CDC recommends HIV screening for all patients ages 13 to 64



HIV crosses the boundaries of sexual orientation, gender, age, and ethnicity.

- More than 1.2 million people in the United States now have HIV, and 1 in 7 (about 14%) are unaware of their infection.
- Blacks represent approximately 12% of the U.S. population, but account for 47% of HIV diagnoses.
- Unless the course of the epidemic changes, an estimated 1 in 16 Black men and 1 in 32 Black women will be diagnosed with HIV infection in their lifetime.

A Message from the President

Greetings and welcome to Detroit, Michigan and the 2015 National Medical Association and Scientific Assembly. For more than 120 years, the NMA has served to bring men and women together for learning and renewal. Today, the NMA serves as the leading advocate for health equity for all Americans. This year, the scientific program seeks to balance the need to inform all members about the transformations taking place in clinical practice driven by health care reform, and at the same time update members about new treatments and approaches to disease management. This year's Convention program brings together an outstanding group of speakers and activities to stimulate your thinking and create learning opportunities.

Every physician in America has felt the resounding impact of the rapid changes occurring in our industry – some positive, some negative, and others yet to be determined. Implementation of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act continues to push forward. The new law outlines strategies to improve health, foster better health care, and lower aggregate health care spending. Implementation of the strategies outlined in the law brings fundamental changes to the delivery of health care services by physicians, hospitals and other providers. Although change best characterizes the current health care environment, we must keep one thing in mind – the delivery of health care depends on physicians and patients working collaboratively to achieve the desired outcomes. In the face of the rapid changes, the relationship established between patients and physicians becomes ever more critical. As physicians, we must assure that all Americans benefit from the highest quality of care, at lower costs, and achieve better outcomes.

In June, the Supreme Court upheld a key provision allowing tax subsidies to make insurance more affordable. This decision moves us one step closer to extending the benefits of health insurance to more people. But even in the face of great progress, work yet remains. In my state, Georgia, more than 500,000 people today have insurance because of the federal health insurance exchange. Because Georgia has no plans to expand Medicaid, more than 650,000 men and women, many of whom work every day in jobs that pay the minimum wage, remain without any form of health insurance, while the Governor, Insurance Commissioner, and now the Legislature continue to create unnecessary barriers to full implementation of health care reform. Without doubt, advocacy is needed at every level to extend the benefits of health coverage to all Americans, and the expansion of Medicaid is necessary to extend the benefits of health insurance to every American. The NMA must continue its long tradition of advocacy to assure that patients and families in our care achieve the best possible outcomes and the full benefit of health care reform.

In July, Medicare proposed to make a new bundled payment model for lower extremity joint replacement mandatory for acute care hospitals. Medicare and other payers continue to promote and test new payment models aimed at rewarding both value and outcomes. As new payment models emerge, such models must be fair and reflect the intensity of care required for patients with disproportionate disease burdens because of longstanding health disparities. At the same time, new quality measures and public reports must be equitable and reflect accurately care and associated outcomes. Quality measurement and public reports must not penalize physicians who care for our nation's most vulnerable populations. New payment models and quality measure initiatives must be fair. NMA and its members must make it a top priority to remain connected to the development and implementation of new payment models and quality measurement strategies.

The need for NMA advocacy is as important today as it was 50 years ago when we took a stand to support Medicare as a means to extend the benefits of health insurance to Americans 65 and older. As we look back to celebrate 50 years of Medicare and its benefit to older Americans, we must also look forward together to setting a course for quality healthcare for each and every American. Together, we must continue to stand strong to assure that the benefits of better health care, lower costs, and improved outcomes extend to each and every American.

Thank you for the opportunity to serve as your President. I am deeply honored and humbled. I want to thank the NMA staff for working with me and supporting me throughout the year. And give special thanks to the Chair of the Board, the Speaker of the House, the Immediate Past President Dr. Michael Lenoir, and the President-elect, Dr. Edith Mitchell for working with me to help navigate NMA through another challenging year. I also want to thank the Past Presidents Council and the chair, Dr. Vivian Pinn, for their valuable guidance and counsel. And last but not least, I want to thank you for your membership in the Association. Now more than ever, we need your support to help bring back former members and bring in new members. Needless to say, the more members, the stronger and more effective we are as advocates.

