LET ME START BY INTRODUCING MYSELF. I AM ELIZABETH DOLE'S HUSBAND. THE SECRETARY OF LABOR IS IN POLAND TODAY, ON THE FRONTLINE OF THE FREEDOM REVOLUTION THAT IS SWEEPING ACROSS EASTERN EUROPE. IT IS ONE OF THE GREAT CHAPTERS OF 20TH CENTURY HISTORY.

SHE WAS LOOKING FORWARD TO SPEAKING TO THIS DISTINGUISHED AUDIENCE, BECAUSE SHE KNOWS SO WELL THE GREAT WORK THE Y.W.C.A. DOES AND THE KIND OF LEADERSHIP IT PROVIDES FOR AMERICA'S WOMEN.

WOMEN: BIG LEAGUE PLAYERS

FOR HER, LET ME ALSO CONGRATULATE THE NEWEST MEMBERS OF THE ACADEMY OF WOMEN ACHIEVERS. AND AS I THINK ABOUT IT, NO ONE IS MORE QUALIFIED TO SPEAK ABOUT WOMEN ACHIEVERS THAN I AM. IN FACT, IN MY PERSONAL AND PROFESSIONAL LIFE, I AM SURROUNDED BY REMARKABLE WOMEN: ELIZABETH, OF COURSE; MY SENATE COLLEAGUE FROM KANSAS, NANCY KASSEBAUM; MY CHIEF OF STAFF, SHEILA BURKE; AND THE HEAD OF MY POLITICAL ACTION COMMITTEE, JOANNE COE.

IN MY OFFICE, MY ARMS CONTROL EXPERT IS A WOMAN: MY BUDGET AND APPROPRIATIONS PERSON IS A WOMAN: MY TRADE ADVISOR IS A WOMAN.

IN FACT, MY OFFICE IS FERTILE RECRUITING GROUND FOR THE FOUNDING CHAPTER OF THE "NATIONAL ORGANIZATION FOR MEN". POLITICS AND BUSINESS MAY BE ROUGH AND TUMBLE, BUT THERE IS NO DOUBT WOMEN ARE BIG LEAGUE PLAYERS. THE RECENT, FIRST-TIME EVER, LIVE T.V. BROADCASTS OF THE BRITISH PARLIAMENT CONFIRMS WHAT WE ALL ALREADY KNOW: THAT WOMEN ARE CENTER-STAGE IN WORLD AFFAIRS, TOO. I ALMOST PITY THOSE POOR LABOR MP'S THAT PRIME MINISTER THATCHER RUNS OVER EVERY DAY.

SHE HAS GIVEN REMARKABLE LEADERSHIP TO HER NATION, AND TO THE CAUSES OF FREEDOM IN THE WORLD AND COMMON SENSE IN DEMOCRATIC GOVERNMENT.

VIOLBITA CHAMORRO

I ALSO WANT TO MENTION ANOTHER REMARKABLE WOMAN, WHOSE INSPIRATIONAL STORY IS FINALLY BEING HEARD: VIOLETTA CHAMORRO, THE COURAGEOUS EDITOR OF THE ONLY FREE NEWSPAPER IN NICARAGUA, LA PRENSA -- WHO HAS BEEN CHOSEN TO LEAD THE DEMOCRATIC COALITION WHICH IS CHALLENGING DANIEL ORTEGA'S MARXIST TYRANNY.

MRS. CHAMORRO -- WHO I MET AGAIN RECENTLY IN WASHINGTON -- HAS SEEN HER HUSBAND ASSASSINATED; HER FAMILY TORN APART BY POLITICAL DIFFERENCES;

AND THE NEWSPAPER THAT IS HER LIFE'S WORK UNDER ALMOST DAILY ASSAULT FROM ORTEGA'S CENSORS AND GOON SQUADS. YET SHE REMAINS ALMOST SERENE IN HER DETERMINATION TO GIVE EVERYTHING SHE HAS, INCLUDING RISKING HER OWN LIFE, TO TRY TO BRING FREEDOM TO NICARAGUA.

