Less than 100 new COVID-19 cases recorded, roadmap to ease restrictions to be released

Victoria recorded its lowest number of new overnight COVID-19 cases in nearly two months on Monday and Premier Daniel Andrews has announced a "roadmap" to ease restrictions will be released this weekend.

Department of Health and Human

Services (DHHS) figures showed 73 new cases were recorded on Monday, bringing the state's total to 19,080, with 2620 of those classed as active.

It's the lowest number of new daily cases since July 3, when 66 new cases were confirmed.

The department also recorded 41 new deaths from the virus, however

of that number 33 people died in the weeks leading up to August 27 and were only reported to the DHHS by aged care facilities on Sunday. Only eight of the 41 deaths occurred in the past 24 hours.

It brings the state's overall number of deaths from the virus to 565.

Regional Victoria's active cases have slowly decreased over the past weeks since stage three restrictions were introduced on August 5.

As of Monday there were a total 154 active cases in regional parts of the state.

The latest data for local cases comes from August 30 when the

Central Goldfields Shire had a total of two cases, one of which was active.

The Pyrenees had three total cases, with one active.

Mount Alexander (nine total cases), Hepburn (2) and Loddon (4) had no active cases.

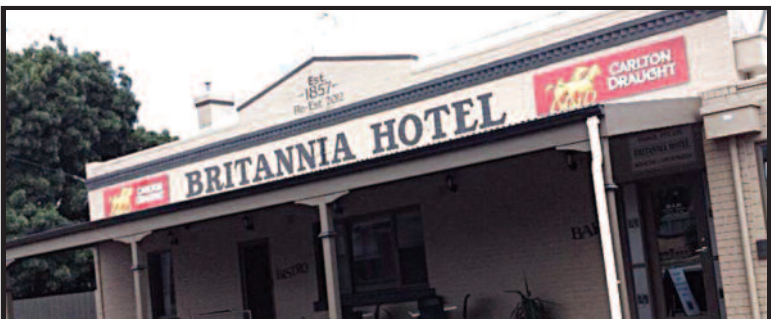

Appeal for information after fence is vandalised

Police are encouraging community members with information regarding the recent vandalism of a fence in Urquart Street, Carisbrook to come forward.

It's believed that between 6 pm on Monday, August 10 and 6.10 pm on Tuesday, August 11, an unknown person has used black spray paint to graffiti along the entire fence line of an address in Urquart Street.

Maryborough Police Leading Senior Constable David Scott said the incident is "disappointing", particularly for the property owner.

"It's disappointing for people who keep their properties in a nice, neat condition and have a bit of pride in their place," he said.

"If you look at how the nature strip is mowed and maintained it's clear this property owner does have some pride in their property so it's certainly disappointing."

While it's unclear how much it will cost to remove the graffiti, the Central Goldfields Shire Council spends between \$20,000 and \$25,000 each year cleaning up or fixing graffiti and chief administrator Noel Harvey said each incident is "disheartening" for the community.

"It is very disappointing to see private and public facilities vandalised. The property that is being damaged belongs to someone or it's for the whole community to enjoy so seeing graffiti on our buildings is really disheartening," he said.

"I encourage all of our residents to take pride in our shire and take care

of our public facilities and other people's property."

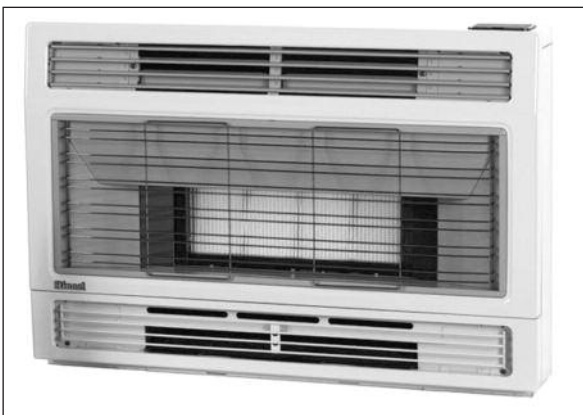
Led Sen Con Scott encouraged any community members with information about the incident to get in touch with local police on 5460-3300 or Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000.

"We're absolutely encouraging anyone with information to get in touch, if anyone knows of someone who's had a black can of spray paint lately and something is a bit awry, it would be nice to nip it in the bud," he said.

Coalition hits out at Premier's State of Emergency plan

Plans by the State Government to extend Victoria's State of Emergency for a further 12 months could be reduced following backlash from the Coalition.

Last week Premier Daniel Andrews announced plans to pass legislation to extend the State of Emergency, which first came into effect on March 16 and has been extended each month since then.

The State of Emergency allows rules to be enforced including the wearing of face masks in public, restrictions on the number of patrons allowed in places like restaurants and cafes, and fines for disobeying restrictions — it does not relate to which restrictions are in place or for how long.

Currently, it is only able to operate for a maximum of six consecutive months which is due to expire on September 13, and Mr Andrews said last week the State of Emergency would be extended for another year — bringing it to a total of 18 months.

