Summary

This holiday looked at all aspects of wildlife on the attractive island of Menorca, focussing mainly on birds and plants, but also including butterflies and dragonflies. The weather at this time of year is usually warm and sunny but initially it was unusually overcast, wet and very windy, restricting pre-breakfast walks and necessitating some re-organisation of the itinerary. Nevertheless during the course of the week we saw a good variety of wildlife, as well as touching briefly on some of the history of the island.

Day 1

Friday 19th April

Our flight from Gatwick departed virtually on time and two hours later we met Llorenc, the hotel owner, at the airport, organised the minibus and drove the short distance to our hotel, found our rooms and had a short time to rest after our early flight. After lunch we had a walk around the fields adjoining the hotel and along the long entrance drive. It was a cool afternoon, with an unusually strong easterly wind and not ideal for birding, but we managed to find numerous House Sparrows (the Spanish Sparrow does not occur on Menorca), and Common Linnet. A few Common Nightingales and Cetti's Warblers were heard from the track. Yellow-legged Gull and Kestrel passed overhead.

The hotel grounds provided a useful introduction to the island's plants. In the fields behind the hotel we found both Common Asphodel (Asphodelus aestivus) and Hollow-Leaved Asphodel (Asphodelus fistulosus) along with Milk thistle (Silybum marianum) and Boar thistle (Galactites tomentosa), conspicuous plants that are common on roadsides and uncultivated fields around the island. We also found the delicate annual daisy (Bellis annua) and the oddly shaped leaves of the small yellow Annual Hyoseris (Hyoseris scabra). Aleppo Pines (Pinus halepensis) grow along the hotel track along with a variety of plants including the attractive Crow Daisy (Chrysanthemum coronarium). We also found some rather old specimens of Sawfly Orchid (Ophrys tenthredinifera) and the remains of numbers of Giant Orchid (Barlia robertiana), Fodder Pea (Lathyrus annua) and Winged Vetchling (Lathrys ochrus) adjacent to the track.

We met up at 7.00pm to run through the day's sightings and to talk about our plans for the next couple of days, and after an excellent evening meal accompanied by wine and beer, most people opted for an early night after a long day travelling.

Day 2

Saturday 20th April

We met in the morning for a substantial breakfast of assorted pastries, cheeses and meats, bread, fruit juices, coffee and tea, and having loaded the minibus with the picnic lunches, we set off for a day in the Menorcan countryside.

Our first stops were along the minor road leading to Tirant Marsh where we had our first views of Osprey, Red Kite and Booted Eagles. We scanned over a fairly distant area of water and reedbeds to find Little Egret, Squacco Heron, Gadwall, Grey Heron and on the hillside across the road we had our first view of an Egyptian Vulture. In the adjacent roadside fields we found Purple Vipers-bugloss *(Echium plantagineum)* and Blue Alkanet

(Anchusa azurea). At a roadside stop we found the Three-cornered Leek (Allium triquetrum) and, scrambling along the field wall, Smilax (Smilax aspera)

We moved on a short distance to our next destination overlooking another wetland area where we saw a Marsh Harrier and glimpsed a Glossy Ibis flying into the marsh This extensive marsh is dominated by Common Spike Rush *(Eleocharius palustris)* and dotted with Tamarisk *(Tamarisk gallica)* but close to the edge of the track we found white flowered Pond Water Crow foot (*Ranunculus peltatus*)

As lunchtime was approaching we decided to have our picnic, after which we had a walk down onto the beach and into the sand dunes. Here we found Red-eared Terrapin (an invader from Mexico and the southern USA). They are commonly kept as pets, but frequently escape or are deliberately released, and unfortunately, they are dominant over the native species. Attempts have been made to eradicate them, but so far there has been only limited success. Both species of Terrapin occur here and whilst we saw numbers of heads they were impossible to clearly identify at a distance. An Audouin's Gull was seen from the beach, the highlight here.