LEADERS

HAPPILY, WE ARE -- AT LONG LAST -- APPROACHING THE POINT WHERE WE STOP THINKING ABOUT REMARKABLE WOMEN LEADERS, AND START SEEING THEM AS REMARKABLE LEADERS, PERIOD. REMARKABLE LEADERS WHO HAPPEN TO BE WOMEN. AND, HAPPILY, TOO......THE DAYS OF ADDRESSING A WOMEN'S AUDIENCE WITH A SO-CALLED "WOMEN'S SPEECH" ARE OVER. OF COURSE, THERE WILL ALWAYS BE SPECIFIC CONCERNS FOR WOMEN, BUT MOST OF YOUR ISSUES TODAY ARE MAINSTREAM ISSUES: YOU CARE ABOUT THE DEFICIT, AND THE DRUG CRISIS, THE ENVIRONMENT, FOREIGN AFFAIRS, AGRICULTURE, OR WHATEVER. SO LET ME SPEND A FEW MINUTES ON WHAT MAY BE MATTERS OF INTEREST TO MOST OF YOU.

ON THE HOME FRONT, THE GOOD NEWS IS CONGRESS HAS ADJOURNED FOR THE YEAR. I KNOW IT IS FASHIONABLE TO SAY CONGRESS HAD A "POOR" YEAR, BUT I WOULD SAY THE JURY IS STILL OUT. WE HAVE COMPLETED THE FIRST HALF OF THE 101ST CONGRESS WITH MUCH MORE LEFT TO DO IN THE SECOND HALF. IN MY VIEW WE HAD A PRETTY SOLID 1989.

DRUGS

WE TOOK A GIANT BI-PARTISAN STEP FORWARD BY FULLY FUNDING MAJOR NEW ANTI-DRUG AND CRIME PACKAGES. THE PRESIDENT PROVIDED THE LEADERSHIP ON THIS DOMESTIC CRISIS BY INTRODUCING THE FIRST-EVER NATIONAL STRATEGY FOR THE WAR ON DRUGS AS WELL AS A COMPREHENSIVE ANTI-CRIME PROPOSAL -- MORE PRISON SPACE, MORE FUNDING FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT, MORE EDUCATION AND TOUGHER, STIFFER PENALTIES NOT ONLY FOR THE PUSHER, BUT FOR THE USER, TOO. IF WE ARE REALLY SERIOUS ABOUT WINNING THE WAR ON DRUGS AND FIGHTING CRIMINALS PREYING ON THE INNOCENT, IT IS TIME TO CHANGE OUR PRIORITIES. IT'S TIME TO MAKE A BIGGER COMMITMENT TO EDUCATION AND TREATMENT; AND TO DRUG TESTING, AND WHATEVER ELSE IT TAKES TO GET THE JOB DONE. THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT CAN HELP, BUT IT CAN'T DO IT ALONE. WE NEED HELP -- FROM THE STATES, FROM THE CHURCHES, FROM THE PRIVATE SECTOR, AND PARENTS AND FROM YOU, AMERICA'S LEADERS.

ANTI-DRUG EFFORT

LET'S FACE IT, DRUG ABUSE IS AN INTERNATIONAL NIGHTMARE, WITH FEW COUNTRIES UNSCATHED. IN FACT, IN A LETTER TO PRESIDENT BUSH THIS WEEK, I HAVE SUGGESTED THAT HE AND MR. GORBACHEV USE THEIR MALTA MEETING TO AGREE ON A JOINT EFFORT ON A MAJOR HUMANITARIAN PROJECT: I SUGGESTED A COMBINED US-USSR EFFORT TO DEAL WITH DRUG AND ALCOHOL ABUSE.

