Ames Team chosen for new Chester Bridge construction

New bridge design will be cable suspension

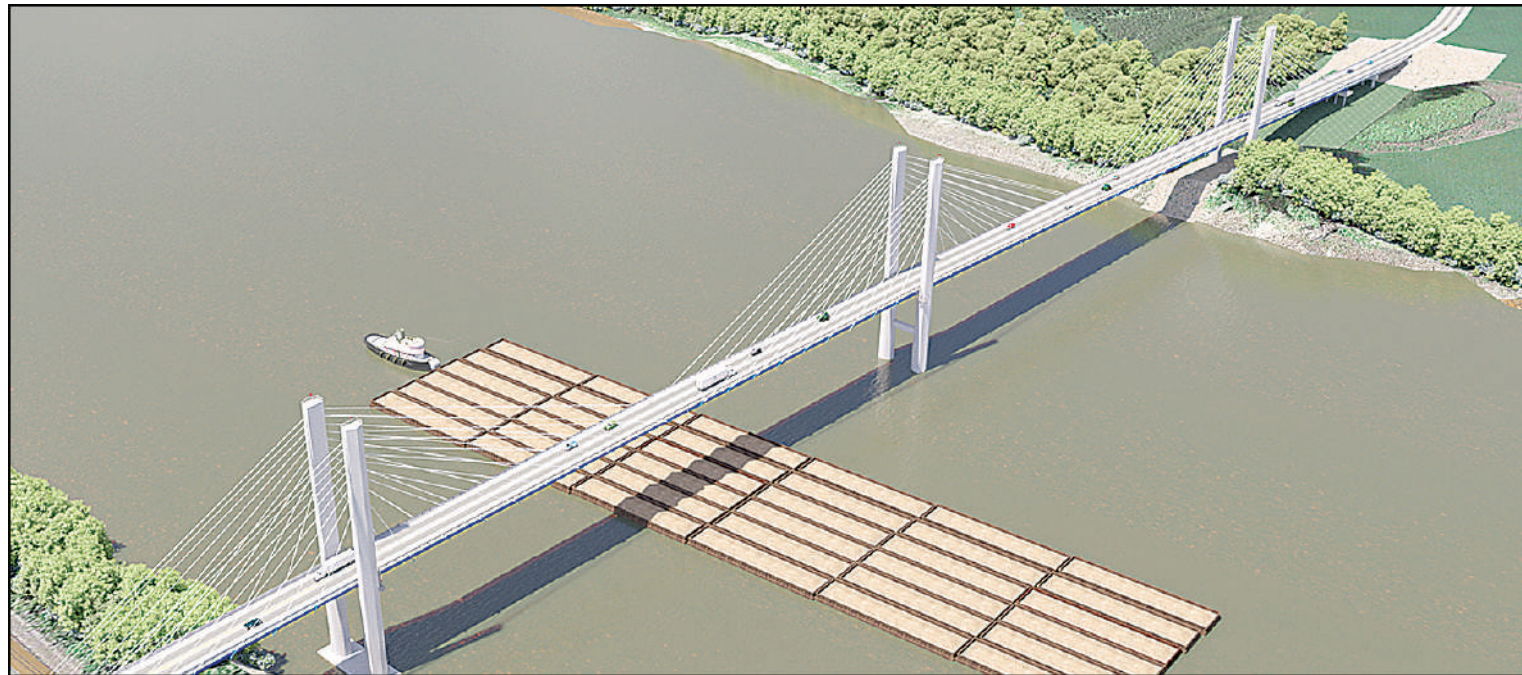
In what was likely the most anticipated development of the project to replace the Chester bridge, a contractor has been chosen, and the artist's rendering of the future bridge was released.

The Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission announced last week that it had selected the Ames Team to build the bridge.

The Ames Team is comprised of Ames Construction of Burnsville, Minnesota and Parsons Transportation Group of Downers Grove, Illinois.

The new bridge, which is a cable suspension design, will be constructed just upstream from the current bridge and will be twice as wide, according to a release from the Missouri Department of Transportation.

"This major river bridge is vital to agricultural traffic, area industries and travelers," said Brian Okenfuss.

Missouri Department of Transportation project director. "While the current bridge is safe, it is in poor condition. The new Chester Bridge will reduce the number of flood-related closures and better serve today's traffic."

"Reviewing proposals from potential design-build teams was a rigorous process, as all the teams under consideration have previously

delivered great projects."

The selected contractor team had to meet or exceed several goals, including replacing both structures—the Chester Bridge and Horse Island Chute bridge—within the project budget using durable 100-year, low-maintenance structures, providing a safe and reliable transportation solution for all modes of transportation, completing

the project no later than December 1, 2026 with the least impact to all modes of transportation and delivering the project safely while utilizing a diverse workforce.

MoDOT said the proposal from the Ames Team was deemed to be the best value to taxpayers based on the project goals. The team will construct a three-tower, cable-stayed bridge.

The new bridge will cost approximately \$284 million.

Construction is slated to begin in late summer or early fall of this year.

Traffic will continue to use the existing bridge during construction, and no long-term lane closures are expected.

The Chester Bridge was constructed in 1942 and is used by approximately 7,000 vehicles daily.



New speed zone

Drivers will need to slow down on State Route 4 in front of the Trico school campus after a new speed zone was posted. Trico Superintendent Larry Lovel said the lower speed zone had been requested a long time ago but has finally been posted by the Illinois Department of Transportation. Lovel said the purpose of the reduced speed limit is to increase awareness of the bus and parking lot entrances and remind drivers to be cautious about vehicles entering and exiting the school.

Following an approximately hour-long closed session, the board emerged to approve a separation agreement with Superintendent Gabe (Schwemmer) Rodriguez.

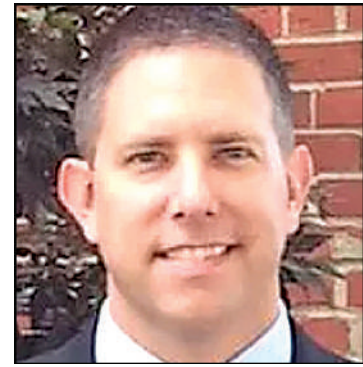
The details of the agreement have not yet been disclosed, but it appears to keep Rodriguez on the school payroll through the end of her contract, which expires June 30.