The lunch stop provided us with an opportunity to see the typical shrub community (Maquis) of the island with the pampas-like Mauritanian Grass (*Ampelodesmos mauritanica*), Spiny Broom (*Calicotome spinosa*), Grey-leaved Cistus (*Cistus albidus*), Sage-leaved Cistus (*Cistus salvifolius*), Montpelier Cistis (*Cistis monspeliensis*) and Phoenician Juniper (*Juniperus phoenicea*).

The sandy dunes contained a spectacular covering of Sea Chamomile (*Anthemis maritime*), along with Annual Valerian (Centranthus calcitrapae), Sea Bindweed (*Calystegia soldanella*) and Sea-holly (Eryngium maritimum) and Sea Rocket (*Cakile maritima*)

We drove next to the village of Fornells for a coffee stop. This was our final stop of the day, given the weather conditions, after which we returned to the hotel to relax before another excellent evening meal. Some of us walked around the hotel grounds before we ate.

Day 3

Sunday 21st April

Given the strong winds after breakfast we headed for the sheltered bay of Cala Galdana on the south coast, stopping first of all at a viewpoint just outside the resort. A male Blue Rock Thrush was seen along with a Peregrine. We walked the short distance to another viewpoint which gave a spectacular view over the bay. At the viewpoints we recorded Rush-like Scorpion Vetch (*Coronilla juncea*) and the Pale Stonecrop (*Sedum sediforme*).

We then drove into Cala Galdana, where we stopped in a small car park to the rear of the town and walked up a long flight of steps rising above the town. Following the walking route above the steps for a little way and after some hunting we found the endemic Orchid *Ophrys balearica*. Once considered a separate but poorly delineated species this has now been merged into the *Ophrys x flavicans* group. We also discovered several specimens of the Bumblebee Orchid *Ophrys bombyliflora*.

We moved on to park at the mouth of the Algendar Gorge just outside the resort, walking into the gorge, to see the first House Martin of the tour. Within the gorge numerous Nightingales were singing In the grassy areas at the entrance to the Gorge we found Small Restharrow (Ononis relinata) and Reversed Clover (Trifolium resputinatum) in damper areas and in a remnant small pond Water Crowfoot (Ranunculus peltatus). Further along the track we saw the Pitch Trefoil (Psoralea bitumenosa). Woodland on the edge of the track contained Kermes Oak (Quercus coccifera) and on the track sides we found Pale Flax (Linum bienne) and Round-leafed Mint (Mentha suaveolens).

After an excellent picnic lunch we returned to the minibuses and drove to another resort on the south coast, Son Bou, where we walked along a track overlooking the back of the large reedbed. Here we found numerous Avocet and Black-winged Stilt, along with Redshank, Little Egret, Gadwall and two Glossy Ibis. A Marsh Harrier soared across the marsh. Along the track we found a single Carob Tree (Canatonia siliqua) and Blue Hound's-tongue (Cyonoglossum creticum). In the marshland towards the end of our walk we also found Narrow-leaved Water Plantain (Alisma lanceolatum) and Rough-fruited Buttercup (Ranunculus muricatus).

Day 4

Monday 22nd April

The strong winds continued along with early morning mist and rain, so we delayed our departure, setting off at 11.00 to explore the North-east of the Island, starting at the disused salt-pans at Mongofre Nou.

We parked at the end of the narrow track and set off to walk to the salt pans, having to take a diversion due to the very high water level. We stopped to look at the very unusual marbled patterns in the sedimentary rocks here and had our first sighting of the Tree Spurge (*Euphorbia dendrodies*). The high-water levels were not ideal for waders, but we found Black-winged Stilts, a Common Sandpiper and numbers of Shelduck. Beyond the initial scrub the salt pans and salt marsh are dominated by Perennial Glasswort (*Arthrocnemon perenne*) and Sea-purslane (*Halimione portulacoides*). Growing on a small bluff adjacent to the track we found the Tongue Orchid (*Serapis linga*) and further along in the edge of a patch of woodland we found a specimen of *S. nurrica* which is a rare IUCN Red List threatened species which has suffered hugely from tourist development along its favoured coastal habitat. We ate lunch at Mongofre Nou given the continuing strong wind.

