Parents say school isn't taking allergy seriously

Parents of a student at Steeleville Grade School met with the school board Monday night because they do not feel their daughter, who suffers from a severe peanut allergy, is being adequately protected while attending school.

Adelynn Knop, 9, is a fourth-grader.

She was diagnosed with the peanut allergy at the age of 2. That is a young age for a child to be diagnosed with an allergy, as Adelynn's father said most doctors will not test a child for allergies if they are under the age of 5.

Stephanie and Chad Knop, Adelynn's parents, have altered their lives to protect their daughter and have requested the school make reasonable accommodations to do the same. They don't feel those accommodations are being entirely met.

The Knops have met with school Superintendent Stephanie Mulholland to draw up a Section 504 Plan, but Adelynn's mother said she doesn't believe the plan is being followed.

Mulholland said she wrote the plan last school year and reviewed it with the Knops.

She said the plan is updated yearly as circumstances and teachers change for Adelynn.

When the County Journal requested comment from Mulholland on some of the items the Knops felt weren't being followed in the plan, she declined to go

into detail.

"(The questions) are getting a little more than what I'm comfortable with," Mulholland said. "I still have to work with them to make the school safe for Adelynn."

During the meeting, Chad Knop read a prepared statement to the board.

"It seems that every year since we've started (at Steeleville Grade School) we have had some sort of major issue," Chad said. "This is a life or death issue."

The Knops requested that the board consider making the school completely nut-free.

"It can be done, and we've been told (by Steeleville administration) it can't be done," Chad said.

Chad said that food allergies, especially nut allergies, are on the rise across the nation.

Adelynn's allergy is so severe that even a miniscule exposure to peanuts could cause major problems. The Knops feel as though the school isn't taking the is-

sue seriously.

"It would be like you walking up to a vat of poison and not being worried about it," Chad said. "She's worried about it."

"If (Adelynn's) not feeling safe at school, there's no learning happening," Stephanie added.

Chad told the board that they have consulted an attorney for advice on their options. One of the options they were given, Chad said, was that if the school could not provide adequate accommodations, then the school may have to pay for Adelynn to attend a school that would accommodate her allergy. He said that would be required under the Americans with Disabilities Act.

Once Chad indicated that he had spoken with an attorney, the board made a motion to enter into executive session. However, they did not specifically state at the time of the motion what exemption they were applying that allowed them to enter into closed session. Mulholland later said that they closed the meeting due to potential litigation.

While potential litigation is a valid exemption under the Illinois Open Meetings Act, Stephanie told the County Journal that the couple had not threatened litigation, nor did they have any intention to sue the school. They had merely sought advice from an attorney.

However, Mulholland said she didn't take the mention of an attorney lightly.

Rauner visits businesses in Red Bud

Illinois Governor Bruce Rauner paid a visit to Randolph County December 15, making stops at two businesses in Red Bud.

What is a Section 504 Plan?

The Knop family has a Section 504 Plan in place for their daughter Adelynn.

So, what is a 504 Plan? Adelynn Knop, 9, of Steeleville suffers from a severe peanut allergy in which contact with peanut products can lead to a long list of debilitating symptoms.

The Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 considers most allergies and asthma as disabilities covered by federal protections.

According to the Disability Rights Education and Defense Fund, Section 504 of the 1973 Rehabilitation Act was the first disability civil rights law enacted in the United States. It prohibits discrimination against people with disabilities in programs that receive federal financial assistance—such as a public school—and was a precursor to the Americans with

Disabilities Act.

Section 504 protects people with disabilities from exclusion and unequal treatment in schools, jobs and the community.

Stephanie Knop, Adelynn's mother, provided the County Journal with a copy of Adelynn's 504 Plan.

The plan states that the services contained in the document are to be provided to Adelynn by school administration, faculty and staff.

The plan requires the school to train staff on common causes of the allergy reactions and emergencies, recognizing symptoms, responding to emergencies, administering medications, including the epinephrine pen, commonly known as an Epi Pen, and to maintain a copy of the plan to be provided to Adelynn's teacher or any substitute teacher.

It is required that a staff

member be trained in administering the medication and that staff member is present during school hours and at all school-related events.

The plan prohibits students who share a classroom or activity with Adelynn from distributing, exchanging or consuming peanuts during the class or activity. It requires any student who knows of Adelynn's allergy and still exposes her or threatens to expose her be disciplined appropriately.

Antiseptic wipes must be provided to the student and teacher to make sure that work spaces are not contaminated by the allergen.

The 504 Plan also covers bus transportation provided by the district. The bus driver is required to receive training, assign Adelynn a seat at the front of the bus and to not allow students to exchange or distribute any food on the bus.

Police show the true spirit of the Christmas season

"Each one of them, in their own way, knows how important this is," Brittingham said of the officers.

Sheriff Shannon Wolff said he was thankful for the community's generosity and for the opportunity to make Christmas memories with these kids.

"It's just awesome to see the smiles on their faces," Wolff

said.

Wolff was also struck by some of the things he saw while walking around with the kids and officers.

"I saw one kid buying food," Wolff said. "That just tells you a lot."

At one point, Steeleville Police Chief Jim Zeidler was paired with two little girls ages 5 and 6.

Zeidler took them to a cart to begin shopping and asked them what they wanted to look at first.

"Shoes," squeaked the small voice of the youngest girl.

The older girl agreed that they both needed shoes.

Randolph court dispositions

Randolph County State's Attorney Jeremy Walker has listed the latest court action.

Tabitha Rice
Tabitha M. Rice, 26, of Willisville pleaded guilty December 4 to unlawful possession of methamphetamine. She was sentenced to two years in prison.

Rice admitted to possessing fewer than five grams of meth located during an October 6 traffic stop in Steeleville.

"Rice had a prior methamphetamine offense in Perry County in 2013 and a possession of a controlled substance conviction in Randolph County in 2015," said Walker. "We are all for people getting help, but after two convictions and you keep using, it is our position you should go to DOC and try the treatment and forced sobriety DOC has to offer."

James Reese
James M. Reese, 34, of Coulterville pleaded guilty December 4 to unlawful possession of methamphetamine. He was sentenced to four years in prison.

Reese admitted to possessing fewer than five grams of meth located during a September 5 traffic stop in Coulterville.

"Reese was on probation for a methamphetamine offense in St. Clair County at the time of his arrest," said Walker. "For that reason, we did not believe probation was an adequate punishment."

"We recommended Reese for treatment at Southwestern Illinois Correctional Center in East St. Louis, which has a great drug treatment program, specializing in methamphetamine addiction."

