Introduction

This holiday looked at all aspects of wildlife on the attractive island of Menorca, focussing mainly on birds and plants, and also including butterflies and dragonflies. The weather in the Mediterranean had been cool and wet prior to our trip with some wind and rain on our first full day, but otherwise we were fortunate in having warm and sunny weather. During the course of the week we saw a variety of wildlife as well as touching briefly on some of the history of the island. The earlier mixed weather had its effect as there were fewer butterflies and dragonflies recorded due to the cooler weather earlier in the month.

Day 1

Friday 22nd April

The group arrived on three separate flights, some a day earlier, but we all eventually met up at Matxani Gran and after settling in had a walk around the fields adjoining the hotel and along the long entrance drive. It was a cool afternoon, with an unusually strong easterly wind and not ideal for birding, but we managed to find numerous House Sparrows (the Spanish Sparrow does not occur on Menorca). A few Common Nightingales and Cetti's Warblers were heard from the track, we had a close view of a Booted Eagle and saw a Balearic Woodchat Shrike (subspecies *badius* is distinguished by the absence of the white primary wing patch).

The hotel grounds provided a useful introduction to the island's plants. An avenue of Aleppo pines (*Pinus halepensis*) grows along the hotel track along with a variety of plants including the attractive Crown Daisy (*Chrysanthemum coronarium*) in both its forms. We also found both Common Asphodel (*Asphodelus aestivus*) and Hollow-Leaved Asphodel (*Asphodelus fistulosus*) and Boar thistle (*Galactites tomentosa*), conspicuous plants that are common on roadsides and uncultivated fields around the island, along with the delicate annual daisy (*Bellis annua*). We saw the yellow flowers the Mediterranean Sow Thistle (*Sonchus tenerrimus*) and the oddly shaped leaves of the Hyoseris (*Hyoseris radiata*). There were some rather old specimens of Bumblebee Orchid (*Ophrys bombylifolia*) and the remains of numbers of Giant Orchid (*Himantoglossum robertiana*).

We met up at 7.00pm to run through the day's sightings and to talk about our plans for the next couple of days. After an excellent evening meal accompanied by wine, most people opted for an early night after a long day.

Day 2

Saturday 23rd April

We met in the morning for a substantial breakfast of assorted pastries, cheeses and meats, bread, fruit juices, coffee and tea, and having loaded the minibuses with the picnic lunches, we set off for a day in the Menorcan countryside, driving north via Es Mercadal.

Our first stops were along the minor road leading to Tirant Marsh where we had our first views of Red Kite and Booted Eagles. This is normally a good site for Bee-eaters but these birds appeared to be arriving late this year.

We scanned over a distant area of water and reedbeds at Es Prat to find Gadwall, Shoveler, Mallard and Redcrested Pochard, along with distant views of a Marsh Harrier. In the adjacent roadside fields, we found Purple Vipers-bugloss (*Echium plantagineum*) and Blue Alkanet (*Anchusa azurea*). At a roadside stop we found the threecornered leek (Allium triquetrum) and, scrambling along the field wall, Smilax (*Smilax aspera*).

We moved on a short distance to overlook the main Tirant wetland area where we saw a Purple Heron at close quarters and a number of Little Egrets and Greenshank. This extensive marsh is dominated by Common Spike Rush *(Eleocharius palustris),* Sea Club rush *(Scirpus maritimus)* and dotted with Tamarisk *(Tamarisk gallica).* On the opposite side of the track, we saw the Large-leafed Buttercup *(Ranunculus macrophylis)* along with the Narrow-leafed Water Plantain *(Alisma lanceolata)* and distant clumps of the Sharp Rush *(Juncus acutus)* Our pre-lunch stop provided u

s with an opportunity to see the typical shrub community (Maquis) of the island with the pampas-like Mauritanian or Nit Grass (*Ampelodesmos mauritanica*), Spiny Broom (*Calicotome spinosa*), Grey-leaved Cistus (*Cistus albidus*), Sage-leaved Cistus (*Cistus salvifolius*), and Phoenician Juniper (*Juniperus phoenicea*). Walking a little way up the track we also found Bladder Vetch (*Anthylis tetraphylla*) and a very small Thymelaea (*Thymelaea myrifolia*)

As lunchtime was approaching, we decided to have our picnic, after which we had a walk down onto the beach and in the sand dunes. The sandy dunes contained a spectacular covering of Sea Chamomile (*Anthemis maritime*), along with Annual Valerian (Centranthus calcitrapae), Sea Bindweed (*Calystegia soldanella*), Sea-holly (*Eryngium maritimum*) and Sea Rocket (*Cakile maritima*). Two Audouin's Gull were seen from the beach along with a small group of Yellow-legged Gulls and a Ringed Plover picked its way along the stream edge. Unfortunately, it started raining heavily so we abandoned the beach and drove to the village of Fornells for a coffee stop.