CHILD CARE

CONGRESS ALSO MADE A START ON CHILD CARE. CHILD CARE IS A PRIORITY ISSUE, BUT THE DEBATE CONTINUES OVER HOW TO ADDRESS IT. DO YOU DO IT WITH TAX CREDITS, WHERE THE PARENTS MAKE THE DECISION? OR DO YOU TURN IT OVER TO SOME A GOVERNMENT BUREAUCRACY THAT DICTATES WHAT TO DO.

LET ME SUGGEST THAT WHATEVER THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT DOES IT WILL NOT SOLVE THE PROBLEM. AGAIN WE NEED BUSINESSES, CHURCHES, CLUBS AND MOST OF ALL THE PARENTS TO GET INVOLVED.

DAYCARE - THE "Y" WAY

FOR EXAMPLE: THE YWCA AND THE YMCA DESERVE GREAT CREDIT FOR THEIR DAY CARE INITIATIVE HERE IN NEW YORK. WITH 10 SITES THROUGHOUT THE 5 BOROUGHS, YOUR DAY CARE FACILITIES ARE PROVIDING AFFORDABLE, QUALITY DAY CARE TO THE PEOPLE WHO NEED IT MOST.

NO QUESTION, WE NEED TO PROVIDE CARE FOR CHILDREN OF WORKING MOTHERS; WE NEED TO KEEP THAT CRUCIAL INVESTMENT IN THE WORKFORCE. BUT IN MY VIEW, WE SHOULD DO IT WITH MINIMAL BUREAUCRATIC RED TAPE AND GOVERNMENT INTERFERENCE. I DO NOT BELIEVE WE HAVE TO INVENT THE MOST EXPENSIVE NEW SPENDING PROGRAM JUST TO DEMONSTRATE CONCERN ABOUT CHILD CARE.

PORTABLE PENSIONS

AS MORE WOMEN ENTER THE WORKFORCE, AND AS THIS WORKFORCE BECOMES INCREASINGLY MORE MOBILE, WE WILL NEED TO TAKE A CLOSE LOOK AT OUR PENSION LAWS TO SEE IF IT MAKES SENSE TO ALLOW PENSION BENEFITS TO BE TRANSFERRED FROM JOB-TO-JOB. BY ALLOWING A TRANSFER - BY MAKING PENSION BENEFITS "PORTABLE," IN OTHER WORDS -- WORKERS WOULD BE ABLE TO CARRY OVER VALUABLE BENEFITS THAT THEY HAVE ACCRUED IN PREVIOUS JOBS.

LET'S FACE IT: THE DAYS WHEN PEOPLE SPEND THEIR ENTIRE LIVES WITH A SINGLE EMPLOYER ARE NEARLY OVER. THE STATISTICS SHOW THAT AMERICAN WORKERS -- BOTH MALE AND FEMALE -- WANT MOBILITY -- AND THAT THEY WILL SWITCH JOBS ANY NUMBER OF TIMES DURING THE COURSE OF THEIR WORKING LIVES.

IF THE SECRETARY OF LABOR WERE HERE TODAY, SHE WOULD TELL YOU THAT HER DEPARTMENT IS NOW STUDYING A WIDE-RANGE OF OPTIONS ON THE ISSUE OF PENSION PORTABILITY.

SHE WOULD ALSO TELL YOU THAT THIS ISSUE IS A VERY COMPLICATED ONE -- THE TERM "PENSION PORTABILITY" MEANS DIFFERENT THINGS TO DIFFERENT PEOPLE.

BUT I KNOW THAT PENSION PORTABILITY IS A HIGH PRIORITY ITEM AT THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR -- AND I LOOK FORWARD TO THE RESULTS OF THE DEPARTMENT'S STUDY.

HEALTH

WITH THE UNFORTUNATE TOTAL REPEAL OF THE CATASTROPHIC HEALTH CARE LEGISLATION, THE ISSUE OF EMPLOYERS' RESPONSIBILITY FOR AND FUNDING OF RETIREE HEALTH CARE WILL HAVE INCREASING IMPORTANCE. AND WHILE THERE IS BI-PARTISAN AGREEMENT THAT CONGRESS MUST REVISIT MAJOR HEALTH POLICY ISSUES SUCH AS LONG-TERM AND CATASTROPHIC CARE NEXT YEAR, BUDGETARY CONSTRAINTS COMBINED WITH RELUCTANCE TO RELY ON SELF-FUNDING MECHANISMS WILL MAKE EFFECTIVE FEDERAL LEGISLATION EVEN MORE DIFFICULT TO ENACT.