I am pleased to welcome Martin Hamlette, our new Executive Director, to his first NMA Convention. Mr. Hamlette joined us in January. He brings energy, commitment and dedication to this role.

Lastly, thank you for setting aside this week on your calendar to join us. I hope you will use this time to reconnect with friends and colleagues, share ideas, and learn something new to enhance your practice. Enjoy your time in Detroit – America's great "come back" city!

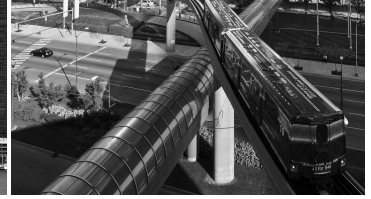
Smoking: Smoking is not permitted in the convention center.

Situated along Lake St. Clair, the estate stands amid 87 acres of beautifully landscaped gardens and grounds. Despite its size (30,000 square feet with sixty rooms), the estate has the unpretentious look of a quaint manor from the Cotswold Hills of England. Construction on the home began in 1926, not long after the Fords commissioned Albert Kahn to design their ideal residence. **Lunch included.**

MOTOWN MUSEUM & MUSEUM OF AFRICAN AMERICAN HISTORY TOUR

**Sunday, August 2 • 12:30 p.m.—4:30 p.m.
Cost: \$50 / \$60**

Despite the passage of time since Motown Records’ establishment in 1959 by Berry Gordy, tens of thousands of visitors pass through Hitsville U.S.A., home to the Motown Museum, each year. Their presence is a testimony to Motown’s legacy and to the charisma, talent and staying power of the music and those who made it. The Motown Museum is home to an extensive array of Motown artifacts, photographs and other memorabilia. The Motown Museum tells the story of how a man’s vision turned into one of the largest, most successful record companies of all

time and how the music—the Motown Sound—captured the hearts of young people, not only in America, but across the globe.

The Charles H. Wright Museum of African American History

is the world’s largest institution dedicated to the African American experience. Dr. Charles Wright, an obstetrician and gynecologist, envisioned an institution to preserve Black history after visiting a memorial to Danish World War II heroes in Denmark. As a result of this visit, he was convinced that African Americans needed a similar resource center to document, preserve and educate the public on their history, life and culture. The Wright Museum houses over 35,000 artifacts and archival materials and is home to the Blanche Coggin Underground Railroad Collection, Harriet Tubman Museum Collection, Coleman A. Young Collection and the Sheffield Collection, a repository of documents of the labor movement in Detroit. The museum also features: Maya Angelou’s *And Still We Rise: Our Journey through African American History and Culture*, the museum’s 22,000 square foot, interactive core exhibit.

The Henry Rouge Factory opened in 1929 as a school and was driven by Ford’s belief that the genius of the American people was not being taught in textbooks. Today, The Henry Ford Factory, in Dearborn, Michigan, is an internationally-recognized cultural destination that brings the past forward by immersing visitors in the stories of ingenuity, resourcefulness and innovation that helped shape America. This national historic landmark has five unique venue attractions: Thomas Edison’s Menlo Park Laboratory, The Wright Brothers’ Home & Bicycle Shop, Buckminster Fuller’s Dymaxion House, one of Steve Jobs’ and Steve Wozniak’s 1976 Apple-1 computers and Henry Ford’s Quadricycle. These five distinct attractions at The Henry Ford captivate and inspire more than 1.6 million visitors annually.

HENRY FORD MUSEUM

**Monday, August 3 • 12 noon—4:00 p.m.
Cost: \$60 / \$70**

Henry Ford Museum showcases the American ideas and innovations, technological and social, that have fired our imaginations and changed our lives. Here, visitors explore the first 40 years of flight, browse through the world’s premier automotive collection, walk past an array of presidential limousines including the one in which John F. Kennedy was assassinated and see an unparalleled collection of artifacts representing powerful change such as the bus on which Rosa Parks took a stand for Civil Rights, the camp bed George Washington used during his tour of Revolutionary War sites and the chair in which Abraham Lincoln was sitting the night he was shot.

