

Introduction

This was Robert's third trip to India and Nilla's first. After having bought the plane tickets in July 2009, we began an e-mail correspondence with Kalypso Adventures, a company that have been highly recommended in many trip reports. We soon understood that using them would be very expensive compared to arranging everything on our own, and they were not interested in customizing the trip according to our wishes concerning cheaper hotels (despite saying so on their web page), why we decided to try it on our own. This turned out to be an excellent decision, which we never regretted.

Birding this part of India on one's own is easy and a true pleasure: people are friendly and helpful, it is easy to get to all of the hotspots, it is possible to use the service of good local bird guides at the main hotspots and the birding is exciting with many endemic bird species. All in all we saw 238 bird species. We saw a fantastic 25 out of 28 Southern India endemic bird species and races¹, and 8 out of 9² Western Ghats and Sri Lankan endemics. When it comes to the timing of the trip some of the local bird guides we met suggested that the second half of January is a better time, because then many species have started breeding, and the possibilities for taking good pictures are better.

We flew with Lufthansa from Gothenburg to Bangalore return ticket, which cost 16 700 Swedish kronor for the both of us. The visas needed cost 1440 Swedish kronor for the both of us.

Places visited

We arrived to Bangalore International Airport (BIAL) 02.30 in the morning the 20th of December. From there we took a bus (BIAS 09) to Kempegowda Bus Station downtown, which took about 45 minutes (140 Rs³ per person). From there we continued with a comfortable Volvo Airvath bus to Mysore Suburb/Central Bus Stand, which took two and a half hours (240 Rs per person).

Mysore/Ranganathittu

December 20-21, January 8-9

Mysore is an exciting and interesting city, why we returned to it and spent two more days there by the end of our trip. We arrived to Mysore on a Sunday morning, which turned out to be a real hit since the beautiful Mysore palace light show is on Sunday evenings. From Mysore we took a taxi to the temple site Somnathpur, a place well worth visiting.

From Mysore it is 19 kilometres to Ranganathittu. We went there by a taxi arranged at the hotel (750 Rs), but it is close enough for taking a cheap auto-rickshaw. Ranganathittu is a pretty small place, but it kept us busy for three and a half hours. Taking a boat trip (500 Rs for foreigners for a private boat) is highly recommended since this is a good way of getting very close to the birds. Some of the interesting species seen here were *Indian Grey Hornbill, Spot-billed Pelican, Great Thick-knee* and *River Tern. Grey-headed Fish Eagle* is possible here, but according to people we spoke with only one bird was in the area at the time of our visit.

The last day of the trip (January 9) we went by auto-rickshaw to a marsh (Dalawahi Kere – shown on Google maps) a few kilometres south of the city, located west of the road towards Ooty and Mudumalai. Some of the interesting species seen here were *Blue-tailed Bee-eater*, *Spotted Owlet*, *Red Avadavat*, *Purple Swamphen* and *Red-naped Ibis*.

The first two nights in Mysore (December 20-21) we stayed in The Green Hotel⁴, which we had pre-booked via e-mail without having to pay in advance. We paid 2950 Rs for a semi-deluxe room in the garden. It was a nice place to stay, especially the garden and the restaurant there, but the room standard was very simple and did not match the price. Therefore we decided to stay in Comfort Inn, Vyshak⁵ when we returned to Mysore the 8th of January (near Suburb Bus Stand). This hotel had opened in November 2009, and the room

we stayed in was very good with A/C and a comfortable bed and definitely worth the 1700 Rs we paid. The restaurant in the hotel served fantastic food!

From Mysore we went by taxi the 90 kilometres to Mudumalai NP, which took three hours. We arranged the taxi trip through one of the auto-rickshaw drivers and it cost us only 900 Rs with an Indicar (it would have cost us the double if we had booked through the hotel travel agency).

Mudumalai NP

December 22-25

We spent four memorable days in Mudumalai NP in the surroundings of Forest Hills Farm & Guest House, close to the more famous Jungle Hut. When we arrived to the guest house we were hit by terrible news - a French woman had been killed by an elephant at Viboothimalai close to guest house the in August⁶, why the had authorities prohibited tourists from walking in the jungle. Because of this most

of the birding was done by walking along roads between Forest Hills and the small village of Bokkapuram and around Jungle Hut. With the help of bird guide Siddha⁷ (tel.nr. 944 38 57 985), who worked at Jungle Hut, we managed to find some of our target species, i.e. *Malabar Lark* and *Grey-headed Bulbul*. The birding was generally slow, but the scenery was fantastic and we saw some really good species: *Indian Vulture*, *Rufous-bellied Eagle*, *Brown Fish Owl*, *Crested Treeswift*, *Malabar Whistling Thrush*, *Tytler's Leaf Warbler*, *Nilgiri Flycatcher*, *White-bellied Flycatcher*, *Blue-throated Flycatcher*, *Indian Blue Robin*, *White-browed Fantail*, *Indian Scimitar Babbler*, *Loten's Sunbird* and *Asian Fairy Bluebird*. There are a couple of important target species here that we didn't see: *Yellow-legged Buttonquail*, *White-rumped Shama*⁸, *White-naped Woodpecker*⁹ and *Blue-bearded Bee-eater*¹⁰.

