and in the sky above circled **Scarce Swifts**. After a short while the trail starts to ascend and you reach a lookout where you have a good view of the surrounding trees.

Here we soon had very close views of two **Kungwe Apalis**, and in a distant flowering tree we saw a male **Purple-breasted Sunbird**. On the way back to the car we saw **Grey Apalis**, which was quite distinct compared to the Kungwe Apalis. We also saw **Cinnamon-chested Bee-eater** and **Yellow-eyed Black-Flycatcher**.

Since the lights on our car weren't working Alfred had to get it to a repair shop before dark so we headed back to the guest house at 16.30. On the way back to the guest house we saw a huge group of migrating **Black Kites** and **"Steppe" Buzzards**, probably more than 200 birds. While Alfred was gone, me and Magnus birded the tea plantation in front of our cabin were we found a few more good birds like **Cape Robin-Chat**, **Dusky Twinspot** and **Abyssinian Crimson-wing** of the distinct Rwenzori race.

3/3 Nyungwe Forest NP-Kigali

Today we had until lunch in Nyungwe and we decided to spend the morning on the trail surrounding Kamiranzovu marsh. The scenery at the marsh was beautiful with several species of flowering orchids. Several **Grauer's Swamp-Warblers** were easily found out on the marsh and a **Sharpe's Starling** was singing from a dead tree. Along the trail we had good views of **Evergreen Forest Warbler**, **Black-faced Prinia** and **Black-billed Weaver**, but both **Neumann's Warbler**s refused to give us any tickable views. Claver told us that he'd seen the little known Albertine Owlet at this site, so it was too bad that we weren't allowed to do any night birding!

After completing the trail we still had some time left and decided to bird along the main road east of the HQ at Uwinka and the upper part of the road to Rangiro, since this is a good area for the difficult Rockefeller's Sunbird. As expected we didn't find the sunbird but did get good views of a pair of **Purple-breasted Sunbirds**, a nice **Dusky Crimson-wing** and brief glimpses of a **Dwarf Honeyguide**. At the HQ we saw a **Black Sparrowhawk** and a couple of **Crowned Eagle**s soared high above.

At 11.50 we left Nyungwe, arriving in Huye (formerly known as Butare) at 13.45, were we had a lunch break and shopped for souvenirs at the *Co-opérative des Producteurs Artisanaux de Butare*. At 15.10 we left Huye, arriving in Kigali at 17.30.

4/3 Kigali-Gatuna-Kabale-Echuya Forest-Kisoro

At 07.10 we left Kigali, arriving at the border crossing at Katuna around 08.30. The border crossing went fairly quick and at 09.20 (10.20 Uganda time) we were on the road again. Today our little group was to become bigger — we had decided to meet up with Magnus's girlfriend Eja, and friend Johan at the White Horse Inn, in Kabale. Since they had some birding planned at Lake Mburo in the morning they wouldn't arrive until later in the afternoon so we had plenty of time to enjoy a good lunch and do some relaxed birding at the beautiful hotel grounds, seeing the only **Ovampo Sparrowhawk** of the trip. At 15.15 we all left Kabale and headed towards Kisoro, making a few stops en route.

At the Echuya Forest reserve we scoped a **Grauer's Swamp-Warbler** at the swamp for Eja and Johan and got another great view of a **Doherty's Bushshrike**. A skulky **Dusky Crimson-wing** showed itself for most of the group as did several **Kandt's Waxbills** and an **Archer's Robin-Chat**. At another short stop at a small pond close to Kisoro we saw **Yellow Bishop** and **Western Citril**. At 19.00 we arrived at Kisoro and checked in at the Kisoro Tourist Hotel.

5/3 Mgahinga Gorilla NP

At 06.30 we departed the hotel for the short, but very bumpy, ride to Mgahinga Gorilla NP. Most of the species found at Mgahinga can be found at Bwindi as well, but it's a better site for Rwenzori Turaco and the only site on the trip for the sought after, and difficult, Shelley's Crimson-wing.

The crimson-wing is most often seen at the upper part of the Mt. Sabinyo Gorge trail, so I was very anxious to get into the right habitat while bird activity was still good. Alfred seemed to have another plan though and our progress through the secondary shrub at the lower elevations was frustratingly slow. Some of the species seen in the area included **African** and **Rufous-breasted Sparrowhawk**, **Western Tinkerbird**, **Chinspot Batis** and **Rwenzori Double-collared Sunbird**.