During his press conference last Monday, Mr Andrews said the State of Emergency cannot end on September 13.

"We simply can't have those important rules and the legal framework that sits behind them end on September 13 because this virus won't have ended by then," he said.

However, the announcement caused backlash from the opposition including Member for Ripon Louise Staley who said a 12-month extension is too long and that the

Liberal Party will be proposing amendments to the bill.

"I am deeply concerned about this blatant power grab by Daniel Andrews. A 12-month extension to the State of Emergency is too long," she said.

"Of course, we can't go from stage four in Melbourne and stage three here to stage zero overnight but 12 months is too long an extension with no oversight.

"My colleagues and I in the Liberal Party will be proposing several amendments to this bill. These include a requirement to resubmit to the Parliament every month to extend the State of Emergency and that this extension of powers only applies to the current COVID-19 pandemic."

In a statement on Friday the Liberal Nationals announced they would propose a number of amendments to Labor's legislation, including that the State of Emergency only be renewed on a month-by-month basis subject to Parliamentary approval in both chambers, remove the proposal for current State of Emergency powers to apply even when there are no COVID-19 cases in Victoria, and

that any amendments to renew State of Emergency powers are only applicable to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Member for Mallee Anne Webster said Labor's 12-month extension could lead to unnecessary restrictions and a "clear plan" is needed moving forward.

"If this extension was implemented, regional Victoria could be forced back into further unnecessary wide-ranging restrictions," she said.

"An emergency demands a precise and rapid response, with an identifiable beginning and a recognisable end point.

"This is not what we are seeing. Instead, we are experiencing the complete lack of State Government planning to either get us through this or get us out of it.

"Rather than a continuous, rolling State of Emergency, a clear plan is needed, to put in place rapid, targeted responses to future outbreaks. Our communities need to have confidence they will be able to get back to work, back to school and to see their families again.

"The extension of a State of Emergency gives the Premier and his government the ability to operate without Parliamentary oversight, without the checks and balances which our democracy demands. The State of Emergency vests total power with the Premier and a small number of unelected officials with little accountability.

"The Parliament of Victoria cannot let these restrictions go on for a moment longer than is absolutely necessary or without explanation and full disclosure of the facts."

Scam targeting residents

Police are encouraging the community to stay vigilant on Facebook after several residents were targeted by a recent scam.

In the last fortnight, Maryborough Police have received at least three reports of attempted scams where the victim is contacted on Facebook and asked to send intimate images of themselves.

Maryborough Police Leading Senior Constable David Scott said upon receipt of any private images, the scammer uses them to blackmail the victim.

"There's been a Facebook scam going around with a person who has been befriending people in the area," he said.

"Their Facebook page says they're located at Aireys Inlet and they've been befriending males, getting them to send some intimate images and is then blackmailing them.

"This person is saying that if you pay them money, they won't forward the images you sent and upon receiving any payment, reports are that this person is forwarding them anyway."

Led Sen Con Scott said he's aware of three residents who have been targeted by the scam and encouraged community members not to send intimate images of themselves on social media.

"Please don't send intimate images over Facebook and if this person does try and contact you, please block them immediately," he said.

"We believe this individual has added someone local on Facebook and has then gone through their

friends list adding others.

"There are three incidents that I'm aware of and it is a concern, particularly when at least one of the victims has paid money."

According to Scamwatch, Australians have lost more than \$23 million to dating and romance type scams already this year, with July alone seeing \$3.9 million lost.

Scamwatch states any of the following are warning signs you may be the target of a scam:

- You meet someone online and after just a few contacts they profess strong feelings for you and ask to chat with you privately. If you met on a dating site they will try and move you away from the site and communicate via chat or email.

- Their profile on the internet dating website or their Facebook page is not consistent with what they tell you. For example, their profile picture looks different to their description of themselves, or they say they are university educated but their English is poor.

- After gaining your trust — often waiting weeks, months or even years — they tell you an elaborate story and ask for money, gifts or your bank account/credit card details.

- Their messages are often poorly written, vague and escalate quickly from introduction to love.

If you believe you have been scammed, report it to the website, app or social media site the scammer first approached you on and if you believe they have your bank details, contact your bank immediately.

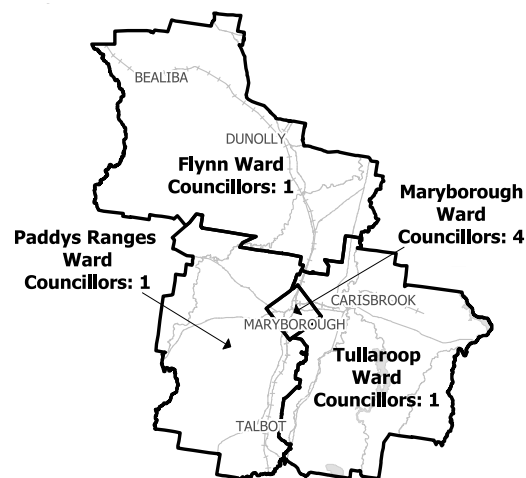

Council adopts changes to help identify flood risks

The Central Goldfields Shire Council has resolved to update existing planning controls for identifying flood risks in Carisbrook and Dunolly.

