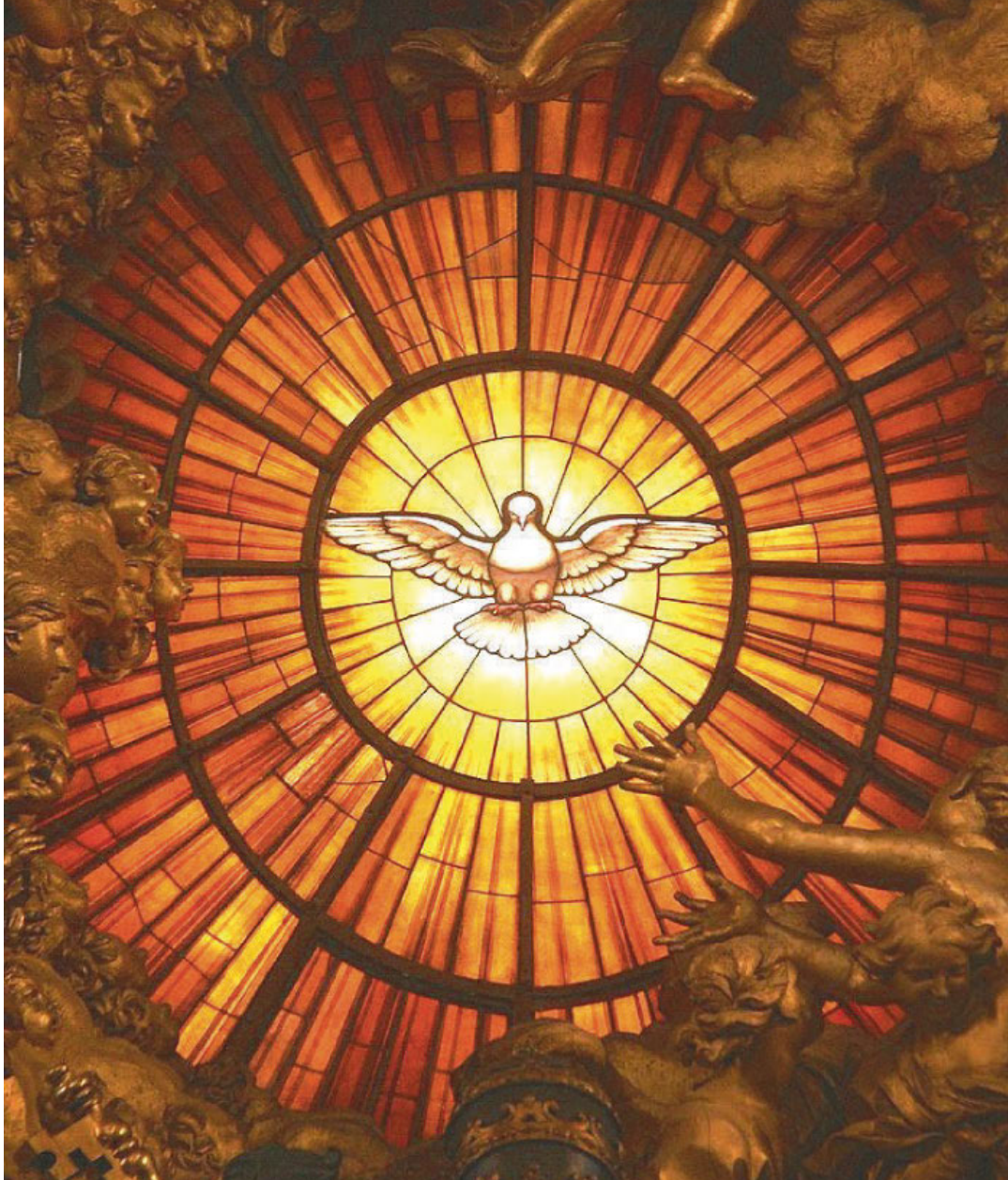

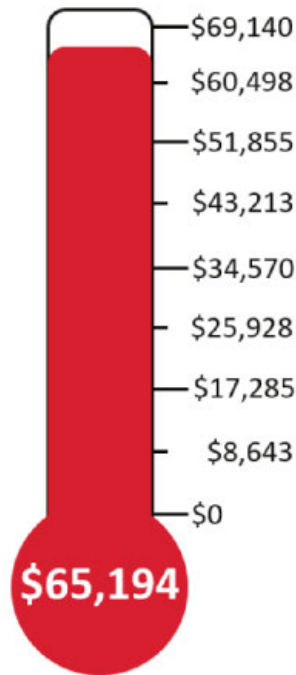

This Weekend: Home Missions - Our Own Needs

Attached to this bulletin, you will find an envelope for this Diocesan collection: Home Missions-Our Own Needs. Pope Francis reminds us that everyone is meant to evangelize. This collection clearly calls us to work as a family to help our brothers and sisters to share the Love, Faith, and Hope of Jesus Christ. We can all make a difference by offering prayers for the support of the missions in the United States and by financially assisting these organizations. Our generosity makes a difference for our brothers and sisters across the United States. Below are the four major beneficiaries represented in this collection:

