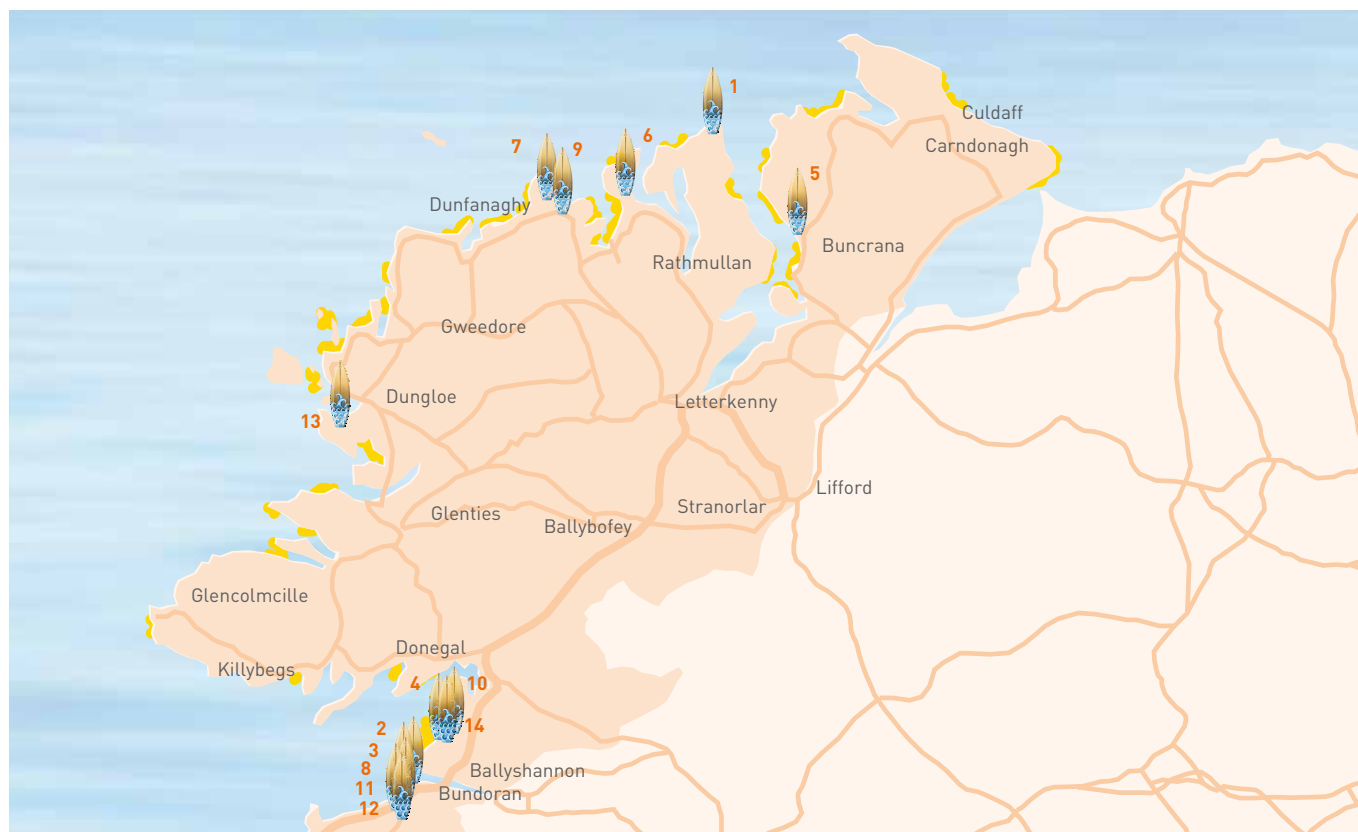

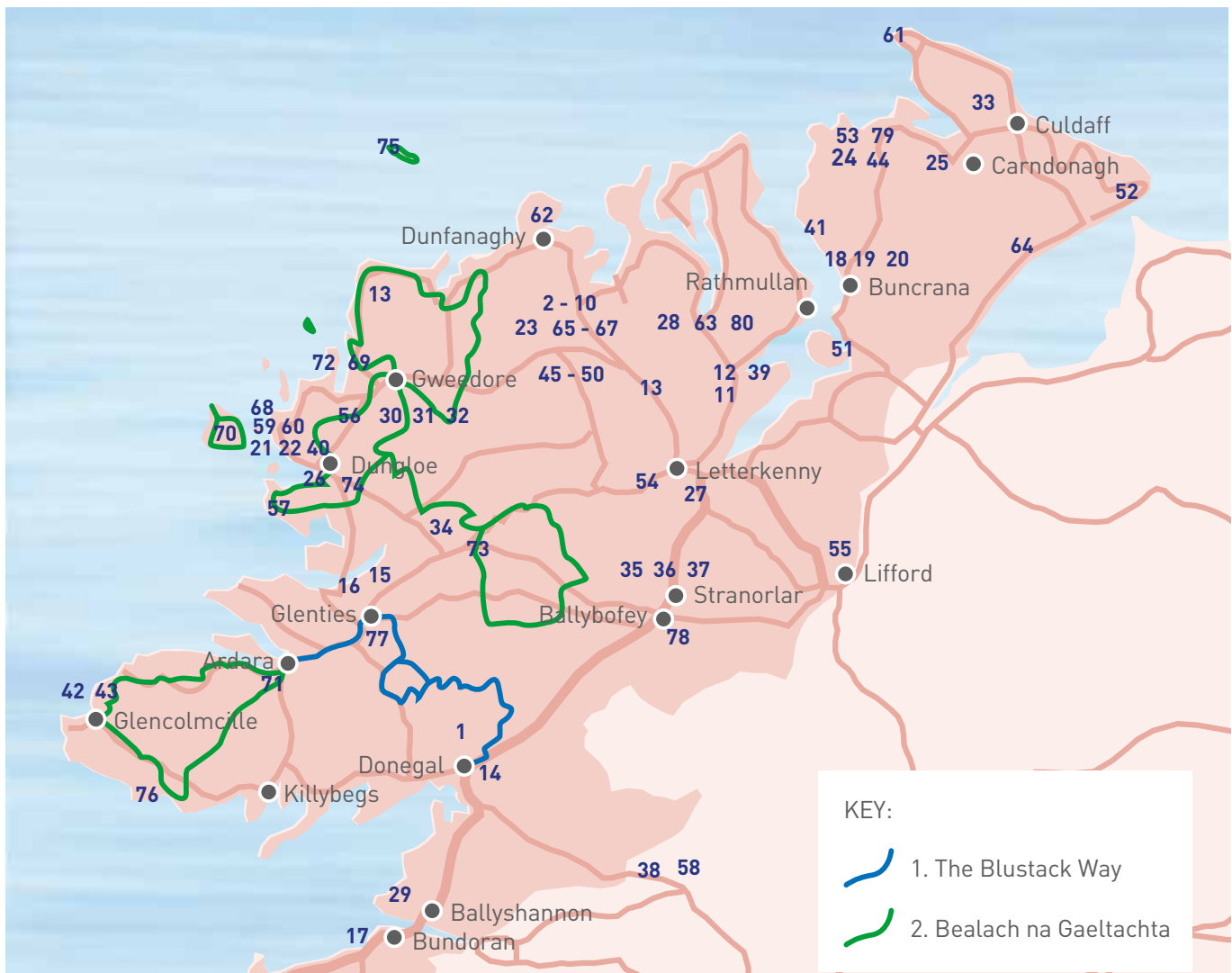

12 Things You Must Do In Donegal



1. Malin Head

Ireland's most northerly point

Catch a cloudless evening and you may be enchanted by a night sky display of the Aurora Borealis, the Northern Lights. The celestial light show, with its ghostly wispy rays of dancing colours has been seen hanging like a fluorescent curtain over Malin Head – what better reason to go than to witness this astonishing sight. As you make your way around the 100-mile circuit of the scenic Inishowen peninsula, you will find many attractions and distractions on the journey to Ireland's most northerly point, Malin Head. Those with an interest in military history will want to see Fort Dunree Military Museum near Buncrana. Further along, Doagh Famine Village, an outdoor museum, provides a thought-provoking look at the area from the tragedy of the Famine in the 1840s up to the present.

