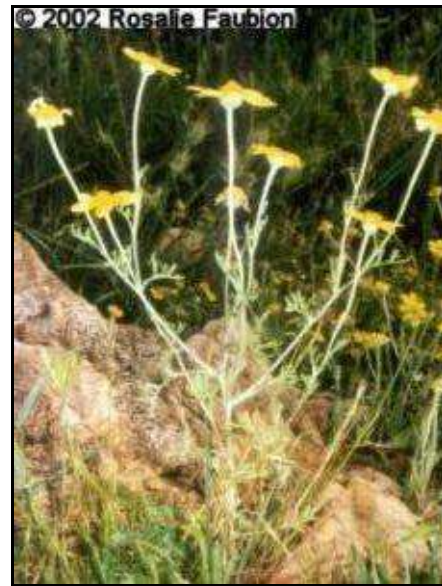


**SAN JOAQUIN ADOBE SUNBURST
(PSEUDOBAHIA PEIRSONII)**

Federal/California status: Threatened/Endangered
California Native Plant Society List 1B



Description

San Joaquin adobe sunburst is a member of the sunflower family (Asteraceae). It is a gray-green plant from 8 to 28 (20 to 70 cm) inches tall. The leaves are finely divided and the flowers are yellow. It blooms in March and April, about two weeks later than Hartweg's golden sunburst.

Habitat

San Joaquin adobe sunburst grows on heavy clay soils in Valley and foothill grasslands and foothill woodlands in the south-central San Joaquin Valley.

Range/distribution

It is known to occur within Fresno, Tulare, and Kern counties.
