

Scientific name: Engelmannia pinnatifida, E. peristenia

Common name(s): Engelmann's Daisy, Cutleaf Daisy

Family: Asteraceae (Sunflower)

Native: CO, Southern Great Plains, Southwest

Habitat: Prairie, roadsides

With a deep taproot, Engelmann's Daisy thrives in hot, dry gardens. Combine with Blanket Flower (*Gaillardia aristata*), Plains Coreopsis, (*Coreopsis tinctoria*), Beardtongue (*Penstemon sp.*), Dotted Blazing Star (*Liatris punctata*), Sage (*Artemisia sp.*), Grama Grasses (*Bouteloua sp.*), Yucca and Red Yucca (*Yucca sp.*, *Hesperaloe parviflora*), Cholla (*Cylindropuntia sp.*) and Prickly Pear Cactus (*Opuntia sp.*). Leave seed heads standing to provide winter forage for birds; cut to the ground in spring.

Plant type: Perennial (may reseed)

Elevation: Native range to 6200', cultivated to 7500'

USDA Hardiness Zone: 5

Exposure: Full sun, part sun

Soil: Clay, loam, sandy; prefers unamended, poor soil and

inorganic mulch

Moisture: Moderate, low, dry xeric

Flower color: Bright yellow

Bloom time: Mid spring to early fall (hard frost)

Mature size (height x width): 18-28" x 14-24"



Propagation: Sow in situ in early fall. Press lightly into the soil. The seeds require light to germinate.