At last week's ordinary council meeting, administrators moved to make changes to Central Goldfields Planning Scheme C031cgo1, which will implement the findings of the Dunolly Flood Investigation 2014 and Carisbrook Flood and Drainage Management Plan 2013.

According to the report tabled to council, the amendment means the planning scheme maps and controls will be used to identify the risk of flooding and flood damage on all new developments on land within the nominated overlays.

Central Goldfields Shire administrator Karen Douglas said the amendment will ensure future development is designed to manage flooding in a "much safer way".

"Amending the planning scheme to address flood risk for the townships of both Carisbrook and Dunolly has been recognised as a high priority in the North Central Regional Flood Plan management strategy of 2018-2028," she said.

"Until now, council has had to rely on pretty much outdated and fairly sketchy information to support planning decisions in these townships and this amendment will ensure that future development is designed to manage flooding in a much safer way."

Council exhibited the amendment from May 22 until July 23 and received 12 submissions, two which were withdrawn, five in support and five in objection.

The report states the five ob-

jections received included submissions from landowners objecting to the application of overlay controls on their land and were seeking to have the overlay extent either completely removed or reduced, as well as a group submission objecting to the amendment as a whole.

During the meeting, administrators moved to request the Minister for Planning Richard Wynne appoint an independent planning panel to consider the five outstanding objections.

Speaking to the report tabled to council, Ms Douglas said both council and the North Central Catchment Management Authority (NCCMA) do not view the objections as "justified" given the circumstances.

"While a minor change to the amendment is warranted in response to one submission, which refers to a property in Dunolly which as a result of recent flood mitigation works is deemed unlikely to be affected, both council and the north central CMA do not regard the other requested changes as justified and adopting all of them would diminish the effect of the amendment and undermine its overall strategic

justification," she said.

"A repeated concern is in relation to the timing of this amendment in light of the proposed flood mitigation works in Carisbrook, which as most people would realise has not been completed yet.

"Unfortunately, these final stages of the works have not been completed and the amendment is funded to progress immediately, so it can only deal with what is the existing situation.

"However, when this final stage of the mitigation works is completed, a subsequent assessment and changes can be made to the planning controls."

Central Goldfields Shire chief administrator Noel Harvey said the amendment is the "next step" in mitigating flood risk for Carisbrook and Dunolly residents.

"This has been a long time coming when we consider the last major flood was nearly 10 years ago, it is quite amazing that we have not been able to have this mapping done up until now," he said.

"This is the next step in providing some certainty for the residents and property owners in Carisbrook and Dunolly."

Region escapes damage from windy weather

Despite winds of up to 80 kilometres an hour whipping across the region late last Thursday, Maryborough's SES Unit received just one call out but say the strong winds serve as a reminder for the community.

According to the Bureau of Meteorology Ballarat recorded wind gusts of up to 80 km/h at around 6 pm on Thursday, while gusts in Bendigo reached a high of 65 kilometres an hour.

While no data is available for Maryborough and surrounds, gusts of between 30 and 40 km/h

continued from 7 through to 9 pm on Thursday before dying off in neighbouring Ballarat and Bendigo.

Maryborough SES Unit deputy controller Aleisha Borg said despite the strong winds experienced across the region, the unit was only called to one fallen tree in Phelan Road, Maryborough at 2.20 pm.

"It was good that we had just the one call out, they were strong winds so I think we were pretty fortunate in that regard," she said.

"The call we did have was for a fairly big tree that was right across Phelan Road blocking traffic both ways.

"Police were on scene when we arrived and we worked for a little while before the council turned up and pushed the tree off the road with

some machinery, traffic was probably blocked for 30 to 45 minutes."

Ms Borg said while the unit wasn't kept busy, last week's strong winds are a good reminder for the community to ensure they have things in place for when bad weather strikes.

"Make sure anything that's loose is tied down, even blinds on houses can come loose and cause damage if winds are strong enough," she said.

"Trampolines in particular should be secured as best as they can be, I don't think anyone wants to find their neighbour's trampoline flying around in their backyard."

Kody's poster takes top spot in platypus project

Carisbrook Primary School students have been drawing for a cause, entering a poster-making competition to help protect platypus populations, and 12-year-old Kody Clarke has taken out the top prize for his design.

The competition is a joint initiative of Bacchus Marsh Platypus Alliance, Melbourne Water's Waterwatch program and the Werribee River Association and called for young people aged 18 and under to design a poster with the theme 'please protect our platypus'.

Fellow Carisbrook students Eden Weaver and Noah Kerville were runners up in the competition and Kody's poster was one of a number of winning designs selected, and will now be used to raise awareness of the importance of protecting the platypus and its habitat.

While Kody hasn't spotted any of the local platypus that inhabit waterways around Carisbrook, the drawing aspect of the competition piqued his interest.

"I liked the drawing part," he said. "I was happy and excited when I found out I won."

Carisbrook Primary School grade 5/6 teacher Kate McLoughlin said the competition was a big hit with students.

