

Order ANGUILLIFORMES

Pelican Eel

Family EURYPHARYNGIDAE

Eurypharynx Vaillant 1882

eurýs (Gr. εὐρύς), broad or wide; *phárynx* (Gr. φάρυγξ), throat, referring to its large pelican-like mouth and throat

Eurypharynx pelecanoides Vaillant 1882 -oides, Latinized suffix adopted from etdos (Gr. εἶδος), form or shape: pelekán (Gr. πελεκάν), pelican, referring to its large mouth and throat, similar to that of the bird
