■ This selection of newly released, high quality varieties, gives you a unique opportunity to be among the first to grow these daffodils in your home garden setting! They have all been selected as being easy to grow yet offering you something a little different.

Dolly Mollinger: 11 W-OWO

A beautifully ruffled butterfly daffodil; sparkling white, round petals contrast with the very decorative, heavily ruffled split corona of brightest apricot-orange, highlighted with broad white splashes. Late **\$5.45.**

Tangaloo: 2 W-YYO

An eye-catching bloom of striking color contrasts. The round, very white petals highlight the open, bright yellow pleated crown that is finished with a very deep orange serrated edge. Tall, perfumed. Mid **\$5.95.**

Mellow Yellow: 1 Y-W

An enchanting flower of excellent form and substance; opening a uniform sulphur-yellow, the trumpet matures to a soft white with a pinkish blush while retaining its attractive yellow frilled edge. Longlasting; tall, strong stem. Mid **\$4.50.**

Titaan: 2 Y-O

Huge, arresting bloom; the magnificent, very long straight trumpet-cup is a uniform rich, vibrant orange, with a scalloped edge, making it very prominent against the broad, bright yellow petals. Late **\$4.25.**

All are available in multiples so you can start off with a striking display next Spring!

EARLY FLOWERING

Poached Egg: 2 Y-Y

Very large, spectacular decorative bloom. The enormous, flat, frilled, orange-yellow cup almost covers the soft yellow perianth. Strong stem. Early-mid **\$5.95.**

Ansett: 1 Y-Y

Splendid large yellow trumpet bloom of consistent exhibition quality which makes a striking garden display. Tall. Early-mid. **3 for \$6.65; \$2.35.**

Golden Empire: 1 Y-Y

Magnificent, large, smooth, deep gold exhibition bloom with a bold, flared trumpet; perianth is exceptionally wide and overlapping. Tall. Early-mid. **3 for \$4.40; \$1.55.**

BRIGHT CUP DAFFODILS

■ After the traditional yellows, these varieties, with their beautiful bright yellow petals and contrasting orange-red cups, would have to be the next best known. We find this group particularly prolific and ideal to naturalize, so choose varieties that give you a staggered flowering and plant in clumps for spectacular clumps of color.

EARLY FLOWERING

Roman Legion: 2 Y-O

A magnificent, eye-catching bloom; well-formed, softest yellow perianth; large open, pleated cup of yellow-orange with beautifully frilled edge of deeper orange. Tall.

Aranjeuz: 2 Y-YYO

Striking; shallow, expanded crown of rich yellow widely banded deep orange-red; yellow petals.

High Peak: 2 Y-YYO

Huge flower on a very tall, straight stem; glistening, mid-yellow, flat petals and large expanded clear gold cup frilled with deep orange. Early-mid. **3 for \$6.65; \$2.35.**

An excellent, long-lasting cut flower; broad pointed, bright yellow petals and fiery scarlet-orange cup.

SULPHUR COLORED DAFFODILS

■ These intriguing varieties, in shades of lemon, soft lime-yellow and sulphur, all have very long-lasting flowers. Each opens as a single colored bloom then develops a white trumpet as the flower matures. Plant clumps of these in a spot where you can enjoy the color changes as the flower develops.

EARLY FLOWERING

Lunar Glow: 2 Y-WWO

A striking, beautifully formed bloom; excellent round flat perianth of strong sulphur-yellow; long, straight trumpet-cup opens lemon-yellow, maturing to white with an unusual orange-yellow frilled edge. Tall. Early-mid **\$3.50.**

Phip's Green: 2 Y-W

A large, superior bloom of exhibition form and excellent substance. Opening a uniform sulphur-yellow, the long, straight trumpet-cup matures white with a frilled edge of bright yellow. Tall, strong stem. Mid. **3 for \$8.40; \$2.95.**

MID FLOWERING

Koolite: 2 Y-WWY

Magnificent, beautifully formed bloom; flat, bright sulphur-yellow perianth has a white halo at the base of the cup; the elegant long cup matures from sulphur-yellow to white, leaving a yellow band on the serrated edge. Tall. Mid. **\$3.50.**

Lemon Sorbet: 1 Y-WWY

Attractive round flower with excellent reflexed perianth; very straight trumpet with neat serrated rim; opens strong sulphur-green color. Mid **\$4.95.**

Pastorale: 2 Y-WWY

Most attractive, long-lasting bloom; long soft lemon cup, suffused with apricot-buff, matures white with fine lemon rim; lemon petals. Tall. Mid. **3 for \$4.40; \$1.55.**

LATE FLOWERING

Blimey: 2 Y-W

An elegant, well-formed bloom, opening a wonderful lemon-green throughout; with maturity, the open pleated cup turns to pure white. Long-lasting. Mid-late **3 for \$5.55; \$1.95.**

Day Dream: 2 Y-W

Perfectly formed exhibition bloom with glowing, deep greenish, sulphur yellow petals. The bold, frilled crown opens sulphur-yellow and matures white. Long-lasting. Mid-late. **3 for \$8.40; \$2.95.**

St Patrick's Day: 2 Y-Y

A striking bloom; broad round petals and excellent widely flared and fluted saucer crown, which quickly develops from clear lemon yellow to soft white with a sparkling yellow frilled edge. Mid-late. **3 for \$8.40; \$2.95.**

FLAT CUPPED DAFFODILS

■ These delightfully showy varieties are a complete contrast to the traditional trumpet shape. Each one has the centre of the flower flattened into a most striking 'disc' in the middle of the petals. The colors of these flat centres vary from brilliant orange to bright yellow . . . and each has plenty of pleats, ruffles or frills . . . giving you a wonderful range of spectacular varieties to select from! Remember . . . unusual shapes and colors do not effect the growing of a variety . . . each one is just as easy to grow as traditional daffodils!