Steeleville woman dies in Bremen crash

A Steeleville woman was killed in a crash on State Route 150 last week.

According to Illinois State Police, Meggie White, 38, was eastbound on 150 March 10 at 8:21 p.m., when her vehicle ran off the right side of the road near the Mary's River Covered Bridge.

The vehicle rolled before landing upside down.

As the vehicle was rolling, both White and a 14-year-old female passenger were ejected, according to the Chester Fire Department.

White was pronounced dead at the scene.

The 14-year-old was airlifted by Arch Medical to a St. Louis hospital for treatment of serious injuries.

Another passenger, Chad Ferguson, 36, of Steeleville was taken to the Chester hospital.

An investigation into the cause of the accident is ongoing.

Marissa building new firehouse

The Marissa Fire Department could soon have a new home after a proposed project, which has been ongoing for about two years, kicked into high gear this week.

The fire department began seeking bids this week for the construction of the new firehouse.

Marissa Fire Chief Jim Perrine said the department will open bids prior to the fire district's April 12 board meeting and could accept a bid or alter the

proposal at that time.

"We'll open the bids when they come back," Perrine said. "We'll have an estimate, and we can decide to move forward with it or scale some things back."

The fire district is working with architect Quadrant Design of Waterloo on the project.

The new firehouse will total about 10,000 square feet, a big upgrade from the current facility, which is less than half of that size at 4,670 square feet.

"It's needed. We're out of

room, and it's a safety issue," Perrine said.

He explained that it is a tight squeeze to store all of the department's equipment, trucks and other vehicles.

"The current (firehouse) was built in 1976, and since then, apparatuses have only gotten bigger," Perrine said.

The construction will start on the undeveloped land adjacent to the public works building, allowing

Truck leaks fuel through Chester

Another truck leaking diesel fuel caused a big mess through Chester Sunday morning.

Marty Bert. Illinois State Police found the truck—a semi from T Squared Farms of Perryville, driven by 43-year-old Richard Darwin of Perryville—pulled over on Route 3 near the intersection with Korando Lane.

Bert said the fuel fortunately stayed mostly on the road, allowing for easier cleanup. He also said that no roads were shut down, but lane restrictions were necessary to allow the crews to work.

A tractor trailer truck began leaking the fuel somewhere across the bridge in Missouri, and the fuel was tracked on the bridge, Bridge Bypass Road in Chester, Water Street and down to State Route 3. The truck finally stopped about eight miles into Jackson County on Route 3.

The truck had a broken fuel line, which caused the leak. The truck was towed from the scene for repair.

It took firemen approximately three hours to get the diesel fuel off the road.

"I believe he stopped on his own because he ran out of fuel," said Chester Fire Chief

Bert called Missouri authorities, and the Missouri Department of Transportation used Oil-Dri to clean up the fuel on the bridge and Highway 51 in Missouri.

The incident was reported to the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency.

Chester firemen also used Oil-Dri and sand to soak up the fuel in

This is the second major diesel fuel spill in the Chester area since August 19, when another semi leaked diesel throughout town and was stopped on Route 3 south of the sewer treatment plant.

Illinois Supreme Court grants expedited appeal in assault weapons ban case

 The Illinois Supreme Court agreed this week to fast-track the state's appeal of a Macon County judge's ruling against parts of a recently passed state ban on assault weapons and high-capacity magazines.

Lawmakers passed the ban during a lame duck session in January, and Governor J.B. Pritzker signed it into law almost immediately.

The law came in response to numerous mass shootings in the United States, including at an Independence Day parade in Highland Park near Chicago last summer in which the shooter used an assault-style weapon, killing seven people and injuring dozens of others.

The new law bans the sale and manufacture of a long list of firearms defined as assault weapons, assault weapon attachments, .50-caliber rifles and .50-caliber cartridges, as well as large-capacity magazines.

The law allows people who already own such items to keep them, but it restricts their ability to sell or transfer them to someone else, and requires those owners to register them with the Illinois State Police by January 1, 2024.

The law also exempts certain people from the ban, including current and retired law enforcement officers; wardens, superintendents and keepers of state and federal prisons; members of the armed services or reserve forces while they are performing official duties or traveling to or from their places of duty; and companies that employ armed security guards at federally supervised nuclear sites.

Passage of the law prompted immediate legal challenges in both state and federal courts by gun rights advocates who said it violated both the Illinois and U.S. constitutions.

One of those suits was filed by a group of plaintiffs led by Republican state Representative Dan Caulkins of Decatur.

On March 3, Macon County Judge Rodney Forbes ruled that the exceptions to the assault weapons ban violate the equal protection clause in the Illinois Constitution as well as the special legislation clause that prohibits the General Assembly from passing a special or local law when a general law can be made applicable.

"We look forward to vigorously defending this final judgment

by Judge Forbes," Caulkins said at a news conference Wednesday. "We believe that we have the facts on our side."

That decision, the judge wrote, was based on a 5th District Court of Appeals ruling in another case in which an Effingham County judge had granted a temporary restraining order to block enforcement of the ban.

That order, however, applied only to the roughly 800 plaintiffs who were named in the case.

That case, Accuracy Firearms LLC v. Pritzker, also is on appeal before the Illinois Supreme Court.

Although the Accuracy Firearms case went through an appellate court before reaching the Supreme Court, Attorney General Kwame Raoul appealed the Caulkins case directly to the high court.

In both cases, Raoul filed motions for an expedited hearing schedule. However, on Tuesday, the court chose to take only one, accepting the Caulkins case and denying the motion in the Accuracy Firearms suit.

According to the court's order, oral arguments in the Caulkins case are scheduled to be heard sometime in May.

Unpaid fines a problem

 The city of Sparta is looking into a new way to collect past due fees and fines.

City attorney Alan Farris reported during the city council's March 13 meeting that he has had discussions with Judges Jeremy Walker and Gene Gross about using PayCourt, which is based in Taylorville, to recover delinquent fines.

Randolph County recently approved to utilize PayCourt. Farris noted that over 80 counties in the state use the system.

Farris estimated that, over the years, Sparta probably has over \$10,000 in unpaid fines.

If Sparta enters into an agreement with PayCourt, there would be no cost to the city because PayCourt earns its money through a surcharge added to the fines.

Farris said the only remedy Sparta has for past-due fees and fines is to get a warrant, which he said normally goes nowhere. He recommended that the city authorize him to look into PayCourt further, potentially bringing forth an agreement by the council's next meeting.

