CPR PAYS OFF

In February of 1989, our Industrial Nurse, Debbie Graham, gave an Adult CPR course here in the plant. **Rick Englund**, Design & Drafting Dept., was among the employees taking the course at that time.

About two weeks after the completion of the course, Rick was driving by an accident in the early evening, involving a gentleman and a lady on Vamo Road. The gentleman had turned his bicycle into the traffic and was thrown against the windshield and then to the ground. He was bleeding and unconscious. Bystanders were there but not doing anything for the gentleman. Rick stopped the car and offered assistance.

Those nearby said the injured man had a pulse but was not breathing. Rick said he knew CPR and they urged him to do something.

The man was unconscious, gray faced, and not breathing. Rick opened the air way and gave two breaths. He saw the chest wall rise and then gave another breath, and another at 5 second intervals until the victim started to breathe on his own. About 4-5 minutes after the man started to breathe the police arrived, the victim remained conscious and he was then transferred to the ambulance. This victim very possibly could have died or suffered permanent brain damage for lack of oxygen had Rick Englund not stopped to help.

The Adult CPR training received at work in a company sponsored program, provided at no cost to employees, is proven to be invaluable. Rick's rescue efforts and its details have been submitted to the National Red Cross headquarters for recognition. We are all proud of Rick Englund, his compassion for others, and the successful outcome of his heroic endeavors.

Physical Inventory 1989

A Physical Inventory (P.I.) was conducted at the end of July in order to confirm the division's inventory asset balances. Physical inventories such as this are normally conducted when a company changes owners. Many companies still do physical inventories on a yearly or quarterly basis in order to maintain accurate records. We have not conducted an extensive P.I. in over five years. Periodic test counts known as "cycle counts" were instituted here in Sarasota during 1980. After cycle counting for five years in conjunction with formal P.I.'s, we realized that the cycle counts provided a more reliable method of maintaining record accuracy.

Well over 200 employees were involved in the P.I. held on July 28 and 29. Areas counted included the Main Stockroom, Incoming Inspection, Material Review Authority, Floor Stock, Finished Goods, and 20 Field Service sites scattered around the country. At the time of this writing, results of the Field Service counts had not been reconciled, but the balance of the P.I. counts were completed and reconciled in record time. The results indicated that the inventory accuracy levels were 99%+ accurate overall. Some other interesting statistics were also gathered:

The count teams and auditors devoured 34 dozen doughnuts and drank 48.4 gallons of coffee and 4 cases of soda. Reconciliation teams inhaled 20 pizzas while working till almost midnight Saturday.

A pool was organized to see who could guess the number of inventory tickets that would be written, voided, and returned blank. The winners of the pool will receive prizes supplied by Personnel.

Assistant Controller Dave Taylor and Materials Manager John Kerwin agreed that this Physical Inventory qualifies as the most accurate in the Division's history. John and Dave also commented that it was organized and implemented in record time as well. They attributed this kind of success to the employees involved in the daily maintenance of our records and inventory as well as those who counted, keypunched, audited, and reconciled the P.I. Dave and John's parting comment was: "Though we consider this P.I. extremely successful, we hope that another one is not necessary for a long, <u>long</u> time."


Also attending this festive occasion, were their supervisors and their guests, who presented them with their service award and who 'roasted' them along with giving them their well deserved award.

NOVA UNIVERSITY GRADUATES EIGHT F.W.S.I. EMPLOYEES


Eight of our employees have finished the requirements for a Masters Degree in Business Administration.




SURPRISE PARTY
