NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS BOUND: The 10th-seeded and eighth-ranked Georgia men's tennis team (18-7) punched its ticket to the round of 16 "final site" of the 2014 NCAA Championships last weekend, winning its first and second round matches in Athens to advance out of the regional round for the 11 consecutive time and 14th time out of 16 tries since the current format was adopted in 1999.

Georgia will take on the No. 7 seed North Carolina (26-5) in the round of 16 on Fri., May 16 at 4 p.m. The Tar Heels defeated South Carolina by a 4-1 score in the second round to advance. A win would set Georgia up to face either Kentucky or Oklahoma in the Elite Eight on May 18.

Georgiadogs.com will offer live scoring, video streaming, and the Georgia Tennis Live Chat as long as the Bulldogs are alive in the tournament. UGA is serving as host of the team tournament and individual events a record 31st time.

GEORGIA IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT: The Bulldogs are making their 36th overall appearance in the tournament and 31st in a row, now with an all-time record of 98-31 (.760). Georgia reached the NCAA semifinals in 2013, and has reached the finals a total of 13 times.

In all, the squad owns six NCAA championships, most recently coming in back-to-back seasons in 2007-08.

A LOOK AT THE FIELD: Fourteen of the 16 national seeds advanced out of their respective regionals to make it to Athens on the men's side, with the only two upsets coming in College Station (California def. No. 8 Texas A&M) and in Durham (Tennessee def. No. 11 Duke).

The Southeastern Conference leads the way with four teams in the round of 16, followed by the Pac-12 and Big 12 each with three, the ACC and Big 10 with two, and the Big East and Ivy League with one apiece.

HOW THEY GOT HERE: Georgia used wins over Jacksonville State (4-0) and NC State (4-1) in the regional rounds in Athens last weekend to reach the round of 16.

Against the Wolfpack on Sunday, the Bulldogs (18-7) won the doubles point, then found three singles wins to down the Wolfpack (18-10) and advance. Sophomore Austin Smith provided the clinch at No. 1 to seal it.

IN THE RANKINGS: Georgia came in at No. 8 in the May 1 team poll, the team's 11th trip inside the top-10 this season. Southern California held the top spot, followed by Oklahoma, Ohio State, Virginia, UCLA, Baylor, North Carolina, Georgia, Texas, and Texas A&M to round out the top-10 entering the NCAA Championships.

In the singles poll, Austin Smith leads the way for the Bulldogs at No. 23, while Nathan Pasha came in at No. 30, Garrett Brasseaux at No. 70, and Ben Wagland at No. 82. In doubles, the team of Wagland and Hernus Pieters is No. 8 this week.

GEORGIA WITH FOUR PLAYERS IN INDIVIDUAL TOURNEYS: Four members of the Georgia men's tennis team were awarded at-large bids to the singles and doubles portion

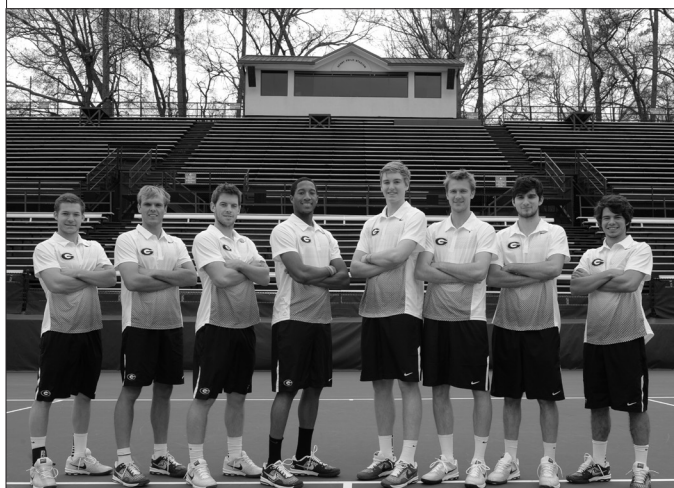

of the NCAA Championships to be held May 21-26 at the Dan Magill Tennis Complex. The individual championships will follow the team tournament set for May 15-20 in Athens.

Junior Nathan Pasha and sophomore Austin Smith were selected for the singles draw, while senior Hernus Pieters and sophomore Ben Wagland were selected as a No. 5-8 seed in the doubles draw, which secures All-America honors for the tandem.

Match-ups for the individual tournaments will be announced during the team portion. A total of 64 players will participate in singles in addition to 32 doubles teams.

Georgia players have won the NCAA singles title four times: Mikael Pernfors in 1984 and 1985, and Matias Boeker in 2001 and 2002. Pernfors beat teammate George Bezecky for the crown in 1985. The Bulldogs have won three NCAA doubles titles including Ola Malmqvist and Allen Miller in 1983, Boeker and Travis Parrott in 2001, and John Isner and Antonio Ruiz in 2005.

THREE BULLDOGS EARN SEC HONORS: Three members of the Georgia men's tennis team have received Southeastern Conference honors, including a league-leading three players on the All-SEC first team, the conference office announced.

Senior Garrett Brasseaux, junior Nathan Pasha, and sophomore Austin Smith all landed on the first team, marking the second consecutive season Georgia has had three players on the elite list and only the second time since 2007. It is the first such honor for Brasseaux and Smith, while Pasha was also named first team in 2013 and to the All-Freshman Team in 2012.