Next, we drove out towards Cap Favaritx, stopping on the way to spend some time looking at the specialised plant community found on this exposed, windswept area. This area contains the typical 'soccoral' (the spiny dwarf bush community of the north coast) and the plants that we found here included Milk Vetch (*Astragalus balearicus*), the Spiny Clover (*Dorycnium fulgerans*), Prickly Lettuce (*Launaea cervicornis*), and Rodriguez's False Olive (*Phillyrea latifolia var rodriquezii*). Amongst these spiny bushes we also discovered the Miniature Daisy (*Bellium bellidioides*).

Parking near the lighthouse with the strong wind blowing directly onshore provided just the right conditions to observe Shearwaters making their way north around the headland, but it was impossible to determine the species in the strong wind at that distance. We also saw Ringed Plover on the shallow wetland next to the lighthouse. On walking towards the lighthouse we found the Hairy Catchfly *(Silene sedoides)* and Sea Heath *(Frankenia hirsuta)*. From Cap Favaritx we headed to the large nature reserve at S'Albufera des Grau and made several stops in the area around the reserve, finding Great Crested and Little Grebes plus numerous Coots, and a distant Flamingo and Black-necked Grebe. We added to our growing list of orchids by finding Tongue Orchid *(Serapias linua)* and also Hairy Lupin *(Lupinus micranthus)*.

We rounded off the day by driving the short distance to the village of Es Grau for a treat of coffee and/or ice cream, while also observing Audouin's Gulls and Yellow-legged Gulls.

Day 5

Tuesday 23rd April

Today we set off on the longest drive of the week to the headland of Punta Nati on the north-west tip of the island in improving weather. Our first brief stop on the track to Punt Nati was at the island's only Cattle Egret colony with a small number of Egrets beginning to nest We couldn't stop for long on this single-track road without disrupting the local traffic, so we moved on slowly towards the car park. As we walked down to the lighthouse we enjoyed close views of Corn Bunting and also found Short-toed Larks and a Thekla's Lark. We also saw Blue Rock Thrush, Peregrine, and had distant views of Egyptian Vultures.

On the road to the lighthouse we found Squirting Cucumber (*Echallium elaterium*), Caper (Capparis spinosa) and Silver Ragwort (*Senecio cineraria*). Whilst on the exposed maritime headland, where *Senecio rodriguezii* seems to thrive, we also found Sea Lavender (*Limomium virgatum*) Dwarf Sea-lavender (*Limonium minutum*), Curved Hard-grass (*Parapholis incurve*).

Lunch today was to be a barbecue provided by Llorenc at his father's house at the upper end of the Algendar Gorge. After driving along the narrow road and rough track to the car park at the top of the gorge we walked down into the gorge itself, where Nightingales and Cetti's Warblers were singing, and crossed the stream to the house in its superb setting. Everything was prepared for our arrival and we sat down to a variety of meats and pastries, accompanied by beer, soft drinks and water and followed by locally grown fruit. As we ate Egyptian Vultures from the nearby colony soared overhead along with a Booted Eagle, while Nightingales and a Blackcap sang. Lunch today, not surprisingly, took longer than usual, but eventually it was time to return up the hill to the car park, some of the group taking the main track while others took the steeper, narrower old path. Those following the old track were treated to some spectacular finds, including the following endemic plants: *Paeonia cambessedesii, Viola slolonifera, Sibthorpia africana, Cyclamen balearicum, Ononis crispa* and the ferns *Anagramma leptophylla, Aspelenium onopteris* and *Phyllitis sagittate*.

We decided to take the old road - the Cami den Kane - back to Mahon, which is much quieter than the main road across the island, and took a drive along the side of the harbour, admiring the many luxury yachts moored here, eventually returning to the hotel just before 5pm, leaving plenty of time to relax before dinner.

Day 6

Wednesday 24th April

After breakfast we headed first of all towards the holiday resort of Son Parc, driving all the way through the built-up area, which was almost deserted as the main tourist season hadn't started yet, to the car park by the beach. We walked through the wooded area to a point overlooking a marshy wetland, with some open water and on the track we saw the Many-flowered Heath (*Erica multiflora*) and a single specimen of Balearic Orchid (*Ophrys balearica*). Crossing a damp area adjacent to the marsh we found the Thick Leaved Plantain (*Plantago crassifolia*).