Shaquille Bulliner
Shaquille D. Bulliner, 23, of Sparta pleaded guilty December 4 to possession of a weapon by a felon. He was sentenced to four years in prison.

During the plea, Bulliner admitted to possessing a firearm in Sparta August 8 after having been convicted of a felony.

"This offense is not eligible for probation and requires a DOC sentence," said Walker. "Bulliner previously had been to DOC for a three-year stint in 2012. Therefore, we obtained an additional year over the prior sentence. Bulliner will still be a young man when he gets out; for that reason, we hope this time it sinks in that you cannot continue to break the law."

David Shemonia
David L. Shemonia, 50, of Baldwin pleaded guilty December 4 to retail theft.

He was sentenced to two years of probation and is to remain in the Randolph County Jail until placed in residential treatment.

Shemonia admitted to stealing items with a value of \$300 from Buchheit in Sparta September 24. He was on first offender probation for a methamphetamine-related offense at

the time he committed this crime.

Walker said the probation in that case was terminated, and a conviction, which would not have been entered against him had he completed probation, was entered on his record.

Shemonia was convicted of this offense and will now stay in jail for treatment.

John Ehlinger
John J. Ehlinger, 29, of St. Louis pleaded guilty December 4 to violation of an order of protection. He was placed on conditional discharge for two years, with the condition to have no contact with the victim or her family.

A related, but separate, charge of stalking was dismissed with leave to reinstate, pursuant to the plea.

Ehlinger admitted to reaching out to the victim on social media, after having been served with an order of protection.

"I met with the victim and her family regarding the disposition," said Walker. "All the victim wanted was for the defendant to leave her alone."

Brandon Jones
Brandon L. Jones, 28, of Sparta pleaded guilty December 4 to a reduced charge of criminal damage to property, a Class A misdemeanor.

He was ordered to pay restitution.

Jones admitted to damaging an apartment building door in Sparta August 25.

"Sometimes I joke with people that we really only need two charges in our criminal justice system, misdemeanor stupid and felony stupid," said Walker. "Damaging a door to an apartment complex seemed misdemeanor stupid to me, especially when we have money from bond to substantially pay for the damage. Therefore, we reduced the charge and will get the landlord restitution."

Perry Nesbitt
Perry J. Nesbitt, 23, of Sparta pleaded guilty December 11 to theft over \$500.

He was sentenced to three years in prison and ordered to pay restitution.

Nesbitt admitted to taking \$800 cash from the Chester Police Department October 16.

"He was to work as a confidential informant and was given the money to purchase drugs, not for his services, but was to purchase a quantity of methamphetamine with the \$800," said Walker. "However, he took off, and we did not see him until a warrant secured his arrest."

"Nesbitt has prior felonies but no prior DOC commitments. Based on his criminal records and the need to show we do not show favoritism to those who are to cooperate with law enforcement, a DOC sentence seemed necessary and appropriate."

Bradley Sronce
Bradley L. Sronce, 55, of Oakdale pleaded guilty December 11 to theft over \$500. He was sentenced to four years

in prison.

Sronce admitted to stealing a 1995 pickup truck in Coulterville September 25.

"Sronce recently served three years in prison for a similar offense and probably deserved more time," said Walker. "However, he was found in Kansas with the vehicle. Therefore, if we went to trial, we would have had to pay a Kansas state trooper to come to Randolph County and testify regarding what he was told and saw. To save money, we took the plea."

Joshua Woolard
Joshua J. Woolard, 34, of Willisville pleaded guilty December 11 to unlawful possession of methamphetamine. He was sentenced to three years in prison to run concurrently with a Perry County meth-related charge.

Woolard had an additional charge of possession of meth dismissed.

He admitted to possessing fewer than five grams of meth located during an April 7 traffic stop by a Randolph County sheriff's deputy.

Woolard had no prior history before the April 7 incident. However, he was later arrested in Perry County for an offense and another offense in Randolph County.

Derrick Downey
Derrick L. Downey, 33, of Chester pleaded guilty December 11 to aggravated battery. He was sentenced to 90 days in jail and probation for two years, with conditions to stay away from the victim and seek counseling for mental health and substance abuse issues.

Downey admitted to causing bruising on the back of a boy under age 13, the son of his girlfriend, July 28 in Chester.

Travis Lailer
Travis L. Lailer, 26, of Chester was sentenced December 11 to 30 months of probation following a sentencing hearing.

Lailer had previously pleaded guilty to criminal damage to property regarding an incident occurring September 12 near Chester.

During the sentencing hearing, the state requested a term of two years in prison, with a boot camp recommendation.

Lailer successfully argued for a term of probation. He was incarcerated from the date of the offense to the time of his sentencing.

"Lailer pleaded guilty to damaging a driveway by doing an excessive burnout on the driveway," said Walker. "Evidence at the sentencing hearing showed he did not have a driver's license and was likely under the influence of alcohol."

"Furthermore, evidence showed Lailer had been on probation as recently as last year for burglary. Based on all of this, we did not feel probation was appropriate."

These cases were heard by Judges Richard Brown and Gene Gross.

Items confiscated

State issues roundup of deer season violations

Citations and warnings were issued during deer season.

More than 1,800 citations and warnings were issued during the recent firearm deer hunting season in Illinois.

Conservation police enforced wildlife laws and hunting regulations in the form of 971 written warnings and 831 citations for hunting-related violations statewide from November 13 through December 4.

Officers seized 16 firearms from violators, along with more

than 430 pounds of deer meat, eight deer antlers/skulls, five deer heads, one truck, one utility vehicle, as well as archery equipment, tree stands, trail cameras, bait samples, permits, illegal drugs and drug paraphernalia.

"Our conservation police officers want hunters to be safe," said Rafael Gutierrez, chief of the IDNR conservation police. "We remind (hunters) to make sure their elevated tree stands are secure and in good working order and that they always use

a fall arrest system harness to be as safe as possible when hunting.

"We also want poachers and other violators to know that our officers are in the field with them, and violators will face charges if they are hunting illegally."

Hunters checked in more than 80,000 deer during the season.

Only four hunting-related accidents were reported, three of them involving injuries from tree stand falls, according to Illinois Department of Natural Resources conservation police.

A tale of two stories

As I sat in the Old Firehouse Event Center in West Frankfort last Thursday and listened to a New York Times reporter discuss a situation she'd written about in February when an undocumented alien was arrested by immigration officials and supported by many in his community, I thought, *I've heard this story sometime, somewhere before.*

Then it occurred to me that I'd written about a very similar situation myself in 1974 when I was a reporter for the Daily & Sunday Herald in Roanoke Rapids, North Carolina.

