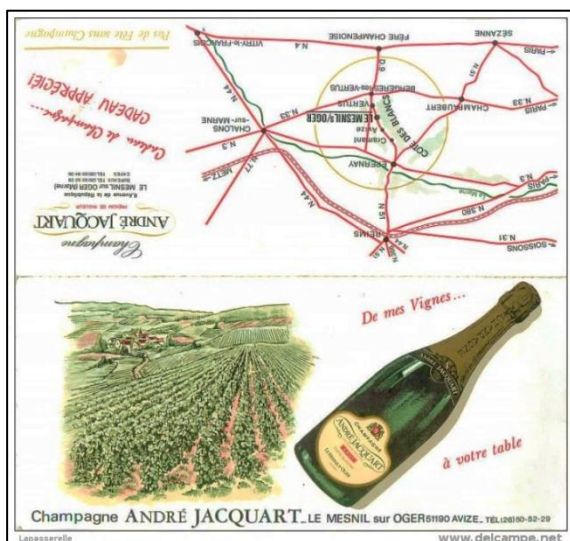

Loire Valley Chenin Blancs

Two not-very-well-known regions in the Loire Valley are the source of some of the best white wines in France: Vouvray and Savennières. Made exclusively with the Chenin Blanc grape, they share a limestone soil that's the key to their finesse and complexity. Both are noted for the beauty of their perfume: peach, white flowers, green apple. Then there is the exquisite balance: an often honeyed fruit set off against the bright, citrus-like acidity. In Vouvray, the limestone is mixed with clay and chalk; the wines are forward and lush. In Savennières, the soil is limestone and slate, producing a more refined, tightly-wound wine with mineral flavors and great ageability.

Santorini

On the Greek island of Santorini, an ancient method is still used to train the Assyrtko vines. Buffeted by brutal winds and with basically no rain through the long summer, the islanders centuries ago devised a system to cope. Old and new vines are twinned together in basket shape, cosseting the tender leaves against the wind and maximizing the usefulness of the night mist –the only real source of moisture. The resultant wine are as sturdy and unique as you might imagine. Powerfully mineral from the volcanic soil, taut, bone dry, super-concentrated; absolutely world class white wine. Try the Argyros, above.

Littorai, Sonoma Coast
Previous to founding Littorai in the early nineties, Ted Lemon studied oenology in Dijon and then worked with a who's-who list of Burgundy's great winemakers: Roumier, Bruno Clair, De Villaine, Dujac. Back in the states, he was one of the first to recognize the potential of the Sonoma Coast. He was also ahead of his time in the desire to craft wines that emphasized balance and elegance, rejecting the flamboyant fruit-bomb style that had become dominant in California at the time. Despite his love of Burgundy, his aim is to create wine true to its place of origin, and that's exactly what he's done. For me, these are definitive North Coast Pinot and Chardonnay.

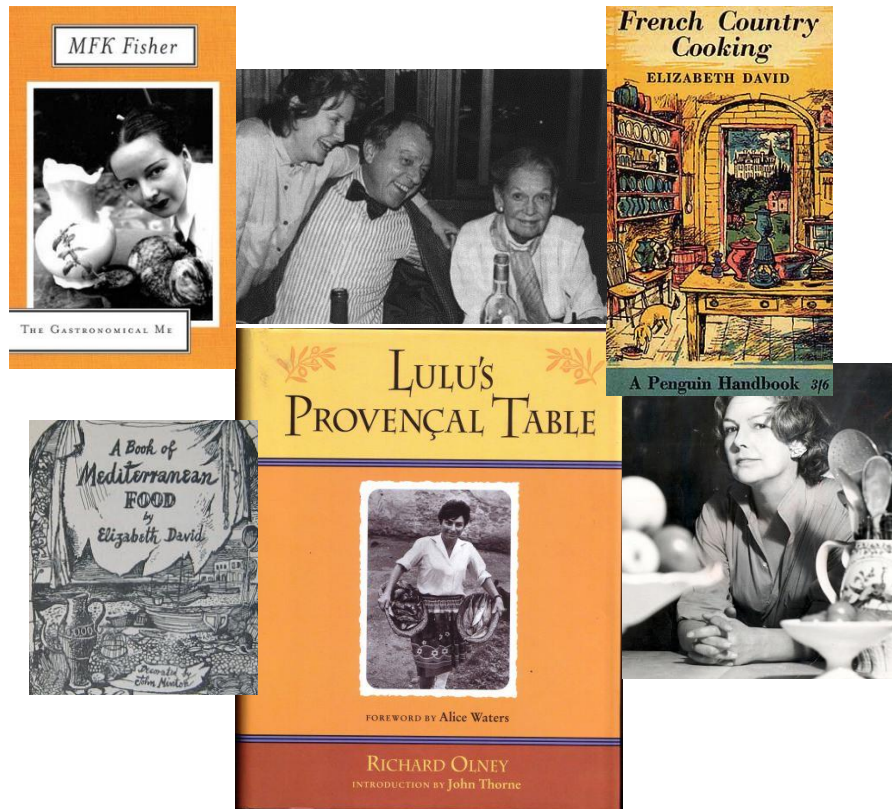

In the post-war period, a generation of cooks and writers from England and the US came to live in the inexpensive but supremely bountiful south of France. Welcomed by folks like Lulu Peyraud of Domaine Tempier, in Bandol, they absorbed a culture of food, wine (and living) that was threatened by mechanization and commercialism. The Provençal or more broadly, Mediterranean approach to fresh, seasonal food that they would bring back to the States, initially in California, would revolutionize the way we eat and drink, basking in fresh, ripe, bright flavors. Every chef, restaurant and sommelier in America today is in their debt. The wines of the Rhône share the same profile and are a natural accompaniment to much contemporary cuisine.