"This is definitely something we should look into and get more information about," said Mayor Jason Schlimme.

Commissioner Michael Kelley asked if a payment through this system would go on the person's credit report.

Farris said he believes it would be reported to a credit bureau, but there are ways for people to give explanations to credit bureaus on certain payments.

"I think this operates just like a normal collection agency," Farris said.

The council directed Farris to bring more information about PayCourt to the next meeting.

Farris said he also plans to bring this topic up at the other municipalities he represents, which are Steeleville and Coulterville.

In other news, the council approved a resolution for maintenance to appropriate \$227,122 of motor fuel tax funds for the purpose of maintaining streets and highways from April 1, 2023 through March 31, 2024.

City manager Corey Rheinecker noted that this estimate is about \$25,000 less than last year.

Now approved, these numbers will be sent to the Illinois Department of Transportation for approval.

The council approved resolutions to execute contracts with Tim Copple of T&T Lawn Ser-

vice of Steeleville for grave opening services and mowing and landscaping maintenance at Caledonia Cemetery and Old Bethel Cemetery.

The cost for a regular grave opening is \$385, pauper's grave \$275, and infant and cremation \$200.

The mowing and landscaping maintenance contract will run May 1, 2023 through April 30, 2026. T&T will be paid \$147,000 over the three years.

The council approved a resolution to authorize the city to begin negotiations with John Hamilton for a potential TIF project at the old laundromat on the south side of town at 912 South St. Louis Street.

"It's a property that is definitely in need of redeveloping," Schlimme said.

In reports, Kelley noted that projects along Miller Street are progressing. He also stated that he hopes work will start soon on the Mound Street bridge.

Fire Chief Tim Rucks reported that with the time change that occurred over the weekend, individuals with battery-operated smoke detectors should have changed the batteries in those devices.

The next meeting of the city council is Monday, March 27 at 6 p.m.

Meacham's Madness By John Meacham

From Illinois to Illifornia to Worsifornia

I am confident that the multiplied hundreds upon hundreds of millions of regular readers of this column understand why I now call the state formerly known to me as Illinois Illifornia.

If any of the multiplied dozens upon dozens of millions of irregular readers are puzzled, all they have to do is take a look at a few of the bills sponsored by members of the party of the left that are pending in the 103rd General Assembly.

I did just that recently when the Illinois Family Institute's newsletter arrived in the mail, along with IFI's list of proposed legislation to oppose and support.

I thought I knew how bad the political culture of this state was under the rule of the party that controls the executive mansion and has overwhelming majorities in the House and Senate, but I was in for a shock.

Many of the laws those representatives and senators hope to pass—and probably will—seem to me to have originated in the deepest, darkest pit of the Warm Place.

On abortion, for example, I already knew the legislature had passed and Chicago Democrat Governor J.B. Pritzker had signed what the Associated Press called sweeping abortion, gender-affirming care safeguards.

"In addition to shielding reproductive and gender-affirming health care patients and providers from legal action originating across state lines, the act will also protect the Illinois licenses of health care providers licensed in multiple states who provide treatment legal in Illinois but may cost them their license in a state where it's not," the AP reported. "The measure also prevents insurers from charging more for out-of-network care when in-network providers object to treatment on moral grounds."

That legislation was sponsored in the Senate by Chicago Democrat Celina Villanueva.

The progressives are not quite finished targeting unborn babies, though.

Chicago Democrat Representative Mary Flowers is the sponsor of three bills IFI calls alarming. HB 3, for example, removes restrictions for midwives to do abortions, prohibits disclosing drug test results on pregnant women and newborns to DCF or law enforcement and removes the portion of the neglected child definition that refers to newborns who test positive for controlled substances.

The other abortion-related Flowers-sponsored bills the IFI opposes are HB 999 and HB 1046. Leftists in the legislature are also taking aim at students, parents and the school-student-parent relationship.

Once again, Flowers is the culprit. She is the sponsor of HB 1011, about which IFI says: Flowers' bill would add to the list of laws that would require indoctrination of minors with leftist views of race and sexuality transforming government schools into woke re-education camps and children into leftists.

The IFI newsletter quotes passages from some of the books that HB 1011 would require. Suffice it to say that many of the words begin with the sixth letter of the alphabet, and IFI replaces the remaining three letters with asterisks.

Along the same lines, here's a dandy idea from another Chicago Democrat Representative, La Shawn Ford. He is sponsoring HB 29, which establishes the offense of parental bullying. Go to ilga.gov and read the description of bullying under this bill. Then tell me this bill wouldn't give left-leaning judges a club with which to pound conservative parents.

In case you think legalizing pot use was bad (or good)enough, Ford begs to differ. He is the sponsor of HB 1, which would legalize psychedelic mushrooms, LSD and other hallucinogens.

Ford is also the sponsor of HB 39 and HB 989, which allow a incarcerated prisoners to vote, to vote by mail and to have election materials provided to them.

How about HB 1286 and SB 126 from Collinsville Democrat Representative Katie Stuart and the aforementioned Sen. Villanueva? These laws would create all-gender multiple-occupancy public bathrooms—just what the world needs!

I've barely scratched the surface on proposed laws I'm sure 99.999 percent of my readers would oppose, and I haven't even mentioned any of those sponsored by the Republican Party I believe they would support.

State is second in nation for dumping

Illinois has the second highest real estate taxes in the United States, according to Wallet Hub. If you own property in the Land of Lincoln you already know that.

But what you might not know is that Illinois also claims the number two spot in the nation when it comes to illegal dumping of plain old trash and larger, unwanted items.

That's according to a recent survey of 3,000 anonymous respondents by *PestDude.com*.

Oddly enough, Illinois was beat out for the top garbage spot by the folks in Montana, which one normally associates with pristine open spaces. Plus, Montana doesn't have nearly the population that Illinois has, which should lead to less trash being generated on a per capita basis.

One only has to drive down any local road-

It's not something Illinois residents should be proud of

way to see the effects of people who are lazy and inconsiderate.

Beer cans, fast-food sandwich wrappers, empty cigarette packs and foam drink cups are just some of the nasty items people throw onto other people's frontage.