Entering the first forest habitat we soon found our first target, a **Rwenzori Turaco** – here another race than in Nyungwe. Slowly birding our way through the forest meant that we unfortunately didn't arrive at the gorge itself until lunch time. By this time bird activity was low, but we found a good position to have lunch and keep a look out, but in vain. After about half an hour it started to rain and we had to walk down again. The only new bird seen at the spot was a **Brown Woodland-Warbler**.

The rain didn't last for long though and in the forest we ran across a small group of **Mountain Illadopsis** and heard a **Grey-chested Kakamega**, which refused to show itself. Back in the secondary growth we heard a **Lagden's Bushshrike** calling. It responded well to playback and gave us prolonged views.

Other notable birds seen during the day on the mountain included **Rwenzori Batis**, **White-tipped Crested Flycatcher**, **White-browed Crombec**, **Mountain Yellow Warbler**, **Strange Weaver**, **Dusky Crimson-wing**. Down by the reception we saw **White-tailed Blue Flycatcher**.

At 17.40 we left Mgahinga and headed back to Kisoro, having seen quite a few good birds during the day, but still feeling quite disappointed with dipping the crimson-wing.

6/3 Kisoro-Echuya Forest-Nyamuriro Wetland-Buhoma

Today our plan was to bird a few different sites en route from Kisoro to Buhoma. We departed Kisoro at 06.30, and arriving at Echuya Forest Reserve, we made today's first stop at the Echuya Forest Reserve, hoping for a Kivu Ground Thrush – a bird that had eluded us so far. At Echuya you mainly bird along the road going through the forest, since there are hardly any trails. We spent about two hours walking, listening and playing the song, but it was as quiet here as at the previous sites – apparently not the season for them. The best bird of the morning was **Olive Woodpecker**, we saw four of them and Echuya seem to be a very good site for this species. Other birds worth mentioning included **Mountain Oriole**, **White-browed Crombec** and **Strange Weaver**.

At 10.00 we left Echuya and continued towards Nyamuriro Wetland, close to Lake Bunyoni – one of the best sites for some of the more difficult papyrus species. One of the first birds seen was the enigmatic **Entebbe Weaver**, a little known and range-restricted species.

Next we found a couple of one of the more difficult papyrus species, the **Papyrus Canary**, giving us good scope views when they landed in the top of papyruses. We had to work somewhat harder for our third target, the **Papyrus Yellow Warbler**. They were fairly easy to find, but it took some time before we all got decent views of this sculker. A few other good birds were seen in and around the swamp, like **Lesser Swamp-Warbler**, **Little Rush-Warbler**, **Carruther's Cisticola**, **Red-chested Sunbird** and **Fawn-breasted Waxbill**.

After a brief packed lunch we left Nyamuriro at 13.30 and continued towards Buhoma. Along the road between Nyamuriro and the main road we saw a weird looking Jackson's Chameleon and in the area we also had a couple of **Lanner Falcons**. At 14.30 we entered the famous Bwindi Impenetrable NP through the Ndego Gate, then passing Ruhija, before making a short stop at the area called "The Neck", since it's the thinnest part of the park. Being mid afternoon birding was a bit slow, but we still added some nice birds like **Scarce Swift**, **Black Bee-eater**, **Green Hylia**, **Slender-billed** and **Narrowtailed Starling**, **Dusky Tit** and **Kakamega Greenbul**

At 18.20 we arrived in Buhoma and checked in at the Buhoma Community Rest Camp.

7/3 Bwindi Impenetrable NP (Buhoma)

After breakfast at the lodge we were eager to head out on the main trail at Buhoma by 07.00. Since you're not allowed to enter the park without a ranger we had arranged to meet one at the park entrance, but well there he didn't show up. This meant that we had to spend the first hours birding around the lodges which was quite frustrating. We did see a few good birds like **Petit's Cuckooshrike**, **Many-colored Bushshrike** and **Common Chiffchaff** (rare in Uganda)

At 09.00 we could finally start birding inside the park, along the Ivi River Walk, and despite the late start we were to have a fantastic day of ahead of us. Top priorities were the Albertine Rift endemics we still hadn't seen – for me especially to get good views of **Neumann's Warbler**. After having struggled with this species in Nyungwe we were prepared for hard work, but the first individual we heard singing (at the Waterfall Loop) was easily attracted to play back, circling around and giving us spectacular views. What a fantastic little bird!

