Day 1

Friday 1st May

Weather: overcast with showers am, Bright with sunny spells pm

The party arrived at Mahon on five different flight times so much of the group did not meet each other until early evening. Those who did arrive early not only got a splendid lunch but managed to see some of the wildlife in the fields around Matchani Gran before we all met up for the evening meal.

Birds of note were Quail (calling), Nightingales and Sardinian Warblers, Woodchat shrikes, Hoopoe's and Turtledoves, A Red kite and two Collard Pratincoles were seen flying over.

Flowers of note were Bumblebee and Giant Orchids with a few tongue scattered around. Large clumps of *Ornithogalum arabicum* were in full flower with much added colour of wild Gladiolus and Tassel Hyacinth.

Day 2

Saturday 2nd May

Weather: Sunny with a fresh north wind

Pre breakfast walk around Matchani Gran produced a few birds. Hoopoe's Woodchat Shrikes, Pied Flycatchers, Egyptian Vulture, Pallid Swift and an Eleonora's Falcon.

We were soon on the road after our last member arrived from Scotland. Tirant Marsh was soon in our sights and all of our party had a large flock of at least 150+ Bee eaters to welcome them. More flocks were seen during the day, some going up to a great height and flying off to the North. Other highlights were four Stone Curlew, two Purple Gallinule, Squacco Heron, Purple Heron, Red Kites, Booted Eagles, Tawny Pipits and Fan Tailed Warblers. Fields were still full of Crown Daisy and Italian Sainfoin.

Our lunch stop overlooking the sea just up the road gave us more Bumblebee and Tongue Orchids and our first migratory Locust of the trip. Later during the afternoon a few Striped Tree Frogs were found and gave good views. A very enjoyable day was had by all in warm sunshine.

Day 3

Sunday 3rd May

Weather-Sunny and warm

The early morning walk gave us very little. The usual Hoopoe's and Stone Curlews could be heard calling, a few Pied and Spotted flycatchers, turtle doves, Tawny Pipit and Short Toed Larks were about the best.

We were soon on the road after breakfast heading for Cap Cavalleria. We had to pass Tirant Marsh on the way so a short stop was called for. The large flock of Bee eaters was still present plus a couple of Little Egrets and a Scaup Heron. Then on out to the Cape where we saw Cory's and Balearic Shearwaters, several Audouin's Gulls and Blue Rock Thrushes. Plenty of Pallid Swifts were around the cliffs and a Flamingo was seen flying past. Plants of note were the Large Dragon Arum in full flower also three endemics, *Digitalis Dubia*, *Senecio Rodriguezii* and *Launea Cervicornis* were seen.

We had a short coffee stop before moving on to Binimella along the coast where we had our lunch. A Pond Terrapin was found in the stream that ran into the sea. A short walk along the coast produced more Audouin's Gulls, three Black Kites, Booted Eagles and Egyptian Vultures. Large patches of *Anthemis Maritima*, Purple Vipers Bugloss and Field Poppy were in full bloom along the seashore. On returning to Matchani Gran a Roller was seen perched on the wires along the drive.

Day 4

Monday 4th May

Weather-Warm and sunny

The early morning walk produced several Pied and Spotted Flycatchers, turtle Doves, Nightingales and Woodchat Shrikes. A Golden Oriole and the Roller were seen briefly.

Once again we were on the road just after 09:30 and soon arrived at Son Parc, An area of fresh water with reed beds and pine woods. Highlights were several Ferruginous Ducks, Purple Gallinule's Marsh Harrier, Osprey, Red Crested Pochard and Booted Eagles. We then had a long walk up through the woods and back along the coast to the car park. Flowers of note were, Tongue Orchids, Mirror Orchid, *Ophrys Balearica*, *Astragalus Balearicus* and Yellow Cytinus. A few Pond Terrapins were seen in a ditch near our vans while we were having lunch. In the afternoon we drove up to the top of Monte Toro for fine views of the entire island and a well earned cup of tea. An early return to Matchani Gran gave the group a chance to relax in the warm by the pool.

