## Senior Class History

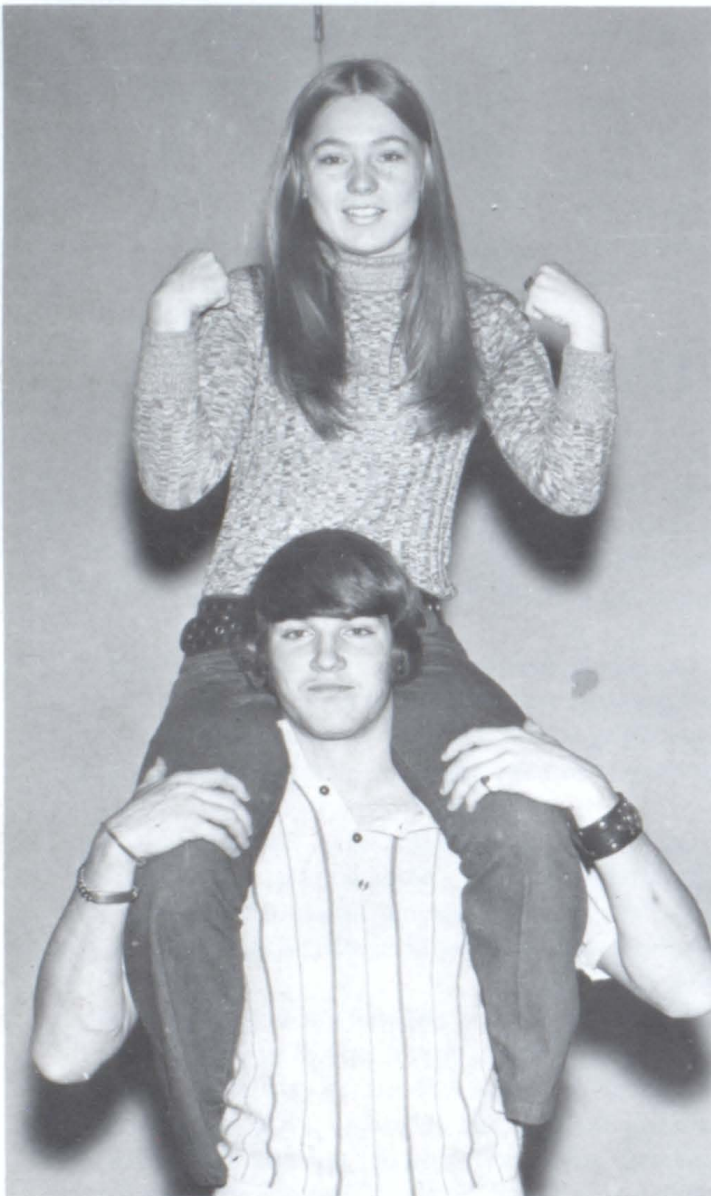

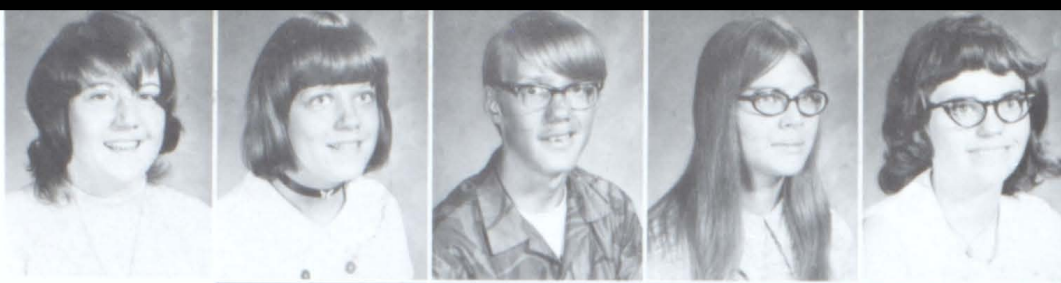


The deep loss we feel with the deaths of our two classmates Sheryl Haas and Eunice Schrupp can never be expressed in a simple memorial.

During the school year, the choir and the glee club present three concerts: a Christmas concert, a spring concert, and half of the pop concert.