The PestDude survey tells us that the most common items to be dumped are food waste at 57 percent, followed by old mattresses (17 percent); TVs (8 percent—perhaps not surprisingly, given the rate at which TV technology improves); computers (6 percent); and furniture, washing

machines and fridge/freezers (4 percent each).

Zachary Smith, owner of *PestDude.com* notes that illegally dumped trash is a haven for all kinds of unwanted pests and vermin (and therefore, disease). Rats, mice and cockroaches are some of the most common pests that are drawn to illegally dumped trash.

These pests can breed and multiply quickly in the piles of garbage, leading to an infestation that can quickly spread to neighboring areas. Flies and other insects are also attracted to

the rotting food and waste, which can cause not only a nuisance but also health hazards, Smith says.

An astounding 81 percent of those who took the survey said they toss their trash into a dumpster that someone else pays for. That might not be ethical, but at least it keeps it out of someone else's yard or drainage ditch that they or the state mow.

We have done stories about illegal dumping on private property where items have gotten into creeks and streams. PestDude notes that 4 percent of respondents admit to dumping trash into a river, lake or stream.

We have used this space to implore local residents to not litter or commit illegal dumping. There are plenty of ways to dispose of your trash the proper way. Please do so.

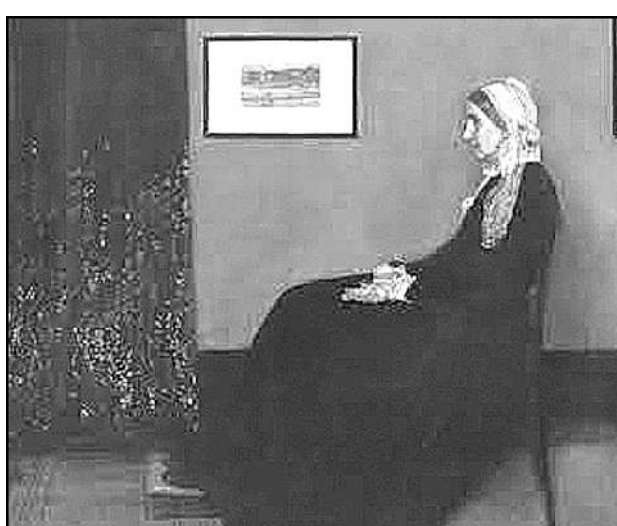
Being a non-whistler and being unable to carry a tune in a bucket, my whistling skills are nil.

Supreme Court considers SAFE-T Act

The state's highest court heard arguments Tuesday in a case that could drastically alter the legal landscape for criminal defendants who are incarcerated as they await trial.

It's the latest development in the ongoing legal challenge to the pretrial detention provisions of the SAFE-T Act criminal justice reform, which the high court put on hold in December just hours before it was scheduled to take effect.

The case pits the Illinois' attorney general, legislative leaders and the governor, who wish to uphold the pretrial detention overhaul, against state's attorneys and sheriffs representing 64 counties who say the legislature should have put a constitutional amendment to voters if they wanted to make such a change.

If the Illinois Supreme Court allows

the pretrial detention changes to take effect, judges would no longer be able to incarcerate a defendant who is awaiting trial solely because they cannot afford to post bail. The system replacing cash bail would allow a judge to order pretrial detention based on an accused person's level of risk of reoffending or fleeing prosecution.

But the law would also create a list of lower-level nonviolent offenses for which a defendant cannot be held pretrial if they are not already out on pretrial release when committing the alleged offense or proven to be a willful flight risk.

The case was appealed to the Supreme Court by the state after a Kankakee County circuit court judge ruled in December that parts of the law were unconstitutional. The court must decide whether the state's constitution gives the judiciary a right to assess cash bail and whether lawmakers overstepped

their bounds by passing a law that infringes on such a right.

The law's opponents based their claims of unconstitutionality on two references to bail in the constitution.

Section 9 states that all persons accused of crimes shall be bailable by sufficient sureties except in certain circumstances.

Section 8.1, the Crime Victims' Bill of Rights, notes a crime victim's right to safety must be considered in denying or fixing the amount of bail.

In oral arguments before the high court Tuesday, Deputy Solicitor General Alex Hemmer with the attorney general's office argued that if the circuit court's ruling is allowed to stand, it would severely limit the future authority of the General Assembly.

The high court, Hemmer argued, has consistently allowed the General Assembly to regulate pretrial practices, including by setting sentencing re-

quirements, prohibiting the use of unsecured commercial bail bonds and prohibiting detention in certain circumstances.

"We're talking about six decades of legislative regulation of pretrial practices that are all called into question by plaintiffs' expansive reading of judicial power and their narrow reading of legislative power in this area," Hemmer said.

The constitution's mention of bail and sufficient sureties don't imply a monetary nature, Hemmer argued. He said that language was derived from the state's 1818 constitution which was passed at a time when the modern monetary bail system was all but unknown.

"Bailable just meant eligible for release on those conditions imposed by a court," he said.

Hemmer added that judges maintain the authority to impose conditions of release under the new law.

In other personnel news from the March 9 school board meeting, Evansville special education teacher Judy Wright will retire at the end of the school year, and Jackie Smith and Abbey Miles were approved as academic honors banquet sponsors.

Resignations were accepted from Connor McCall as high school PE teacher, Lyndsey Nichols as Lincoln kindergarten teacher and Barry Dickerson as high school girls basketball head coach.

The board hired Zachary Hickman, junior high school

math teacher at Lincoln; Jerry Carpenter, volunteer assistant track coach at Evansville; Zac Drumwright, high school assistant baseball coach; and Brittany Tolder, high school assistant track coach.

Katherine Bostick, a second-year probationary teacher, was terminated, and the school will not re-employ her for the coming year.

At the beginning of the meeting, Miesner recognized the junior high boys basketball team, which brought home a fourth-place trophy in the state tournament and first place in the Marissa Invitational.

Miesner said the team is full of young men with great attitudes and sportsmanship.

"It was a really cool ride these guys put us on," Miesner said.

The history of the New Athens Odd Fellows lodge

The Independent Order of Odd Fellows originated in England in the 1700s. The first lodges in the United States were founded in New York City in 1806.

Where the name Odd Fellows comes from is open to debate. Some historians state it came from the odd works the early lodges performed in helping the needy. Others state the name comes from the fact that members were from many different professions. Some believe there is a religious aspect to its formation because early members were mainly Catholic.

A social organization, many of their meetings emphasized fellowship among the members.

