 - all functioning Irish banks were already protected by the State guarantee;
 - Irish deposits in Anglo Irish Bank and INBS could have been protected for a fraction of the €30.6 billion promissory note cost; and
 - all €22.5 billion of senior debt in Anglo Irish Bank and INBS has been, or will shortly be, paid in full;
- there is an irrefutable case for the burden of the €30.6 billion to be shared with other Eurozone members, who were the beneficiaries of the promissory notes, via stabilisation of their banks;
- it is not appropriate to ask current and future Irish generations to pay for the losses of Anglo Irish Bank and INBS; and
- the Government did not seek any burden sharing of the €30.6 billion with other Eurozone members; and

directs the Government to return to negotiations with relevant parties, with a clear instruction that there must be fair burden sharing of the principle amount of €30.6 billion, and further directs that payment on the March €3.1 billion is suspended, pending successful outcomes of these negotiations.”

recognises that corruption in public and commercial life represents a great threat to the democratic functioning of the State;

finds that culturally-ingrained concepts of patronage, clientelism and favouritism have pervaded political institutions and have led to serious failures in corporate governance, particularly where inappropriate links between business and politics have been exploited;

concludes that such failings have eroded public confidence that politics and commerce operate to benefit the many over the few;

notes that Bunreacht na hÉireann places in the care of the Oireachtas a responsibility to ensure that the operation of free competition shall not be allowed to develop as to result in the concentration of the ownership or control of essential commodities in a few individuals to the common detriment; and that the Oireachtas has failed to adhere to this guidance in recent years;

recognises that the State has no effective means of preventing, investigating or prosecuting corruption or white-collar crime as responsible agencies are too disconnected, lack appropriate powers, or lack necessary resources;

further notes:

— that prosecutions arising from cases of proven corruption have been rare;

- the failure of the Government to adequately act on the findings of the Tribunal of Inquiry into Certain Planning Matters and Payments (Mahon Tribunal) nor the Tribunal of Inquiry into Payments to Politicians and Related Matters (Moriarty Tribunal);
- that there have been eight tribunals of inquiry in the past twenty years, and where they made findings of impropriety in public or commercial life, very few consequences, if any, have arisen; and
- that five commissions of investigation are currently in operation, and that in some cases, commissions have sought additional powers to ensure they can fulfil their terms of reference; and

recommends, in order to effectively address these matters, that the Government:

- establish a permanent, independent Anti-Corruption Agency to, initially, assume the functions of the Standards in Public Office Commission; the Office of the Director of Corporate Enforcement; the Registrar of Lobbyists and the Competition Authority, but not confined to these bodies;
- mandate the Anti-Corruption Agency to act as a Standing Commission of Investigation;
- confer the Anti-Corruption Agency with powers of:
 - investigation;
 - compellability and testimony-taking;
 - court-authorised search and seizure, including access to bank records;
 - prosecution at District and Circuit Court level only; and
 - arrest;
- empower the Anti-Corruption Agency to initiate and conduct investigations and sectoral reviews of its own volition;
- consolidate and reform legislation tackling corruption, official malfeasance and white-collar crime, and place the Anti-Corruption Agency at the apex of the State's legislative architecture countering corruption;
- confer the Anti-Corruption Agency with a monitoring and investigative role over public procurement activities, both ongoing and historic;
- mandate an advisory role, initially upon the Anti-Corruption Agency in relation to the Garda Síochána Ombudsman Commission; the Comptroller and Auditor General; the Ombudsman for the Defence Forces; the Garda Bureau of Fraud Investigation; professional bodies and any future Electoral Commission, but not confined to these bodies;
- draw on the experience in other jurisdictions in establishing an Anti-Corruption Agency, in particular the Independent Broad-Based Anti-Corruption Commission (IBAC) of Victoria, Australia, the Serious Fraud Office (SFO) of the United Kingdom, and the Hong Kong Independent Commission Against Corruption;
- create a new joint Oireachtas oversight committee, to be called the Public Interest Committee, a majority of whom shall be Opposition members; and
- establish annual reporting by the Anti-Corruption Agency to both Houses of the Oireachtas, and ensure reports are debated in both Dáil Éireann and Seanad Éireann;”