We stayed five nights at Forest Hills Farm & Guest House" in Bokkapuram, which we prebooked via e-mail without having to pay in advance. We paid astronomic 5500 Rs per day for the Tree House including three meals per day. The accommodation was very Spartan, but the food was superb, staff excellent and the atmosphere great. The nearest neighbour was Jungle Hut and we were allowed to walk around in their garden. From what we saw Forest Hills is a better option compared to Jungle Hut, especially the scenery is better at Forest Hills, and there is a nice watchtower overlooking the mountains.

From Mudumalai it is possible to take a day trip to the Hindu temple site of Gopalaswamy Betta, 42 kilometres from Masinagudi, which we unfortunately never did. At Gopalaswamy Betta the following species are possible: *Painted Bush Quail*, *Jungle Bush Quail*, *Barred Buttonquail*, *Oriental Skylark*, *Tawny Lark*, *Ashy-crowned Sparrow-Lark* and *Jerdon's Bushlark*.

Ooty December 26-28

We had planned to continue to and stay overnight in Ooty the 26th of December. We called several hotels the night before, but every hotel was full. Because of this we decided to stay an extra night at Forest Hills Farm & Guest House, but to go over the day to Ooty. We took a taxi to Masinagudi (150 Rs), and from there a local bus to Ooty (20 Rs). After having booked a room for the coming night at Regency Villas¹², a hotel situated within walking

distance of Cairnhill Forest, and after having had an overpriced lunch at Fernhill Palace, we spent two hours birding Cairnhill Forest. We returned to Forest Hills Farm & Guest House from Ooty with a taxi (700 Rs). The 27th of December we took a jeep taxi from Forest Hills to Ooty (800 Rs). During the afternoon we spent an hour birding the Potato Research Station. We had planned to continue birding at Cairnhill Forest, but a heavy rain made this impossible. The 28th of December we spent three hours birding Cairnhill Forest starting at dawn.

Ooty was the only disappointment of the trip birdwise. Birding was extremely slow both at Cairnhill Forest and at the Potato Research Station. We managed to see some of the target species, i.e. *Black-and-rufous Flycatcher*, *Nilgiri Wood Pigeon* and *Rufous-breasted (Nilgiri) Laughingthrush*, but we never found important species like *Brown Wood* Owl, *Kashmir Flycatcher*, *White-bellied Shortwing* and *Nilgiri Thrush*.

From Ooty we took a shared taxi to Ukkadam Bus Station, Coimbatore (four hours, 450 Rs for both of us), and from there a local bus to Pollachi (one hour, 28 Rs).

Top Slip

December 29-31 We decided to stay in a hotel in Pollachi and go to Top Slip on day trips. Pollachi itself is genuine, nontouristy Indian town with friendly people, some interesting things to see. like the flower market, and a very good restaurant (Hotel Amutha Surabhi; upper floor A/C room). From Pollachi there is a daily bus to Top Slip at 6 am $(1 \frac{1}{2})$ hours), and from Top Slip you can leave by bus at 1 or 6.30 pm. One can buy water, drinks, soft coffee/tea and snacks Top at Slip.

At Top Slip one pays 100 Rs per person to do bird walks for a couple of hours in the area with a guide. We had Kethan for guide all three days, and he can be warmly recommended. His English might not be very good, but he knows the bird names in English, where to find the target species and he knows most songs and calls. Some of the interesting species seen here were *Black Eagle*, *Sri Lanka Frogmouth*, *Malabar Trogon*, *Great Pied Hornbill*, *Heart-spotted Woodpecker*, *Indian Pitta*, *Forest Wagtail*, *Orange-headed Thrush*, *Wynaad Laughingthrush*, *Rufous Babbler*, *Little Spiderhunter*, *Large Woodshrike* and *White-bellied Treepie*. There are a couple of target species here that we didn't see: *Black-throated Munia*, *White-browed Bulbul*, *Blue-bearded Bee-eater* and *White-rumped Shama*.