- **Black and Indian Missions** - exists to build Christian communities among the Native American, African American, and Alaskan Native peoples. Every penny collected is distributed as diocesan grants to support and strengthen evangelization programs in the United States. Annually, in our Diocese, we receive grants to assist our parishes in outreach, education, and service to the people of the Menominee Indian Tribe.
- **Catholic Communications/Evangelization** - modernizes how the church communicates the joy of the Gospel nationwide and locally. This enables us to spread the Gospel message and reach more people. Half of all funds collected for the CCC remain in our Diocese to support our local communication efforts.
- **Catholic Home Missions** - assists 40% of Dioceses in the United States. Their fragile financial situations, poverty, vast distances, difficult terrain, and lack of priests significantly affects the ability of the Diocese' mission to offer basic pastoral needs. Home Missions provides financial assistance for Mass, the sacraments, and faith formation.
- **Catholic University of America** - is the National University of the Catholic Church. Your gift enables the University to prepare the next generation of Catholic leadership, both religious and lay. Every donated dollar supports scholarships to assist financially deserving students in completing their education. Alumni include 19 Cardinals, 58 Bishops and over 12,400 priests.

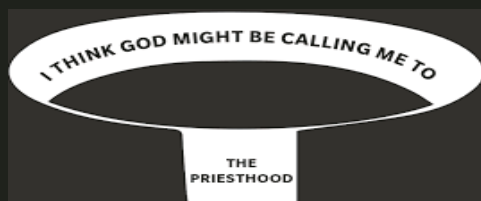

SECRETARY-TRUSTEE ELECTION 2023

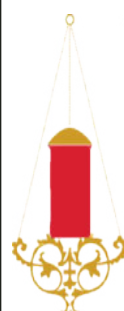

Eucharistic Procession



June 10 & 11, 2023

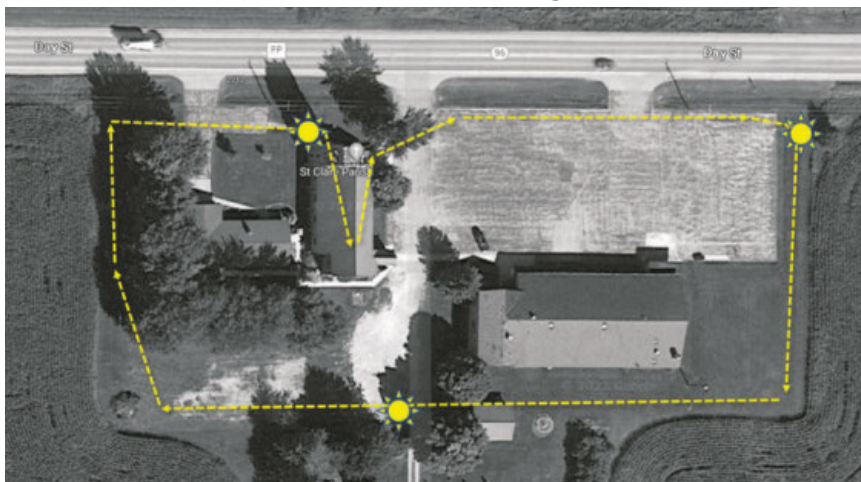
On the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (i.e., Corpus Christi), the Masses at 4, 8, and 10 will be followed by a Eucharistic Procession. The procession has its origins in the Middle Ages, and its purpose is to make our Catholic faith in the Eucharist *visible* to others in the area so that they might see and believe.

The procession routes are pictured at left. The “suns” indicate where the procession will pause for a moment of prayer, before continuing on. The processions will take 20-25 minutes.

Following the processions, we’ll continue to celebrate the Presence of Christ among us in the Eucharist with ice cream socials!