2. Grianán of Aileach

Awaken your mystical spirit

Perched 800 ft. above sea level on a spectacular hilltop, the Grianán of Aileach fort is a former home of the Irish High Kings. The origins of this circular site are believed to date from around 1700 BC. Although it has important connections with the ancient monasteries of Donegal, its history stretches far beyond the era of Christianity and is steeped in legend. The terraced fort is an enigmatic place in which to immerse yourself in the past and survey the landscape. Sweeping views take in patchwork fields and lakes as well as the wider hilly countryside. In 2013, the fort was chosen as one of the landmarks included on the new Irish passport.



3. Surfing in Bundoran

Ride the waves!

In the south of the county, Bundoran has become the unrivalled centre of surf culture hosting world class competitions. Regarded as the top spot by the black-clad brigade, it is a place where wave-riding runs deep in the veins of some locals' blood. Set against a backdrop of dramatic scenery and beaches, the reefs around Bundoran are world renowned, producing the optimal wave size. Donegal Adventure Centre in Bundoran – the largest of its kind in Ireland – provides expert tuition from qualified instructors in the tricky art of staying up on your board. If you are new to surfing, a good place for beginners is Rosstown, a few miles north.

4. Sliabh Liag

Drink in some of the best views in Europe

A narrow road twists steeply up from Teelin to the dramatic Sliabh Liag cliffs and mountains. From the viewing point, you look across one of the finest panoramas in Europe that will set your heart racing. An information panel, part of the Donegal Interpretative Project, sets out the details of what you see. This area of Donegal is also part of the famed Appalachian Trail that leads eastwards along the Bluestack Way and joins up with the Ulster Way and the Causeway Coast. The nearby cultural centre, Teelin, is a rich source of information on the area and its archaeological heritage.

5. Fanad Head

See the light at Fanad Lighthouse!

Golden sandy beaches and rolling farmland threaded by narrow roads set the scene in the secluded Fanad peninsula squeezed in between Lough Swilly and Mulroy Bay and leading to spectacular Fanad Head where you can take a tour and climb to the top of the lighthouse. You can even stay in the original Lightkeeper's cottages. On the way, families can enjoy a day of water sports at picture-postcard resorts such as Rathmullan or Portsalon. Take your pick from spinning for mackerel off a pier, learning to fly-fish for rainbow trout, hire a pedalo or paddle a kayak. If you are feeling energetic, why not saddle up and gallop along the shores of Lough Swilly on the pristine Rathmullan Strand. As you drive around this thrilling peninsula be prepared for delays on single track roads; your path may be blocked by a herd of heifers and you will be reduced to cow-speed. Don't forget you are in north Donegal where the motto *festina lente* 'hurry slowly' applies and where life moves at an easy pace.



6. Donegal Bay Waterbus

Cruise around Donegal Bay

The most enjoyable way to explore the highlights of Donegal Bay is on a 75min boat tour taking in everything from historic sites to seal-inhabited coves, admiring an island manor and a ruined castle along the way. Crew members give an informative and entertaining commentary on the local history and the sights of special interest in the bay on the outward journey with a sing-along music on the return voyage. Sailing times are usually morning, afternoon or evening and are dependent upon weather and the tides. Tickets can be bought from the ticket office which is a renovated cottage near the Tourist Office. The Donegal Bay Waterbus has all modern amenities, seated upper deck viewing area, modern safety equipment and even a small dance floor.

7. Glenveagh National Park

Look out for golden eagles

The largest track of land in the wildest part of Donegal, Glenveagh National Park incorporates moorland, mountains, lakes and woods within its 40,000 acres of wilderness. The park – the second largest in Ireland – was once owned by the American millionaire Henry P. McIlhenny and is now in the hands of the Irish government. Tours of the castle, as well as guided tours of the Italianate formal gardens are available, or you can join a ranger-led walk along footpaths through the grounds. You may be lucky enough to catch sight of soaring golden eagles which have been reintroduced into the area or chance upon a shy red deer.

8. Hike Errigal

Stand at the top of Donegal

The distinctive white conical peak of Errigal, (from the Irish translation, Aireagál meaning 'oratory') the highest point in the county, is a potent symbol and has a grip on the imagination. Pull on your walking boots for a pleasant hike across heather and grass before joining a stony path to the summit at 2,466 ft., where two cairns are connected by a narrow path. Anyone with a reasonable level of fitness, and the right gear, will be able to complete the walk to the top in less than two hours. It's well worth the effort. You will be rewarded with an uninterrupted panorama of Bloody Foreland, a countryside speckled with sheep and white cottages, and lying out to sea, the islands of Inishbofin, Inishdoeey and Inishbeg.