SO THESE ARE SOME OF THE ISSUES CONGRESS WILL BE LOOKING AT COME 1990. MEANWHILE ALL THE WORLD WILL BE WATCHING MALTA: BUSH AND GORBACHEV

THIS WEEKEND THE WHOLE WORLD WILL BE WATCHING A COUPLE OF SHIPS IN THE MEDITERRANEAN, AS GEORGE BUSH AND MIKHAIL GORBACHEV MEET FACE-TO-FACE IN THE FLOATING SUMMIT.

IN MY VIEW, GOING INTO THE HISTORIC SUPERPOWER MEETING, THE PRESIDENT HAS NEARLY ALL THE CARDS, AND IT LOOKS LIKE GORBACHEV HAS ALL THE HEADACHES. GEORGE BUSH IS A VERY POPULAR PRESIDENT, AND THE AMERICAN PEOPLE ARE UNITED BEHIND THE DRAMATIC DEVELOPMENTS INSIDE THE IRON CURTAIN.

GORBACHEV, MEANWHILE, IS STRUGGLING TO KEEP THE SOVIET UNION ON ITS FEET, MUCH LESS THE COMMUNIST EMPIRE. HIS ECONOMY IS A BASKETCASE, WITH LONG LINES, A HUGE DEFICIT AND CONSUMER PATIENCE AT AN END.

AT THE SAME TIME, SOVIET REPUBLICS ARE THUMBING THEIR NOSE AT MOSCOW, DEMANDING DEMOCRATIC REFORMS AND SELF-DETERMINATION.

WITH FREEDOM BREAKING OUT ALL OVER, AND THE WORLD FINALLY COMING TO THE REALIZATION THAT THE SOVIET UNION IS UP TO NO GOOD IN CENTRAL AMERICA, THERE IS NO REASON FOR PRESIDENT BUSH TO GO TO MALTA WITH A BASKET FULL OF GOODIES FOR GORBACHEV.

THE BOTTOMLINE IS, COMMUNISM IS IN SHAMBLES. IT DOESN'T WORK. LIKE YOU, I'LL BE WATCHING THE MEETING IN MALTA WITH GREAT INTEREST, AND I AM CERTAIN YOU JOIN ME IN WISHING ALL THE BEST TO PRESIDENT BUSH AS HE REPRESENTS THE FREE WORLD THIS WEEKEND.

WOMEN IN THE WORKFORCE

LET ME JUST CONCLUDE BY SAYING THAT AMERICA IS NOW IN A RECORD 84TH CONSECUTIVE MONTH OF ECONOMIC EXPANSION. SINCE 1984, WE HAVE CREATED OVER 20 MILLION NEW JOBS -- AND OVER HALF OF THOSE JOBS HAVE BEEN FILLED

AMONG SMALL BUSINESES -- RESPONSIBLE FOR THREE OUT OF FIVE NEW JOBS CREATED IN AMERICA -- WOMEN-OWNED BUSINESSES ARE GROWING AT A RATE FIVE TIMES THAT OF MALE-OWNED -- REPRESENTING THE LARGEST INCREASE IN THE MOST SIGNIFICANT AREA OF OUR ECONOMIC EXPANSION.

TODAY, WOMEN COMPRISE THE MAJORITY OF WORKERS IN FINANCE, INSURANCE, REAL-ESTATE, BANKING, AND HEALTH AND LEAGAL SERVICES.

THE NUMBER OF WOMEN PROFESSIONALS -- LAWYERS AND DOCTORS, FOR INSTANCE -- HAS ALMOST DOUBLED SINCE 1972. AND THE NUMBER OF WOMEN IN MANAGERIAL JOBS HAS ALMOST TRIPLED.

