SBS 2003 R2 provides small businesses with many of the same features and benefits used by large companies—e-mail, Internet connectivity, internal Web sites, remote access, support for mobile devices, file and printer sharing, backup and restore—all in one affordable, integrated package.

An ideal first server for small businesses, SBS 2003 R2 is available in two editions— Standard and Premium.

What is the SBS 2003 R2 Transition Pack?

The Windows Small Business Server 2003 R2 Transition Pack (SBS 2003 R2 Transition Pack) is designed to address the growing needs of small businesses. The SBS 2003 R2 Transition Pack allows you to easily move up to the standard line of Microsoft server products, while protecting your initial investment in SBS 2003 R2, as you approach the 75 user/device limit or require other key scenarios.

The SBS 2003 R2 Transition Pack helps you grow as your technology needs change:

- Converts the SBS 2003 R2 license into standard licenses for each of the individual server components. The licenses will depend on which edition of SBS 2003 R2 you own (Standard or Premium).
- Removes the design constraints of SBS 2003 R2. With the SBS 2003 R2 Transition Pack, you can exceed the 75 user-or-device limit and are not required to keep SBS 2003 R2 as the root domain controller.
- Protects your technology investment in SBS 2003 R2 through specially designed Transition Pack pricing. The Transition
 Pack is available for purchase through the retail channel, only.

SBS 2003 R2 customers should consider the SBS 2003 R2 Transition Pack if you:

- Will have more than 75 users or devices in the near future.
- Want to move the individual SBS 2003
 R2 server components onto different
 machines. For example: Exchange Server
 2003 or Microsoft SQL Server 2005
 Workgroup Edition (Premium Edition only).

SBS 2003 R2 Transition Pack Licensing

The SBS 2003 R2 Transition Pack upgrades SBS 2003 R2 to the stand-alone versions of the respective product components.

Customer Client Access Licenses (CALs) are also upgraded to include additional servers.

SBS 2003 R2 Transition Pack Standard Edition provides licenses for stand-alone versions of the following products:

- Windows Server 2003 R2 Standard Edition
- Exchange Server 2003 Standard Edition

SBS 2003 R2 Transition Pack Premium Edition provides licenses for stand-alone versions of the following products:

- Windows Server 2003 R2 Standard Edition
- Exchange Server 2003 Standard Edition
- SQL Server 2005 Workgroup Edition
- ISA Server 2004 Standard Edition

SBS 2003 R2 Transition Pack CALs will

upgrade your SBS 2003 R2 CALs into Windows Server 2003 R2 CALs and Exchange Server 2003 CALs. SBS 2003 R2 Premium Edition customers should buy additional SQL Server CALs to access your SQL Server 2005 Workgroup Edition. You can purchase additional Transition Pack CALs in increments of 5 and 20.

For example, if you have purchased SBS 2003 R2 Premium Edition and have a total of 70 CALs and you want to move to the stand-alone editions of the server, you would purchase one SBS 2003 R2 Transition Pack Premium Edition, 65 SBS 2003 R2

Transition Pack Premium CALs (5 CALs are included with the SBS 2003 R2 Transition Pack Premium Edition) and 70 SQL Server 2005 Workgroup Edition CALs.

SBS 2003 R2 Transition Pack Protects Your Technology Investment


SBS 2003 R2 Transition Pack pricing has been designed so you will not be paying any more than if you had bought the retail editions of the individual server components initially. For each of the Transition Pack SKUs, the price is calculated based on the cost of what you will transition to, minus what you have paid for SBS 2003 R2

Purchasing the SBS 2003 R2 Transition Pack and Obtaining Media

The SBS 2003 R2 Transition Pack is available for purchase through the retail channel. The SBS 2003 R2 Transition Pack includes media for Windows Server 2003 R2 Standard Edition, a product key, and a wizard that removes the SBS 2003 R2 design constraints. With the SBS 2003 R2 Transition Pack you are entitled to the media for the product components included in your version of SBS 2003 R2. You can use this media to move the applications to a new server or for system recovery.

For example, if you own SBS 2003 R2 Standard Edition and you purchase the SBS 2003 R2 Transition Pack Standard Edition, you are entitled to receive the media for Exchange Server 2003 Standard Edition. SBS 2003 R2 Premium Edition customers who purchase the SBS 2003 R2 Transition Pack Premium Edition are entitled to receive the media for Exchange Server 2003 Standard Edition, SQL Server 2005 Workgroup Edition, and ISA Server 2004 Standard Edition.

To obtain this media, you should contact your Microsoft customer service center to request it and state you are an SBS 2003 R2 customer and have purchased the SBS 2003 R2 Transition Pack. You will not need to pay for the actual software, but there is a small media fulfillment fee.