The Times headlined Monica Davey's article: He's a Local Pillar in a Trump Town. Now He Could Be Deported.

The subject of her article was a man named Carlos who had entered the United States sometime in the 1990s and started, but never completed, an application for citizenship. Davey wrote that his effort: ... stalled somewhere along the way. Some call him a symbol of the many undocumented immigrants who are threatened by the Trump administration's promised crackdown but who have contributed to their communities.

At his trial, Ernest had character references from his plant supervisor and coworkers, a realtor, a nurse and a dentist, all of whom said they considered him reliable and trustworthy.

When he escaped, Ernest had served two years and seven months of a 15-year sentence for assault with intent to commit rape. (He told me he was innocent of that charge.)

The judge added two years to Ernest's original sentence but suspended the new sentence on condition Ernest not break any penal rules for five years.

The Herald headlined mine: Captured Prison Escaper Hopes For Better Life Now. It was about a man named Ernest who escaped from Caledonia Prison in Halifax County and eluded authorities for nearly five years. Under a false name, he lived in Chesterfield County, Virginia, held a job, bought a house and married.

Carlos and Ernest each made many friends in their communities. Many West Frankfort residents said Carlos, who managed a Mexican restaurant in that town, was a model citizen.

During Thursday's program, Mayor Tom Jordan recalled that Carlos had supported the fire department, law enforcement, the local high school and other charities.

On the negative side, Carlos had two DUI convictions in 2007. (He told the Times he's since quit drinking.)

Carlos is free on bond while his case is pending.

Cindy Buys, an immigration law specialist and associate dean of the SIU School of Law, told those who attended the West Frankfort forum that immigration courts are backlogged. She said standing in the community is one factor officials

"I know what (the Knops) said (in the meeting), and I know that can change in a heartbeat," Mulholland said.

Don Craven, an attorney from Springfield and media law expert who represents newspapers within the Illinois Press Association, said this exemption probably did not fit.

"There has to be a reasonable probability that there will be litigation," Craven said.

While the board was meeting in closed session, the Knops gave the County Journal a couple of examples of issues they have had with their daughter at the school.

"They said that Adelynn has described incidents of students taunting her, even going as far as holding peanut products in her face.

Last year, when Adelynn was in third grade, the class was studying the Chinese New Year, and one of the students brought in peanuts. Because of the peanuts, Adelynn had to sit in the hallway while the class finished its project.

"Kids asked if she was in trouble," Stephanie said.

Stephanie said she doesn't blame Adelynn's teachers and even went as far as to say that her current teacher is Adelynn's biggest advocate at the school.

Chad has also had to resort to taking Adelynn to school instead of her riding the bus, because she had been the subject of taunts from other students on the bus.

Stephanie said she fears the perceived lack of protections for Adelynn, especially since she and Chad both work so far away, Stephanie for the Illinois Department of Transportation office in Carbondale and Chad for Metrolink in St. Louis.

Additionally, she said Steelville does not have a school nurse on staff.

She also said she would hate for anyone on the school board to think that she is against them.

"I know every single one of (the board members) in there," Stephanie said. "I don't want to make a stink."

However, she said it has come to a point that something has to be done.

"I've given them five years to have a plan,"

she said.

During the closed session, the board called the Knops into the board room to finish the discussion privately.

While the County Journal was not allowed to hear that discussion, Stephanie informed the newspaper of what was discussed.

She said the board had decided to send home a letter to parents informing them of the peanut allergy, and that fourth-grade students bringing snacks to school would be the subject of a search to make sure that none of the snacks contained peanut products.

Stephanie said the board members did not seem to be aware of her daughter's peanut allergy, even though her Section 504 Plan requires school administration to be notified.

"They were all dumbfounded," she said.

Mulholland said she had informed the board of Adelynn's allergy. However, there have been new board members elected to serve on the board since the plan was put in place.

Mulholland said she informed the board members prior to the meeting that the issue would be discussed.

While applying the peanut rules to one classroom may be a viable option for this school year, Stephanie said that when Adelynn enters fifth grade next year, she will start switching classrooms for different subjects.

As a fourth-grader, Adelynn still does go to the computer lab and library. When she is in the computer lab, Stephanie said the school is required to give her antiseptic wipes to clear her area of any potential contaminants.

"According to my 9-year-old, that's not happening," she said.

Stephanie said she wishes there was more education about peanut allergies available to the students. Education on the risks could prevent some students from teasing Adelynn about her allergy, which is something she can't control.

She said her daughter worries that the increased rules surrounding her allergy will only intensify teasing at school.

"She told me, 'Mom,

they're already teasing me at school. They're already blaming me as the reason they can't bring snacks in,'" Stephanie said.

However, Mulholland said other students teasing Adelynn would not be tolerated.

"That would be dealt with as a bullying issue," Mulholland said.

All in all, Stephanie said she is glad Mulholland and the board took the time to listen to her about this issue.

"I just wish they would be more proactive," Stephanie said. "I think they could be more aggressive. I think they are taking this lightheartedly, but this is a lot more than that for our family."

Mulholland said she, too, hopes to come to a resolution that benefits everyone.

"Myself and the school want the same things that (Adelynn's parents) want," Mulholland said. "The piece that's difficult to control is what other people do."

"There are procedures and precautions you can take, but we're not going to search and seize every student every day."

In speaking with other schools in the area, the County Journal has found they mostly deal with peanut allergies on a case-by-case basis.

Tim Lochhead, principal of Chester Grade School said the school handles each student's case individually. He said the school has placed educational posters around the school about allergies, and the school's electronic database flags students with food allergies so the cooks and other staff can be made aware of the issue at every turn.

"Our cooks are especially made well aware of each child," Lochhead said.

He also said the school nurse makes a point to educate those handling students with allergies about the risks and procedures for managing that student's health and that the severity varies greatly.

"We've even made entire wings of the school nut free," Lochhead said.

However, the more drastic measures such as that are only put into place if a student has a severe allergy.

Sandy Jackson, the nurse at Sparta Lin-

coln School, said Lincoln also has a database that flags students with food allergies, so staff can be aware of their condition.

Jackson said the first thing she does when a student has an allergy is notify the teacher.

Jackson said that, generally, peanuts are not allowed in any classroom in the school.

"If Sparta were to have a severe student, we would designate a table for them, and they could have a friend sit with them as long as that friend doesn't have any peanut products in their lunch," Jackson said.