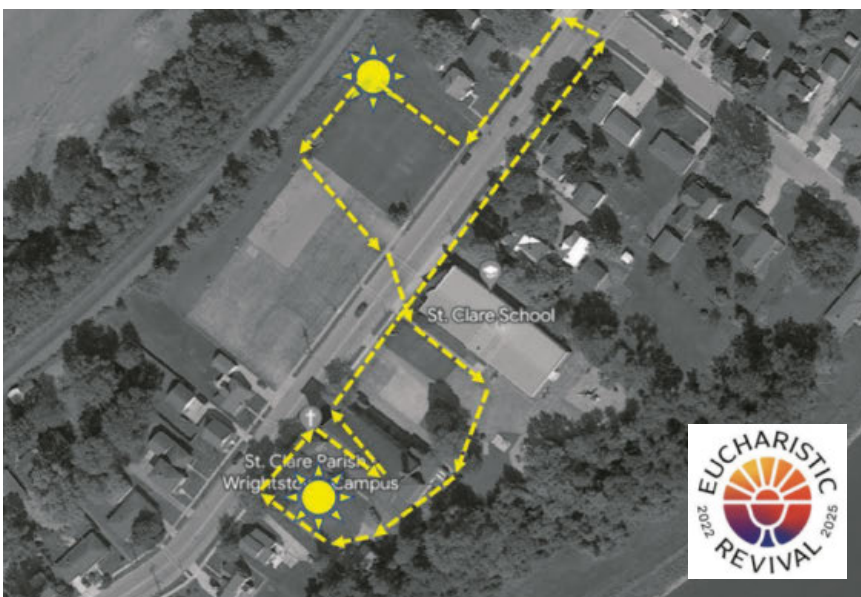
Greenleaf Campus Procession Route – Following 8:00 Mass, June 11

Are there any books that you love so much that you have read them twice (or more)? "The Great Divorce" by C.S. Lewis is a book that always has a place on my shelf, and it has been a yearly read for me each Lent.

When you find yourself with a "free night," what is something you are likely to do? My free nights often are determined by where I happen to be at that moment. During the formation year, those nights are often filled with different things like visiting fellow seminarians, reading, or working on a draft of a book.

What do you remember from your First Communion? I remember clearly dressing in my suit, not really knowing why I needed to dress nicer than I usually did. But the moment I remember most was Fr. Robert Rhyner coming to speak with each of us individually before the Mass. He jokingly asked me if I needed to go to confession again since I had my First Reconciliation yesterday. The feeling of total love and contentment I had receiving our Lord for the first time is a grace I have only now begun to recognize and appreciate.

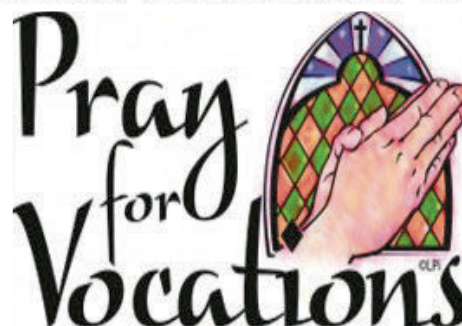
Where is one of your favorite places to pray, and what makes it special to you? I have always had a habit of sneaking over to Christ the King Chapel in the dead of night or at least when it is dark outside. When the chapel is lit only by the sanctuary lamp, it creates a feeling of privacy with Jesus, which is very important for my personal prayer life. The sensation is the same when I go to the sacrament of confession; prayer then becomes a place where I can be open in a particular way with Jesus and take as much time for prayer as I want.

What role has the Eucharist played in your discernment of the priesthood? The Eucharist is everything. Without it, my discernment would have been mechanical, like any other job. The Eucharist is what changes the priesthood from primarily being about a choice made by the man who seeks to be ordained to being more about Jesus and his call to the man. It focuses my discernment on the role of the priest as someone who brings Jesus to others, who is a servant of the people of God, and who loves the Church above all else. Adoration is one way to spend time with the Eucharist that has been a key part of my discernment. While speaking with Jesus in the tabernacle is important, there is something special about doing that same thing

face to face with him. For me, when Jesus is on the altar, I can speak to him face to face, and the presence he has become much more palpable. In seeing him in the Eucharist, I can hear his voice clearly.

If there was one thing you could communicate to the faithful about the importance and role of the Eucharist in our Catholic faith, what would it be? Without the priesthood, we do not have the Eucharist; without the Eucharist, we do not have the Church. It is easy to take the Eucharist and the priest's role for granted, not because we have any desire to, but because having ready access to the Eucharist is all many Catholics today and I have ever known. I remember when I was in quarantine during the pandemic, and each morning when a priest would bring me the Eucharist, it was the most memorable moment that day. I began to better understand the saints we read about who had such a hunger for Jesus. That is why the Eucharist was such a strong symbol in the heart of a parish. It's part of the call that Jesus offers a man to give up his entire life to bring to people the only thing that can truly satisfy, himself. To be fully alive as a Catholic it seems to me, is to desire the Eucharist so strongly we're willing to go to Mass even when it's inconvenient, to make a Holy Hour even in the dead of night, or to be willing to bring Jesus to those who cannot leave their homes or too sick to come see him. The Eucharist is not merely bread or just a symbol. It is the God of the universe who desperately wants to meet you.

Which saint should people invoke for your vocation and why? This year, please invoke the intercession of **Blessed Carlo Acutis**; his devotion to the Eucharist through documenting miracles is something I wish to emulate.