Day 5

Tuesday 5th May

Weather: Strong northerly wind, sunny

A short early morning walk in very strong winds with the odd light shower produced very little, a couple of Hoopoe's, Pallid Swifts, Pied Flycatcher and Turtle Dove.

We kept to the South coast today to try and keep out of the near gale force winds. After about a 40 min drive we arrived at Cala Galdana and parked near the coast path through the woods. Very little in the bird line was seen, highlights were Egyptian Vultures, Booted Eagles, Pallid Swifts, Peregrine, and a singing Great Reed Warbler on the coast path.

This year was a good show of *Ophrys Balearica* and plenty of Tongue and Pyramidal Orchids. After lunch at Cala Galdana we drove to Cales Coves to try and get out of the wind, lower down near the sea it was less windy with a few birds showing themselves. Hoopoe, Blue Rock Thrush and Alpine Swift were the best we could do. A large clump of French Lavender in the car park was the highlight of the plant world.

Day 6

Wednesday 6th May

Weather: Light winds, sunny and warm

Pre breakfast walk produced several Pied and Spotted Fly catchers, Hoopoe's, Wood Warbler and Night Heron.

After breakfast we drove to the other end of the island and out onto the headland of Punta Nati. On this barren landscape were plenty of Short toed and Thekla Larks, Blue Rock Thrush and Pallid Swifts. A few Balearic Shearwaters were moving offshore with a small number of Audouin's Gulls. Halfway back from the headland there was a large group of Cattle Egrets which appeared to be nesting in a clump of pine trees.

We then moved on to Naveta Des Tudons, a prehistoric burial chamber. Egyptian Vultures and Booted Eagles along with Red Kites were seen in this area. After a while we drove on to Son Bou for lunch by the beach and the usual walk along the dunes. But once again, like last year it was somewhat disappointing, with only a Little Egret and a Purple Heron on the marsh. A few Waders were on the beach, Little Stint, Kentish Plover, Sanderling and at least 10 Audouin's Gulls.

With time to kill we decided to go home via Tirant Marsh. We were met by the usual flock of Bee eaters, at least 200+ in the area, Egyptian Vultures, Booted Eagles, a singing Great Reed Warbler, twelve Cattle Egrets and three fine Red Footed Falcons. A fitting climax to a busy day...

Day 7

Thursday 7th May

Weather: Hot and Sunny

The early morning walk gave us good views of the Roller a Golden Oriole, Red Kite, Hoopoe and a brief Eleonora's Falcon.

After breakfast we were soon on our way to the saltpans of Montgofre Nou. Along the track through the saltpans were plenty of Spanish Broom, Strawberry Tree, Rosemary and Myrtle. Good numbers of Black Winged Stilts were seen, some sitting on eggs. At least twenty wood Sandpiper, three Temminck's Stints, Spotted Redshank, Greenshank, Little Ringed and Kentish Plovers. Booted Eagles, Red Kite, and Egyptian Vultures were overhead, and another nice Striped Tree frog gave good views.

After a while the group moved onto Cap De Favatrix for lunch. In this area were plenty of clumps of leaves from Sea Daffodil - also of note was Sea Knott Grass, Yellow Horned Poppy and *Teucrium Marum* subsp, *Spinescens* and the usual species of Socarrell's, *Launaea Cervicornis*, *Anthyllis Hystrix*, *Dorycnium Fulgurans*.

A few birds were seen, Audouin's Gulls, a couple of Cory's Shearwater, Blue Rock Thrush and four Little Ringed Plover.

Later in the afternoon we returned via the airport to refuel the vans, and then back to Matchani Gran. Some members of the group relaxed by the pool, while others walked back down the lane to have another look at the Roller.

Day 8

Friday 8th May

Weather: overcast and windy with a few spots of rain

Only a few did the early morning walk as most were dispersing at different times to catch three flights. Birds that were seen were Golden Oriole, Woodchat Shrike, Hoopoe, two Tawny Pipits and some Pied Flycatchers.