While Steelville does not have a nurse on site, Mulholland said at least six staff members in the school are trained to use the Epi Pen each year. Furthermore, she said the school staff is made well aware of Adelynn's allergy, although there is no electronic database such as in Sparta or Chester.

"It's called face-to-face communication," Mulholland said. "They have the list, and they are aware."

Some school districts, such as Mount Vernon, have gone completely nut free.

According to information obtained from the Mount Vernon website, the school has banned all peanut or tree nut products from school lunches or even lunches brought from home.

The school's website states: Food allergies are on the rise and can cause severe, systemic, potentially fatal allergic reaction called anaphylaxis in allergic individuals. Peanut and tree nut allergies account for most fatal and near-fatal anaphylactic reactions. Allergic individuals can experience anaphylaxis if they touch, inhale or ingest even the slightest trace or residue of the allergen.

Symptoms include impaired breathing, swelling in the throat and sudden drop in blood pressure, according to the American College of Allergy, Asthma and Immunology.

Stephanie described the first time Adelynn had a reaction at age 2, when she bit into a Snickers.

"She spit the candy back into my hand and started clawing at her throat," she said.

"Most kids would never say they want shoes over toys," Zeidler said, "but if they want shoes, we're going to get them shoes."

Zeidler was asked what he thought about this program and the opportunity to provide for these kids.

"It's completely awesome," he said, looking down at the little girls as they picked out their new shoes.

Wolff said, aside from getting to provide a better Christmas for these kids, he sees an opportunity to build

relationships between the police officers and the next generation of the community.

The LST 325, which is a decommissioned United States landing ship tank, will dock at Chester September 6-10 and will coincide with the Popeye Picnic.

"We're looking forward to it," Page said.

Brian Congiardo, a member of the Military Vehicle Preservation Association SEMO Chapter, said the different organizations that sent in letters went a long way with the MVPA.

"This will be a unique event," Congiardo said. "They were really pleased the last time they were here. It's rare for them to come to a city this size even once. They are looking forward to coming back."

The approximately 330-foot-long LST was at the Chester riverfront in September 2011. The vessel was one of 1,051 LSTs built during World War II. It is the last fully operational LST in the United

States.

In 2011, 7,500 people attended the daily tours offered on the ship.

In other news, Page said he will be meeting with a representative from the Illinois comptroller's office December 21.

Page said he plans to talk to the representative about the Menard Correctional Center budget and the state's unpaid water, sewer and gas bills.

Chester is still owed \$1,054,203 from Menard, according to Page.

"This is not Menard," Page said. "This comes out of the comptroller's office."

The council approved an ordinance authorizing the agreement to terminate the reciprocal lease agreement with Southern Illinois Sand Company and enter into a new lease agreement.

Alderman Ray Allison voted no on the motion.

Allison cited one sentence in the agreement, where it stated the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and Coast Guard shall not be allowed to dock at Southern Illinois Sand Company

real estate.

"I would like to see that sentence deleted," Allison said. "I don't agree with it."

The land in question is near the boat ramp, according to city attorney Jeff Kerkhaver.

Kerkhaver said the Corps and Coast Guard could tie up on the city's other property.

Kerkhaver explained that Chester entered into an agreement in 1985 with Southern Illinois Sand that gave the company rights to dock on city property. At that time, Chester used Illinois Department of Natural Resources funds to build the boat ramp.

The council ratified action of the gas committee to purchase gas futures for January and February.

For January, Alderman Dan Ohlau said the cost of gas is \$2.64 per unit, which is down from the \$3.93 price it was in January 2017.

"We don't see January gas this inexpensive often," Ohlau said.

Zane Wallace and Caleb Golding were approved to attend the full-time police academy.

W'ville discusses fees for turning water back on

In November, the Willisville Town Board discussed an ordinance that would have set a \$250 fee to restore water service after regular working hours to a customer who had his water shut off for non-payment of the bill.

Of the \$250 to be paid, \$100 would go to the town worker who performed the work.

However, resident Lonnie Fulkerson raised a question as to the legalities of paying a worker more than time-and-a-half overtime.

As it turned out, Fulkerson was right.

At this month's meeting Tuesday night, the matter was discussed again.

Attorney Aaron Atkins said payment to employees must be commensurate with the town's costs, and a court would probably not uphold such a payment system.

The board decided to forego the ordinance and require that customers who don't pay their bills on time and get their service shut

off will have to pay their bill and all fees due during the next business day to get service restored. There will be no after-hours service.

The board agreed.

There was some confusion about action last month on the hobby animal ordinance, which allows residents to keep animals such as chickens and rabbits.

Atkins said he thought the ordinance was tabled last month. The County Journal story last month also indicated that no action had been taken.

However, the board minutes from last month indicated it had been passed.

"I don't really remember," said Mayor Clarence Warner.

As it stands, the ordinance is law.

In other action, the board agreed to give maintenance worker Daltyn Becker a \$1 an hour raise to \$9.50.

Warner said before the next meeting, the board should be thinking about a possible water rate increase.

Kinkaid raised it rates to the town months ago.

The stop sign ordinance will be amended for action next month. It will include new signs on Harris, Dolce, Alms and Birch streets and Reiman Drive.

Gary Hayden was named as the new zoning board president.

Police officer Austin Dyer reported on a ticket he wrote in November.

Dyer said some residents had a boarder, Carrie Bunton, they wanted to leave their house. There were some disputes, and Dyer was called to the house more than once.

Finally Bunton moved out. She wanted police to go back to the house and make sure her property was safe while she moved other items.

Dyer went back where the homeowners were moving Bunton's belongings, and he allegedly found a cannabis pipe.

Bunton was given a ticket for possession of cannabis paraphernalia.

Tilden plans to clean up

Tilden should soon have its plan of attack for a trailer it is attempting to clean up in town.

Mayor Jeff Zimmermann, still filling in for Curtis Forcum, reported at the town's December 19 board meeting that the owner of the trailer has two options.

Zimmermann said a letter has been sent to the owner asking him to sign over the deed of the trailer to the town.

If the owner does not choose that option, Zimmermann said the town will go through the legal system to claim the right to clean up the trailer then put a lien on the property.

The trailer is located at 651 N. Railroad Street.

"Hopefully, he'll sign it over to us," Zimmermann said.

In other news, Tilden received a good report from Tim Allgire of Testing Analysis and Control of Swansea in regards to the town's lagoon.

Zimmermann said Allgire noted that the lagoon is in pretty good shape. Allgire will send a full report to the town with suggestions of how to make the lagoon still better and

last longer.

