Welcome to my 2021 list. It has been a very late season here at Dryad Nursery but our much-awaited Summer List is being finalised for a Saturday night 31st July launch. There will be a slight change from usual as I have just not had time to put the list onto the website pages, so instead you will order from the pdf which has details and images of all the items – almost 200 different species and cultivars. I will put a link to an updated list of availability on our home page every so often, so that you can see which are sold out. Each item has an item number which should make ordering easier. Orders will be by email as usual. So many things have happened over the last few years but as we are hopefully approaching a return to normality it is time for me to take stock.

As time becomes more precious, I have decided to free myself up to concentrate on two key areas, my first love, miniature Narcissus and my Dryad breeding programme snowdrop ranges: Dryad Golds, Myths & Legends, a new 'Snow Range' and another development (of which more exciting announcements later, but as a three word clue: 'Ipcoc', 'Yellow' and 'Range'). Both these latter two ranges are undergoing my normal rigorous selection & naming process to ensure they are unique, stunning and worthy to be named.

I have much enjoyed working in the snowdrop world and have developed strong friendships with so many of my customers over the years. Therefore, and as this will be my last offerings of many of our non-Dryad varieties, I wanted to thank all my customers with a 'Bumper List', keenly priced to allow my remaining stock to be widely available. Hopefully there will be something there for everybody as a thank you for all your support.

I will be conducting Ebay listings of resting bulbs, including some of the Dryad Golds, Dryad Myths & Legends, some of the Estonian series and other rare cultivars shortly.

Next year in the winter I will be offering my Dryad specials in the green as usual.

I recommend you email in your order as soon as possible. If you wish to telephone, I will note the time of your request and slot it into the appropriate place among the email requests.

I hope you enjoy browsing, and look forward to hearing from you.

PLEASE NOTE – MOST ITEMS ARE IN VERY LIMITED NUMBERS, SO PLEASE APPLY EARLY, LAST DATE FOR ORDERS AUGUST 14 2021. ALL ITEMS OFFERED SUBJECT TO SUCCESSFUL HARVEST. As usual, we will also have a selection of our very special items on ebay for those not fast enough to order from the main list.

UK orders will be sent as soon as I can. Orders to outside the UK will all be sent together, after the ebay listings are finished, as they will all need to be inspected together by FERA before dispatch. All plants are flowering size, unless otherwise specified.

POSTAGE AND PACKING – UK £5-50 per order. I am asking for less than the actual cost of delivery and packaging. If your order can be sent as Large Letter, I will refund any extra postage. Parcels will be sent by first class post, recorded delivery, so will need to be signed for. Orders can be collected from my home address if you are in the area.

USA Shipping at cost plus £35 contribution to Phytosanitary certificate. Customers in the USA may order narcissus **but not** snowdrops. As it now costs £30 for each Phytosanitary certificate, on top of the soil sampling costs and fees for the inspectors' visits, American customers may combine orders with a friend, but the shipping can only be insured for £250 maximum. I will not post until the ebay listings finish, in case you wish to bid on the narcissus listed.

ESTONIAN BIRD DOUBLE SNOWDROPS

These new double varieties have the stamp of that great plantsman Taavi Tuulik who bred and developed the range in Estonia, along with the excellent Estonian Spirit range grown and introduced by Dryad Nursery.

Taavi chose to name the series after Estonian birds. There are varieties with wonderful inner markings, quite distinct amongst the doubles and those with elongated inner petals like Berthille, which give them a petticoat appearance. We are proud to be able to release some of these stunning new varieties making a major addition to the double snowdrop varieties available to discerning collectors.

Taavi's own notes on the group:

Galanthus Estonian Birds Group is created by Taavi Tuulik from hand pollinated seeds using *Galanthus nivalis* 'Flore Pleno' as a male parent. The crossings were made in open garden 2007-2008 and were not fully controlled. Female parents were:




The Estonian Spirit Group of snowdrops were discovered by renowned Estonian plantsman Taavi Tuulik in abandoned gardens and woods in Estonia and named as part of the Spirit family due to their pale, ghostly coloration and residual presence in abandoned or secluded areas.










As a group they are distinct by their generally compact stature, very pale leaves and ethereal colouring of ovary and inner mark – a very pale creamy yellow. A distinctive and outstanding diminutive form of *G. nivalis*, and a very different treasure for your collection.