Breakaway: 2 W-O

An immense decorative flower. The very flat, pleated creamy-orange crown is complimented with an attractive, darker orange edge; large, white, well overlapping round petals.

George Bass: 2 W-Y

A top quality decorative bloom; impressive, very frilled flat cup opens bright lemon-yellow, passing to apricot-buff; large, round milk-white perianth. Early. **\$5.45.**

Joseph Banks: 2 Y-YYO

Large bright, early flowering decorative bloom with broad flat, mid-yellow petals; wide, golden-yellow, saucer-shaped cup has a distinct orange band at the edge. Strong, tall stem.

MID FLOWERING

Gay Vagabond: 2 W-YYO

Spectacular large bloom; very flat, open pleated cup is a soft lemon at the base, gradually increasing in color to the magnificent orange-gold ruffled band; large creamy-white petals. Mid. **\$5.45.**

Heavenly Gift: 2 W-O

Magnificent large bloom; the huge, bright lemon-yellow flat cup matures to a beautiful deep apricot, contrasting with the creamy-white, well-formed petals. Mid. **\$5.45.**

Spectacular flower; excellent, creamy-white flat perianth is almost covered by the magnificent, flat, deep tangerine-orange cup. Mid. **\$5.45.**

Spectacular, large bloom; the imposing, serrated crown of deep apricot-orange lays flat against the beautifully formed creamy-white petals. Very tall, strong stem. Late. **\$5.45.**

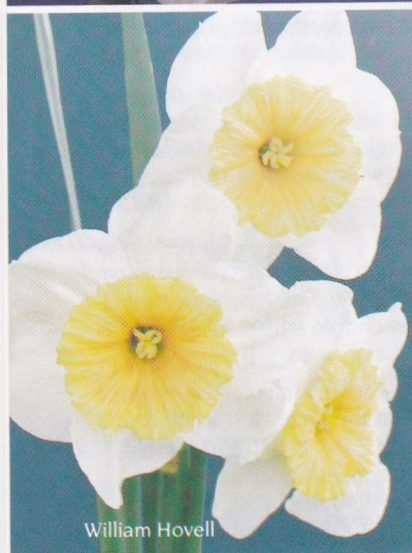

BANDED CUP DAFFODILS

■ All the varieties in this selection have an eye-catching two-tone centre or cup, which forms a bright, distinctive band on the edge. Yet, a selection from this range will give you variety as well . . . in petal color, flowering time and in the shape of the bloom. They really compliment the plainer colors of the traditional daffodils.

EARLY FLOWERING

Bright Lass: 2 Y-YOO

This striking bloom has rich yellow petals and expanded yellow cup with bright, deep red-orange frill. Tall.

Fried Egg: 2 Y-YYO

A most spectacular, very large bloom; the huge yellow-orange flat pleated crown has a distinctive orange rim and lies right back on the round, primrose yellow petals.

Princess of Tasmania: 2 W-YYO

Very bright bloom with broad, flat clear yellow petals. The large yellow saucer-shaped crown is broadly edged tomato-red. Tall.

Beautifully poised exhibition flower; pure-white round perianth of very good overlap and substance; flat soft yellow pleated crown is brightly edged with an intense red rim. Tall straight stem. Late. **\$4.95.**

Corofin: 3 W-YYR

Tall, striking perfumed bloom; beautiful, snow-white round waxy petals; almost flat yellow corona has a broad crinkled margin of brilliant tangerine-red. Late . . . **3 for \$5.55; \$1.95.**

Tuskar Light: 2 W-YYR

Another eye-catching flower with very white petals and a dainty open flat cup of citron yellow, banded brilliant orange-red.

WHITE DAFFODILS

■ White daffodils are very elegant flowers that add a touch of sophistication to your Spring display. The color 'white' varies from rich cream to brilliant white, with some varieties developing from cream to white with maturity. While many of this selection have the classic daffodil trumpet, there are others, like 'Polar Imp', that have a dainty small cup and a distinctive green 'eye' to the centre of the flower. For added contrast, try planting some of each shape to flower through the season.

EARLY FLOWERING

Hailstorm: 1 W-W

An immense bloom with broad, purest white petals forming a complete circle; the magnificent, widely flanged, ivory-white trumpet opens palest lemon. Tall. Early-mid. **\$4.50.**

First Frost: 2 W-W

Most elegant, all white bloom with a very straight, long trumpet-cup and flat, well-formed petals. Early-mid. **3 for \$6.65; \$2.35.**

Isabella: 2 W-W

Charming, neat, glistening white bloom of exhibition quality; splendid waxy petals and slightly expanded, long straight cup. Early. **3 for \$6.65; \$2.35.**

MID FLOWERING

Himalaya: 1 W-W

Magnificent large white show bloom; broad, flat, smooth petals and widely flanged trumpet, rolled at the mouth. Mid. **\$5.45.**

Polar Imp: 3 W-GWW

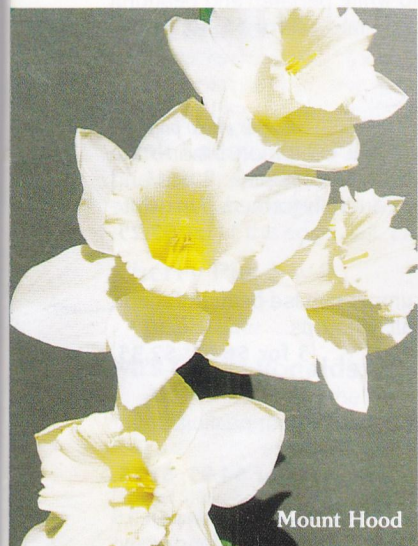