The Odd Fellows came to New Athens in 1875, when the first lodge, Independent Order of Odd Fellows Lodge 588, was founded. There were 10 charter members with R.J. Watts chosen as the noble grand of the organization.

By 1877, the lodge had grown to 35 members. Caspar Pabst was now the noble grand of the lodge. Lodge 588 held regular monthly meetings, which were often scheduled for Saturday evenings, usually taking place in a hall attached to a local saloon or tavern.

With most of the lodge's all-male membership being of German descent, this may explain why these establishments were chosen for their meetings.

In 1885, the membership purchased a building on North Benton Street for their lodge.

That would be home to the lodge until 1911, when they purchased a building on Van Buren Street. That building was destroyed by a fire in 1918.

In December of 1920, the lodge made a major building decision. Plans called for demolition of the damaged building and erection of a two-story brick structure with a concrete basement.

The front of the building would extend from Keiner's barber shop to the Jacob Frantz residence and have a depth of 80 feet.

Residents of New Athens were excited that a new building would replace the eyesore that had sat

in disrepair since the fire. However, financing would be an issue.

Finally, in November of 1922, the lodge awarded a contract to William Feldt, a local contractor and lodge member, to build the new facility.

The lodge would have a large meeting room on the second floor and two storefronts on the main floor. A banquet area was planned for the basement. The main floor would be elevated from the street to accommodate for potential flooding from the nearby Kaskaskia River.

One interesting fixture of the new building would be the placement of a concrete emblem on the upper portion of its facade.

The emblem would feature three chain links with the letters F L T, one letter to be placed in each of the links. These letters refer to the order's motto of Friendship, Love and Truth.

The lodge was part of a regional association comprised of other local Odd Fellows lodges. This association was named the Triple Links Association and governed the regional Odd Fellows orders.

Karber's Pharmacy moved from its location two doors down to the southern storefront of the new building. Various other stores were located in the northern storefront, but those did not last.

Financing continued to be a concern for the lodge.

In October of 1927,

the lodge signed a 10-year lease with the United States Postal Service to move into the north storefront.

This was a major financial boost for the lodge.

E.J. Dittman, the financial secretary for the lodge, stated that the day was not far off when the Odd Fellows would be free from indebtedness. (New Athens Journal, October 14, 1927, Page 1)

With membership declining, the Independent Order of Odd Fellows Lodge 588 of New Athens decided to consolidate with Belleville Lodge 36 in April of 1944.

With the invention of radio and more social functions being held on Saturday evenings, the membership had been declining for some years. Losing local men to military service also hurt membership.

The post office and Karber's Pharmacy would be the storefront occupants of the building until 1965, when the post office moved into its current location on South Benton Street. After the post office relocated, Karber's Pharmacy occupied the entire first floor. Henry Kar-

ber had purchased the building from the Odd Fellows years before.

After's graduation from pharmacy college in 1952, Ron Karber, Henry's son, served in the U.S. Army before returning to New Athens to work with his father. After Henry retired, Ron took over operation in 1974.

In 1995, Karber's Pharmacy celebrated its 80th anniversary of being in business in New Athens. When Ron retired in 1998, the pharmacy closed.

The building is now owned by Gaetano and Fara Pattie and is the home of Village Pizza & Deli.

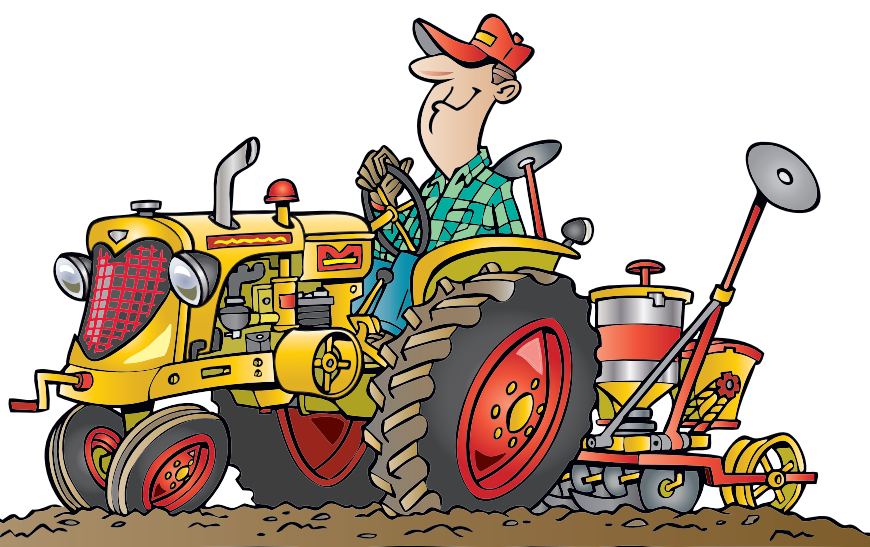

Moody's gives Illinois another credit upgrade

Moody's Investors Service announced Tuesday that it has upgraded Illinois' bond rating to A3, up from Baa1, marking the eighth credit upgrade the state has received in less than two years.

Moody's is now the second major rating agency to put Illinois in the A category following S&P's decision on February 23 to upgrade the state to an A- on its scale.

"This credit upgrade, our second one this year, is the result of the steps we've taken in Illinois to put ourselves on firm fiscal footing," Governor JB Pritzker said in a statement. "We have balanced our budget, paid our bills on time, cleared out decades of debt, made extra pension payments, and saved billions for a rainy day."

In its announcement, Moody's cited the state's improving governance as a key factor in its decision. Moody's is one of many firms that now assesses companies and governments on an environmental, social and governance framework.

The rating agency said it had updated the state's issuer profile score in the governance category from 3 to 2. "Like other states, Il-

linois enjoyed solid tax revenue growth over the past couple years, expanding its capacity to build financial reserves and increase payments towards outstanding liabilities," Moody's said in its announcement. "The state is on track to close fiscal 2023, which ends June 30, with further growth in reserves that are already at their strongest level in over a decade."

Illinois' rainy day fund is slated to reach its highest-ever balance of more than \$1.9 billion by the end of the fiscal year.

The new rating applies to the state's general obligation, or GO, bonds and its Build Illinois sales tax bonds.

Illinois has approximately \$26 billion in outstanding GO bonds and \$2 billion in outstanding sales tax bonds.