Outer segments have green shading in the central section, while the inner segments have a deep green apical mark to half the length, usually shaded green to the base. Late flowering.</p>	
<p>G40 Galanthus The Bride</p> <p>£ 30</p> <p>7 available</p>	<p>A beautiful poculiform variety of <i>G. elwesii</i></p>	
<p>G41 Galanthus Trymlet</p> <p>£ 15</p> <p>10 available</p>	<p>Neat, short-growing inverse poculiform snowdrop.</p>	










<p>M1 Anemone nemorosa Evelyn Meadows</p> <p>£5</p> <p>7 available</p>	<p>Pink semi-double flowers from carmine buds and dark foliage at flowering</p>	
<p>M2 Anemone nemorosa Explosion *</p> <p>£20</p> <p>10 available</p> <p>Max 2 per customer</p>	<p>An amazing variety found in Norway after the Chernobyl disaster. The double flowers are very variable from season to season and flower to flower on the same plant. Flowers usually contain a mixture of white, green and crimson.</p>	
<p>M3 Anemone nemorosa Green Stranger</p> <p>£5</p> <p>6 available</p>	<p>Striking semi double semi-bracteate white flowers flashed with green.</p>	

<p>M4 Anemone nemorosa Salt and Pepper</p> <p>£10 10 available</p> <p>Max 2 per customer.</p>	<p>Odd anemone-centred variety with brownish-olive ring of petaloids surrounding the white centre boss.</p>	
<p>M5 Anemone nemorosa Tups</p> <p>£8 2 available</p> <p>Max 2 per customer.</p>	<p>From Estonia - Elegant large semi-double white flowers, with an occasional green flash.</p>	
<p>Anemone ranunculoides cultivars from Estonia</p> <p>These wonderful forms were collected mostly by that great plantsman, Taavi Tuulik in woods in Estonia. They grow well in the UK in woodland conditions.</p>		
<p>M6 Anemone ranunculoides Aita</p> <p>£10 6 available</p>	<p>Full double flowers</p>	
<p>M7 Anemone ranunculoides Ants</p> <p>£10 6 available</p>	<p>Anemone-centred double with neat boss of petaloids surrounded by broad rounded outers.</p>	
<p>M8 Anemone ranunculoides Aureus</p> <p>£15 3 available</p>	<p>Very full double, small green centre.</p>	
<p>M9 Anemone ranunculoides Golden Dream</p> <p>✳️</p> <p>£20 7 available</p> <p>Max 2 per customer</p>	<p>The most amazing of the Estonian yellows - flowers can vary from season to season, and within the same plant in one season. The flower usually has striking green petaloids emerging from the centre of the flower, but some flowers will be almost normal or with a condensed, dark green centre.</p>	
<p>M10 Anemone ranunculoides Hiumaa</p> <p>£4 3 available</p>	<p>Anemone-centred double with spiky inner petals, and a ring of stamens between the inners and outers. One of the first to be discovered.</p>	
<p>M11 Anemone ranunculoides Kahar</p> <p>£4 4 available</p>	<p>Semi-double variant, vigorous.</p>	
<p>M12 Anemone ranunculoides Kai</p> <p>£10 8 available</p>	<p>Neat full double.</p>	

<p>M13 Anemone ranunculoides Leena</p> <p>£12 6 available</p>	<p>Very full deep yellow double with tiny green eye.</p>	
<p>M14 Anemone ranunculoides Leida</p> <p>£10 12 available</p>	<p>Anemone-centred double with neat boss of pointed petaloids surrounded by broader outers.</p>	
<p>M15 Anemone ranunculoides Linda</p> <p>£10 6 available</p>	<p>Very pretty anemone centred form with wide, overlapping outer petals and a full centre with green eye. Good increaser.</p>	
<p>M16 Anemone ranunculoides Muku</p> <p>£15 8 available</p>	<p>Tall open habit, flowers are very fully double.</p>	
<p>M17 Anemone ranunculoides Orange</p> <p>£10 11 available</p>	<p>Deep orange-flowered single form. Distinctive and unusual.</p>	
<p>M18 Anemone ranunculoides Orjaku</p> <p>£6 3 available</p>	<p>Vigorous double form with many long narrow petaloid stamens.</p>	
<p>M19 Anemone ranunculoides Papa</p> <p>£10 5 available</p>	<p>Characterised by a deep warm gold colour. An anemone-centred form, full centre with pointed inners.</p>	
<p>M20 Anemone ranunculoides Prees</p> <p>£4 10 available</p> <p>Max 1 per customer.</p>	<p>Tall open habit, semi-double flowers. Vigorous.</p>	
<p>M21 Anemone ranunculoides Prinz Eugen</p> <p>✳️</p> <p>£20 4 available</p> <p>Max 1 per customer</p>	<p>An amazing variety fully double golden flowers blending through green-flashed gold to a ruff of green bracts. Very rare and choice.</p>	