Fortunately the weather cleared during our coffee stop and we were able to drive to Ses Salines to look at the salt pans. After a brief scramble we arrived at the salt pans and found Kentish Plover, Common Ringed Plover, Black-winged Stilt, Common Sandpiper, and a rather elusive Curlew Sandpiper. After the salt pans we drove back to our hotel, meeting up at 7.00pm for a debrief before enjoying another excellent evening meal.

Day 3

Sunday 24th April

Today after breakfast we set off towards Cap de Cavalleria, the most northerly point of the island. At our first stop beside the ancient Roman port at Sanitja we saw only Shag and Yellow-legged Gull. We found Pyramidal Orchid (*Anacamptis pyramidalis*) growing amongst small shrubby plants of the endemic False Olive (*Phyllirea latifolia var rodriguezii*). We also found a Dodder (*Cuscuta epithymum*)) growing on the endemic Balearic Milk-vetch (*Astragalus balearicus*) which also had the small endemic Four leafed Bird's-foot Trefoil (*Lotus tetraphylus*) growing up through it.

Further on at the picturesque inlet of Cala Viola the coast is very exposed. On the shoreline we found Rock Samphire (*Crithmum maritimum*), and on the escarpment the low growing spiny bush community ('socarrall') containing the endemic Hedgehog Lettuce (*Launaea cervicornis*) and the endemic Vetch (*Anthyllis hystrix*), and Evax (*Evax pygmaea*). We also found found the endemic Rodriguez's Ragwort (*Senecio rodriguezii*) and a Stonechat.

We decided to drive on to the lighthouse, parking just short of it, and walking round the headland we found a Blue Rock Thrush. Near the lighthouse and on the path from the from the lighthouse we discovered the Balearic Foxglove (*Digitalis dubia*). Further along the cliff we saw the spectacular Dragon Arum (*Dracunculus muscivorus*), but with no open flowers, and close by the endemic Smilax (*Smilax aspera var balearica*). Our most surprising find

was *Paeonis cambessedesii* – growing in a small bowl of rock and which had clearly flowered some weeks ago - an unusual setting for this endemic plant.

After lunch we headed for the Talayotic site of Poblat d'en Galmes, one of the largest of these historic sites with a significant range of buildings, a site that shows traces of use into the Middle Ages. We spent some time exploring this fascinating place before returning to Matxani Gran.

Day 4

Monday 25th April

This morning we were joined by Javier Mendez Chavero and set off for the wetland of Son Bou, where we walked along part of the Cami de Cavalls, overlooking the back of the large reedbed. Here we found numerous Black-winged Stilt, Little Egret, Gadwall, Purple Swamphen, Spoonbill and Ruff.

Along the track we found a single Carob Tree (Canatonia siliqua) and Blue Hound's-tongue (Cyonoglossum creticum). In the marshland towards the end of our walk we also found Narrow-leaved Water Plantain (Alisma lanceolatum) and Rough-fruited Buttercup (Ranunculus muricatus). We walked on the track across the marsh finding European Pond Terrapin and then on to the beach passing a spectacular display of the white flowered Water Crowfoot (Ranunculus peltatus) and finding Tawny Pipit and numbers of Spotted Flycatchers on the open ground towards the beach that were arriving as migrants.

We retraced our steps to the bus and had our picnic near the main beach at Son Bou before driving on to Cap de Favaritx. The landscape forms a dramatic wind swept peninsula, with mounds of vegetation composed of specialist and often endemic 'socorral' plants. On the route in we saw the endemic Vetch (*Anthylis balearica*) in flower. The areas along the track are increasingly fenced off to protect this rare plant community, so we proceeded to the remaining small parking area by the lighthouse. There is an ephemeral wetland here - a rare habitat - where we found Common and Little Ringed Plover, Redshank and a Curlew Sandpiper. An Osprey flew close by overhead. There were no plants on show here so we walked on to the point and had distant views of Balearic and Scopoli's Shearwaters. We then returned to Matxani Gran after another interesting day.

Day 5

Tuesday 26th April

Today we set off on the longest drive of the week to the headland of Punta Nati on the north-west tip of the island in improving weather. We couldn't stop for long on this single-track road without disrupting the local traffic, so we moved on slowly towards the car park. As we walked down to the lighthouse we enjoyed close views of Short-toed Larks. We also saw Blue Rock Thrush and had excellent views of a Stone Curlew.

On the road to the lighthouse, we found Squirting Cucumber (*Echallium elaterium*), Caper (Capparis spinosa) and Silver Ragwort (*Senecio cineraria*). Whilst on the exposed maritime headland, we found Sea Lavender (*Limonium virgatum*) and Dwarf Sea-lavender (*Limonium minutum*).

