No. 13, Public Acts of Michigan, 1932, as amended by Act No. 143, Public Acts of Michigan, 1933, by Act No. 42, Public Acts of Michigan, 1935, and by Act No. 271, Public Acts of Michigan, 1937, the Village has power, with the permission of the Public Debt Commission of Michigan, to issue refunding bonds:

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, that the Village Clerk and Village Treasurer apply to the Public Debt Commission for permission to issue refunding bonds to the amount of \$184,060.17 and interest-refunding certificates to the amount of \$64,855.76.

RESOLVED, further, that if such permission be granted, refunding bonds be issued in four series and interest-refunding certificates in four series, all of which shall be general obligations of the Village, as follows:

provided, that if at the time of any annual tax levy the amount of such bonds or certificates of any series which shall have been retired shall exceed the aggregate of the amounts required by this resolution to be provided for the principal of such bonds or certificates previous to that time, the tax for that year may, in the descretion of the Village Council, be reduced by the amount of such excess.

RESOLVED, FURTHER, that at the time of preparing the annual appropriation bill for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1942, an accounting shall be taken of the amount of interest-refunding certificates retired up to that time, and if the amount so retired shall be less than the amount of sinking fund deposits therefor required up to that time, and additional tax shall be levied in each year thereafter, equal to one-fifth of such deficiency. In determining the amount of tax to be levied in any year for interest and for principal of serial bonds, the percentage of tax delinquency for the preceding year shall be ascertained, and allowance shall be made for a like percentage of delinquency. In any year when any of said refunding bonds or certificates become due, the tax to be levied shall, in any event, be sufficient, with the money then in the sinking fund, to pay in full the principal and interest falling due during such year.

If tenders are not received below par and accrued interest to the full amount available, the Treasurer shall call bonds or certificates for redemption at the earliest practicable date, to the amount available, selecting the bonds or certificates to be called by lot. Any bonds or certificates purchased or redeemed shall be cancelled, and notice of cancellation sent to the Public Debt Commission.

Gentlemen:

We are writing you with the view of explaining the reason for the increase in the fire rate on your City Hall, and in explanation wish to advise that, effective August 1, 1929, the preferential rate on public buildings of frame construction, known as the public building basis rate, was discontinued, due to the fact that the loss ratio on this class was quite heavy, and it was found that these buildings were subject to the same hazards as frame mercantile buildings. They were accordingly put in the class of frame mercantiles. The changing of this classification brought about an increase in the basis rate of approximately 16¢ annually, which, after the addition of the occupancy charges made a net increase of approximately 26¢ in the annual rate, or 65¢ for three years. There was a further increase in your rate of approximately 8¢ annually, or 20¢ for three years, due to the storage of an automobile in this building. No reinspection of your building was made until January 14, 1932, so that the Village received the benefit of the old classification for nearly four years longer than they should have.

We wish to advise further that if, approved 2½ gallon extinguishers are installed on each floor of the building, a reduction of approximately 7¢ for one year, or 17¢ for three years can be secured, and if the automobile, which is now stored in this building, will be permanently removed, a further credit of 8¢ for one year, or 20¢ for three years can be secured.

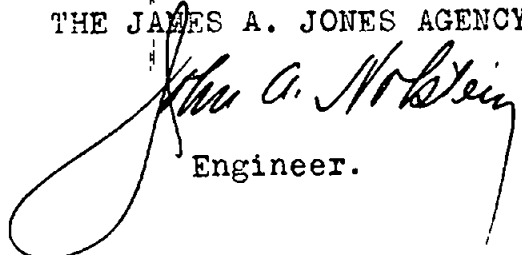

AN ORDINANCE To license and regulate public games, amusements and entertainments in the Village of Riverview.

THE VILLAGE OF RIVERVIEW ORDAINS:

Section 1. No person shall publish, maintain or operate within the limits of the Village of Riverview, any theatre, moving picture show or theatrical exhibit or exhibit or maintain any circus, menagerie, carnival, playing game or any natural or artificial curiosity or give any concert, vocal or instrumental, or a show of any kind for which an admission fee is charged unless a license has been obtained therefor from the Village Council.

Section 2. Application for such license shall be made in writing to the Village Council and filed with the Village Clerk who shall refer the same to the Chief of Police for immediate investigation. Such application shall give the full names of the applicants or applicant and of every person interested in the issuance of the license applied for together with the business and residence addresses of such persons. If said applicant shall be a corporation, then the names, business and residence addresses of the present officers and directors of said corporation only shall be required. Such application shall also give the place or places where said business is to be conducted and the number of devices, if any, to be there established, maintained or operated. Separate licenses shall be procured for each theatre, moving picture house or other public place of amusement operated in the Village of Riverview.