"We asked all our grade five and six students to design a poster and most of them were really excited about it," she said.

"The organisers were so impressed by the number of entries from Carisbrook that they created a Carisbrook section for the competition which was really nice."

According to Melbourne Water, platypus can get tangled in litter that is washed into rivers and creeks from the street and some of the poster artwork will be used in signs and other messages to help remind people to dispose of litter properly.

Ms McLoughlin said the competition tied in with the students' animal unit and that they're hoping to see Kody's poster in action.

"We've just finished a whole unit

of animal studies so that tied in nicely," she said.

"They'll be displaying the posters on social media to show people how they can protect the platypus and our waterways.

"They'll also be using it on signs and leaflets. Hopefully we'll be sent some copies of the poster being used once the COVID restrictions have relaxed a bit and they can get out and distribute them."

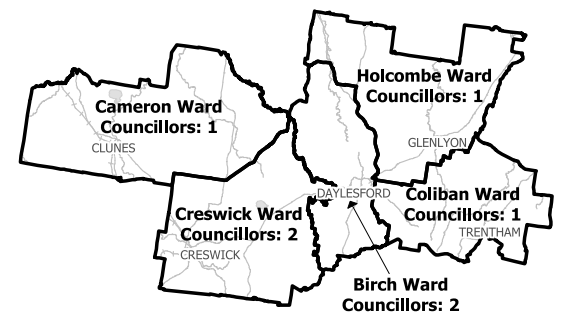

Targeted approach “logical”

Regional Australia frequently finds itself bearing the brunt of urban centric policy which hurts its communities.

State Government responses to the pandemic have shown a blatant disregard for communities who live as one entity across borders.

The social cohesion normally enjoyed by cross border communities has been shredded by poor policy, such as blanket restrictions as opposed to target approaches, which has fundamentally altered how regional populations live.

Every aspect of daily life has been reshaped, altering how families live, business operates, and services such as healthcare and education are delivered.

People’s lives have been turned upside down and with little publicly understood medical evidence to justify demands.

A targeted approach to outbreaks is a logical response, but instead, small rural and regional settings

have been gathered into the COVID narrative with active postcodes in Melbourne. The narrative has been damaging.

The pandemic has challenged our federation as never before.

Border closures have not only disrupted the social fabric of regional life, it has been of dubious gain or benefit to those communities and indeed the state.

The Australian federation was never designed to maintain hard borders, as Section 92 and 117 of the Constitution makes clear.

I believe the Federal Government has a responsibility to ensure that our domestic borders do not remain barriers which undermine the unity and sovereignty of Australia as a nation.

Australian citizens expect our democratic system of government results in elected

officials providing due transparency and accountability for the decisions they make.

While medical advice has been the ongoing excuse for blanket rules and regulations being imposed on communities, that evidence has not been provided to communities. There has been little if any appeals process which has been opaque.

These basic factors undermine our democracy in a way Australia has not experienced before. My concern is that a precedent has now been set by state governments, which could be repeated more easily the next time. The question is what could trigger these controls in the future?

I welcome the Prime Minister’s determination that a national definition of hotspot be made very clear. That way hotspots can be addressed where they exist, rather than causing wide ranging pain in regions where there is scant reason to do so.

Clear plan needed

There was widespread concern across regional and rural Victoria when it was revealed that more than half of students recorded a drop in VCE results over the past decade. The gap in achievement between city and country students was widening.

Evidence shows us two things about education in Victoria — country kids are disadvantaged and remote education has a significant negative impact of student learning.

Last year, eight of the 10 poorest performing secondary schools, based on median study scores, were in rural and regional Victoria.

This ‘disadvantage crisis’ forced Labor’s Education Minister to, reluctantly, look at the issue.

No sooner had the report on poor achievement in regional and rural schools been finalised, the minister immediately took action that again disadvantaged our students.

Teachers in metropolitan areas were given six pupil free days to prepare for the second round of

remote learning, but teachers in rural and regional Victoria were given one day.

In the last two weeks 29 local government areas in rural and regional Victoria have had no confirmed cases of COVID, with another eight having less than three.

It is important the Andrews Labor Government explain their plan for a return to school and not just say that it will happen sometime in term four.

If this means bringing schools back in COVID free parts of Victoria sooner, explain how and when this will happen.

The Andrews Labor Government must stop treating teachers and students in regional and rural Victoria as the poor cousins.

Lost trees replaced in Phillips Gardens

Eleven new trees have been planted in Phillips Gardens as part of a \$20,000 grant, as the Central Goldfields Shire Council adopts a new tree management plan.

Made possible through the State Government's Growing Victoria's Botanic Gardens fund, the new trees are replacements for those that have died from drought in the past 20 years.

Council's parks and gardens team have replicated the original trees as closely as possible with the new ones, with original garden maps showing tree locations and species used.

Central Goldfields Shire team leader town pride Wayne Pritchard said members of the community will recognise the placement and species of trees, which were planted last week.