Board member Jerry Laramore reported that he issued four written and one verbal warnings for code violations.

He said most people in town will clean up what needs taken care of when they receive a notice, but there are about three people who are written up consistently.

Laramore said he is slow to issue tickets, but he might have to get the process moving.

Board member Kevin Holliday said he is working to fix the POW flag at the cemetery.

Zimmermann said that by next spring, the town might need to get a new hydrant in front of the water tower.

The current hydrant has been broken for quite some time. He said everything could be fixed for under \$1,000.

Board member Preston Glodo said he contacted the Department of Transportation about the possibility of a crosswalk by the library.

Glodo said he was told that the DOT normally will do this if there are at least 100 people who cross the street per day.

While that is not the case in Tilden, Glodo

said there are some provisions that could allow Tilden to get a crosswalk for the area.

Board member Jessica Lea said since she last reported on lights getting broken out and adults sleeping at the park, that issue has gone away.

Lea purchased a camera that can take a picture every 10 seconds. She said she is working on figuring out the best place to put it at the park.

The board held off attempting to turn over zoning board matters to the county.

Zimmermann said he is still waiting to see if anybody in town is interested in taking over the zoning board.

"It will not be an easy process either way," Zimmermann said. "We need to exhaust all of our efforts in town."

Glodo said he recently spoke with Forcum. Glodo said Forcum is adamant about giving zoning responsibility back to the county.

The board passed its tax levy ordinance. The total amount levied is \$64,700, with total appropriations at \$724,100.

The board also passed a sexual harassment prohibition ordinance.

Chester committee talks about old school building

Not sitting on enough for the \$6 million needed

To renovate or to build?

That is a decision the Chester school board could have to make down the road in regards to the 1925 section of Chester High School.

Superintendent Brian Pasero met December 15 with facility committee members Dan Colvis and Trent Vasquez to discuss the high school, grade school and new land the district purchased earlier this year.

"It goes without saying, the concern is the 1925 building," Pasero said. "My understanding is there is upkeep being done, but there is no getting around the age of the building."

Pasero cautioned that there are no plans in place to do anything drastic with the facilities, but it is important to lay out a plan of attack and figure out the biggest needs of the district.

"I don't think anything will be in the near future, but we need to start having these discussions," Pasero said. "We don't want to be caught without a plan. These are just conversation starters and gives us a starting point."

Pasero noted that the district is on the 2004 Construction Grant waiting list, but that grant has been suspended until further notice.

The district could receive \$2.29 million through the grant, with \$762,000 matching funds from the district—if the grant is ever rewarded.

"Thirteen years later, though, costs have gone up, and that wouldn't pay for (the facility) we currently have," Pasero said.

With the 1925 section of the high school being three stories tall, Pasero cited a project that Crab Orchard recently did when it tore down a three-story building

and replaced it with a one-story facility. He said that project cost around \$6 million.

Pasero also noted that the Chester Grade School gymnasium alone was \$5.87 million.

"If we wanted to replace the whole (1925 section), it would cost more," Pasero said. "Our current bonding ability is not close to being able to do that."

Pasero said some factors the state considers in regards to the construction grant are natural disasters, over crowding, consolidation and severe and continuing health and life safety matters.

"With roof leaks that occurred, it makes you wonder what it looks like inside of the beams," Vasquez said.

Pasero went on to say the state also considers special legislation and renovation.

"I don't know how easy it is to pass legislation to increase bond limits to help cover costs," Pasero said. "In regards to renovation, we've had requests to have the hallways painted for a facelift, but we still need to look at the structure itself."

The district purchased land near the high school off State Street across from the Best Western Hotel earlier this year. That land could be a potential location for a new high school building.

"I don't know what it takes to get land ready," Pasero said. "These are just options. I'm not saying we need to lean toward a new building or the other way."

The facility tax the district receives from the county could also help.

"That tax has been fantastic as far as the district is concerned," Pasero said. "It is a big bonus for general upkeep."

Pasero said that this year, the district is on pace to receive at least

\$640,000 from the tax, with \$500,000 being delegated for bond payments.

Overall, as of July, the district is sitting on around \$1.4 million in facility tax money.

"We're not sitting on enough, currently, for the \$6 million needed," Pasero said. "We're not there yet for a new building for what we have saved and our bonding ability. It is not too far away, though, to talk about what we're interested in, whether that is to renovate or build a new building."

"I will continue to investigate and look for the best route for the overall benefit of our students."

The group agreed that renovating definitely needs to be investigated to see whether the district could save money when the time comes.

Colvis added that it could be wise to have Baysinger Architects of Marion look at the steel structures of the 1925 section and come back to the district with suggestions and recommendations.

"That could give us options to look at down the road," Colvis said.

Colvis also noted that there was an architect study on the building two or three years ago that the district should locate and work from.

"We definitely want something that will be long lasting," Pasero said.

In regards to the grade school, Pasero said it is in pretty good shape, and the recent HVAC replacement in the band room went well.

Pasero said he has spoken with Baysinger about getting quotes on what it would cost to replace other HVAC units in the building over time.

"I commend the county for the sales tax," Pasero said. "It is a big plus. It goes a long way with two big buildings."

Sparta will discuss SWIC dual education program

In the weeks and months ahead, the Sparta school board and administrators will be discussing a dual education program with Southwestern Illinois College.

High School Principal Scott Beckley brought up the subject at the December 14 school board meeting.

Beckley said the program would be open to as many as 12 high school students who could earn high school and college credit at the same time and receive an associate degree with their high school diplomas.

The students would attend a SWIC campus for two years starting with their junior year. Beckley said the program could begin next school year.

College tuition would be \$4,800 per student per the two-year program.

There will be a lot to discuss before any program begins, according to Beckley.

He said he had no idea how many Sparta students would be involved in the program, which is already offered in Chester, Steeleville, Red Bud and Coulterville.

In other news from the meeting, the board approved the tax levy in the amount of \$3.8 million plus \$795,000 for bond and interest needs.

trict was approved in the amount of \$44,632.

The board approved a December 29 overnight trip to Decatur for the high school wrestling team.

Evansville Principal Jayson Baker said his school conducted a successful active shooter drill with the help of the sheriff's office.

Lincoln Principal Amy Price noted that the school had donated more than 1,600 canned goods for the Delta Theta Sorority's food basket program.

Superintendent Gabe Schwemmer announced her shout out people for the month.

From the high school, they are Dan Langwith, who donates many items to the schools, and student Kayla Cowell; from Evansville, parent Pat Frazier and

student Zach Cheek; from Lincoln, Steve Walker, a school mentor, and student Evan Schulein.

