

The suggestion that a merchant should, at times, discharge all his salespeople and endeavor to run his business with no one to make sales, or tell prospective buyers about the store's

goods and service, would be met with positive refusal, and the man making such a proposition would be considered entirely lacking in business judgment.

While no merchant in all this city would entertain the thought of so unbusiness-like action as dispensing with his selling force, there are storekeepers who do what experience teaches is equally bad pelicy—suspend all their advertising.

When it is considered that a merchant's newspaper advertising is the only way many purchasers have of knowing what is offer seem, stopping advertising becomes actual extravagance under the false guise of economy.

The logic that would influence a merchant to cease advertising because the returns were not always the same would determine him t discharge his salespeople because their sales were not always up to the highest point.