"The trees are replacements for old trees that have died out over the years and we have tried to replace them as best we can, there are one or two where we couldn't get the exact variety but they're pretty close to it," he said.

"The replacement trees are also very close to where the older ones

were, in some cases we could actually see the old root systems as we dug the holes.

"There will be members of the community who'll remember the trees we're replacing, they'll walk through and say, 'oh I remember when that tree was here', they'll notice for sure."

Central Goldfields Shire general manager infrastructure assets and

planning Rebecca Stockfeld said the \$20,000 grant also allows for botanical signs for the new trees, which are expected to arrive in the near future.

She said maintaining a community asset like Phillips Gardens is of "significant" importance.

"Our community loves these gardens and lots of people come here through the course of the year to

walk through or have their lunch, it's a great social space," she said.

"This grant was to bring back some of the trees we've lost in the past 15-20 years but we do work to maintain the gardens throughout the year, they're significant for the community.

"Grants like these are a good opportunity to put in some significant trees and we've put in some very advanced species, they've come in already established and they'll just grow."

Ms Stockfeld said council have also applied for additional funding from the Growing Victoria's Botanic Gardens fund for irrigation work in the gardens.

"This funding round from the State Government opens regularly and we've just made a second application for quite a significant amount of money to do irrigation work in the gardens to keep them at their best all year-round and using water as sensibly and sensitively as we can," she said.

"We have our fingers crossed for a positive outcome on that one as well."

The additional trees come just after council adopted a Tree Management Plan at last week's ordinary council meeting.

Trees throughout the shire have

previously been managed without a formal management plan and following tragedies where tree failures have resulted in deaths in other Victorian councils, investigations have highlighted the need for robust tree management plans to mitigate further incidents.

The plan covers street trees, trees in parks and gardens and caravan parks.

The report tabled to council during last week's meeting indicated council conducts tree assessments on a largely reactive basis and the newly adopted plan would allow council to manage risks associated with trees throughout the shire's townships.

A street tree inventory undertaken in 2016 saw more than 8000 trees assessed and recorded and Ms Stockfeld said as this inventory process is expanded, it's likely the number of trees council manages will be closer to 10,000.

"Council has thousands of trees that it owns and at a minimum, at least for our risk management, we need to make sure we're assessing those trees regularly to ensure limbs aren't going to fall and put the community at risk," she said.

"The trees need to be managed to ensure the community is safe and we get the best value out the trees."

Roadmap to reopen Victoria to be phased, safe and steady

Ballarat had a total of 61 cases, with six still active, while Greater Bendigo had 102 total with 10 active.

"Regional Victorians are doing a fantastic job, as are the vast majority of all Victorians, but the numbers are low in regional Victoria and we want to keep them that way," Premier Andrews said during his daily press conference on Monday.

"Testing is critical, please come forward and get tested if you have

even the mildest symptoms, as soon as those symptoms begin.

"That's a really important thing you can do and it gives us a more complete picture of how many cases are out there and we're then able to work with you to keep you safe, your family safe and others you've been in close contact with."

Mr Andrews also announced on Monday that a roadmap to ease Victoria's current restrictions will be released this Sunday.

"On September 6 we'll be announcing the roadmap to ease these restrictions," he said.

"I know and understand that just as the vast majority of Victorians are doing the right thing, they also want the clearest picture possible of what the next phase looks like.

"We will defeat this second wave, and if we do it properly — and we will — with a phased, appropriate, safe and steady opening up we will avoid a third wave."

The State Government announced it will undertake an intensive and extensive round of discussions with industry, unions and community organisations this week to inform the final development of Victoria's roadmap to 'COVID normal'.

The consultation will be based around six principles for industry on a COVIDSafe re-opening, based on the best advice from public health experts.

"There will be a number of key

principles that underpin this roadmap," Mr Andrews said.

"This includes ensuring physical distancing is maintained such as following density requirements, making sure staff work from home wherever possible, limiting the total number of staff and customers in any enclosed area, stopping carpooling — that has to be a feature of opening up and getting people back to work — wearing a face covering at all times in the work place and ensuring PPE is used."

Ashley gets ready to chop her long locks

Growing up, local Ashley van der Hulst always had flowing long, blonde locks until she underwent the chop for charity in 2014. Six years on, she's ready to do it again.

With her hair reaching far past her back now, Ashley looks like her old self, but after several people in her life have been affected by cancer in the last two to three years, Ashley said she knew it was time to 'rock the chop' by signing on with the Cancer Council's Ponytail Project.

"I've done a very similar thing before, but it wasn't registered through the Ponytail Project," she said.

"By registering through the Ponytail Project all money raised goes to the Cancer Council and my hair will go to the Sustainable Salons Australia group. They then make wigs and donate them to Variety, the children's charity which helps kids with cancer or alopecia."

Sustainable Salons, who distribute hair once it is made into wigs, need to collect at least 4000 ponytails of 20 centimetres or longer annually to make enough wigs for those living without hair due to medically-induced hair-loss conditions.

Ashley said that apart from her last donation in 2014 where she chopped her hair publicly for the Cancer Council, she has always had long hair which she has learned not to take for granted.