BARRIERS

STILL BARRIERS REMAIN. THOSE FOOLISH ENOUGH TO MAINTAIN ROADBLOCKS TO WOMEN IN MANAGEMENT AND OTHER SIGNIFICANT POSITIONS ARE ONLY SHORTCHANGING THEMSELVES. TOGETHER WE WILL KEEP WORKING AND TO KEEP KNOCKING DOWN TTHOSE BARRIERS.

IN THE END, HOWEVER, YOUR SUCCESS WILL BE JUDGED NOT BE THE ACHIEVEMENT OF POWER FOR POWER'S SAKE. RATHER, YOU WILL BE JUDGED BY HOW YOU USED THAT POWER, WHAT WE STOOD FOR, AND THE DIFFERENCE -- THE POSITIVE DIFFERENCE -- YOU MADE IN THE LIVES OF OTHERS. AND THAT'S SOMETHING WORTH FIGHTING FOR.

The YWCA of the City of New York was founded in 1870, when working women were considered "pitiable creatures," according to the strict rules of respectability that governed the society of the day. Only 200,000 women were employed in Manhattan, and few earned more than four or five dollars a week. The YWCA was the first agency in the city to address the needs of these "self-supporting girls," and it has remained on the cutting edge of women's issues ever since.

Prophetically, the YWCA/NYC opened the first typing instruction class for women, breaking down a barrier that had held them back from working in offices because it was considered "too arduous." The YWCA also pioneered the first free circulating library for women, the first employment bureau for women, and the first business and professional center for women.

Within 50 years of its founding, the YWCA had become one of the major social service agencies in the New York metropolitan area, concerning itself not only with the needs of working women, but also with the needs of the poor, disadvantaged women and their children, immigrants, and the unemployed.

Later, as women began to enter the managerial structures of corporations, the YWCA/NYC helped with classes, special courses, and conferences. The Salute To Women Achievers Luncheon and the Academy of Women Achievers were created to call attention to their accomplishments.

It is a distinguished past, solid yet flexible, innovative yet measurably effective. We have accomplished important work, work of which we can be proud – proud to have achieved, and proud to carry on.

Today, as yesterday, The YWCA of the City of New York works

for a stronger community and stronger families, responding with flexibility and compassion, never veering from its focus on the building of character, confidence, competence, and self esteem. The YWCA of the City of New York is the largest of 500 YWCA's throughout the world, with over 15,000 members and an annual budget of \$5.7 million.

It was the first agency in the City to offer on-site infant and toddler care for disadvantaged teen mothers preparing for their high school equivalency exams and the first in the nation to offer an organized program that enables disabled girls to meet successful disabled women who act as role models and mentors. The YWCA, in cooperation with the YMCA, is the largest provider of day care in the entire City, with ten centers located in all five boroughs. It also has programs for teenage mothers, for young fathers, for Asian immigrants, for homeless families, and for newly widowed or divorced mid-life women who must re-enter the workforce after being homemakers for many years.

In addition, the YWCA is much in demand to present workshops and training sessions at a wide variety of social service agencies, community centers and schools.

The convictions that have distinguished The YWCA of the City of New York throughout the past also guide us into the future: the conviction that personal development is the birthright of every individual; that programs must be accessible, available, and affordable if all but the staunchest aspirants are not to lose heart; that flexibility, innovation, responsiveness, and compassion have been and must remain hallmarks of our past and future.