9. Daniel O'Donnell Visitor Centre

Celebrating a glittering life in music

He has appeared 18 times in the US Billboard World Album Charts and now Donegal's famed singing star, Daniel O'Donnell has his very own visitor centre charting a glittering musical career. The Daniel O'Donnell Visitor Centre in Dungloe opened in 2012 and since then thousands have come through the doors to celebrate the story of his life. A 12-minute film explains his humble beginnings in Kincasslagh and rise to international stardom. Memorabilia includes gold discs, stage outfits, his wedding suit and his wife's wedding dress, as well as his first schoolbag. O'Donnell's repertoire of songs covering Irish, country and pop has struck a chord with many emigrants. In a musical career of more than 30 years he has sold 10 million albums.

10. Glencolmcille Folk Village Museum

Commune with the rural past

There are few better places to delve into the past than at Glencolmcille Folk Village. This clachan, or village, comprises eight thatched, whitewashed cottages showcasing three specific years of Irish culture: 1720, 1820 and 1920. New exhibitions house a fisherman's cottage and a traditional pub-grocery and shoemaker's shop. Potter around this reflective place and you will find a sweat house (an early Irish sauna), replica lime kilns and mass rocks. A few miles north of Glencolmcille, at Port, you can follow in the footsteps of the Welsh poet, Dylan Thomas, who holidayed in the area in 1935. Organised walks lead through the serenely beautiful peat bogland of the valley of Glenlough, past glacial waterfalls and over the Glengesh Pass to Ardara.

11. Donegal Islands

A get away from it all

Donegal's islands offer something special: a get away from it all, a feeling of being somewhere unlike anywhere else in the world.

The inhabited islands have ferry services from various ports on mainland Donegal and some of the small craft operators will take passengers to the uninhabited islands.

The reasons to visit any the Islands are innumerable, be it rock climbing, bird watching, getting in touch with nature or visiting a well preserved traditional culture. Whatever the case may be, a unique and spirited adventure awaits you!



12. Oakfield Park

Secret Jewel in East Donegal

Oakfield Park is referred to as the Secret Jewel in the Heart of Donegal. If you are looking for somewhere to entertain the whole family for the day – then Oakfield Park is the perfect place for an adventure.

It is set in 100 acres of magnificent parkland, woodlands and gardens near the town of Raphoe. This beautifully restored house is set in a lush landscape of parklands and mature woodlands, overlooking the distant Croaghan Mountain. The grounds include walled gardens, ponds, lakes, a lakeside Nymphaeum, heritage trees, sculptures, extensive walks and trails and a 4.5km narrow gauge railway with trains operating passenger trips each day. An adventure not to be missed.