"Going from long hair to short hair, it is a big change and it changes the way you feel about yourself. It's

something that people always notice and want to bring up in conversation," she said.

"I'm lucky that it's something that I can choose to do where as losing your hair involuntarily to a condition or disease, I'd hate to know what that would feel like.

"From my last donation I heard stories from people firsthand who said that it can be quite embarrassing and shameful and they definitely don't deserve to feel that way. Especially while they're

going through such a tough time already, they don't need that added stress."

The Cancer Council estimates that a person is diagnosed with some form of cancer in Australia every four minutes, which adds up to around 145,000 Aussies per year.

A figure that unfortunately, Ashley and her circle of friends and family have not been able to escape.

"Over the years, particularly the last two to three years, I've definitely had my fair share of bad news and loss due to cancer," she said.

"It comes in all different forms and some have passed on in their battles, others who have gone through remission and recovered and others have had scares so it's something that's definitely really close to me. I just felt it was the right time to do it again.

"It's a horrible thing to watch and I can't even begin to imagine what it's like to go through it.

"It's nice to know that something as small as me chopping off my hair can raise some money, provide some comfort in a wig and also put a smile on peoples faces."

A resident of Dunolly, Ashley is currently stuck in NSW due to the COVID-19 border restrictions and hopes that she will be able to return home to the Central Goldfields to have her chop in October.

So far, Ashley has raised almost \$800 of her \$1000 goal, which will go towards cancer research and supporting programs which help those who are battling the disease, but still has over a month and a half of fundraising to go.

Avian influenza has struck another Golden Plains Shire egg farm and an emu farm near Kerang.

Work progresses but threat remains with avian influenza

AVIAN INFLUENZA

Agriculture Victoria has now completed work on depopulating the four poultry farms confirmed to have avian influenza in the Golden Plains Shire and East Gippsland.

Victoria's Chief Veterinary Officer Dr Graeme Cooke said that while this was an important milestone as part of eradication efforts, this did not mean the threat was over.

"We're urging everyone to remain vigilant and be alert to the presence of sick or dead birds, either in their own backyard hens or flocks, and in wild birds," he said.

"Avian influenza is present in our wild birds and environment, so it can occasionally spill into our domestic bird populations. It is crucial that we can identify these cases quickly so we can stop it spreading.

"Report sick or dead birds anywhere in the state to the 24-hour Emergency Animal Disease Watch Hotline on 1800 675 888 to help us eradicate avian influenza."

On Thursday last week avian influenza was also confirmed at an additional egg farm in the Golden Plains Shire and an emu farm near Kerang.

Dr Cooke said Agriculture Victoria was acting swiftly to contain the outbreaks.

"The Golden Plains egg farm has been placed under quarantine after being confirmed as having high pathogenic H7N7 avian influenza. It has about 37,000 birds on site within the existing restricted area," he said.

Dr Cooke said Agriculture Victoria has been undertaking regular surveillance at the property as part of its response to avian influenza in the high-risk area,

which has allowed for the rapid identification and containment of the disease at an early stage.

"Agriculture Victoria will undertake the appropriate actions to depopulate and decontaminate the site," he said.

The new detection requires a small revision to the existing restricted area, but the control area remains the same size spanning the Golden Plains Shire.

The emu farm near Kerang reported sick birds to Agriculture Victoria and subsequent testing has confirmed low pathogenic H7N6 avian influenza. This is a different strain of avian influenza than is currently impacting poultry farms in Golden Plains Shire and is not linked to previous cases of avian influenza.

The property has about 8000 farmed emus and is under quarantine. A restricted area of two km and a control area of five km is now in place around the farm.

"Thank you to the property owners who notified us quickly when they noticed sick birds," Dr Cooke said.

A strain of highly pathogenic avian influenza (H7N7) virus was first detected at a free-range egg farm near Lethbridge on July 31, with a second affected farm confirmed to have the virus on August 6. A turkey farm in the Golden Plains Shire and at Bairnsdale were found to have the low pathogenic strain (H5N2) of avian influenza on August 10.

"With no live birds remaining on the infected properties, work is now underway to thoroughly decontaminate the sites to ensure we eliminate all remnants of the virus," Dr Cooke said.

Dr Cooke said movement controls of domestic birds, bird products or equipment, into, out of or within the restricted and control areas, spanning all of the Golden Plains Shire and the specified area near Bairnsdale, is not allowed without a permit from Agriculture Victoria.

"This includes buying, selling or moving eggs, manure and chickens, whether on the side of the road, from your property, your local store, online (such as Gumtree or Facebook) or at markets," he said.

"Purchasing eggs or chicken meat in retail food outlets or supermarkets is not restricted," he said.

"These controls will remain in place until we are confident that the disease has not spread further and has been eradicated."

In addition, a housing order is in place for Golden Plains Shire requiring all bird owners (pet, backyard and commercial) in the area to house or keep them in an enclosure for a minimum of 30 days from August 7.

If you have pet birds or backyard hens or flocks in the restricted or control areas near Bairnsdale or in Golden Plains Shire, you must observe all associated restrictions.

