PERSONAL BAGGAGE STORE FOR FEDERAL GOVERNMENT OFFICERS

It is notified for general information that the Baggage Store for the storage of personal effects of Federal Government officers whilst they are on overseas leave or otherwise absent from Nigeria on duty is now under the control of the Chief Stores Officer, Works Division, Federal Ministry of Works and Surveys, Main Stores, Ijora.

- All letters in respect of the storage of loads should in future be directed to him at the above address (telegrams: "Storeworks Ijora").
 - 3. Under its new control, the Baggage Store Section of the Ministry will provide the following services:—
 - (a) Collection of the personal baggage of Federal officers, either from their residences in the Lagos area, or from Lagos rail or sea terminals, and its storage whilst they are on overseas, leave or absence;
 - (b) Delivery in, or consignment from, the Lagos area of such baggage to residences or up-country stations of Federal officers upon their return from absence overseas;
 - (c) Removal within, or consignment from, the Lagos area of a Federal officer's baggage, should he change quarters or station during the course of a tour of duty.

N.B.—"The Lagos area" means the Federal Territory and Ikeja.

- 4. No other service can be provided unless the prior approval of the Chief Stores Officer has been obtained in response to a written application to him. Any approved additional services provided will be liable to attract charges debitable to the applying Ministry or Department or the officer concerned. It must be understood that the Baggage Store Section does not provide a general transport service. Neither, under normal circumstances, does it handle officers' accompanied or unaccompanied baggage for inward or outward shipment to and from Nigeria, such services being provided by the Government Coastal Agency.
- 5. To ensure the efficient operation of the Section, it would be appreciated if all requests for services are submitted in writing at least fourteen days prior to the date they are required. It may be impossible to provide service should the application not comply with this provision. Any application where less than fourteen days notice is given should be submitted to the Chief Stores Officer with a written endorsement of the request by the officer's immediate superior officer. The decision of the Chief Stores Officer will be accepted as final.
- 6. Applications for the withdrawal or storage of an officer's loads should be addressed to the Chief Stores Officer by the Department or Ministry of the officer and not by the individual officer. They should quote full details including the following as applicable:—
 - (a) officer's name, rank, and Ministry or Department;
 - (b) number of loads involved;
 - (c) date and time the service is required;
 - (d) residential address or transport terminal;
 - (e) probable duration of storage;
 - (f) consigning particulars for loads to be transported to up-country stations.
- 7. The storage of officer's cars, which is also under the control of the Chief Stores Officer, is administered separately from the Baggage Store. A further circular is being issued on car storage.
- 8. All applications will be acknowledged when received, and conditions of storage, etc., provided for the information of officers.

DETAILS OF A NEW SCHEME UNDER WHICH NIGERIAN University Graduates may obtain A Regular COMMISSION IN THE ROYAL NIGERIAN. MILITARY FORCES

Nigerian undergraduates who wish to be considered for the grant of Regular Commissions in the Military Forces are required to apply not later than the end of their penultimate year of residence to the Principal of their University in Nigeria, or if studying at a University :-

- (i) in the United Kingdom, to the Defence Services Liaison Officer, c/o the Office of the Commissioner for Nigeria in the United Kingdom;
- (ii) in North America, to the Nigeria Liaison Officer, Washington;
- (iii) elsewhere abroad, to the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Defence, Lagos, Nigeria;

from whom application forms and further particulars may be obtained. Provided that applicants in Nigeria or the United Kingdom undergo a medical examination (to be arranged by the military authorities), and are found fit for military service, their applications will then be forwarded to the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Defence, Lagos. Applicants studying at Universities in countries other than Nigeria or the United Kingdom should attach to their application forms a certificate of physical fitness, issued by a registered medical practitioner. Candidates will be called forward, after passing their final University examinations, to attend a Forces Selection Board in Nigeria. When a candidate has already obtained his degree, and is no longer at a University, he should apply direct to the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Defence, Lagos. He will then be required to pass a medical examination and, if successful, will be called forward to attend a Selection Board. This Board will assemble twice a year. Passages to Nigeria will not be provided at public expense to enable applicants to attend a Forces Selection Board.

2. Candidates, who must be between the ages of 21 and 30 years on the date of being commissioned, who duly graduate and who are suitable in all respects for the grant of a commission, may be accepted by the Board for officer training. On acceptance, the Board for officer training. On acceptance, they will be enlisted into the Military Forces and will undergo a basic training course, lasting six weeks, with a unit of the Military Forces, to be followed by a sixteen weeks' course at the Mons Officer Cadet School, Aldershot. Where, however, a graduate has been a member of his University Training Corps, and has been awarded Certificate "B" while in the Corps, arrangements will be made to dispense with the basic training course, and for the graduate to proceed direct to the Officer Cadet School. On successful completion of the course at the Officer Cadet School, graduates will be granted regular commissions and promoted to the rank of Lieutenant and arrangements will be made for them to attend Young Officers' courses in the United Kingdom, or to be attached for a short period to units of the British Army in the United Kingdom or Western Germany, in accordance with their choice of arm or service, before they return to Nigeria.

If a cadet fails to reach the standard required, he will be discharged from the Royal Nigerian Military Forces unless he elects to continue to serve in the initial rank of private.

- 3. The commissions granted to university graduates will be ante-dated so as to align their seniority in the Forces more closely with that of cadets commissioned from the Royal Military Academy, Sandhurst. The extent to which a graduate's commission will be so ante-dated will depend upon the class and nature of the degree he has obtained. Applications from candidates with degrees in technical subjects will be particularly welcomed.
