To live independently, MW would need supports to ensure that his basic needs are being met. When he is ready, he might benefit from beginning with a group home experience where he could have a sense of autonomy within a supervised/supported and safe setting.

At this time, I would advocate for MW to select a community work-related services provider that offers built-in programming that would encourage his continued participation in his community, exposure to new experiences, continued skill refinement, and the acquisition of new skills.