SPAIN Priorat, Catalunya and the Balearics

Priorat

Priorat is a rugged mountainous region south of Barcelona. For centuries, it had been famous for its "black wine", but, with the ravages of the 20th century, found most of its vineyards abandoned. Then in the late 1980s, a group of pioneering winemakers rediscovered the area's potential. The ancient vines of Grenache and Carignan, many over 100 years old, still bore fruit. It was a question of quality over quantity. They produced fewer grapes but those grapes were capable of making profound wine. Today, Priorat is again recognized as making some of the finest wines in Spain.

Nestled between the Pyrenees mountains, the coast of the Mediterranean and the French border, Empordà has a growing reputation for producing hidden gems, Mas Estela chief among them. The Soto-Dalmau family bought the property in 1989 and began to reinvigorate the old vineyards planted with Grenache, Carignan and Syrah. Similar in style to a great Priorat, they age marvelously, with flavors of fig, anise and melted dark chocolate.

No one is more traditional than Lopez-Heredia, Lopez-Heredia will not release their wines until they are considered ready, like the 1981 listed above, a current release. Pecina, CVNE, La Rioja Alta and Marqués de Murrieta are also proud practitioners to one degree or another, of the traditional style, which emphasizes finesse, delicacy and complexity. Really no other wines in the world are delivered to you with this much pampering at a comparable price.

The wines of Etna, the looming still-active volcano on the north east coast of Sicily, have re-established a stellar reputation in the last few years but a few decades ago, almost none were being produced commercially. Dr. Giuseppe Benanti was instrumental in this revival. In 1988 he began working to revitalize an old family vineyard and also set about intensive research on the indigenous grape varieties of Etna and their clones. Searching out ancient plots of old vine Nerello Mascalese and Nerello Cappuccio on the volcanic soil, he has created world-class wines with an indelible sense of place. Firm but not heavy, they age beautifully.

Snowden

Snowden winery is a fifth generation family-owned Napa winery, in itself a rarity as more and more US wineries sell out to the big conglomerates. Rarer still is Diana Snowden Seysses, wine-maker both at her families Napa winery and at her husband's family's estate in Burgundy, the renowned Domaine Dujac. This is an unprecedented vote of confidence from her father-in-law Jacques Seysses (pictured above with Diana and his two sons) one of the most influential and revered winemakers in France. Along with David Ramey, another former mentor, Diana has put Snowden at the forefront of an impulse to reinvigorate California winemaking with a more traditional European approach: less intervention, more natural, more food-friendly, more complex. Snowden is very much the future of California wine.

A real rarity in the California wine world, Renaissance differs in striking ways. While almost all quality California wines come from the coast, this is grown in the interior mountains, at an elevation of 1200 ft. While most Cabs have become super ripe and alcoholic (over 15 ° has become common) these are lean and elegant at 12.7°-13.5°, more like the Cabs from the 70's and 80's. And look at the vintage: 1999 and 2001. Renaissance cellars their wines until they feel that they are at their peak. These are current releases: The wines feel fresh and still young, just folded in layers of the complex flavors that only age can bring.

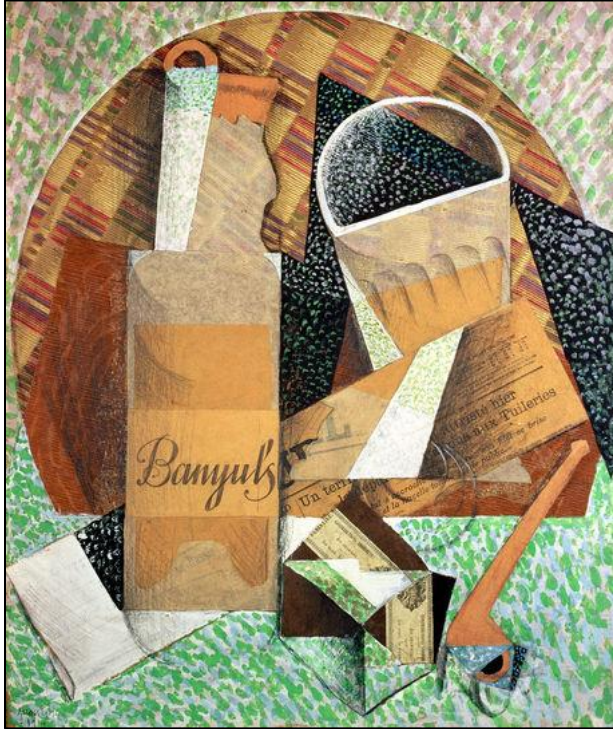

Banyuls, a sweet, port-like fortified wine is made in the hills behind a small fishing village on the French Mediterranean close to the Spanish border. The village was a favorite haunt of painters at the turn of the 20th century. Guys like Matisse, Braque, Picasso and Gris were enchanted by the brilliant light of the region and right there, helped to create modern painting. It's not hard to imagine them retreating from the heat of the day into the shade of a little café with friends, arguing, eating a bite of cheese and sipping the local wine.