The Department of Health and Human Services has confirmed the H7N7 and H5N2 strains of avian influenza are not a risk to the public as they rarely affect humans unless there is direct and close contact with sick birds.

There are no food safety issues identified — properly cooked chicken meat and eggs are safe to eat.

Rust reports spark calls for monitoring

STRIPE RUST

Reports of early infections of stripe rust in some Victorian wheat crops have prompted calls from experts for growers to review their variety ratings and monitor crops for signs of the disease.

A new strain of stripe rust first detected in the southern region in 2018, which has increased virulence on wheat varieties such as DS Bennett and LR Trojan, has been the cause of many of the reported rust outbreaks.

Agriculture Victoria senior research scientist Grant Hollaway said the new strain was also showing increased virulence on durum wheat varieties including DBA Spes, DBA Lillaroi, DBA Vittaroi and EGA Bellaroi.

"We have not had too many reports of rust in recent years due to the drier conditions, but this year we are seeing it earlier than normal in

areas which have had a wet start," he said.

"However, other grain growing areas need to be on high alert too because stripe rust reproduces and spreads by spores, which are wind-blown and can travel hundreds of kilometres.

"This means we are likely to see it elsewhere this year."

Dr Hollaway encouraged growers and advisers to adopt a three-step approach in assessing stripe rust infections:

- Review crop variety ratings using a current disease guide, not last year's.
- Monitor crops closely.
- Download the new StripeRustWM app to support decision making regarding management options.

Dr Hollaway said StripeRustWM, which was developed with the support of the Grains Research and Development Corporation (GRDC) would give growers and advisers

more confidence in decisions about whether to spray.

"StripeRustWM is a powerful tool which estimates potential losses using information including variety resistance rating, plant growth stage, fungicide history, presence of rust either within the crop or in the district and climatic conditions," he said.

"The app compares expected yield, predicted loss to stripe rust and anticipated net return for the cases where fungicide is not applied, is applied once, or is applied twice."

Dr Hollaway said stripe rust is a difficult disease to predict as it is highly influenced by seasonal conditions, which the app takes into account.

"By reviewing variety ratings, monitoring crops closely and using the StripeRustWM app, growers and advisers will be able to understand what their risk profile is and plan appropriately," he said.

VFL and NEAFL set to merge

From next year just one AFL reserves competition will exist on the eastern side of Australia, with the Victorian Football League (VFL) and the North East Australian Football League (NEAFL) set to merge.

Announced by the AFL last week, the leagues which serve as the reserves pool for the national league, with nine AFL aligned clubs playing in the VFL and four in the NEAFL alongside a combined 11 stand alone clubs, will become one from 2021.

Other state-based competitions, the SANFL (South Australia), WAFL (Western Australia), TSL (Tasmania) and the NTFL (Northern Territory) will remain stand alone and it is not yet known how this newest merge will affect the women's competition, namely the VFLW.

In a statement the AFL said VFL and NEAFL clubs have three options after the announcement and confirmed that the merger was influenced heavily by the COVID-19 pandemic.

"AFL clubs based in Queensland, New South Wales and Victoria will be provided with flexibility to determine the form of their involvement in second-tier football

in 2021 with three options available to each of those; fielding a standalone team, align with an existing second-tier club or spread their AFL listed players across multiple second-tier clubs," the statement read.

"The AFL will continue to work towards ensuring greater alignment across all second-tier competitions across the country and also increase the alignment with talent programs in each state and territory.

"Second-tier football in 2021 will be a year of transition that will see the AFL take into consideration the impact of a reduced AFL Soft Cap, the level of AFL club investment and resource allocation across men's and women's football programs, any player CBA revisions and any associated impact on player list sizes.

"The model for second-tier women's football in Victoria is currently still under review with the AFL to finalise this model in due course."

The Age has since reported that the women's VFL season which usually is played in winter alongside men's football may in fact run concurrently with the AFLW season in the summer in the future, although this hasn't been confirmed.

Former Australian Test batsman and two-time Victorian Sheffield Shield title winner Chris Rogers has been appointed as the head coach for the Victorian Men's Cricket Team.

Having amassed 33,458 runs throughout his playing career, including 2015 runs in 25 tests, Rogers was appointed to Cricket Australia's High Performance team in early 2018 where he undertook a number of coaching roles including head coach of the Australian Under 19 team for the World Cup earlier this year.

Maryborough's Cam McClure got the call up for the national side under Rogers and has not long put pen to paper on a rookie contract for the Victorian men's team, where the pair will again meet face-to-face.

Speaking to Cricket Victoria, Rogers said he is excited for the opportunity and is expecting some challenges in relation to COVID-19 in the season, which is yet to be scheduled for the same reason.

"I'm really excited about the job

and I'd like to thank Cricket Victoria for the opportunity. It feels a bit like I've come full circle in playing for Victoria for seven years and now coming back into the fold as the senior coach," he said.

"I'm looking forward to working with this talented squad of players and coaches. I've been lucky enough to work with many of the Victorian players in recent years and I look forward to working with them to achieve individual and team success.