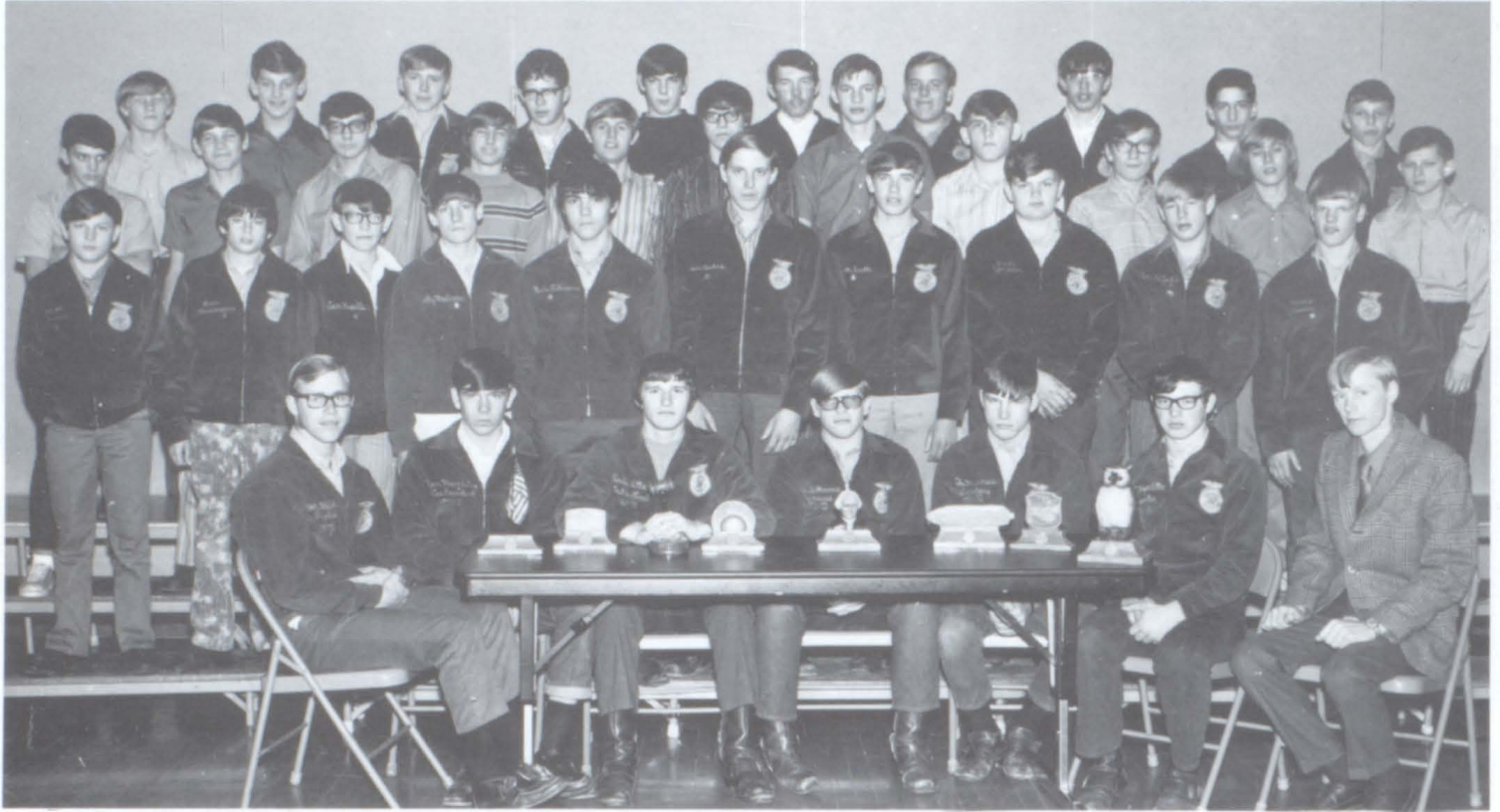

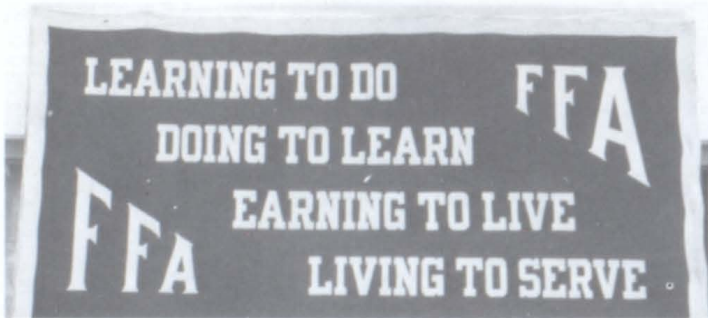

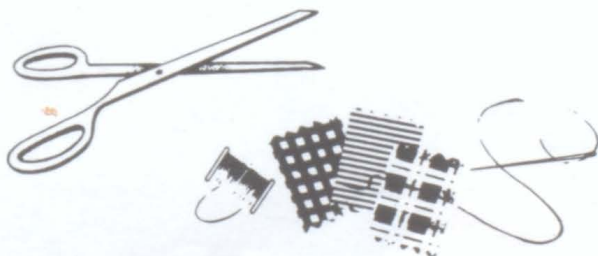