Moody's also rated the state's financial outlook as stable, saying that such an outlook balances the financial progress being made by the state with the uncertainty of the present economic climate.

"The state's lean financial reserves and heavy long-term liability and fixed cost burdens make it more vulnerable than other states to a negative shift in the national or global economy," it said.

IDNR boat dock lease agreement approved

A new lease agreement for the boat dock along the Kaskaskia River in Evansville was approved Monday night by the village board.

President Kenneth Kempfer had sought an addendum to the agreement, stating that the Illinois Department of Natural Resources, which leases the dock from the village, will assist with maintenance of the dock.

Kempfer recently said that maintenance had become burdensome on the village, especially with the increased number of floods that have befallen Evansville in recent years.

A line was added to the new lease that states that IDNR will assist Evansville with maintenance and cleanup activities.

Kempfer said during the meeting that he was under the understanding that IDNR would split maintenance costs 50/50 with the village.

The board also approved a new work agreement for maintenance superintendent Ed Braun.

Under the agreement, Braun will be paid \$28.34 per hour, with a \$300 stipend per weekend of work and annual cost of living increases. His call-in rate is double time.

In addition, the village will reimburse Braun for health insurance and unused vacation days at the end of each year and receive a fifth week of vacation in 2024. Braun will also receive an annual clothing stipend of \$550.

In other news, the board approved accepting bids for the fire department's Chevrolet Suburban, with a minimum bid of \$2,500, and the blue police car, with a minimum bid of \$1,000.

Trustee Darren Kempfer reported that the recent agreement with the Randolph County Sheriff's Office to regularly patrol the town is going well. He said

he believes it has had a positive effect.

Kempfer also reported that the fire department's Easter egg hunt will be at the baseball fields Saturday, April 8, starting at 10:45 a.m. sharp.

The department is seeking donations, as it is short on cash after recent purchases of bunker gear. The fire department typically provides about 150 Easter baskets to the children.

The board also approved for Deutschmann Plumbing of Sparta to perform repairs to the sewer system at city hall not to exceed \$2,500.

Trustee Kenneth Rhyne questioned the delay from Ameren in placing a streetlight at the Dollar General entrance. The light, which has been sought for months, would alleviate the dark entrance to the store from State Route 3, which village officials have cited as a safety issue.

Randolph Society: Honoring Katie Fiene

The Randolph Society Foundation board announced that Katie Fiene, a pioneering journalist and food historian, will be inducted into the foundation's 2023 class of honorees.

Katheryn Rae Rosendahl, born March 9, 1917 in Willisville to Henry Ray Rosendahl and Maude Smith, was raised in rural Perry County alongside her three sisters.

After three years at Steeleville High School, she completed her senior year at Cleveland High School in St. Louis.

In 1938, 21-year-old Katie married George Edison "Judy" Fiene at St. Mark's Lutheran Church in Steeleville.

Their early years of marriage were, like so many others, affected by war, when Judy enlisted in the U.S. Army in March of 1943.

Katie was inspired to do her own bit to improve the morale of

the young men from the area who had joined the service.

During the war, she began publishing her first column called Dear Boys, in the Steeleville Ledger. The column was written like a letter from home, sharing all the latest news to make the soldiers and sailors feel like they were hearing from a friend.

After the war, the Fiene family grew to include children Cassandra and Kent. Stories of family life often made their way into Katie's column.

By this time, Katie had been hired to write for the Sparta News-Plaindealer, and Katie's Kolum became a mainstay in the paper for the next three decades.

She also began making regular 10-minute radio appearances on WHCO and KSGM, reading her columns and broadcasting special events.

For years, she was

WHCO's radio host for Steeleville's Fourth of July parade, and she also served as the director of advertising and public relations for First National Bank of Steeleville.

Katie covered an enormous range of topics in her column, everything from the twist to the church bazaar, she told a fellow columnist in the 1960s.

She was always on the hunt for good material. Some subjects were particular favorites.

Along the way, she incorporated two of her greatest interests, history and cooking.

Katie was an active member and president of the Randolph County Historical Society. She

was also elected president of the Illinois State Historical Society in 1976, becoming just the second woman to hold that position.

When she began sharing recipes and stories from her kitchen, the reader response was overwhelmingly positive. Katie found her regular baking ritual to be a soothing and essential part of life. She became so proficient at bread making that she won a blue ribbon at the Du Quoin State Fair.

For three decades, her readers mailed in their favorite recipes. Katie tested and tried them, sharing her favorites with the public in her column. By the 1980s,

she had amassed such an interesting assortment of dishes that she decided to publish her own cookbook featuring many of the recipes. She also shared recipes and cooking tips from her own family, especially her mother, and added a historical angle by including techniques and dishes from Randolph County's past.

In 1977, Katie's husband passed away. She surprised herself by finding love again. In 1979, she married state representative Vincent Birchler in Chester. They shared a dedication to public service.

Katie was a member of numerous boards, including the Randolph County Welfare Service and Southern Illinois Incorporated. She did a little bit of everything, from emceeding local fashion shows and judging county fair cookbook competitions to delivering keynote

speeches and volunteering with elementary school programs. She also received numerous awards for her writing and her cooking.

As a member of a small pioneering group of local female columnists, she demonstrated that a woman's viewpoint, the phrase she used to describe her column, was more than worth reading.

In a letter to a friend who decided to try her own hand at writing, Katie wrote: I'm so happy you are taking up journalism. It's such fun ... and you never get over the whole bit. I always say that when I cut my finger I don't see blood, but ink!

Katie lived to the remarkable age of 100, passing away Christmas Day 2017.