"Due to the impact of coronavirus, we know this season will come with some very new challenges for us, but we'll continue to prepare as best we can and come ready to play when the time is right."

Cricket Victoria CEO Andrew Ingleton said Rogers is highly regarded in cricket circles, making him the ideal candidate among a strong pool.

"Chris is highly regarded and his technical knowledge, organisational skills and commitment to high performance are qualities that will serve him well in this position," he said.

"We will start off with the one-day season as normal and hopefully we can get that full fixture in and get back out there and play."

Recent data released by Cricket Australia outlined that Victorians led the nation on participation for the sport and while the MDCA is small, Allen said there have certainly been some "new faces" around the traps over the last few seasons.

"We have had a few new faces over the past year or two which is really good, to have players join our league provides a bit of variety in the competition," he said.

"It's a credit to the clubs and, I reckon, a credit to the wickets. For an association our size I always say just how good our wickets are and I think once players come from outside they realise how good a majority of our facilities are."

Allen recognises that this season

in particular produces a rare opportunity for local turf wickets, with little to no football played on ovals due to COVID-19.

"It's one of the rare opportunities where all turf wickets should be ready to go because there has been no footy on the grounds and I'd say that's a once in a lifetime situation for sure," he said.

The league was unable to field a 16 and under cricket competition last season due to lack of numbers and Allen is hopeful that it will make its return if possible this season.

"We fight hard every season to find a way to field each grade and especially junior cricket," he said.

"It was sad not to have that grade last season, but maybe some kids that are usually into their winter sports might want to have a go at cricket after a long time at home."

Allen hopes a flow-on effect for senior cricket may also be a renewed interest in the sport from

locals, who without any winter activity, may be itching to have a crack at something new this summer.

"I think people are keen to get out and do something and play some sport after almost six months out of it," he said.

"We've sent out an email to clubs to see what teams they'll be fielding and we will go from there.

"We'd invite anyone who is wanting to get involved or return to cricket to do so. There's nothing better than getting out and being active and being around your mates. I really miss it.

"You'll never take anything for granted after this that's for sure."

Players are encouraged to connect with local clubs with the league stretching from Maryborough and its surrounding towns such as Carisbrook, Dunolly and Talbot and as far as Creswick and Clunes.

Regular start for Australian Open planned

Tennis Australia has recently confirmed that they are planning for the 2021 Australian Open to still go ahead in January and in Melbourne, despite coronavirus.

Chief executive Craig Tiley has revealed his organisation has already put detailed plans in place to ensure the Australian Open can go ahead as scheduled in Melbourne in January, despite all current sport such as AFL, NRL and Super Netball heading north due to Victoria's second wave of COVID-19

and restrictions.

Concerns have already been expressed over a tournament that is still almost six months away and Tiley admitted the Australian Open is set to look very different in 2021.

Reduced crowds, bio-secure hotels for players and quarantine issues have all been considered, with Tiley telling The Australian Associated Press that the situation in Melbourne could remain fluid up to the planned start of the event in January.

"We made the decision this week to go with that scenario from a

number of options," he said.

"We will not hit the numbers we had last year, a record 821,000 through the gates. Our fans will be from Melbourne and Victoria, interstate, as well as potentially New Zealanders, if they lift border restrictions. But the 15 percent we get from overseas will likely not be here.

"There is no question the current lockdown in Melbourne is not ideal for people today, but positive for the future. If we get on top of the infection rate, we will all have learned some good lessons."

MDCA planning for October start date for season 2020/21

The Maryborough and District Cricket Association (MDCA) is hoping to bring some normalcy back to the community this year, with a plan to start cricket in October as per usual.

While the MDCA is of course bound by government restrictions and Cricket Victoria guidelines, returning league president Mark Allen said if all goes to plan, local cricketers could be back on the

park within a few months.

This is a particularly important step for cricket as it was one of the first sports affected by COVID-19, with the 2019/20 finals series and grand final in March of this year cancelled due to the risks associated with the virus.

“As always we are guided by Cricket Victoria, I would expect an announcement on community cricket this month when hopefully restrictions are eased. But for now,

we are planning for the season to start pretty much in mid-October when it normally does,” he said.

“It was frustrating that our finals series was impacted by COVID-19, we just can’t wait to get back into it and feel a bit normal.

“We’re knocking some provisional fixtures up because we can hit the ground running pretty quickly once we get the green light.

“To start any later than October

would be really disappointing. Just for everyone’s sanity at this point it’ll be good to get back out there, especially with no footy going ahead it’s been a quiet few months.”

The local cricket season usually kicks off with the one-day cup which is wrapped up before the Christmas/New Year break, followed by the major title, the two-day cup usually played in March.

Cricket Victoria has given associations until late April to finish

their cricket competitions in 2021, given what could be a delayed start due to COVID-19.

“There is a bit of flexibility in the fixture dates this season so if we had to start a bit later (than October) we could,” Allen said.

“In A grade especially we still want to have both the one and two-day cups, but we will consult with clubs about that.