The water level was very high this year, with very little in the way of muddy margins, and accompanied by a strong wind, birding was difficult as everything was sheltering in the reeds. After some time we abandoned the wetland and returning to the car park walked down onto the beach, seeing a Willow Warbler and a Tawny Pipit

in the low scrub, and an Audouin's Gull on the rocks. On the short walk through the sand dunes we found the Figwort (Scrophularia ramosissima) and a false sow thistle (*Rhichardia tingitana*).

We then decided that it was lunchtime, so we drove the short distance to Sa Roca, a pleasant wooded area in the centre of the island where we unpacked the picnic. During lunch amongst the wooded slopes thick with Allepo Pine and Tree Heather we found here Sawfly Orchid *(Ophrys tenthredionifera)* and numbers of the spectacular Violet Limodore *(Limodorum abortivum)*. After lunch we drove a little further along the road, to find the parasitic plant Cytinus *(Cytinus ruber)* and Osyris *(Osyris alaba)*.

Our final stop today was at the prehistoric site of Taula de Torralba. We spent an hour or so wandering around this ancient settlement which dates back to around 1,000 BC, some of the site having been restored while other parts have been left exactly as they were abandoned.

Day 7

Thursday 25th April

After breakfast we set off towards Cap de Cavalleria, the most northerly point of the island. As we manoeuvred along the track a Stone Curlew landed in an adjacent field stopping for a few moments to afford a spectacular view. At our first stop beside the ancient Roman port at Sanitja we saw Stonechats and Tawny Pipits. Here we found Pyramidal Orchid (*Anacamptis pyramidalis*) growing amongst small shrubby plants of the endemic False olive (*Phyllirea latifolia var rodriguezii*). We also found a Dodder (*Cuscuta epithymum*)) growing on the endemic Balearic Milk-vetch (*Astragalus balearicus*) which also had the small endemic Four leafed Bird's-foot-trefoil (*Lotus tetraphylus*) growing up through it and a little further along the almost insignificant endemic spurge *Euphorbia maresii*.

Further on at the picturesque inlet of Cala Viola were several grounded migrants, including a Common Redstart and a Stone Chat. The coast here is very exposed. On the shoreline we found Rock Samphire (*Crithmum maritimum*), and on the escarpment the low growing spiny bush community ('socarrall') containing the endemic Hedgehog Lettuce (*Launaea cervicornis*) and the endemic (*Anthyllis hystrix*), and Evax (*Evax pygmaea*).

We decided to drive on to the lighthouse, parking just short of it, and walking round the headland we found a Blue Rock Thrush as well as Tawny Pipit. Near the lighthouse we found the endemic Rodriguez's Ragwort *(Senecio rodriguezii)* and on the path from the from the lighthouse the Balearic Foxglove (*Digitalis dubia*), and in the same location the endemic Smilax (*Smilax aspera var balearica*). Further along the cliff we saw the spectacular Dragon Arum (*Dracunculus muscivorus*).

We had our picnic lunch back at the minibuses after which we set off for Monte Toro, (the name derived from the Arabic al-tor meaning high ground), which is the highest point on the island at 357 meters. The monastery complex is run by a community of Franciscan nuns. On route we stopped briefly at Platja de Cavalleria to find Coris (*Coris monspeliensis*). At Monte Toro, we found Blue Rock Thrush and Italian Wall Lizards, and a spectacular patch of the endemic *Helichrysum ambigum*,. As always the view from the summit was spectacular, taking in most of the island.

Day 8

Friday 26th April

We had a little time this morning before our flights home and a few of us saw a Turtle Dove on the wires near the car park. Nightingales could be heard along the track which entertained us while we loaded up the minibuses. It was time to thank Llorenc for his help and hospitality, and then we were on our way to the airport. The flight back to Gatwick was uneventful and after collecting our luggage we all went our separate ways.