Another charming warbler that gave us close up views was **Black-faced Rufous Warbler**. More of a challenge were greenbuls of many kinds that tested our identifying skills – goods one included **Ansorge's**, **Kakamega**, **Toro Olive** and **Cabanis's Greenbul**.

Another big target of the day was Chapin's Flycatcher, only found in the Albertine Rift and Kenya's Kakamega Forest, but at lunch time it started to rain heavily and all we could do was to take as good cover as we could and wait out the rain. After about half an hour it subsided a bit and almost immediately we heard a **Chapin's Flycatcher** calling and we soon found it perched right above the trail!

Another prize bird we really struggled with was **Jameson's Antpecker** and it wasn't until the very last minutes of birding, before we had to leave the forest, we found a male posing on a sunlit branch. The plate in the guidebook really doesn't do this beautiful species justice!

Other good species seen during the day were plentiful and included an overflying Bat Hawk, Little Sparrowhawk, Bar-tailed Trogon, Grey-throated Barbet, Willcocks's Honeyguide, Tullberg's Woodpecker, African Broadbill, Buff-throated Apalis, Pale-breasted Illadopsis, White-bellied Robin-Chat, Equatorial Akalat, Grey-headed Sunbird, Stuhlmann's Starling, and Black-necked and Black-billed Weaver.

Since we had to be out of the forest by 17.00, we still had some daylight time left so we birded our way slowly back. Close by one of the first lodges Magnus found what was probably the rarest bird of the trip – a **Melodious Warbler**. This is the first record for Uganda of this species.

8/3 Bwindi Impenetrable NP (Buhoma)

Today was set aside for gorilla trekking. Having heard stories at the dinner table the previous night about hard and steep trekking for eight hours to see one of the gorilla groups, we were prepared for the worst, but hoped that we would be assigned to a group that was closer by.

Our prayers were heard and we were assigned to meet group M. Starting out at 09.00 it only took half an hour for the trekkers to locate the group. We then had the privilege to spend an hour in the company of these majestic animals – an experience not to be missed!

A bonus of finding the gorillas quickly was that we could spend the afternoon birding and at 14.00 we headed out on the Muzabajiro Loop. A bird I had really hoped to see, after only hearing it in Cameroon, and so far on this trip again hearing it in Nyungwe and Mgahinga was the **Grey-chested Kakamega**. When we heard another individual calling along this trail we therefore decided to do what we could to see it, keeping very still and quiet and working with playback. We probably spent half an hour trying to tease the bird out into the open, but once again had to admit defeat.

Otherwise birding was a bit slow, but we did see a few good species like a calling **Least Honeyguide** high up in a tree, **Black Bee-eater**, **Cardinal** and **Elliot's Woodpecker** and another **Jameson's Antpecker**. Back in the lodge area we once again connected with the **Melodious Warbler** (we assume it was the same individual), saw our first **Bocage's Bushshrike** and a pair of **Brown-capped Weavers**. We ended that day with a walk along the short Munyaga River Walk.

9/3 Buhoma-Ruhija

After breakfast we left the lodge and drove a short way to the agricultural lands down by the village. Alfred wasn't very keen on this stop – he wanted to get going and spend more time further on, but both me and Magnus insisted that we had to try for **Speckle-breasted Woodpecker** and Bamboo Warbler, two species present at the site. We were lucky with the woodpecker and soon got good observations, but the warbler proved very difficult – according to Alfred you need to visit the area in May or June to have a good chance of seeing the species, since they're quiet this time of the year. Apart from the woodpecker we also saw **Double-toothed Barbet**, **Compact Weaver** and our only **Brown-backed Scrub-Robin**.

A bit further on the landscape became much dryer, with a different set of species. We stopped the car every now and then and birded by foot along different sections of the road. This way we added quite a few really nice species like a **Rufous-necked Wryneck**, **Dark-capped Yellow Warbler**, a rare **Basra Reed-Warbler**, **Arrow-marked Babbler**, **Black Bishop**, **Yellow-bellied Waxbill** and **Brimstone** and **Black-throated Canary**.

Alfred knew a good spot for **Dusky Twinspot**, which Johan and Eja had yet to see. To see it we walked up a small slope and scanned the surrounding farmland and shrubbery, soon finding no less than five birds. In the same area a **Wing-snapping Cisticola** was display flying, but it took us some time to find the tiny bird, flying so high up in the sky you could hardly see it. Nearby a **Sharpe's Starling** was singing.