The YWCA: Building for Our Second Century

In 1982, the board and staff of The YWCA of the City of New York entered into the development of a long-term plan. Our goal was to discern and enumerate appropriate ways for the YWCA/NYC to address women's needs, community issues, and the needs of specific population groups. The result was our vision for the future — a vision dependent upon the full realization of three objectives, which are the underpinnings of the Building for Our Second Century campaign:

- To provide the kinds of programs women and girls need to develop their potential in many different directions
- To increase total income by 5% per year over inflation and earmark 50% of the annual endowment income to subsidize special and start-up programs
- To develop the human, physical, and technological resources necessary to implement the plan and meet the challenges of the future

With the articulation of these objectives, the Board of Directors and the Board of Trustees of The YWCA of the City of New York committed themselves to the implementation of the vision. The Building for Our Second Century Fund was authorized, with a goal of \$14,000,000. The first \$6.5 million of the goal has already been achieved by selling the air rights to our midtown facility; the remaining \$7.5 million is being raised through the capital campaign, with \$3.7 million currently committed. This campaign presents unique partnership opportunities:

- An opportunity for our corporate neighbors, our members, and our friends throughout the city to join together to strengthen our community
- An opportunity to ensure this historic institution's ability to build on its distinguished past
- An opportunity to enable the YWCA to continue serving the needs of the people of the City of New York

Senator Bob Dole, one of America's most respected and best known leaders, has a distinguished record of public service that spans almost four decades.

A tough, common sense conservative from America's heartland, Senator Dole has earned national acclaim with his leadership for budget responsibility, tax reform, a sound Social Security system, quality and affordable health care, rights for the disadvantaged and persons with disabilities, and for a better future for rural America.

Also respected as a master legislator, he was unanimously reelected by his Republican colleagues to a third term as their Senate Leader on November 28, 1988.

Bob Dole was first elected to the United States Senate in 1968, after serving four consecutive terms in the House of Representatives. From 1981 to 1984, he was Chairman of the powerful Senate Finance Committee, where he was instrumental with President Reagan in laying the foundation for America's strongest economic recovery in thirty years.

Born and raised on the plains of western Kansas, Bob Dole has been a fixture on the Agriculture Committees ever since he came to Washington in 1961. In fact, he has often been called the voice of American agriculture on Capitol Hill.

During the second World War, Bob Dole left premedical studies at the University of Kansas to enlist in the Army. Rising quickly to a position of command, he became a platoon leader in the legendary Tenth Mountain Division in Italy. In 1945, he was gravely wounded on the battlefield and was later twice decorated for heroic

achievement. His decorations include two Purple Hearts and a Bronze Star with Oakleaf Cluster.

As a result of his injuries, Bob Dole spent thirty-nine months in hospitals fighting for his life, an experience that helped make him a lifelong advocate for veterans and individuals with disabilities. In 1948, he was honorably discharged from the Army with the rank of Captain.

At age 26, Bob Dole entered public office for the first time when he was elected to the Kansas House of Representatives. Two years later, he became Russell County's prosecuting attorney, an office he held until his 1980 election to Congress. Senator Dole later became Republican National Chairman and President Gerald Ford's running mate in the 1976 Presidential election. In the past two Senate elections in Kansas – 1980 and 1986 – Bob Dole won every one of the state's 105 counties.

Senator Dole was born in Russell, Kansas on July 22, 1923, the eldest son of Doran and Bina Dole. He attended local public schools and later the University of Kansas. After the war, he continued his education at the University of Arizona at Tucson and at Washburn Municipal University in Topeka, from which he earned his bachelor's and law degrees.

Senator Dole is married to Elizabeth Hanford Dole, President Bush's pick to be America's new Secretary of Labor. She also served in Ronald Reagan's cabinet as Secretary of Transportation, only the seventh woman in history to hold a cabinet post. Senator Dole also has a daughter, Robin, who resides in Washington, D.C.

OF COURSE, THERE WILL ALWAYS BE SPECIFIC CONCERNS FOR WOMEN, BUT MOST YOUR ISSUES TODAY ARE MAINSTREAM ISSUES: YOU CARE ABOUT THE DEFICIT, AND THE DRUG CRISIS, THE ENVIRONMENT, FOREIGN AFFAIRS, AGRICULTURE, OR WHATEVER. SO LET SPEND A FEW MINUTES ON WHAT MAY BE MATTERS OF INTEREST TO MOST OF YOU.

