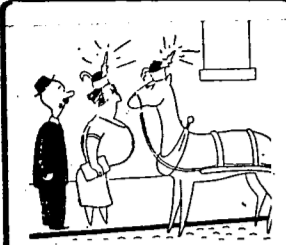


40 Years Ago