Again passing "The Neck" we stopped briefly by the bridge to scan for the **Cassin's Flycatcher** that had been strangely absent to first time we passed by. This time two birds were present.

At 14.40 we arrived at the I.T.F.C. (Institute for Tropical Forest Conservation) Guesthouse at 14.40 in Ruhija, situated at an altitude of 2,345 m.a.s.l. After offloading our bags we immediately went birding in the vicinities. Opposite the guesthouse a gravel path goes through some remnant forest patches and farmland. Here we finally got good views of **Black-billed Turaco**, as well as **African Black Swift**, **Rufous-breasted Sparrowhawk** and **Black-faced** and **Chestnut-throated Apalis**. In the farmland you have a good view of the landscape, and this is a reliable spot for **Yellow-crowned Canary**, even though it took some waiting before a couple of them landed in a bare tree.

Back at the guesthouse we positioned ourselves to see **Brown-necked Parrot**s fly in to their roost before dusk – we ended up only seeing a single bird – the only one we saw on the trip. While waiting we also saw a **Grey Cuckooshrike** in the garden. After dark we took a short drive to a spot Alfred knew for **Rwenzori Nightjar**, here we got brief views of two birds hunting along a the slope below us.

After returning to the simple guesthouse again we lit a fire in the open fire-place and had a simple dinner, celebrating another successful day with a fine bottle of Black Label.

10/3 Ruhija (Mubwindi Swamp)-Kihihi

After a very windy night, with more time spent worrying about the bad weather than sleeping, it was time for us to head out on the Mubwindi Swamp trail in search of one of the most sought after Albertine Rift Endemics – the Grauer's Broadbill. After breakfast the wind started to subside, as the sun warmed up the air, and with reports of a nest building pair on site a couple of weeks ago we were once again getting our hopes up!

At 07.30 our ranger finally materialized, and we headed out on the trail. We walked on fairly quickly to get to the best area, not seeing much more than a couple of **White-headed Wood Hoopoes** on the way. Well at the nest site we quickly discovered a pair of **Red-chested Owlets** giving us fantastic views. When inspecting the nest itself we saw that it looked unfinished and had probably been deserted. Maybe owls aren't the bird's favourite neighbours? Staking out the site for a while proved unproductive and we decided to walk down to the swamp, birding and keep listening for the characteristic sound.

Down by the swamp we saw a **White-bellied Crested Flycatcher**, **Purple-breasted** and **Blue-headed Sunbird**, **Waller's Starling**, **Grauer's Swamp-Warbler** and heard a **Red-chested Flufftail** that stubbornly refused to show itself to us.

After eating our packed lunch we kept searching different trails for the broadbill and finally chose a new stake-out at a ridge that Alfred guessed was the best spot to spend the last hour. Here we did finally get good views of **Dwarf Honeyguide**, but not a sign of the broadbill. Needless to say it was a very heavy walk back to the guesthouse. The only good bird on the way back was a single **Mountain Buzzard**.

At 17.50 we left Ruhija behind and drove to the town of Kihihi, arriving at 19.30 and checking in at the Rest in Garden Hotel. By staying at Kihihi, instead of spending the night in Ruhija, we would be right outside Queen Elizabeth NP, avoiding spending the morning hours driving.

11/3 Kihihi-Queen Elizabeth NP (Ishasha/Mweya sectors)

At 07.45 we departed Kihihi and soon entered the Ishasha sector of the famous Queen Elizabeth NP. This part of the park is well known for its tree climbing lions. We spent some time driving around scanning the area for lions, but without luck – instead we found another big cat – a splendid leopard!

The area is also really good for raptors, and species seen by us included White-headed Vulture, Beaudouin's and Brown Snake-Eagle and Martial Eagle. Other birds seen were African Grey Woodpecker and Northern Black-Flycatcher. Continuing towards our lodge we added Crested Guineafowl and Black-chinned Quailfinch from the car.

At around 13.00 we arrived at the luxurious Jacana Lodge. After getting installed we enjoyed a fantastic three course lunch on the restaurant deck, overlooking Lake Nyamasingiri, meanwhile adding **Shining Blue Kingfisher** to the trip list.