Lunch today was to be a barbecue provided by Llorenc at his father's house at the upper end of the Algendar Gorge. After driving along the narrow road and rough track to the car park at the top of the gorge we walked down into the gorge itself, where Nightingales and Cetti's Warblers were singing, and we crossed the stream to the house in its superb setting. Everything was prepared for our arrival, and we sat down to a variety of meats and pastries, accompanied by beer, soft drinks and water and followed by locally grown fruit. As we ate Egyptian Vultures from the nearby colony soared overhead along with a Booted Eagle and a Red Kite. After lunch today, we had a brief walk further up part of the gorge where we observed eight Egyptian Vultures in the air at the same time. Returning to Llorenc's house we returned to the car park, via the narrower Pass de Ravull. The old track provided some spectacular finds, including the following endemic plants: *Viola slolonifera, Sibthorpia africana, Cyclamen balearicum, Ononis crispa* and the ferns *Anagramma leptophylla, Aspelenium onopteris* and *Phyllitis sagittate*. However, our greatest find was a new population of *Lysamachia minorcensis,* once extinct in the wild but clearly reintroduced to a new site along with *Viola solonifera.*

Day 6

Wednesday 27th April

Today we had an earlier start at 8.30 picking up Javier in Mahon and driving onto the Harbour at Cala Figuera to meet up with the boat that would take us to Illa de l'Aire, a half-hour journey. Our journey through the harbour took us past Illa del Rei, Illa del Llatzeret and the fort of Sa Mola. On our route out of the harbour we had a brief glimpse of a Gull-billed Tern and a flypast of both Balearic and Scopoli's Shearwater,

Illa de l'Aire is the spring base for Menorcan bird ringing as it is the closest point to Africa. The basics of the bird ringing operation were explained and we were able to see the ringing operation in practice with observations of Willow Warbler, Robin, and Redstart. Ille de l'Aire also contains large numbers of, Lilfords Wall Lizard. Once the predominant species on Menorca they are now restricted to Menorca's Islets.

After our initial bird ringing demonstration, we walked a short distance to the lighthouse through shrubby Sea Blight (*Suada vera*) amongst which there were large numbers of Dead Horse Arum (*Helicodiceros muscivorus*) with a significant number in flower.

Peregrine Falcon were seen near the lighthouse and there are numbers of breeding Yellow-legged Gull and Audouin's Gull which overwinter in Senegal and breed later than the Yellow-legged Gull to take advantage of the available squid. We did not see any shearwaters from the lighthouse, but we did have several sightings of two Bottlenose Dolphin passing the headland.

Returning to the ringing station we had lunch and spent a little time looking at the vegetation of which the main point of interest was the endemic Mallow (*Malva miniorcensis*).

After lunch we returned to Mahon by boat and then set off for Mongofre Nou on the north east of the island. Here we explored the old salt pans for waders and found several Flamingo along with Wood Sandpiper, Green Sandpiper, Redshank, Curlew Sandpiper and Common Sandpiper.

The vegetation along the track contained the Strawberry Tree (*Arbutus unedo*), Tree Heath (*Erica arborea*), Many Flowered Heath (*Erica multiflora*) Spiny Broom (*Calicotome spinosa*) and Mediterranean Buckthorn (*Rhamnus alternatus*). After spending time at Mongofre Nou we returned to our hotel.

Day 7

Thursday 28th April

On our last full day, we travelled to S'Albufera des Grau. Unfortunately this lake was rather quiet as there appears to be increasing levels of salinity due to a lack of fresh water flowing into the wetland. We found several Great Crested Grebe, a number of Little Grebes and a Cormorant undertook a fly past.

We stopped at the Natural Park Information centre before continuing to Es Grau to explore the eastern side of the lake. Following the board walk we crossed the salt marsh which was dominated by Shrubby Glasswort amongst which we could see Rose Garlic with and without bulbils. We found a Hermann's Tortoise in the salt marsh and a Moroccan Gecko was seen on a small log. Continuing through the woodland of Aleppo Pine to the beach we then reached Es Grau itself for a coffee.

We travelled on to Sa Roca, a wooded area to the East of Monte Torro for our lunch where we found Violet Limodore (*Limodorum abortivum*) growing in the woodland. We also discovered specimens of Bumblebee Orchid (*Ophrys bombyliflora*) and Mirror Orchid (*Ophrys speculum*) along with a somewhat faded specimen of the Sawfly Orchid (*Ophrys tenthredinifera*). After lunch we drove a little distance beyond the village to look for the parasitic plant Cytinus but were unable to find a flowering specimen.

Our final stop of the day was at Monte Toro, Menorca's highest point at 357 Meters which provides a great view of the island and an opportunity to see the various sites explored through the week. Taking in the views the group had coffee and explored this religious site. On returning to our bus and taking in the northern views we found the endemic *Helichrysum ambigum* growing on the northern rock face.

Day 8

Friday 29th April

Today there were several different flights at different times returning guests home. Those around for an early morning walk saw a Turtle Dove on the wires along the track and heard multiple Nightingales and Cetti's Warblers. Martin caught an early flight leaving for the airport at 8.00am, while others explored the grounds of Matxani Gran and Mahon before flying home.