The board said the Illinois Empower pilot program will try to find money for the district to hire consultants.

With the program, the high school could have a 2 p.m. dismissal two days a month, so teachers could have collaboration time.

Smysor trust money used to upgrade Ava diamond

A \$10,000 grant from the Elizabeth A. Smysor Charitable Trust has been used to completely overhaul the boys ball diamond in Ava.

The project will help keep water drained from the field and provide better safety for fans and players.

The project began with the donation of 25 tons of clay dirt by Casey and Jaime Lodge and material for the warning track donated by Kinkaid Stone.

The dirt and material were hauled by Brad Heins and Heins Farms, and Trico Little League board volunteers leveled it. Mike Reiman donated a tractor and tiller to work the clay fill.

Next, 100 tons of Dura Edge red crushed brick and golf course sand

With lots of other donations, volunteer hours

were added. That mixture enables the field to drain quickly and reduces rainouts of ball games, usually allowing play within two hours following a one-inch rain.

A warning track has been added as a water buffer to hold material on the field and keep it from eroding.

A 62-foot retaining wall four blocks high was added for the back-

stop. That labor was donated by Sid, Tom, Mike, Greg and Michael Rathert.

Fencing was replaced with a 7-foot-high chain link fence to protect fans from foul balls.

The dugouts were refurbished and have been deepened by two feet.

Sod was replaced around the entire perimeter, and A&I Electrical donated labor to move electric wiring for the scoreboard.

Garrett Thies, Jacob Lodge, Kaden Wilson, Kanon Wilson, Loren Eggemeyer and John Rees were among those who helped with the overall project.

A night to remember

Bollman 3-ball lifts Chester over Trico in triple overtime

It was a night that will not soon be forgotten for those in attendance or listening on the radio.

The players of the Chester and Trico high school boys basketball teams went blow for blow for four quarters then three overtime periods in a game filled with high-end must-see drama that included a dunk to force the last overtime and a huge late 3-pointer.

In the end, it was the visiting Yellow Jackets who emerged victorious, topping the Pioneers 73-70 in an emotional affair that was not decided until the final buzzer sounded.

"I think it just goes to show how tough we were when it came down to it," said Chester coach Brad Norman. "They were just kind of refusing to lose. It seemed like we put ourselves in a hole each overtime and had to come back. We continued to come back and come back in situations we hadn't been in yet. That was really neat and cool to go through that process and see how they would respond."

On a night when many heroes had the chance to emerge, it was Drake Bollman who delivered what turned out to be the largest dagger of the night.

The score was tied at 68 with under a minute to play in the third overtime.

Trico's Nick Compton stole a Jake Haberberger pass near the top of the key and raced to the other end for a bucket to put the Pioneers in the lead, 70-68.

Haberberger pushed the ball back up the floor, penetrated into the lane and whipped the ball to the left corner to an awaiting Bollman.

In one fluid motion, Bollman calmly fired away from beyond the 3-point arc and buried the 3-pointer with just under 20 seconds to play to pull the Yellow Jackets ahead, 71-70.

"What was really cool about it was the composure he had after he hit it," Norman said. "A timeout was called later, and in the timeout, he wasn't worried about celebrating. He was much more worried about what we needed to do to get a stop. He works hard. He deserved that moment."

Following the Bollman 3-pointer, Trico ran back up the court at Chester.

Compton drove the lane and tossed up a driving right-handed runner that rimmed out, and Haberberger pulled down the re-

Trico girls basketball recovers to hold off Sparta, 42-36

All wins are not created equal.

Trico made under 50 percent of its free throws and less than 30 percent of its field goals December 14, but Myah Kelley led the Pioneers with 13 points; and Trico used a 10-1 fourth-quarter run to defeat Sparta, 42-36, at home in a nonconference prep girls basketball clash.

"We're definitely going to spend some practice time shooting some free throws," said Trico coach Tyler Coleman. "It wasn't pretty at the line tonight. Overall, we've been getting our butts kicked a little bit in the strong conference we play in, so I was pretty happy to have this game tonight where we could compete, and our girls did just enough to win."

Trico made only 18-of-43 free throws, 8-of-22 in the second half, and connected on just 26 percent of its field goals.

Sparta, though, did not fare much better, as the Lady Bulldogs made 22 percent of their shots and suffered through foul trouble.

Five Sparta players, four of whom were starters, fouled out of the game.

"I was happy with the team overall," said Sparta coach Grace Hernandez. "We just have to work on last-minute game time situations. It didn't help that we had five girls foul out with just 10 on the team. Then, I was relying on freshmen to play up a level, though they did pretty good and kept the score about where it was."

Sparta trailed by as many as seven points, 30-23, late in the third quarter before mounting a comeback against Trico.

The Lady Bulldogs went on an 8-0 run, spanning to the 6:07 mark of the fourth quarter to grab a 31-30 lead, their first advantage since they led 2-0 in the first quarter.

During the run, Alacyia Williams scored four points, including a right hook to put Sparta ahead.

Amyia Henry scored a bucket in transition during the stretch for two of her game high 18 points, 14 of which came in the first half before Trico switched from its 2-3 zone defense into a box-and-one on her.

"We gave up the 14 points (to Henry) in

the first half, and she killed us," Coleman said. "When we switched to the box-and-one, that was the whole key. We found a way to shut her down and take Sparta's only scorer out of it and force the other girls to beat us. That was the key to the win tonight."

The Pioneers answered Sparta's run with a 10-1 stretch of their own to take a 40-32 advantage with 1:36 remaining.

Izzy Pierceall got the key stretch started with a driving score. Kristyn Reiman then scored back-to-back buckets on the right block, receiving perfect passes from Pierceall and Juhle Prange.

"We had four girls on the floor with four fouls, and they didn't want to foul out of the game, so they were kind of stepping back and letting girls shoot layups," Hernandez said. "I understand wanting to play, but we have to actually play while we're out there. That hurt us and let (Trico) get that jump on us. You still have to play defense."

Trico finished off the run with a pair of Kelley free throws, and Megan Wettig made a foul shot.

"(Sparta) was in foul trouble pretty much the whole game," Coleman said. "I just told the girls you have to be more aggressive. We let them back in the game because we stopped applying pressure. When we started attacking again and our guards started to

lead late in the first quarter after Kelley connected on a pair of free throws. She scored seven points in the opening quarter and 10 in the first half, including a pair of 3-pointers.