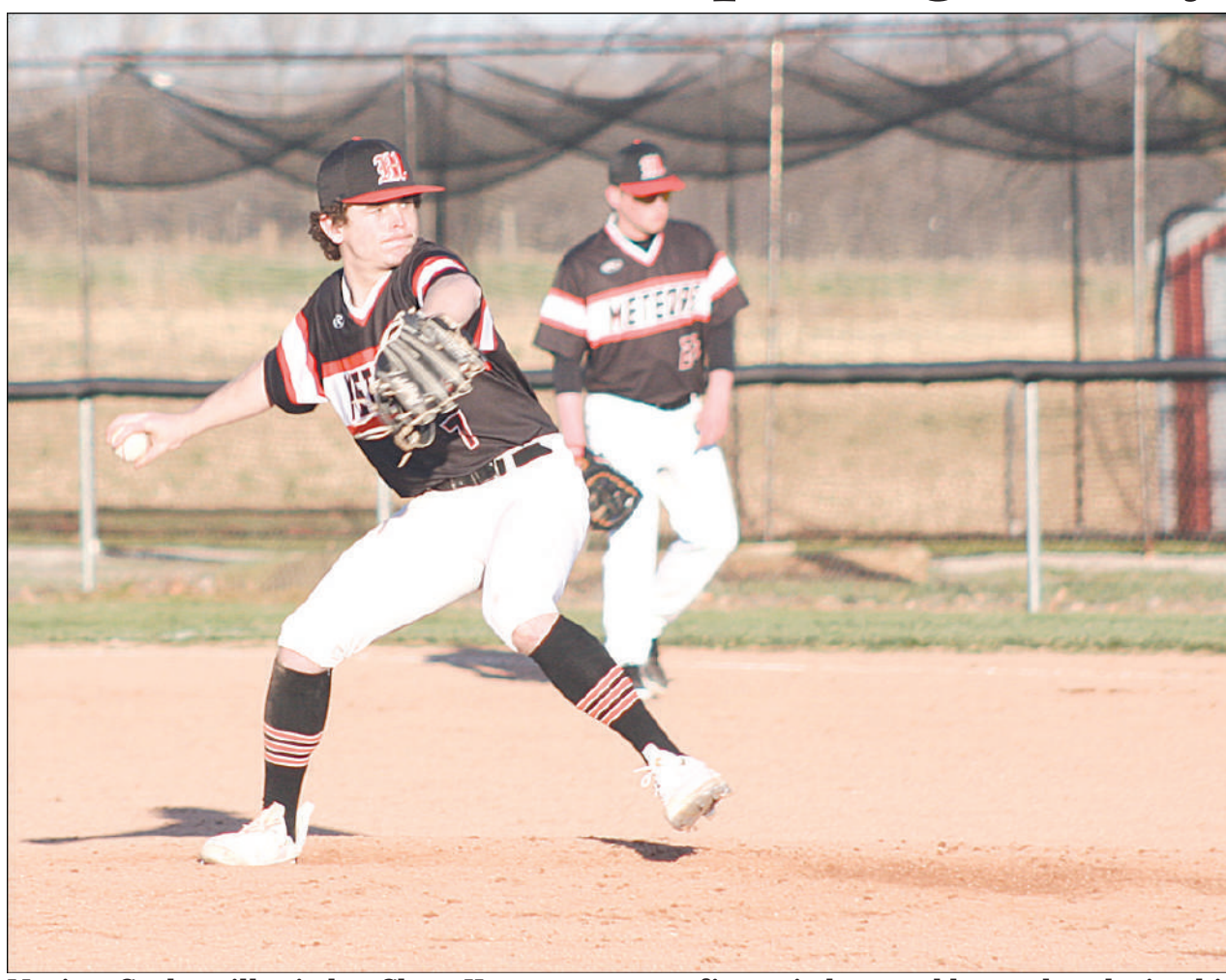
Meteors strike for a season-opening victory

Pinckneyville ready to go Du Quoin aims for history

The Pinckneyville High School girls soccer team is coming off of a 7-11 season that ended with a loss in the first round of the postseason.

However, Pinckneyville is just two seasons removed from advancing to the sectional semifinals. In 2021, there was no 2021, tournaments, rather an extended sectional bracket. Pinckneyville lost in the semifinals to eventual state champion Belleville Althoff.

Pinckneyville has a handful of returning players from last year's squad, but coach Jay Ray also has a number of inexperienced athletes on the field this season.

Morgenthaler was a forward last season, but Ray tried her out Monday as a goaltender.

"Last year, she was an all-conference player at forward," Ray said. "She had never played goalie before, but I

Illinois spring trout fishing season to begin in April

The 2023 Illinois spring trout fishing season will open Saturday, April 1 at 58 ponds, lakes and streams throughout the state. Southern Illinois locations for this season include Derby Lake at the World Shooting and Recreational Complex in Sparta. Other southern Illinois locations are Willow Lake at Peabody

River King State Fish and Wildlife Area in New Athens, the main lake at Frank Holten State Park in Belleville, Jones Park Lake in East St. Louis, Mount Vernon Game Farm Pond, Ferne Clyffe State Park Lake, Belk Park Pond in Wood River, Boston Pond at the Stephen A. Forbes State Recreation Area, the Fort Massac State Park pond, the

lake at Beall Woods State Park and the Sam Dale Conservation Area trout pond. A catch-and-release fishing season opens Saturday, March 18. Willow Lake takes part in that early opportunity. No trout can be kept during this period, but anglers can keep trout after the opening of the regular season that

begins April 1. Anyone attempting to harvest trout before the legal harvest season opening will be issued a citation. All anglers, including those who intend to release fish caught before April 1, must have a fishing license and Inland Trout Stamp unless they are under 16, blind, disabled or are an Illinois resident on

leave from active duty in the armed forces. The daily harvest limit is five trout per angler. Fishing licenses and Inland Trout Stamps are available at IDNR license and permit locations or purchased online at exploremoreil.com. The Illinois Department of Natural Resources stocks more than 80,000 rainbow

trout each year in bodies of water where trout fishing is permitted during the spring season. An additional 80,000 trout will be stocked for the fall trout fishing season that begins in October. For more information on trout seasons and other Illinois fishing opportunities, go to ifishillinois.org.