ON THE HOME FRONT, THE GOOD NEWS' IS CONGRESS HAS ADJOURNED FOR THE YEAR. I KNOW IT IS FASHIONABLE TO SAY CONGRESS HAD A 'POOR' YEAR, BUT I WOULD SAY THE JURY IS STILL OUT. WE HAVE COMPLETED THE FIRST HALF THE 101ST CONGRESS WITH MUCH MORE LEFT TO DO IN SECOND HALF. IN MY VIEW WE HAD A PRETTY SOLID 1989.

DRUGS

TOOK A GIANT PARTISAN STEP FORWARD FULLY FUNDING MAJOR ANTI-DRUG AND CRIME PACKAGES. THE PRESIDENT PROVIDED THE LEADERSHIP THIS DOMESTIC **CRISIS** INTRODUCING THE FIRST-EVER NATIONAL STRATEGY FOR THE WAR ON DRUGS, AS WELL AS A COMPREHENSIVE ANTI-CRIME PROPOSAL MORE PRISON

SPACE, MORE FUNDING FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT, MORE EDUCATION AND TOUGHER, STIFFER PENALTIES NOT ONLY FOR THE PUSHER, BUT FOR THE USER, TOO.

THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT CAN HELP, BUT IT CAN'T DO IT ALONE. WE NEED HELP —— FROM THE STATES, FROM THE CHURCHES, FROM THE PRIVATE SECTOR, AND PARENTS, AND FROM YOU, AMERICA'S LEADERS.

MR. GORBACHEV USE THEIR MALTA MEETING TO AGREE ON A JOINT EFFORT ON A MAJOR HUMANITARIAN PROJECT: I SUGGESTED A COMBINED US—USSR EFFORT TO DEAL WITH DRUG AND ALCOHOL ABUSE.

CHILD CARE

LOOK AT OUR PENSION LAWS TO SEE MAKES SENSE IF IT ALLOW PENSION BENEFITS TO BE TRANSFERRED FROM JOB-TO-BY ALLOWING A TRANSFER JOB. MAKING PENSION BY BENEFITS 'PORTABLE,' IN OTHER WORDS -- WORKERS WOULD BE ABLE TO CARRY OVER VALUABLE BENEFITS THAT THEY HAVE ACCRUED IN PREVIOUS JOBS.

LET'S FACE IT: THE DAYS
WHEN PEOPLE SPEND THEIR ENTIRE
LIVES WITH A SINGLE EMPLOYER
ARE NEARLY OVER.

HEALTH CARE LEGISLATION, THE EMPLOYERS' ISSUE RESPONSIBILITY FOR, FUNDING OF, RETIREE HEALTH CARE, WILL HAVE INCREASING IMPORTANCE. AND WHILE THERE IS BI-PARTISAN AGREEMENT THAT CONGRESS MUST REVISIT MAJOR HEALTH POLICY ISSUES SUCH AS LONG-TERM AND CATASTROPHIC CARE NEXT YEAR, BUDGETARY CONSTRAINTS, COMBINED WITH RELUCTANCE TO RELY ON SELF-FUNDING MECHANISMS, WILL EFFECTIVE MAKE FEDERAL



Dear Senator Dole:

As you know, the Women's Bureau of the U.S. Department of Labor has been the key government liaison with the NYC YWCA for this event. Therefore, if you can, please include in your luncheon remarks today some mention of the role that the Women's Bureau plays with in the Department of Labor in bringing women's employment concerns to the attention of the Hill and to the Executive branch.

Note: the Women's Bureau was founded on June 5, 1920--the year American women got the vote--by an act of Congress. The Bureau is mandated:

> "To formulate standards and policies which shall promote the welfare of wage-earning women, improve their working conditions, increase their efficiency, and advance their opportunities for profitable employment."

Also, we are the only Federal Agency devoted exclusively to the concerns of women in the labor force.

The Region II Women's Bureau works closely with many of the organizations represented at the luncheon to assure New York women get a fair shake at opportunities for equal and profitable employment.