At 14.50 we headed out on a game drive. Along the entrance road to the lodge we saw Cardinal Quelea, Red-collared Widowbird and Broad-tailed Paradise-Whydah, plus a spectacular Rock Python in middle of the road. Driving up to a spot overlooking one of the crater lakes north of the Kazinga Channel, we scoped Lesser Flamingo and Great White and Pink-backed Pelican. We then drove around on smaller dirt roads scanning the landscape for birds and mammals and saw species like Black-bellied Bustard, Crowned Plover, quite a few Caspian Plovers – some in summer plumage, Kittlitz's Plover, Kurrichane Buttonquail and Rufous-naped Lark.

As dusk was approaching we had a **Sooty Falcon** hunting over the grassland and then attracted another **Black-shouldered Nightjar** with playback. Driving back in the dark we spotted a very dark (melanistic?) genet in a tree and saw an African Civet crossing in front of the vehicle. Back at the lodge we had another lavish three course meal, before going to sleep in our comfortable beds.

12/3 Queen Elizabeth NP (Maramagambo Forest/Kazinga Channel)-Kibale NP

We begun the day with forest birding in the Maramabango forest, right outside the lodge. Our main target for the morning was the strange black paradise-flycatchers that inhabit the area. According to "Where to Watch Birds in Uganda" they are melanistic **African Paradise-Flycatchers**, but Alfred had seen two short tailed individuals nesting and though that they could actually be Bedford's Paradise-Flycatchers. We quickly got good views of a bird that we though look very much like a Bedford's, but also seeing longer-tailed individuals made us a bit sceptical. Maybe some more research is needed to clarify the picture?

Other birds seen in the forest during the morning included **Narina Trogon**, **Streaky-throated Barbet**, **Red-tailed** and **White-tailed Ant-Thrush**, **Rufous Flycatcher-Thrush** and **Red-capped Robin-Chat**. In a small wetland area we had **Stout Cisticola** and a flock of at least 200 **Violet-backed Starling**s flying over.

Back at the lodge we spent more time than planned enjoying another fantastic meal and we had to rush to the boat taking us out on the Kazinga Channel. From the car we spotted a **Southern Red Bishop**, and in some shrubbery close the dock we spent a few rushed minutes searching for roosting nightjars, seeing at least a couple of **Square-tailed Nightjars**.

The two hour boat tour started at 15.00 and gave more or less the expected species, like **Goliath Heron**, **Knob-billed Duck**, **Grey-hooded Gull** and a few **Heuglin's Gulls** among the more numerous **Lesser Black-backed Gulls**, large numbers of **Gull-billed** and **White-winged Terns**, plenty of **African Skimmers** and an **African Reed-Warbler**. Above us circled a single **Horus Swift**.

Now time had come for me to bid farewell to the rest of the group. Eja, Johan and Magnus, together with Alfred, had decided to spend one more week of birding visiting sites like Murchinson Falls NP, Budongo Forest and Semiliki NP, while I had to get back to work. However, I couldn't leave Uganda without trying to see Green-breasted Pitta, so I had decided to stay a couple of nights in Kibale on the way back to Entebbe.

I had arranged for a driver to pick me up after the boat ride, and while waiting we twitched a couple of **Red-capped Larks** at a nearby football field. At 17.50 the driver arrived and we headed north. The drive was uneventful, the only interesting sighting being a large flock of about a hundred **Alpine Swifts**. We arrived at the Chimpanzee Forest Guest House after dark and I had a simple dinner and went to bed.

13/3 Kibale NP

In the morning I met up with the local guide Benson Bamutura at the park HQ at Kanyanchu and also got assigned a park ranger who was familiar with the pitta. Knowing that the previous Swedish group failed to find the pitta a couple of weeks ago it felt good to have two competent guides to help me localize the bird.

The ranger had several good spots and we started by walking a short distance to a place where a **Green-breasted Pitta** had been seen a couple of days ago. Very slowly walking the path and carefully scanning the ground I almost immediately spotted a dark head with a pale eyebrow, and – there it was! Quietly feeding and jumping around on the forest floor, the magnificent bird gave us prolonged, close-up views. And it had taken us less than 30 minutes to find it!

Having expected to spend hours searching for the bird I now had plenty of bonus time. Discussing my options with Benson, we decided to drive a short distance to a clearing along the road going through the park and look for pigeons. We didn't see the target White-naped Pigeon and only heard an **Afep Pigeon** calling. At the same spot we had poor views of a couple of **Joyful Greenbuls**.