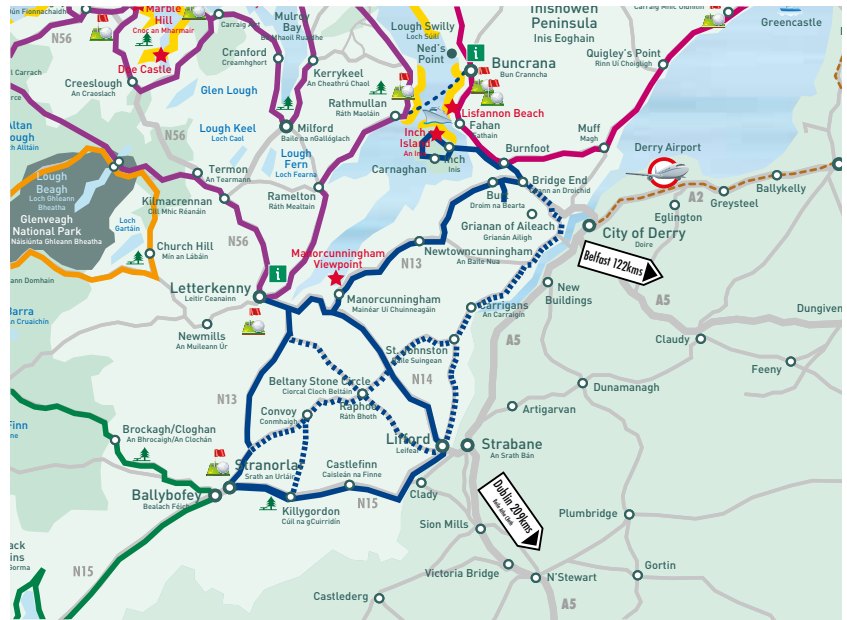

The Gaeltacht

Donegal Gaeltacht is an area in Donegal where, many claim, one of the purest forms of the Irish language has survived and where the traditions of Irish song, dance and folklore prevail. The largest geographical Gaeltacht in the country, and part of the Wild Atlantic Way, spreads from the Gleann Cholm Cille (Glencolmcille) region of the south up along the west coast and through Donegal's Gaeltacht Lár (central) region of the Derryveagh range and the scenic Poisoned Glen; and north through the Rosses on to Fanad Head.

Donegal islands, sitting proudly in the Atlantic Ocean, are the jewels of Donegal's Gaeltacht where visitors can experience a vibrancy to the Irish culture that is both inspiring and engaging. The wild and beautiful islands have captured imagination for thousands of years and provided stimulus for artists and writers alike.

A visit to any of these islands by ferry is an experience that will broaden your horizon and linger in your heart but foresight is forewarned. Accessible by boat, any trip to the island should be researched to maximise your experience. High season (July & August) can be quite busy on some; out of season may require appropriate clothing to appreciate the rugged beauty of these jewels on the edge of Northwestern Europe.

Árainn Mhór - Arranmore Island

Probably the most accessible of all the Gaeltacht islands, Árainn Mór has a resident population of approximately 500 (CSO 2016). From the island's rolling hills, observe views of the Rosses region (Na Rosa), the islands and the or visit two of the islands lovely beaches, at Aphort or Leabh Gharbh. Oileán Ghabhla / Gola Island

The island of Gola / Gabhla covers about one square mile (500 acres). It is situated about one mile from the pier at Machaire Gathlán, or two miles from the pier at An Bun Beag. The island is hilly on its west side, rising to 238 feet at Cnoc an Choillín and 212 feet at An Mhaol Mhór, and these hills shelter the houses that stretch in a ribbon along the east side. The census of 1841 recorded a population of 68 prior to the Famine. This rose steeply to 169 by the time of the 1911 census, in response to a boom in the fishing industry. The schoolhouse, built in 1846, is situated west of Port an Churraigh. At one stage, in the 1940s, it held as many as 70 young pupils. But there is evidence of life in Gabhla prior to this. The remains of two kitchen middens - large heaps of shells discarded over centuries - are found near the lake and probably date back to prehistoric times. Two men from Gabhla, Patrick McGinley and Charles Duggan, were aboard the Asgard, the boat that brought arms into Howth in north county Dublin in 1914, in preparation for the Easter Rising of 1916.

In the late 1960s the island suffered a major population decline. This was due largely to the closure of the school in 1967. Fishing and farming at subsistence level had sustained them for centuries but could not compete with the attractions of mainland living or the better opportunities it now afforded. Gola islanders are renowned for their skills as mariners and fishermen and story-tellers. In the last ten years Gola has enjoyed a new lease of life. The launch of a regular ferry service, the The Cricket, is a great boost to the tourism industry of the island.

There is new-found interest in the ecology of the island, its scenery and the possibility of living close to nature.

Places of interest

- Original examples of Gabhla longhouses, the island's vernacular cottage architecture, can be seen among the newer, renovated houses and among the ruins.
- A small lake, Loch Mhachaire na nGall, nestles mid-island in the hollow between the hills. At one time it heaved with wild eels.
- There are five or six freshwater springs or wells around the island. It is from these that the islanders lifted their drinking water.
- Beautiful white sandy beaches at Tráigh na Béicí and at Port an Churraigh.
- Leac Cuimhneacháin an Asgard.
- Reilig na bPáistí. Children's Graveyard.

- Prehistoric kitchen middens.
- Suíomh dreapadóireachta. Steep seacliffs rim the western side of the island. Their rough granite surfaces appeal to experienced rockclimbers.
- Sea-arch at Scoilt Uí Dhúgáin.
- Cladach na Croiche ('hanging rock shore').
- An Teach Beag - Ionad Eolais

Inis Bó Finne - 'the island of the white cow'

is located four miles from the village of An Fál Carrach (Falcarragh), or just two miles (a 10-minute boat trip) from the pier at Machaire Rabhartaigh (Magheraroarty).