"(Kelley) had a heck of a game," Coleman said. "She was ready to attack and shoot. She had a few games where she struggled at the beginning of the season, but in every game she is building confidence. She's looking better and better each time."

Sparta's shooting woes were apparent from the start, as the Lady Bulldogs made just 2-of-11 shots in the first quarter, including 1-of-8 from behind the arc.

Not possessing a true post player, Sparta did not stray from its strategy and continued to fire away at will against the Trico defense.

"I don't have any sort of false thoughts that we have a post player on the team," Hernandez said. "If Shawna (Smith) gets the ball in there, she has some moves and can go up, but as a shooter, you keep shooting until the shots drop."

"Amyia got a couple to fall after that. She kind of got shut down at the end, but you can't score if you can't shoot. I would rather

take that than a turnover in the paint. We'll take what we can get."

Henry did bury a 3-ball to cut the Sparta deficit to 10-7, and the Lady Bulldogs trailed 12-8 after one quarter.

time expired. "We went into half-time up by one point, and I told coach (Daron) Meyerhoff we need to be thinking about end of game situations," said Trico coach Dan King, who was filling in for Andrew Wilson, who missed the game for his grandmother's funeral. The two stalwarts behind the Red Bud resurgence are seniors guard Griffin Ziebold and forward Alex Birchler.

"It's just been a lot of heart and soul with them," Crusier said. "When they get the fire in their belly, start rolling and feeling good about themselves, you have to go to them and utilize that. Hopefully, the other guys have picked up on that."

"We've put together some pretty good fourth quarters this year, and those two guys have pretty much been the glue. There might have been times where they have felt frustrated during the game, but at the end of the game, we usually lean on them, and they keep us together and are able to make the big play. I've been pleased with them so far."

The duo is no stranger to one another, as they have both been standouts for a Musketeer football team that has made the post-season the past two years, with Ziebold at quarterback and Birchler at receiver.

"(The chemistry) is huge," Ziebold said. "Just to be able to trust a guy to be able to pass it to him and know he will go finish for you and know when he has the ball in his hands, he can make something happen."

"Our other guys are stepping up and scoring points to, but when you look at Alex, with as big and athletic as he is, it's a confidence booster when you pass him the ball."

The last two years on the football field, Birchler has accounted for nearly 1,500 receiving yards from the arm of Ziebold.

This year, on the basketball court, the pair has combined to average 26 points, 10 rebounds and four steals per game.

Both players credited the team's defensive play as a key for the fast start to the season.

"Our defensive presence has really stood out," Ziebold said. "We have a lot of length on the defensive end, and that makes it tougher for a bigger team that can also drive the ball. Our offense has struggled a little bit, but our defense keeps us in games, and we have found ways to score enough points to win."

Red Bud has held teams to just 41.4 points per game this season and has held opponents under 40 points four times.

"Just playing defense the way we have so far has stood out," Birchler said. "We have more chemistry this year, too. Last year, we were pretty young and had a lot of juniors playing. This year, we've just kind of come together as a team."

Of Red Bud's three losses, one came to Steeleville at the Trico/Murphysboro tournament when Birchler was on a football recruiting trip.

With Birchler back in the lineup the following week, the Musketeers beat Steeleville on the Warriors' home floor for a big early season Kaskaskia Division victory.

Wesclin and Harrisburg have dealt Red Bud its other two losses, and both of those teams have just one loss to their names.

The last time the Musketeers won more than seven games in a season before January was in 2006, when Red Bud ultimately went 18-14 and advanced to a regional title game.

Red Bud will play at Freeburg Friday for a chance at win number eight, which would equal the total amount of victories the Musketeers had last season.

"Freeburg is no slouch," Ziebold said. "Our biggest thing is to go there and compete, let our defense keep us in the game and hope whenever the buzzer sounds that our offense is good enough to win."

"It's not what we want, but if we come out with losses (against Wesclin and Freeburg) but know we can compete against good 2A and 3A schools, that will be a big confidence booster."

"If we have any kinks, they will definitely be exploited, so we'll know what we need to work on."

"The prices are very close

to past years," said Mike Riebeling, county engineer. "There was a slight uptick in rock cost."

There was a third bid of \$26,970 from Beelman for Road District 4 that was rejected because the bid should not have included the cost of rock.

The board approved the appellate prosecutor resolution, which helps the county in regards to appeals.

Quarterly board meeting dates were set through March, to start at 9 a.m. January 12 and 26, February 9 and 23 and March 9 and 23.

Commissioner Marc Kiehna said interviews with five applicants for the administrator position at the Randolph County Care Center were scheduled for December 18 and 19.

"We believe they're strong (candidates)," Kiehna said. "We look forward to meeting them in person and seeing what they have to offer."

Administrator Ken Slavens will retire in January.

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 17-06 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE VII: TRAFFIC; CHAPTER 70: GENERAL PROVISIONS; BY CREATING SUBSECTION GOLF CARTS & UTILITY-TERRAIN VEHICLES; CODE OF ORDINANCES CITY OF SPARTA, ILLINOIS

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Sparta, Randolph County, Illinois:

Section 1: That Title VII: Traffic; Chapter 70: General Regulations; be amended by adding subsection Golf Carts & Utility-Terrain Vehicles as follows:

"CHAPTER 70: GENERAL PROVISIONS Section

- 70.01 Adoption of Illinois Vehicle Code by reference
- 70.02 Zones of quiet
- 70.03 No turning signs and turning markers
- 70.04 Location of city parking control signs
- 70.05 Use of roller skates, coasters or similar devices
- 70.06 Squealing or screeching tires
- 70.07 Driving on closed or barricaded streets prohibited

- Golf Carts & Utility-Terrain Vehicles
- 70.10 Generally
- 70.11 Definitions
- 70.12 Requirements
- 70.13 Permits
- 70.14 Violations

- Parades
- 70.20 Definitions
- 70.21 Permit required

Golf Carts & Utility-Terrain Vehicles § 70.10 GENERALLY.

Golf carts and utility-terrain vehicles, as defined and qualified herein shall be allowed on City streets under the conditions as stated herein.

§ 70.11 DEFINITIONS. For the purpose of this subsection, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

GOLF CART. A vehicle specifically designed and intended for the purposes of transporting one (1) or more persons and their golf clubs or maintenance equipment while engaged in the playing of golf, supervising the play of golf or maintaining the condition of the grounds on a public or private golf course.