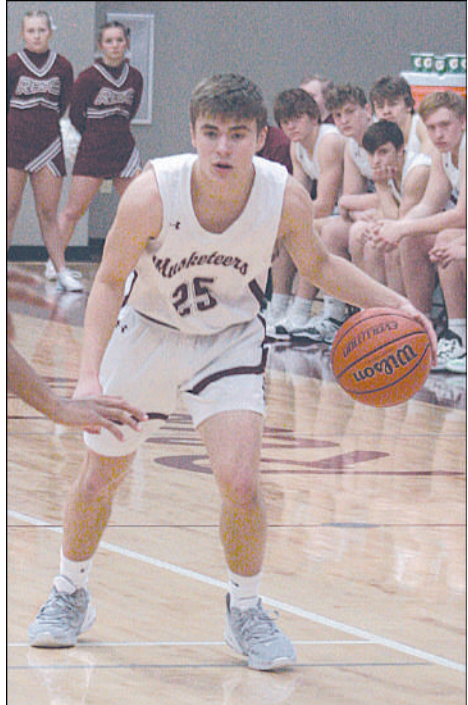

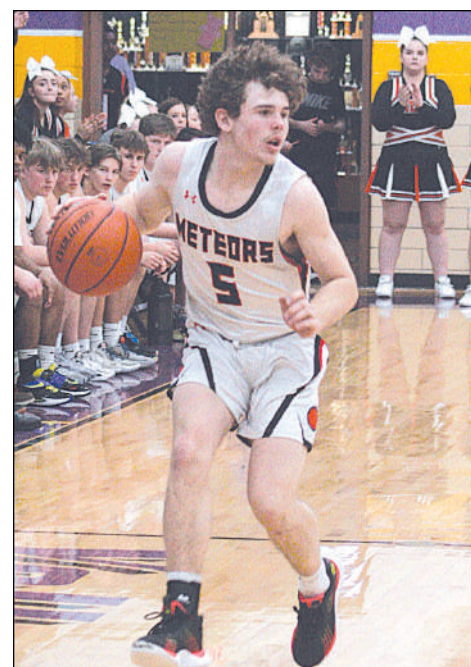

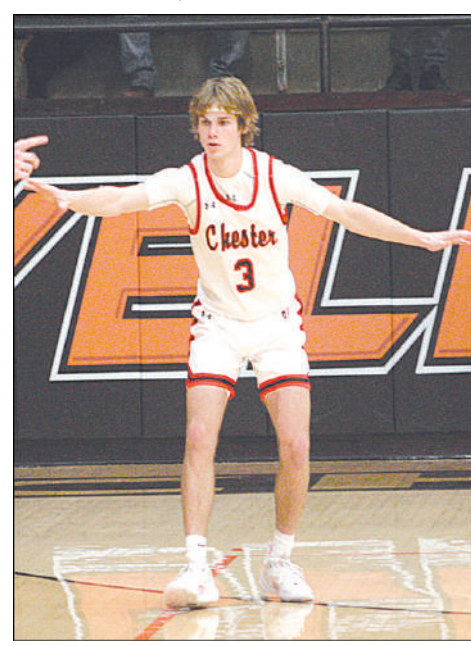

Marissa library gets weather monitor on loan

The Marissa library has been busy implementing new ways to help its patrons. The staff has been active with its Find the Shamrocks project to go along with St. Patrick's Day. Shamrock vouchers have been hidden in plain sight around town, and the lucky people who find them and bring them to the library will receive a special treat. People simple have to look for shiny green shamrock shapes with a small note attached. Besides the Shamrock hunt, the library

has held book club meetings. A new preschool story time project has been started, and the monthly story hour and movie night continue. Computer technical help is available Wednesdays and Thursdays, and the AARP tax service has been operating on Saturdays during tax season. A special spring break project is in the works, and a new take-it and make-it craft is available. Perhaps the newest project to help the community is a severe weather information

center. The Marissa Emergency Management Agency has loaned the library a computer monitor and brochures to inform people how to be safe in severe weather conditions, with safety information on such severe weather conditions as tornadoes, lightning, hail, wind, thunderstorms, flood and power outages. Other ways to get severe weather information and preparedness are on Facebook/vomesda, on Twitter @marissaoem and on YouTube @marissaema4089.

Pro wrestling coming to Perry County Fair

For the first time in its 166-year history, the Perry County Fair in Pinckneyville will feature professional wrestling this summer. The Perry County Agricultural Society, the parent organization for the fair, and Pro Wrestling Epic will present Faircade June 17, on the half-mile track in front of the grandstand. Bell time is 7 p.m. In case of inclement weather, the event will be held in the expo hall at the fairgrounds. "This is truly historic for us," said Pete Spittler, Perry County Fair public relations coordinator. "We've had our highly esteemed queen pageants, monster trucks, concerts, comedy shows, ventriloquist acts, ATV and motorcycle races—we've even had ladies' mud wrestling—but for some unknown reason, never professional wrestling until now." Pro Wrestling Epic, based in Granite City, is one of the premier independent wrestling organizations in the region. The company was founded in 2008 by Ryan Parcell and purchased in 2014 by Lynn Kamadulski, who is a full-time owner. "PWE was very aggressive in earning this contract," Spittler said. "We had three proposals, and after

our board meeting in February, we selected two finalists. "Members of the board conducted a scouting trip on March 4." A final decision was made during the board's March 6 meeting, and the contract for the event was signed March 10 at the fairgrounds. The Faircade name is a nod to the former National Wrestling Alliance/WCW pay-per-view Starrcade that was WCW's flagship event from 1991 to 2000. "This means everything," Kamadulski said. "Every show, everything, is on the line. Every time you walk out of the curtain; every time you stand in front of the people and perform, that's your one chance. You don't know if you'll get another one." Trackside seats for all ages are \$15. General admission grandstand seats are \$10; children 3-12 are \$5 and 2 and younger free. "We will be selling 50 advance trackside tickets, with the rest to be sold the day of the show," Spittler said. "This is in case Mother Nature decides not to cooperate and we have to move inside, and we don't want to oversell those tickets." As part of this event, PWE wrestlers will

meet with attendees prior to the show in the expo hall. "The overall goal with this event is to bring the same kind of big-show atmosphere wrestling fans see on their TV screens once or twice a month, only right here in Perry County," Spittler said. PWE is in negotiations to add a special guest to the show, which will be announced later, along with more on this year's fair schedule. "Faircade is the first of what will be several big announcements for the fair," Spittler said. Established in 1856, the Perry County Fair grew from its humble beginnings as a one-day showcase of farm-inspired displays in the upstairs courtroom of the Perry County Courthouse to the week-long tradition you see today. The long-running event, the oldest continuous county fair in Illinois, minus a pause during COVID, has entertained thousands during its more than 16 decades and five generations of existence. "It's an honor to be a part of history," Kamadulski said. "PWE is about making history and making moments. We won't let you down." The 166th annual Perry County Fair is scheduled to run from June 10-17.

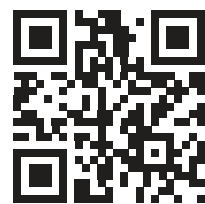