Covering 300 acres, it is a small island, the southern half of the island is fertile and was cultivated in the past in the traditional 'clachan and rundale' manner, which involved communal usage of scarce arable soil and cattle pasture. There are two villages on the island, one near the harbour of An Clachán, and the other a short distance away at An Garradh Bán.

Places of interest

- Ancient farmsteads and field boundaries.
- The White Stone - situated in the middle of the island. It has links with the story of the white cow.
- Schoolhouse and the Church.
- See the unusual rock formations in the red and white granite cliffs at the north of the island.
- Caves at Tóin na Maoile Móire.
- Sea-arch at Scoilt an Droichid.
- The stone beach at Erroonagh with its smooth, egg-like stones of perfect colours, shapes and textures will take your breath away.
- Listen to the soothing sound of the stones as they roll gently in the waves.

Walking

Take an invigorating walk around the island while being revitalised by the fresh Atlantic sea breeze. Walk on the fine, golden sands of the east beach at Tobar an Ghlasáin where you can go for a refreshing swim.

Views from the island summit (An Mullach) are spectacular. In good weather, you can see the white-faced cone of Errigal and 'table-top' Muckish mountain. See also Cnoc Fola (Bloody Foreland), the cliffs of Horn Head, Toraigh and the neighbouring islands of Inis Dumhaigh (Inisdooney) and Inis Beag (Inishbeg).

Birdwatching

In summer, Inis Bó Finne reverberates to the call of the corncrake, a bird species that has vanished from most parts of Ireland. The island holds 10-20 calling males each summer, an important concentration of this globally endangered species.

Peregrine falcons and choughs regularly visit the island, which is inside a candidate Special Area of Conservation.

In summer, some 30-70 breeding pairs of Arctic terns are distributed between Inis Bó Finne and Inis Dumhaigh. The latter island holds colonies of cliff-nesting seabirds, including fulmars, shags and gulls, and a colony of eider ducks.

In winter, Inis Bó Finne is visited by an internationally important flock of some 400 barnacle geese, occasionally accompanied by Greenland white-fronted geese.

Windsurfing & Sea-Kayaking:

The spectacular bay and beach at nearby Machaire Rabhartaigh is popular with windsurfers and sea-kayakers.

Toraigh - Tory Island

Inhabited for 4,000 years, this Gaeltacht Island has its own music, songs, stories and dances and are expressions of a distinctive Irish Culture and tradition, preserved by remoteness. Historical sites include a round tower, a ruined church, the Tau Cross (one of only two found in Ireland). As well as the unique flora and fauna, visitors can enjoy diving, fishing, rock climbing, whale or dolphin watching or walk a portion of the scenic Donegal Way. A signposted 4km looped walk starting at the Pier with exceptional scenery will take your breath away. Toraigh is also famous for its school of artists, whose work has been exhibited all over the world.

Inis Fraoigh – meaning ‘island of

heather’ lies in the sheltered sea bay between Dungloe and Burtonport. The island is about one square mile in area and once held a thriving community of farmers and fishermen.

Inis Fraoigh is just a short boat trip from the pier at Burtonport. Inis Fraoigh is just one mile square. Like many Irish islands, it has a long history of human settlement. In Early Christian times it was controlled by Niall of the Nine Hostages, a local chieftain who became High King of Ireland. In the late medieval period, it was held by his descendants, the clan of Red Hugh O’Donnell, who led the last stand against England’s conquest of Ulster. Their lands were redistributed in the Plantation years. In the early 20th century the island was home to a tightly-knit community of 36 families who lived in a number of ‘clachans’ or clustered settlements of small cottages, complete with school and post office, at Fartown. Two famous Irish authors, Peadar O’Donnell and Séamus Ó Grianna, taught in the school in the 1910s.

Places of interest

1. The two-storey house on the north of the island is claimed to have been built by an ancestor of Ulysses Simpson Grant, the 18th President of the United States.
2. An ancient Mass Rock some 50 metres south of the pier is a reminder of the 18th-century penal laws imposed by the British Crown, which forbade the freedom of Roman Catholic religious practice.

Activities

Walking, boat tours, sea-angling, diving, birdwatching and dolphin-watching. The flora and fauna on Inis Fraoigh are rare.

