

Alger, Horatio (b. Jan. 13, 1832, Chelsea, Mass.—d. July 18, 1899, South Natick), most popular author in the U.S. in the last 30 years of the 19th century and perhaps the most influential writer of his generation. He was the son of a conservative Unitarian minister, Horatio Alger, Sr., who personally supervised his son's early life and saturated it with prayer, study, and discipline. By the age of nine the boy was reading French, Latin, and Greek, and he early showed an interest in writing. At Harvard he distinguished himself in the classics.

in the classics, graduating in 1852.

Alger had always been intended for the ministry by his family, but after leaving Harvard he tried for several years to make a living as a schoolteacher and a contributor to magazines. In 1857, however, he enrolled in the Harvard Divinity School, from which he took his degree in 1860. After a seven-month tour of Europe with two friends, he returned to the U.S. to find that the Civil War was beginning. Alger made two futile attempts to enlist, but was rejected because of asthma, and then became junior associate to his father in his pastorate at South Natick. His first novel, Marie Bertrand, an adult book about life in the Paris slums, was serialized in the New York Weekly in January-February 1864. His first novel to be published in book form was Frank's Campaign (1864), and it was an immediate success.

In 1864 also Alger was ordained and accepted the pulpit of a church in Brewster, Mass. He continued his writing, however, and in 1865 his congregation, feeling that this was accomplished at their expense, voted not to reengage him. In 1866 he moved to New York City, and with the publication of Ragger Dick; or, Street Life in New York (serialized in 1867, published in book form in 1868), a book for boys that was a sensational success he found the vein that he was to work for the rest of his life.

The success of Ragged Dick led to a visit to the Newsboys' Lodging House, a home for foundlings and runaway boys. Alger came to use the home as a base of operations, and for many years he was benefactor and hero to the

boys of the institution.

In this atmosphere Alger wrote those store of poor boys who rose from rags to riches that were to make him famous and contribute the "Alger hero" to the American language. Insteady succession of books, almost alike except for the names of the characters, hereached that by honesty, cheerful perseverance, and hard work, the virtuous lad would have his just reward—though the reward was almost always precipitated by a stroke good luck. A tour through the West in 1876, 77 produced The Young Miner (1879), and other books with Western settings.

Alger settled in Brooklyn, N.Y., with his widowed housekeeper, Kate Down, and he two sons, John and Edward, whom in 1894 he adopted.

- A condensed biography of the nominee's life, including emphasis on his/her early childhood and family background;
- 2. Education and first odd jobs and work progress;
- Who/what influenced nominee's early and later life (both good and less fortunate experiences).

CAREER - CURRENT POSITION

- Outline steps in nominee's professional career; include present position and specifically what he/she is contributing to it;
- Comment on any contributions nominee has made to further America's free enterprise system;
- 3. Include company's annual report or financial statement;
- 4. Relate human interest stories about nominee and his/her company.

COMMUNITY AND COUNTRY CONTRIBUTIONS

- 1. How is nominee viewed by his/her subordinates? Superiors?
- What involvement has there been in one's community? Local and/or national level?
- 3. What contributions has nominee made to benefit his fellow man? His/her country?
- 4. Is nominee a proper role model for the youth of America? How can this be demonstrated?
- 5. Comment on nominee's "track record" once an award is bestowed, i.e., does he/she accept the honor never to be heard from again, or is there an interest in getting involved as an active participant and supporting the goals of the organization.

PHILOSOPHY

- 1. What is nominee's philosophy of life? Business?
- Note nominee's special interest outside of business, i.e., how does he/she spend "free time?" Specify hobbies, honors, awards, citations.

MISCELLANEOUS

- Letters of support from individuals of varied categories -- well acquainted with nominee through community, professional, education, religious, and family affiliations;
- 2. Include six black and white glossy photographs;
- Supply public relations contact when/if additional information is required, address and phone number.

- A person may be of either sex and of any race, creed, or religious persuasion.
- A person's character must be such that he/she is a proper role model for the youth of America.
- Eligibility requires a humble background and dramatic career achievement -- one's life must typify outstanding professional accomplishment and triumph over early adversity.
- An individual in any honorable professional may be considered. Members represent a wide range of professions, including but not limited to, business, government, sports, law, medicine, education, the arts, religion, industry, etc.
- Awardees love America, support its ideals, respect its flag, and believe in the opportunities inherent in America's free enterprise system.
- Awardees demonstrate individual initiative and are committed to excellence -unusual achievements in life having been accomplished through honesty, hard
 work, self reliance, enthusiasm, and perseverance.

Awardees are dedicated community leaders.

- A person should demonstrate a strong commitment to assisting those less fortunate than himself.
- Nominees should believe in and support the goals of the organization and the purpose for which it was founded.