- Christians and other religious minorities in Iraq and Syria will be exterminated or forced to migrate solely for their religion by the ‘Islamic State’ (*Da'esh*) and other militant extremists;
- Christians and other religious minorities in Iraq and Syria have been an integral part of the region’s cultural fabric for millennia;
- since 2003, minority groups in Iraq and Syria have been the target of systematic violence, with millions fleeing their ancestral homes;
- Christians and other religious minorities in Iraq and Syria have been murdered, subjugated, and suffered grievous bodily and psychological harm, including sexual enslavement and abuse, inflicted in a deliberate and calculated manner in violation of the UN Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of the Crime of Genocide;
- these atrocities were undertaken with the specific intent to bring about the eradication and displacement of their communities and the destruction of their cultural heritage in violation of the UN Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of the Crime of Genocide;
- genocide is a crime under international law that shall be punished, whether committed by ‘constitutionally responsible rulers, public officials or private individuals’ as provided by the UN Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of the Crime of Genocide;
- Article I of the UN Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of the Crime of Genocide (signed at Paris on 9th December, 1948) states that ‘the Contracting Parties

confirm that genocide, whether committed in time of peace or in time of war, is a crime under international law which they undertake to prevent and to punish’;

- Article II of the UN Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of the Crime of Genocide declares that ‘in the present Convention, genocide means any of the following acts committed with the intent to destroy, in whole or in part, a national, ethnical, racial or religious group, as such: (a) killing members of the group; (b) causing serious bodily or mental harm to members of the group; (c) deliberately inflicting on the group conditions of life calculated to bring about its physical destruction in whole or in part; (d) imposing measures intended to prevent births within the group; and (e) forcibly transferring children of the group to another group’;
- Article III of the UN Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of the Crime of Genocide affirms that ‘the following acts shall be punishable: (a) genocide; (b) conspiracy to commit genocide; (c) direct and public incitement to commit genocide; (d) attempt to commit genocide; and (e) complicity in genocide’;
- on 10th July, 2015, Pope Francis, Supreme Pontiff of the Roman Catholic Church, declared that Middle Eastern Christians are facing genocide, a reality that must be ‘denounced. In this third world war, waged piecemeal, which we are now experiencing, a form of genocide – and I stress the word genocide – is taking place, and it must end’; and
- a 13th March, 2015 report of the United Nations Committee on Human Rights reported that ‘ethnic and religious groups targeted by ISIL include Yezidis, Christians, Turkmen, Sabea-Mandean, Kaka’e, Kurds and Shi’a’ and that ‘it is reasonable to conclude that some of the incidents (in Iraq in 2014-2015) ... may constitute genocide.’;

resolves that:

- the atrocities committed against Christians and other groups targeted specifically for religious reasons in Iraq and Syria are, and are hereby declared to be, ‘genocide’;
- each of the Contracting Parties to the UN Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of the Crime of Genocide (signed at Paris on 9th December, 1948), particularly the governments of countries and their nationals who are in any way supporting genocide, should be reminded of their legal obligations under the Convention;
- every government and multinational body should call the atrocities being committed in the name of religion by their rightful name, ‘genocide’;
- the United Nations and the United Nations Secretary General are called upon to assert leadership by calling the atrocities being committed in these places by their rightful name, ‘genocide’;
- the member states of the United Nations, particularly member states of the African Union, the Arab League, the Gulf Cooperation Council, and the Organization of the Islamic Conference, should join in this Resolution; should collaborate on measures to prevent further genocides; and should collaborate on the creation and operations of international and domestic tribunals to punish those responsible for the ongoing genocide;
- the governments of the Kurdistan Region of Iraq, the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan, the Lebanese Republic, and other countries should be commended for having undertaken to shelter and protect Christian and other religious minorities until they can safely return to their homes in Iraq and Syria; and

- Christians and other religious minorities have a right to live in their ancestral homelands in safety and stability – for example in the Nineveh Plain, a historic heartland of Christianity in Iraq – and to practice their faith without fear of persecution, displacement, or death.” — *Mattie McGrath*.
