Historical Note:

John Cummins Edwards was born in Kentucky in either 1804 or 1806. He moved to Missouri in 1828 and worked as a lawyer in Jefferson City before entering politics. In 1844, he became Missouri's nineth governor and served in that capacity until 1848, when he moved to California. He died in Stockton, California, in 1888.