Birdwatching

Terns and waders, including artic tern and ringed plover nest on the west coast of the island at Poll an Choire. Interesting ground nesting species including the corncrake are often heard calling in the fields at Fartown. Other species common on Inis Fraoigh are razorbills, cormorants and kittiwakes.

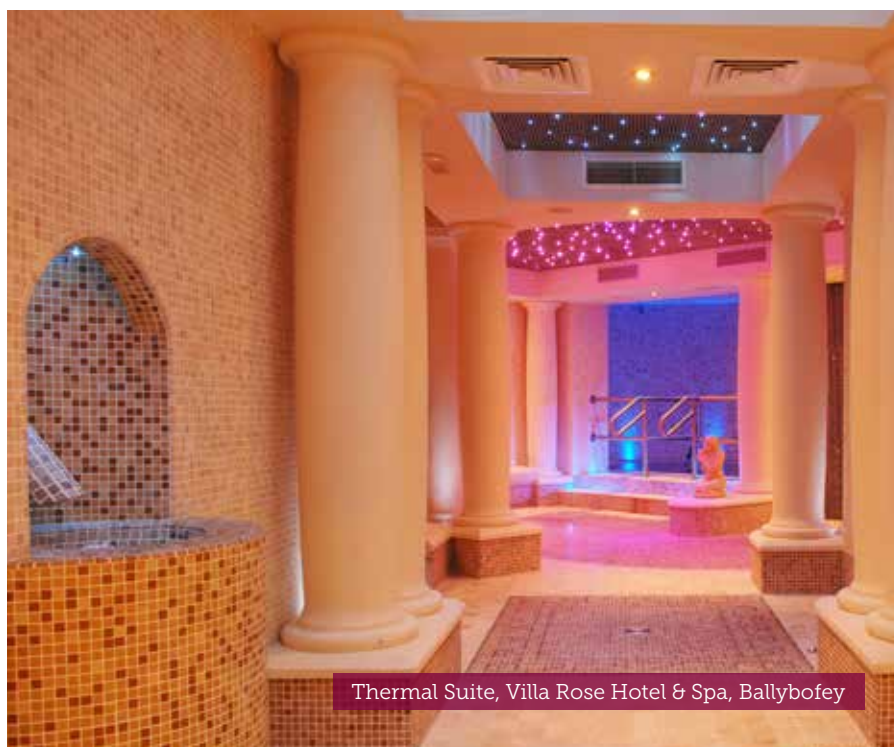

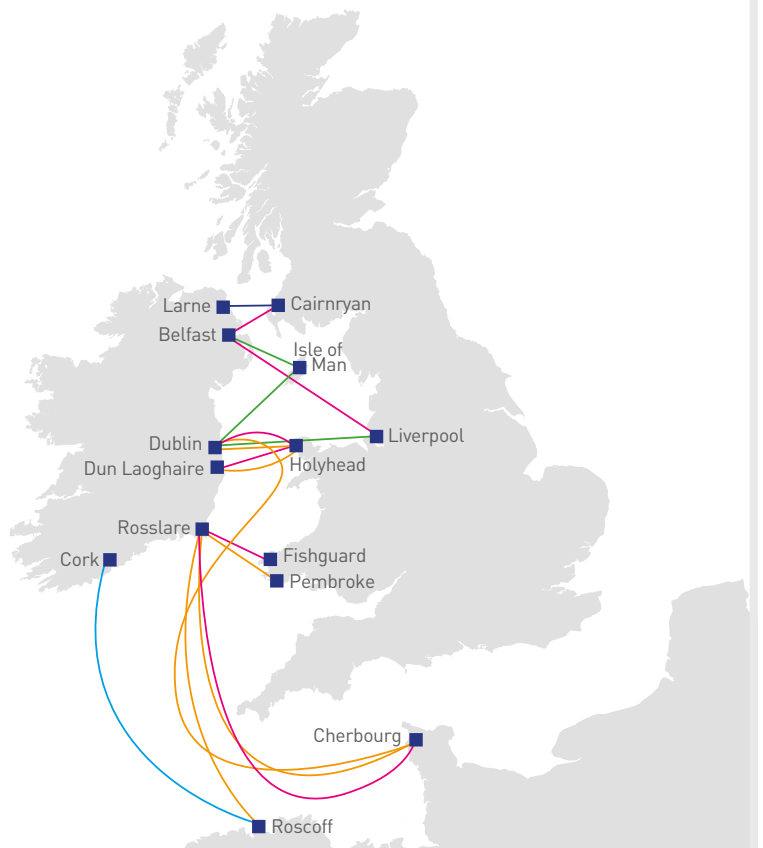

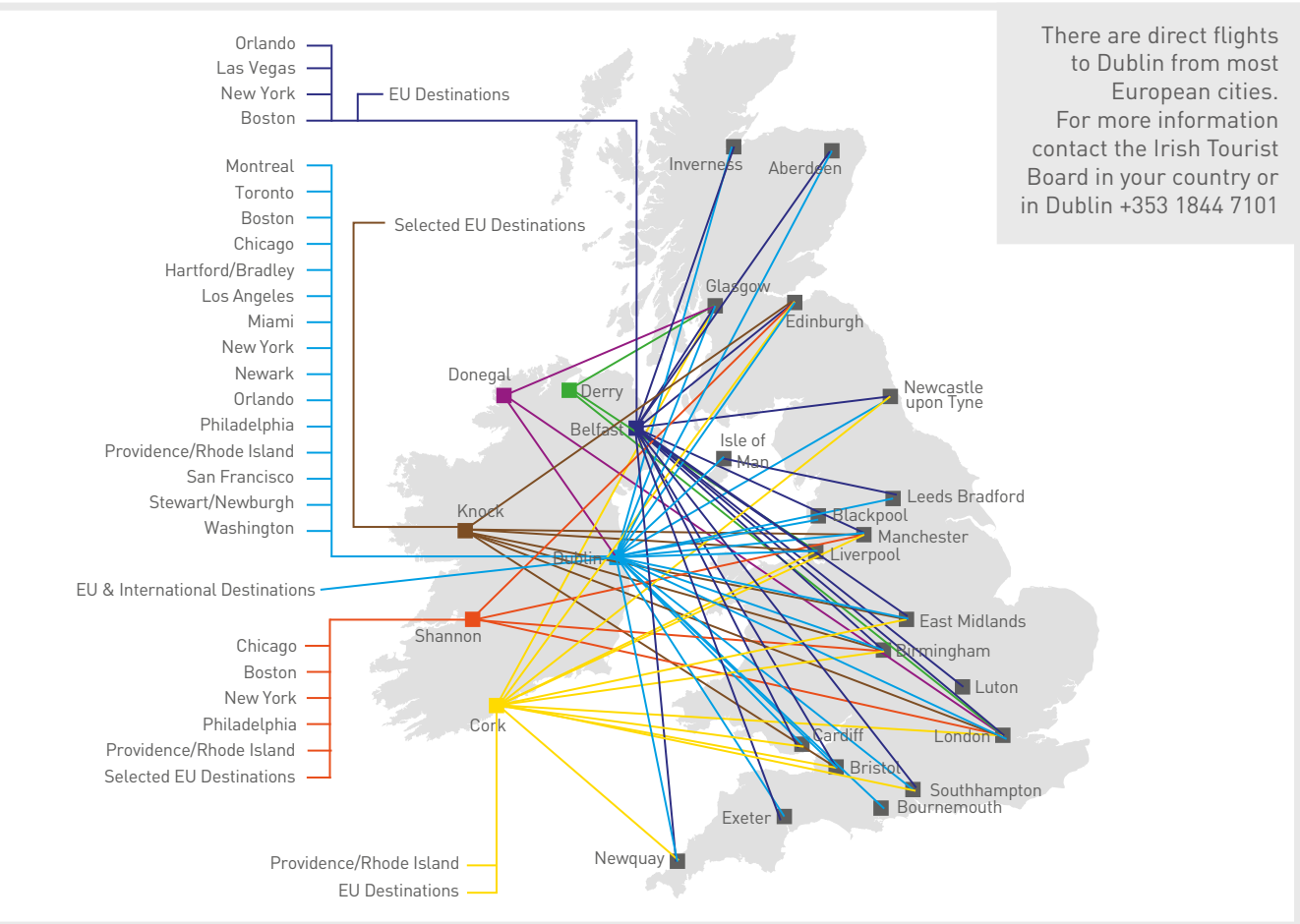