FHA (Future Homemakers of America) is a rather new organization. It consists of about 85 members from grades 9-12.

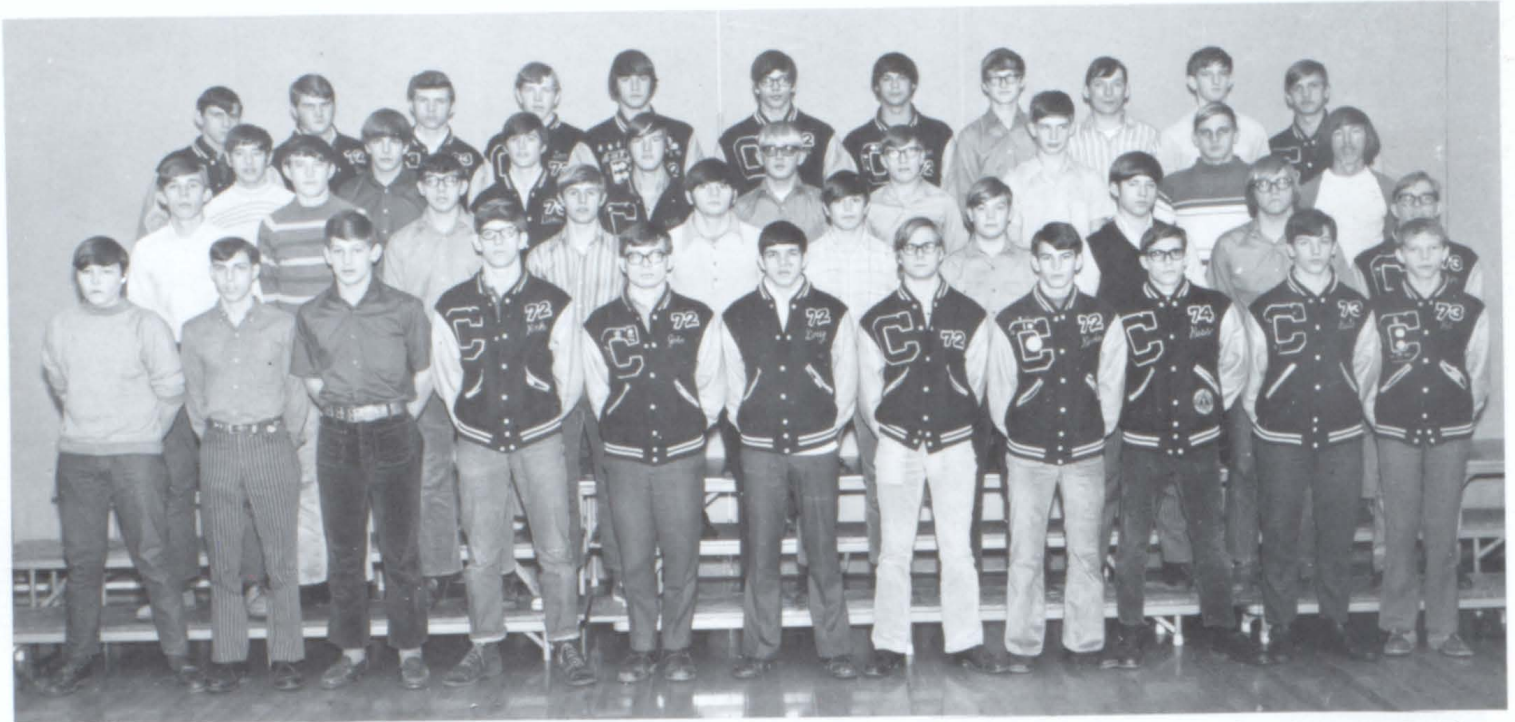
