1748 VERDELHO SOLERA **29.75**

The oldest Solera in existence anywhere in the world. A 220-year slumber was interrupted when this cask was bottled. From the private collection of Joao Alfredo Faria, an important landowner of Funchal.

1792 BOAL SOLERA **27.50**

A rich, golden, almost dessert-like example of Madeira. The wine our ancestors drank with terrapin and shad. From a private estate acquired by Justino Henriques.

1830 SERCIAL SOLERA **24.00**

The driest of the grapes used to make Madeira is called Sercial. Similar to a Fino Sherry but with a special bouquet and character of its own. Here is a great example from the private reserve of Justino Henriques.

Originally acquired by Blandy from Joao de Oliveira, one of the largest land owners in the district of Sao Martinho.

1893 BUAL, Blandy **20.95**

Acquired by Blandy during the 19th Century.

1898 SERCIAL, Blandy **19.75**

Originally acquired by Blandy from Joao Santos Araujo in the district of Camara de Lobos.

From old reserves; aged in oak until 1957; the small quantity remaining was then put in demi-Johns.

LET US EXAMINE THE FACTS. Chateau Lafite Rothschild 1966 has risen on the Bordeaux wholesale market place from \$92.00 a case in 1967 to \$145.00 the case when it was bottled in the Fall of 1969. The probability is that this wine will command about \$200 the case at the consumer level during 1970.

The same ratio of increase will surely prevail in regard to the excellent 1967 clarets. They are soft, quick-maturing, fruity, of superb bouquet, and with good life ahead of them. Therefore, we genuinely believe it would be wise of you indeed, to purchase your '67s now and have them delivered to you, or to a warehouse of your choice, during mid 1970, after their arrival from France.

Why are the great wines of Bordeaux, of the top flight vintage years, moving up so dramatically? Remember—there is an ever increasing world demand competing against fixed production; added affluence throughout the Western world; world travel; more leisure; and increased popularization through books, magazines, wine tastings, radio and television.

It is now obvious that the value of good wine increases in value per annum at a faster rate than interest; hence a good investment. 'Adam Smith,' in his economic articles, points out that you can always liquidate your wine investment by drinking it—a good hedge.

But above all, we must remember that '66s are approaching a price stratosphere—that, 1968 was only average in quality and low in production; the 1969s will prove outstanding, but the vintage is cursed by a total production that does not exceed much more than 50% of an average vintage. As we go to press, rumors reach us from Bordeaux that Lafite and Mouton Rothschild 1969 will be offered for almost \$100 the case to the prime buyers of Bordeaux, such as Cruse, Calvet, etc. Imagine the prices that these 1969s will ultimately command on the consumer level!

In summary, we can think of no significant evidence that should discourage the lover of great claret from buying his 1967s **now** for several years ahead—provided he has the economic resources, the space in his cellar, or the willingness to simply store the wines, in his name, in a reliable public warehouse.