MADEIRA



700 km off of the coast of West Africa, Madeira produced the wines that fed the trade routes of the 18th century. On the long voyages between Africa, Brazil, the Caribbean, the American colonies and Britain, it was discovered that the wines of Madeira, buried deep in the ship's holds through this long and intense tropical heat, arrived in Baltimore not just good but better. The Estufagem process was developed to age the wine in oven-like rooms on the island for long periods, replicating the effects of a sea voyage. Madeira became the most popular drink of our Founding Fathers. Due to its unique production, Madeira is practically indestructible. Bottles from the 19th century remain perfectly sound. Most great Madeira is not sweet. The caramelized, amazingly complex flavors finish quite dry, delicious with cheese or many savory dishes.

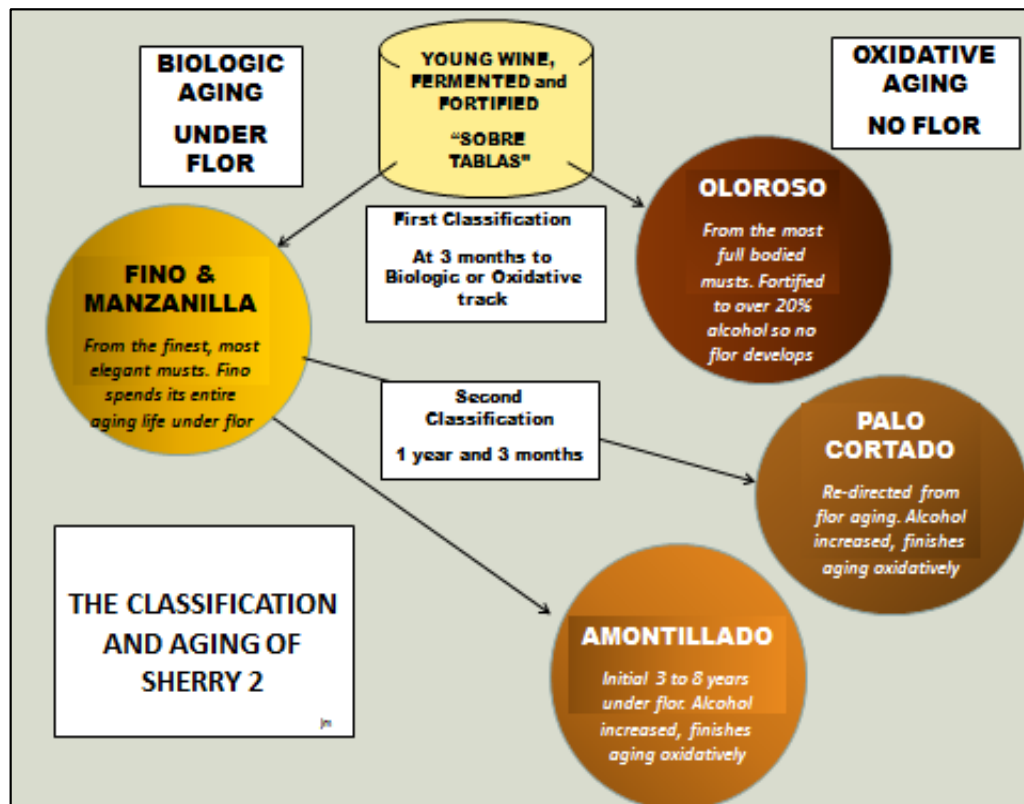

Sherry

Utterly unlike the cream Sherries associated with the old aunt in the murder mystery, these are the real Sherries that the Spanish used to keep for themselves - very little was exported to the US. To me, they are a revelation. They represent the best 'quality to price' ratio of any wines in the world of wine. The four main categories are aged differently (see below) but are all dry. In ascending order of body, the Fino's and Manzanillas go best with appetizers or as an aperitif; the Amontillados with soup, seafood or cheeses. The Palo Cortados and Olorosos are big enough to stand up to braised beef or lamb. Ask for a suggestion, we'd love to have you try one.

In Jerez where Sherry is made, there is a unique microclimate. At this southernmost tip of the Spanish peninsula, ocean breezes come from both the Atlantic and the Mediterranean. When the new wine is put in barrel for aging, a natural yeast, known as "flor", develops on the surface of the wine. (See chart below) This yeast is what gives many Sherries their unique character and allows for what is known as "biologic aging". Oloroso in contrast is aged without flor, creating a richer, darker, slightly more alcoholic wine.