<p>M22 Anemone ranunculoides Rita</p> <p>£10 12 available</p> <p>Max 1 per customer.</p>	<p>Pretty and vigorous full double with many narrow inner petaloids.</p>	
<p>M23 Anemone ranunculoides Sääre *</p> <p>£20 4 available</p> <p>Max 1 per customer</p>	<p>When settled, this is a full double with tiny red tips to the sepals, and becoming bracteate with golden flashes in the bracts and axils of leaves.</p>	
<p>M24 Anemone ranunculoides Siil</p> <p>£5 4 available</p>	<p>Broad outers and small ruff of petaloids and stamens in the centre. Vigorous.</p>	
<p>M25 Anemone ranunculoides Sirje</p> <p>£5 3 available</p>	<p>One whorl of petaloids in the centre, among the whorls of stamens.</p>	
<p>M26 Anemone ranunculoides Therese</p> <p>£15 1 available</p>	<p>Very full double gold.</p>	
<p>M27 Anemone ranunculoides Virve</p> <p>£4 4 available</p>	<p>An irregular anemone centred type with varying numbers of petaloids in the centre.</p>	
<p>M28 Anemone x lipsiensis Stiby</p> <p>£8 6 available</p>	<p>An unusual form found on Osterlen, in Sweden. A wonderful bracteate form of the hybrid between A. nemorosa and ranunculoides. Some of the delicate pale yellow petals flare out into leaf-like extensions.</p>	
<p>M29 Crocus Biflorus biflorus</p> <p>£3 10 available</p>	<p>Attractive clone of this spring-flowering gem with pale lilac inner segments and the poter segments buff yellow boldly striped with darkest purple.</p>	
<p>M30 Crocus biflorus melantherus</p> <p>£4 6 available</p>	<p>Autumn flowering. White flowers with golden throat and black anthers.</p>	

<p>M31 Crocus cartwrightianus Anais</p> <p>£4 4 available</p>	<p>Autumn flowering. Violet flowers with deeper striations in throat and brilliant scarlet styles.</p>	
<p>M32 Crocus gargaricus</p> <p>£5 3 available</p>	<p>Early spring flowering. Deepest egg-yolk yellow flowers.</p>	
<p>M33 Crocus hadriaticus dark tube</p> <p>£5 7 available</p>	<p>Autumn flowering. Selected form of this beautiful species with a very dark tube and substantial white flowers</p>	
<p>M34 Crocus hadriaticus Jumbo</p> <p>£4 2 available</p>	<p>Autumn flowering. Large white flowers with red styles.</p>	
<p>M35 Crocus mathewii</p> <p>£9 4 available</p>	<p>Justly popular autumn flowering species with stunning white flowers set off by deep purple throat, golden anthers and red styles</p>	
<p>M36 Crocus mathewii Dream Dancer</p> <p>£10 3 available</p>	<p>Form of C. mathewii with violet sepals instead of white.</p>	
<p>M37 Crocus Purple Heart</p> <p>£8 3 available</p>	<p>Autumn flowering. Looks similar to C. mathewii but thought to be a hybrid. White flowers with deep purple throat.</p>	
<p>M38 Crocus sieberi George</p> <p>£8 2 available</p>	<p>Scarce variety of this spring flowering species with an amazing contrast between the white inner sepals and purple outers strikingly feathered with white giving the illusion of a high gloss. The throat is deep yellow and styles bright orange.</p>	

<p>M39 Fritillaria davidii</p> <p>£10 per pack 8 packs available</p>	<p>A very unusual Chinese fritillaria with yellow chubby bells chequered with brown on short stalks. The leaves are fascinating, ground hugging, leathery and with netted veins. Offered are bags containing 2 (possibly flowering sized) bulbs, 2 smaller bulbs and many rice-grain bulblets for you to grow on as well. Growing instructions included.</p>		<p>M41 Tecophilea cyanocrocus</p> <p>£4.50 5 available</p>	<p>The stunning "Chilean Crocus" – not a crocus at all, but bears 5cm wide deep gentian-blue flowers over short neat leaves in spring. Lives happily in my just-damp plunge over the summer when dormant. Only a few.</p>	
<p>M40 Scilla greilhuberi</p> <p>£5 7 available</p>	<p>Stunning scilla - the flowers are like tiny blue erythroniums. The exerted stamens bear turquoise blue pollen. To 15-20cm high. I grow it along with my other bulbs, given the same conditions.</p>		<p>M42 Tecophilea cyanocrocus var leichtlinii</p> <p>£4.50 6 available</p>	<p>The almost equally lovely pale azure, white-centred form of the above, requiring similar conditions.</p>	
			<p>M43 Tecophilea cyanocrocus violacea</p> <p>£4 for 1 FS + pup 5 available</p>	<p>Deep purple flowers, reputed to be less hardy than the others.</p>
