Legacy 215+ Event in Wetaskiwin

On the hottest day of the year so far, hundreds of supporters, survivors, and community members of both Wetaskiwin and Maskwacis gathered at the Reynolds Museum in Wetaskiwin to honour and remember the children found at Indian Residential School sites across Canada.

The Chiefs of all Four Nations and Mayor of Wetaskiwin Tyler Gandam spoke to the large crowd on the first day of phase 3 of Alberta's reopening, which removed most restrictions on gatherings and face-coverings.

Chief Randy Ermineskin spoke to the gathering: "There isn't a whole lot for us to celebrate right now. There's so much sadness in the community. We need to figure out a way to heal... Many of the children never made it home. That's a sad, sad thing. Think as your sitting there listening. What if your children didn't make it home?... We have to talk about them. We have to get uncomfortable."

Indian Residential School Survivor Flora Northwest spoke to the attendees about the found children. "It's an honour. They're finally released. To go home to the spirit world with their families. The history of residential schools started, in Ermineskin, back in 1824. It's been 127 years..." Flora spoke of her Father's prayer drum songs, noting that the sound of Northern Cree's drumming lifted



her spirits. Flora's daughter and granddaughter joined her as she finished her speech.

"We did the study of the residential school. Everything came back... the pain, the abuse. I was told that I was going to amount to nobody..."

"My dream was to have all my children graduate... [they] did. All my grandchildren graduated... I'm grateful for the friends that I have and all the gifts that I have... I want to thank all of you for being here... Those children set us free." Flora thanked leadership, the pipe carrier, Northern Cree, the dancers and all attendees for attending and showing support.

Kanawemahasowin Kamik, Inc. (KKI), hosted a drive-thru Pride event that involved flying a Pride flag at the Ermineskin Cree Nation (ECN) administration building, snacks, swag, lunch, and a Parade through the Ermineskin Townsite. KKI Director Chrystal Littlechild-Hill emceed, introducing Keegan Johnson.

Keegan of Maskwacis greeted everyone: “I am from Samson. I identify as a trans male. I’ve been on this journey for a very long time. I just really want to thank everyone that’s here today... What I really want to say is that I’m really proud of how far we’ve come as a community. I’ve grown up here, I know what it’s like to be questioning my identity and sexuality. It was definitely a very difficult time for me... Being able to celebrate pride here on the reserve, it feels very historical, to me... I grew

up here and I feel so supported. I feel very emotional to see this.”

Chrystal thanked Keegan for speaking, “This is just one of many moments you’re going to inspire and empower change... It takes one person... you’ve impacted change. You’re a crusader and we’re so proud of you.”

Two-spirit hoop dancer Lakota Tootoosis shared his dance, demonstrating the symbolism of his dance moves. Lakota dances with 21 hoops.

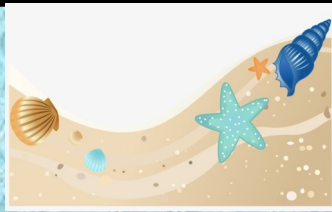

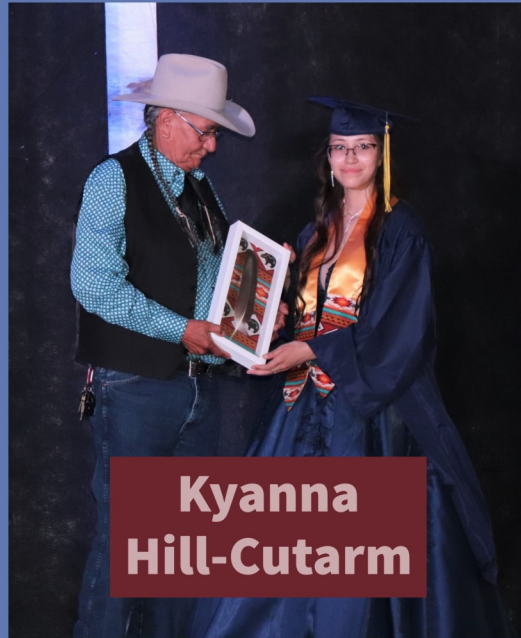

Students were congratulated by various dignitaries, including MLA Rick Wilson, Superintendent Peter Barron, and Principal Dr. Melissa Humby.

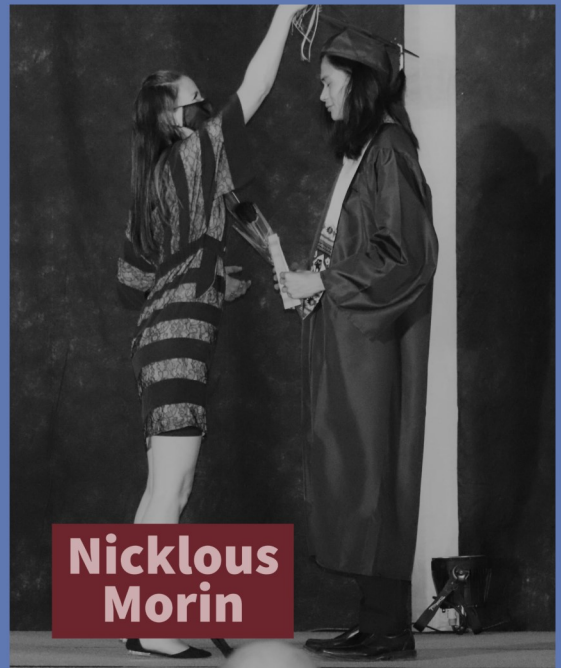

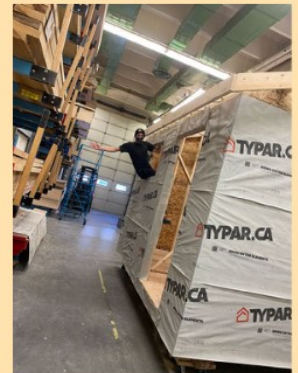