We stayed in Sakthi Hotel¹³ in Pollachi (1150 Rs for A/C Suite), which was close to the bus station and good value.

When we called hotels in Munnar we were told by several hotel owners that every hotel in town was full, why we started thinking about changing our trip plan. We made a final call to Westend Cottages and they actually had a room. What a relief! It seems like booking hotel rooms in Ooty and Munnar in advance is advisable, at least around Christmas and New Years Eve! We went by bus from Pollachi to Udamalpet (those buses run very frequently), and from there took a taxi from the bus station to Munnar (1600 Rs). The entire trip took 4 ½ hours. This is a much cheaper option compared to going all the way by taxi from Pollachi to Munnar. One can also take a bus from Udamalpet to Munnar, and as we understood it there was also one bus daily from Pollachi to Munnar.

Munnar/Eravikulam NP

January 1-2

Munnar is a very touristy place, not at all as pleasant for a nature lover as for example Top Slip and Thattekad, but get all the endemics you have to go there. One day spent there should be enough to see all or most of the target species. We decided spend to afternoon our first day there by walking along the river. This walk was memorable for many reasons, i.e.

all the kids that approached us asking for "pen", "country coin" and "photo" (in that order), wild elephants close to the road and stunning scenery. Birdwise we managed to see one of the main targets, *Grey-breasted Laughingthrush*, and we had the only *Black Bulbuls* of the trip.

Our second day we went by auto-rickshaw to Eravikulam NP, where we took the first possible bus at 8 am (entrance fee plus bus ticket plus camera fee 465 Rs). We spent two hours up there, and did see all the main target species: *Grey-breasted Laughingthrush*, *Nilgiri Pipit* and *White-bellied Shortwing*¹⁴. Returning down the road hordes of tourists were walking on their way upwards, so a word of advice is to be in time to catch the first morning bus.

There are a couple of target species in the Munnar area that we didn't see: *Broad-tailed Grassbird*¹⁵ and *Blue-capped Rock Thrush*.

We stayed in Westend Cottages¹⁶, a friendly homestay, with cheap rooms with shared bathroom and shower.

We took a bus from Munnar to Kothamangalam (3 hours, 97 Rs).

Thattekad

January 2-4

Thattekad is only kilometres from the nice town of Kothamangalam, so if one wants to stay in a comfortable hotel. i.e. Hotel Maria International¹⁷ (1250 Rs for an A/C Suite), and "primitive" homestays or tent camps, that's no problem. Many birders coming here stay at expensive Hornbill Camp, which we can see no reason at all to do. One option that we tried for one

night was staying at a homestay, in this case Jungle Bird Homestay (1500 Rs for a double room including three meals), run by advocate Gireesh Chandran. ¹⁸ Jungle Bird Homestay is perfectly situated just inside the entrance to the bird sanctuary. Gireesh was extremely helpful when it came to finding targets species, driving us in his car and knowing exactly where to find the species, and he seems to be genuinely interested in birding.

We birded mainly four areas:

- 1) a path starting directly before the bridge near the entrance to the bird sanctuary leading to the left alongside the river (coming from Kothamangalam). Here we saw *Indian Pitta*, *Black-naped Oriole* and *Dark-fronted Babbler*.
- 2) the main road towards Idamalayar Dam, where we saw Emerald Dove.
- 3) Kallipara, which was a fantastic place with loads of birds in a small area. We saw *Black-crested Bulbul*, *Mountain Imperial Pigeon*, *Green Imperial Pigeon*, *Pompadour Green Pigeon*, *Grey-headed Bulbul* and *White-bellied Woodpecker* here, but *Black Baza* and *Crested Goshawk* are also regular here according to Gireesh.
- 4) at dusk around Jungle Bird Homestay for owls and nightjars. We were extremely lucky and heard *Oriental Scops Owl*, *Spot-bellied Eagle Owl*, *Indian Scops Owl* and *Sri Lanka Frogmouth*. Gireesh said that *Great-eared Nightjar* is possible to hear outside the homestay at 5 am, which Robert tried the last morning, but unfortunately he only heard a *Brown Hawk Owl*.

We took a taxi from Jungle Bird Homestay to Fort Kochi (2 hours and 20 minutes; 1250 Rs)

Fort Kochi

January 5-7

After two weeks of intense birding we had a few relaxing days at Fort Kochi, visiting Cherai Beach two days combined with evening visits to Ernakulam. Fort Kochi is a popular tourist destination, and sometimes it didn't feel like "real" India, but on the other hand it has got a relaxed atmosphere which is what people come here for.

We took an A/C night bus from the KSRTC bus stand in Ernakulam to Mysore.