UTILITY-TERRAIN VEHICLE. A self-propelled, electronically powered four wheeled motor vehicle or a self-propelled gasoline powered four wheeled motor vehicle with an engine displacement under one thousand two hundred (1,200) cubic centimeters which is capable of attaining in one (1) mile a speed more than twenty (20) miles per hour but not more than twenty-five (25) miles per hour and which conforms to the federal regulations under Title 49 C.F.R. Part 571.500.

CITY STREETS. Any of the streets within the boundaries of the City of Sparta.

§ 70.12 REQUIREMENTS. All persons wishing to operate a golf cart or an utility-terrain vehicle on the City streets must ensure compliance with the following requirements:

- (A) Proof of current liability insurance.
- (B) Must be certified with the City and have the vehicles inspected by the Police Chief or designated representative as provided in Section 70.13.
- (C) Must display City decal on the rear of the vehicle.
- (D) Must have a current, valid Illinois driver's license.
- (E) Must be twenty-one (21) years of age.
- (F) Golf carts must be equipped as follows:
 - (1) Horn;
 - (2) Brakes and brake lights;
 - (3) Turn signals;
 - (4) A steering wheel apparatus;
 - (5) Tires;
 - (6) Rearview mirror;
 - (7) Approved "Slow Moving Vehicle" emblem on the rear of the vehicle (625 ILCS 5/12-709);
 - (8) Headlight that emits a white light visible from a distance of five hundred (500) feet to the front which must illuminate when in operation;
 - (9) Tail lamp that emits a red light visible from at least one hundred (100) feet from the rear which must be illuminated when in operation; and

(10) Any additional requirements which may be amended to 65 ILCS 5/11-1428 or the Illinois Motor Vehicle Code.

(G) Utility-Terrain Vehicles must be equipped as follows:

- (1) Brakes and brake lights;
- (2) Turn signals on the front and rear;
- (3) A steering apparatus;
- (4) Tires;
- (5) Rearview mirror;
- (6) Approved "Slow Moving Vehicle" emblem on the rear of the vehicle (625 ILCS 5/12-709);
- (7) Headlight that emits a white light visible from a distance of five hundred (500) feet to the front which must illuminate when in operation;
- (8) Tail lamp that emits a red light visible from at least one hundred (100) feet from the rear which must be illuminated when in operation; and

(9) Any additional requirements which may be amended to 65 ILCS 5/11-1428 or the Illinois Motor Vehicle Code.

(H) Must obey all traffic laws of the State of Illinois and City.

(I) Must be operated only on City streets, except where prohibited.

(J) Shall not be operated on rights-of-way (ditches), sidewalks or in City parks other than parking areas.

(K) May not be operated on streets, highways and roads under the jurisdiction of the Illinois Department of Transportation (Illinois State Route 4 and 154) or the County Highway Department except to cross at designated streets.

(L) Must not be operated in excess of posted

speed limit and, with respect to utility-terrain vehicles, may not exceed thirty-five (35) miles per hour.

(M) A person operating or who is in actual physical control of a golf cart or utility-terrain vehicle as described herein on a roadway while under the influence is subject to Section 11-500 through 11-502 of the Illinois Compiled Statutes (625 ILCS 5/11-500 - 11-502).

§ 70.13 PERMITS. (A) No person shall operate a qualified golf cart or utility-terrain vehicle without first obtaining a permit from the City Clerk as provided herein.

Permits shall be for a period of one (1) year from April 1st through March 31st and renewed annually. The fee for a permit is Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) per year. Said fee shall not be prorated.

(B) Application for a new or renewed permit shall be made on a form provided by the City Clerk, which shall include:

- (1) Name and address of the applicant;
- (2) Name of liability insurance carrier along with photocopy of insurance card specifically for the vehicle to be operated pursuant to the permit;

(3) The serial number, make, model and description of golf cart or utility-terrain vehicle;

(4) Signed Waiver of Liability by applicant releasing the City and agreeing to indemnify and hold the City harmless from any and all future claims resulting from the operation of their golf cart or utility-terrain vehicle on the City Streets; and

(5) Such other information as the City may require.

(C) Prior to issuance or renewal of a permit, the following conditions must be met:

(1) The vehicle must be inspected by the Chief of Police (or designee) to ensure that the vehicle is safe to operate on City streets and is in compliance with this subsection and with the State of Illinois Motor Vehicle Code;

(2) The applicant must provide evidence of insurance in compliance with the provisions of the Illinois Statutes regarding minimum liability insurance form passenger motor vehicles to be operated on the roads of the State of Illinois. Insurance coverage is to be verified to be in effect by the Police Department; and

(3) A physically handicapped applicant must submit a letter signed by their physician certifying that the applicant is able to safely operate a qualified golf cart or utility-terrain vehicle on City streets.

(D) The City may suspend or revoke a permit granted hereunder upon a finding that the holder thereof has violated any provision of this subsection or there is evidence that permittee cannot safely operate a qualified golf cart or utility-terrain vehicle on the designated roadways.

§ 70.14 VIOLATIONS. Any person who violates any provision of this subsection shall be subject to penalty pursuant to Section 70.99 of the Traffic Code.

Section 2: That all ordinances or any part of any ordinance in conflict with any provision of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 3: Any section or provision of this Ordinance that is construed to be invalid or void shall not effect the remaining sections or provisions which shall remain in full force and effect thereafter.

Section 4: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect commencing April 1, 2018, upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.



Pinckneyville approves two new structures in city park

There will be two new structures at the Pinckneyville city park after action by the city council at its December 11 meeting.

The American Thresherman Association presented a proposal to construct a 22x31-foot portable carport just north of the grandstand. Thresherman representatives Josh Giacomo and Tom Garner said the building would be available for other events in addition to the annual steam, gas and threshing show. Commissioner Kevin

Hicks argued that there had been talk in the past about not blocking the north end of the grandstand with buildings.

The threshermen also want to construct a second pavilion inside the race track near the Boy Scout food stand.

Commissioners Sam Peradotta said while they should not approve a large number of new buildings, this would be something that would benefit many groups.

The request to construct the buildings was approved, with Hicks casting the lone no vote.

In other notes, Chad Rushing from Raymond James asked the city council for business district tax funds to construct a new building on the town square. Rushing said the building would be a two-story structure located next to Parker Heating and Air.

Rushing added that the building would be designed to fit in with the existing buildings on the square.

The council also re-appointed Tom Bardle as a captain on the department, Curtis Miller and David Pearson as second lieutenants and Kevin Kelly and Alan McClurkin as first lieutenants.

A resolution was approved declaring two vacancies on the police department. Officers Nick McLaughlin and Jeff Thornton have accepted positions with other departments and will be leaving Pinckneyville.