Since activity was low we drove to another good spot for pigeons at Sebitoli in the northern part of the park. Walking along the road, scanning the treetops was however unsuccessful, even though we good great views of **Yellow-mantled** and **Brown-capped Weaver**. After lunch at the restaurant at Kanyanchu we spent the afternoon at the nearby Bigodi Wetland Sanctuary. A lot of rain limited our birding time and we couldn't find the wished for White-collared Oliveback. The best bird of the afternoon was instead a **Papyrus Gonolek** and a couple of **Compact Weaver**s in the village.

Back at the guesthouse I was surprised at meeting a Swedish girl working in Kampala, with her boyfriend and a colleague from Italy. They liked to get out of the city during the weekends and often came to the Guest House. We spent a great evening talking, listening to music and drinking red wine and Tusker beer, before going to bed a bit later than planned. What a good way to end the last birding day of the trip!

14/3 Kibale NP-Kampala-Entebbe

Today was mostly a transportation day, getting back to Entebbe. We made a short morning stop at Sebitoli, not seeing anything new and then continued. Just before Kiganda we stopped by the roadside to stretch our legs by a large papyrus swamp. **Papyrus Gonolek**s were calling, and walking along the edge I flushed a bird that flew into the papyrus and landed in clear view – a **Dwarf Bittern!** The last new bird of the trip!

In Kampala I had lunch at a really nice Indian restaurant and went shopping for souvenirs and presents for people back home, before driving to Entebbe checking in at a hotel for a few of hours to get a shower and pack my bags properly before catching the late evening flight back to Sweden.

End of trip.

Range restricted target species not encountered

The following twelve range restricted species where targeted (or dreamed about) but not found. A couple of other specialty species where not possible at the sites visited by us but can be seen at other sites (e.g. Uganda Woodland-Warbler and Ituri Batis):

- White-naped Pigeon (Columba albinucha): Restricted to the Albertine Rift and SW Cameroon. Present in Kibale NP, but did not spend much time looking for it.
- **Itombwe Owl** (*Tyto progoginei*): Very little is known about this Albertine Rift Endemic, might be possible in Nyungwe Forest NP, but no night time birding is allowed.
- **Albertine Owlet** (*Glaucidium albertinum*): Present in Nyungwe Forest NP, but you need to be very lucky to bump into one and no night time birding is allowed.
- **Schouteden's Swift** (*Schoutedenapus schoutedeni*): Officially endemic to E DRC, but swifts that fit the description of this species has been reported from Nyungwe Forest NP.
- **Grauer's Broadbill** (*Pseudocalyptomena graueri*): The major disappointment of the trip was that this year's nesting pair at Mubwindi Swamp had abandoned their nest. We should have allotted at least another day at the site.
- **Kivu Ground-Thrush** (*Geokichla tanganjicae*): This Albertine Rift endemic could have been seen at several sites, but the thrushes were not singing this time of the year.
- **Oberlaender's Ground-Thrush** (*Geokichla oberlaenderi*): Another thrush endemic to the Albertine Rift, but rarer than the previous species.
- **Bamboo Warbler** (*Bradypterus alfredi*): Scattered distribution from southern Ethiopia to northern Zambia. Easier to find when singing in May-June.
- **Karamoja Apalis** (*Apalis karamojae*): Only found around Kidepo Valley and Moroto in northeastern Uganda and the Wembere floodplain in central Tanzania. We had hoped to see this species in Kidepo Valley NP, but maybe recent bushfires made it more difficult to find, or it might be easier during another season.
- Rockefeller's Sunbird (Cinnyris rockefelleri): Little known Albertine Rift Endemic present in Nyungwe Forest NP. Ideally we should have had at least one more day in the park, we now ended up with almost no time spent in the best areas for this species.
- White-collared Oliveback (*Nesocharis ansorgei*): A skulky species that like wet habitats, like papyrus swamps, could have been seen at a number of sites, like Nyamuriro or Bigodi, but we spent little time focusing on this bird. It was seen by the rest of the group after I went back to Sweden.
- **Shelley's Crimsonwing** (*Cryptosiza shelleyi*): We would have needed more time in Nyungwe Forest NP and/or Mgahinga Gorilla NP to search for this sough after Albertine Rift Endemic.
