Pacific Silverweed

Potentilla anserina ssp. Pacifica ~ Rose family

Ethnobotany

 Roots dug in early fall & spring, then steamed; tasted similar to sweet potatoes

 Roots were such an important food that chiefs often owned patches

Characteristics

Grows in marshes, tidal flats & near sandy beaches

 Perennial herb grows from long, reddish runners with flower stalks bearing single flowers

Compound leaves are silver-colored & woolly