DETROIT INSTITUTE OF ARTS

**Tuesday, August 4 • 9:00 a.m.—11:30 p.m.
Cost: \$50 / \$60**

The Detroit Institute of Art (DIA) has been a beacon of culture for the Detroit area for well over a century. Founded in 1885, the museum was originally located on Jefferson Avenue, but, due to its rapidly expanding collection, moved to a larger site on Woodward Avenue in 1927. The new Beaux-Arts building, designed by Paul Cret, was immediately referred to as the “temple of art.” Two wings were added in the 1960s and 1970s, and a major renovation and expansion that began in 1999 was completed in 2007. The DIA building measures 600,000 square feet. Completion of the museum’s renovation and expansion project will add another 77,000 square feet. The Detroit Institute of Arts collection is among the top six in the United States.

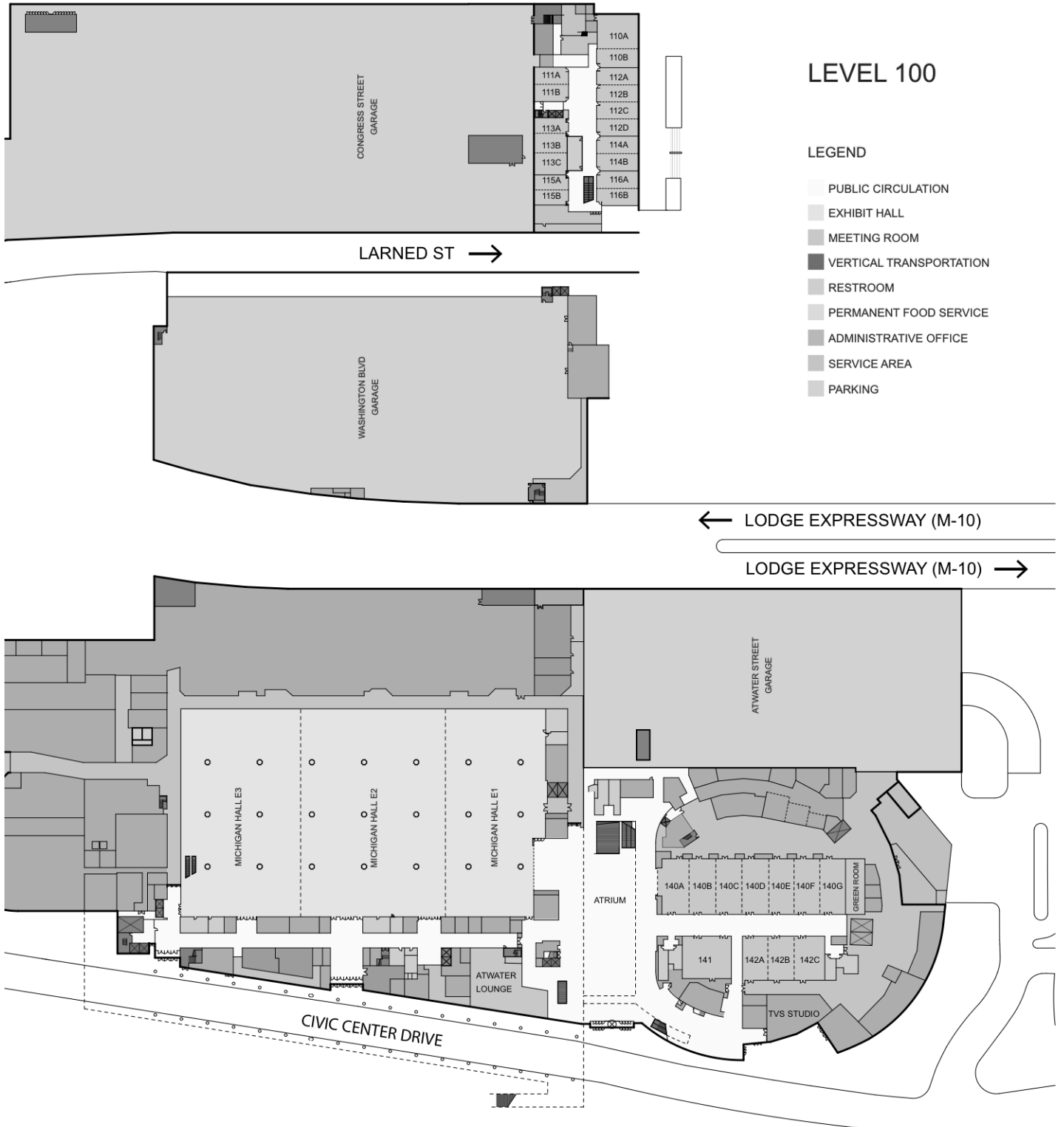
Exhibit Hall Map

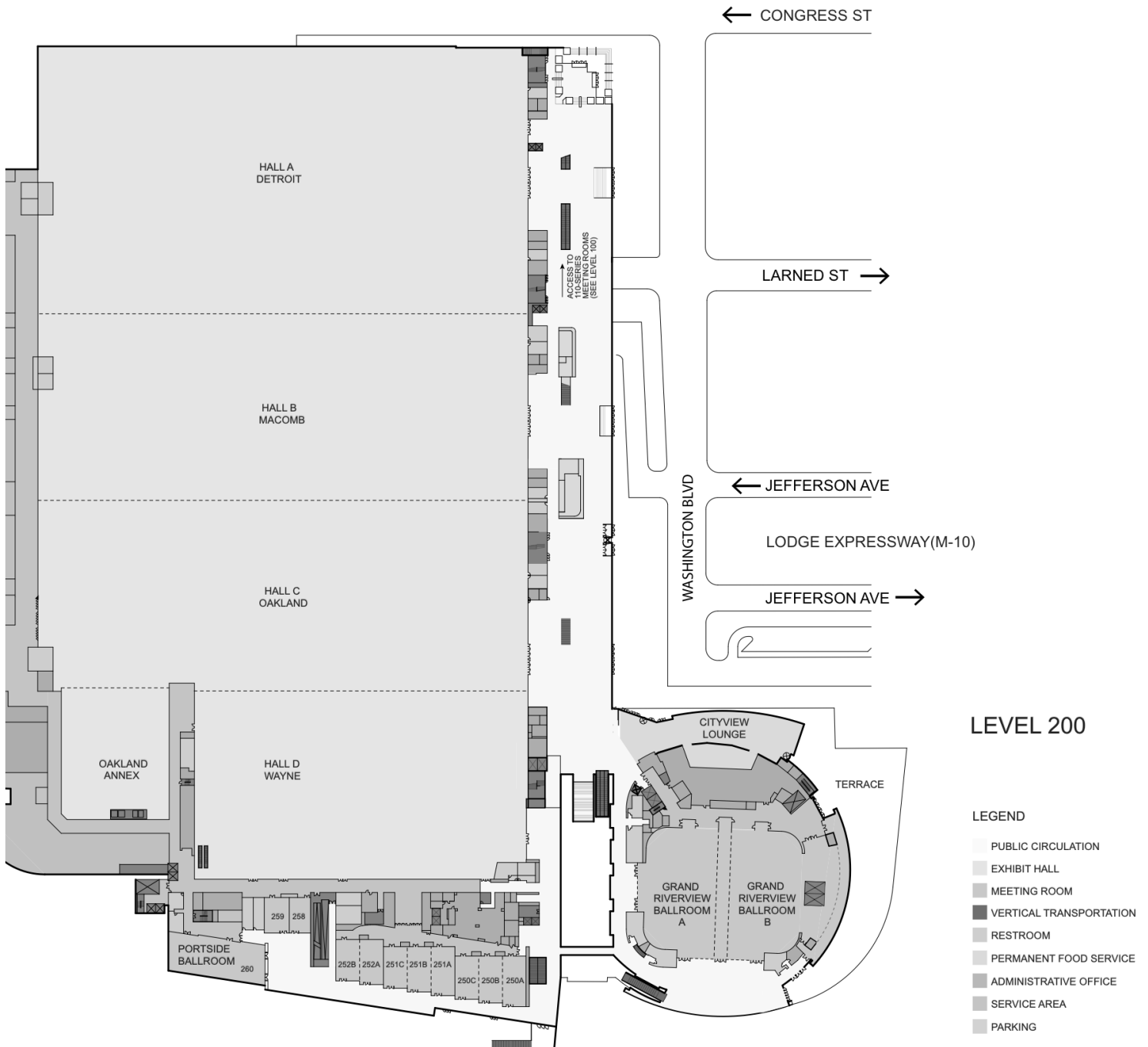
Convention Center Map

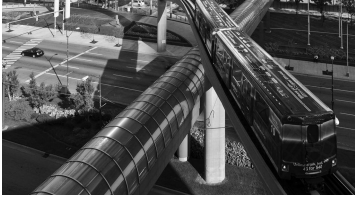
