## THE BIG FOUR GRASSES OF KANSAS PRAIRIES

The tallgrass prairie is made up of hundreds of plant species, but none are more iconic and synonymous with the landscape than “the big four”: big bluestem, little bluestem, switchgrass, and Indiangrass. These grasses are well adapted to our harsh climate and can survive long periods of drought, frequent fires, and grazing. But when considering which to plant in your home garden, you have to get to know each grass and its preferences as an individual plant.

Each is different in habit and preference: big bluestem may grow up to eight feet tall and prefers dry conditions while switchgrass thrives in the swampy low spots of ditches and gullies, usually reaching five to six feet tall. Little bluestem requires excellent drainage or it will rot, while Indiangrass seems to grow in just about any soil.

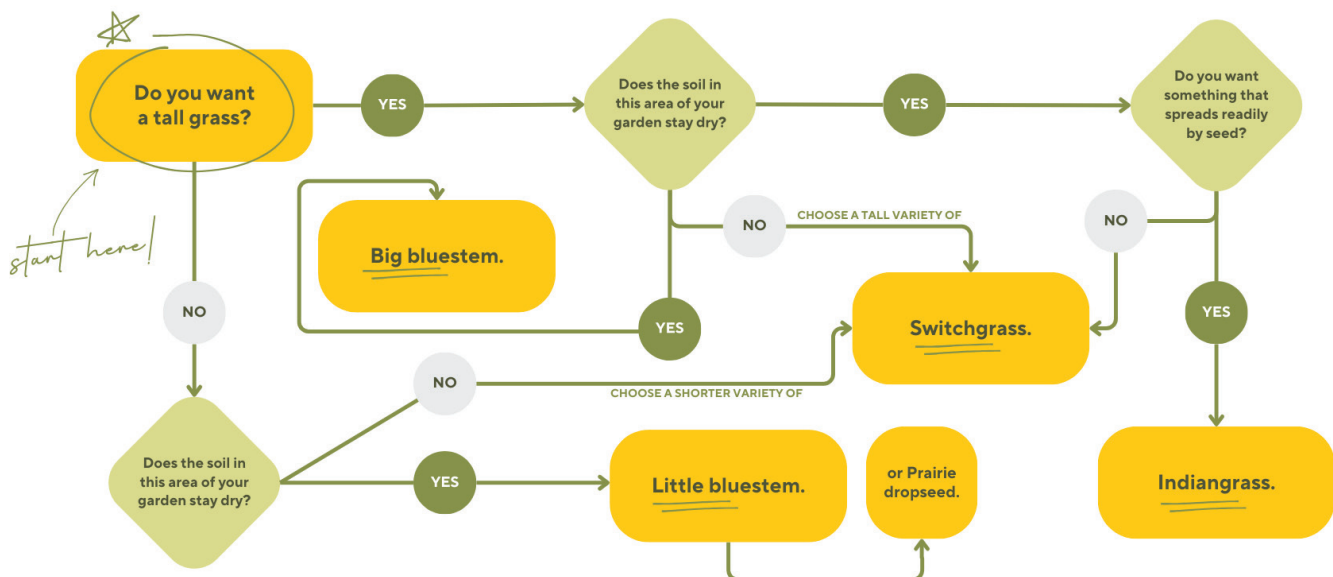
Native grasses play a vital role in the prairie ecosystem, providing food and habitat for a variety of other creatures

as well as improving the soil with organic matter and reducing erosion.

While these grasses are quite at home on the prairie, they can be equally at home in your landscape, bringing their many benefits into your garden.

But it can be hard to keep them all straight! Below is a graph that might help you choose which grasses best fit your needs. (Though not in the “big four,” we threw in prairie dropseed for a shorter option.)

# CHOOSING YOUR LITTLE BLUESTEM

*Schizachyrium scoparium* may be thousands of years old, but its many cultivars and varieties are relatively new on the perennial plant scene. Many people wonder why we need these varieties at all?

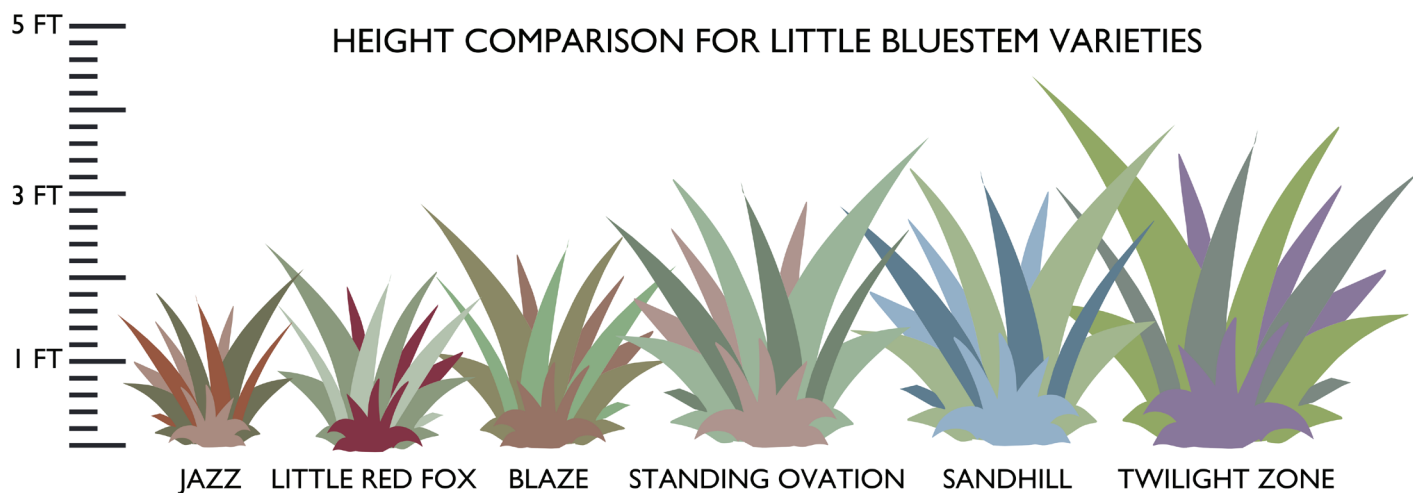
As much as we love little bluestem in its straight species form, the truth is that it is not always a good fit for all landscapes. Straight species, that is, sexually produced seedlings, can have great variations in appearance. Humans select the best seedlings and propagate them asexually, creating a more uniform and predictable plant.

New varieties of bluestem are created by field testing hundreds of bluestem seedlings, and selecting those with unique attributes like color, height, or habit. After many years of study to ensure the grass has garden-worthy merits and is phenotypically stable, it may finally reach the market under a new, patented name.

These varieties exist to solve uniquely urban problems that the *S. scoparium* of prehistoric days wouldn't even recognize! Some of us have very small urban spaces, so we need a bluestem that won't spread aggressively by seed. Many people want the look and benefits of a native bluestem, but need a grass that stays short, to allow for visibility around driveways and city sidewalks.

Choosing the right plant for the right place makes the difference between a prairie garden being well received by the community or being perceived as an eyesore. For urban landscapes, varieties are very helpful. For conservation plantings, or rural settings, local ecotype seed is best.
