Causation


- Trust is a critical factor to achieve the consensus to have collaborative governance structure (Kikuchi 2008)
- Decentralization is to improve governance by bringing government closer to citizen (Blari 2000)
- Why, Decentralization → public trust?
 Public trust is not a sufficient condition for decentralization
 - Top-down decentralization in two countries

Sub-categories of Decentralization	Japan	South Korea
Political	 Municipality system began by constitution in 1947 Unified local election every 4 years since 1947 	By constitution in 1948Suspended in 1972Reintroduced in 1991
Administrative	- Practical needs in the collapse of bubble economy	Political causeA part of democratization
Fiscal	- Local tax by ordinances	 Principle of no taxation without law fiscal self-reliance ratio 62.5%(1995)→46.6%(2016)

South Korea is less decentralized than Japan





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

Trust in Gov't: South Korea






Aggregated Trust at Nat'l Level




Regional Trust in Gov't: Korea






Regional Trust in Gov't: Korea










Regional Trust in Gov't: Japan

Summary and Future Plan

- Findings
 - Japan is more decentralized than South Korea
 - Central affairs do not seem to affect local affairs in Japan. In contrast, trust for local and central gov't seems to move side by side in South Korea.
 - Regional variations in trust in governments exist in both countries. But why?
- What to do in the future
 - Utilizing individual level information from Asian Barometer Survey data
 - Path Analysis
 - Structural Equation model (Political participation, social capital and so on)