PASHA NAMED TO SEC COMMUNITY SERVICE TEAM: Georgia junior Nathan Pasha has been named to the 2014 Southeastern Conference Men's Tennis Community Service Team, the league office announced on April 15.

The SEC sponsors community service teams in all 21 sports, looking to highlight student-athletes who give back to his or her community through superior service efforts.

The Atlanta native is co-president of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) at UGA, while regularly volunteering his time with the Special Olympics and the Boys & Girls Club. He is also a member of L.E.A.D. – Georgia's athletics leadership academy.

DIAZ WINS 600TH CAREER MATCH: Georgia head coach Manuel Diaz - now in his 26th season at the helm - reached an elite milestone earlier this season, with the Bulldogs' 4-0 victory on the road at Alabama on April 11 serving as his 600th career victory.

Diaz won his 500th match on March 15, 2010 against Vanderbilt, then snagged No. 550 in a 2012 dual match also against the Commodores.

GEORGIA WINS REGULAR SEASON SEC TITLE: The Georgia men's tennis team claimed the 2014 Southeastern Conference regular season championship outright with a 4-0 shutout of No. 29 Auburn on April 13. Georgia concluded the regular season with an overall record of 16-6 and 11-1 in conference action. Georgia has now won a league-leading 37 SEC championships, 28 of which are regular season crowns. It marked the 24th SEC title for head coach Manuel Diaz in his 26 seasons.

RECAPPING THE FALL: Georgia players won three singles titles and reached the final of another fall tournament to start the 2013-14 season. Sophomore Austin Smith led the Bulldogs with 15 wins, including seven against ranked opponents. He reached the quarterfinals of the All-American Championships in Tulsa, Okla., and also made the final of the SEC Fall Classic in Nashville. Nathan Pasha notched 13 wins, including titles at the ITA Southeast Regional Championships at Georgia Tech and the Southern Intercollegiate Championships in Athens.

Pasha and Smith represented UGA in the singles draw of the USTA/ITA National Indoor Championships in New York, while senior Garrett Brasseaux was named champion of the Bulldog Scramble in November. In

doubles, the team of Hernus Pieters and Ben Wagland led the team with six wins.

OOSTERBAAN JOINS BULLDOGS IN JANUARY: Michigan native Paul Oosterbaan joined the Georgia team as an early enrollee, arriving in Athens in January in time for the spring 2014 season.

Oosterbaan, who stands at 6-foot-8, earned a wild card into the main draw at the 2013 U.S. Open by winning the boys 18s doubles title at the USTA National Championship earlier this year in Kalamazoo. His other wins include the Clay Court doubles, boys 16s Winter Nationals singles, Lexington grade 4 ITF singles and the USTA 18s National Open.

He has been ranked as high as No. 8 by tennisrecruiting.net and was ranked No. 2 in the country in boys 16s. His father, JP, was a member of the 1989 University of Michigan men's basketball national championship team.

MONTGOMERY SIGNS WITH UGA FOR 2014-15: Wayne Montgomery of Johannesburg, South Africa, has signed a national letter of intent to attend the University of Georgia and compete for the men's tennis team, head coach Manuel Diaz has announced. Montgomery will enroll this summer and begin play with the Bulldogs in the fall.

Montgomery originally intended to enroll this spring, but was not cleared by the NCAA. He has since received the necessary clearance.

Montgomery has won multiple South African and African Junior titles in singles and doubles and has represented South Africa internationally in team and individual events. He has been a member of the ITF junior touring teams each year since the age of 13 and also participated at the Junior Davis Cup in Mexico in 2010 and 2011. He reached a career high ITF U-18 world ranking of No. 7 in 2013, and has 92 career singles wins. He has won ITF junior circuit tournaments in Gaborone, Port Elizabeth, East London, Montreal (doubles), Potchefstroom (singles and doubles), Traralgon (doubles), and Maryland (singles and doubles). He reached the quarterfinals at the U.S. Open and the Australian Open as well as the doubles semifinals at Wimbledon.

He will join incoming freshmen Andy Martinez and Peter Bertran, in addition to current redshirt freshman Paul Oosterbaan, in the class. Bertran recently defeated former NCAA doubles champion and All-American Robert Farah in Davis Cup action.

GEORGIA TO HOST NCAA TENNIS CHAMPIONSHIPS AGAIN IN 2017:

The University of Georgia will serve as the host site for the 2017 NCAA Division I Men's and Women's Tennis Championships, it was announced by the NCAA in December.

The Dan Magill Tennis Complex has played host to the men's NCAA Championships 24 times and the women's NCAA Championships three times, in addition to three combined tournaments for a total of 30, most recently in 2012. UGA will also serve as host in May 2014.

The Georgia men's tennis team has won six NCAA titles, including five in Athens. The women claimed the national title in 1994 and at home in 2000.

Bulldogs Punch Ticket To National Indoors With Win

ATHENS, Ga. --- The third-ranked Georgia men's tennis team weathered a late charge by No. 40 Stanford en route to a 4-1 victory and a place in the Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) National Team Indoor Championships on Sunday evening at the Lindsey Hopkins Indoor Facility.

The Bulldogs (2-0) used two wins this weekend over Columbia and the Cardinal to advance out of the ITA Kickoff's Athens region and snag a spot in the prestigious 16-team field next month in Houston.

"It wasn't easy this weekend - both matches were very tight," said head coach Manuel Diaz. "The Regional was very competitive, and our guys had to play their best to win. It's a sign of how deep things are going to be this year. Nothing is going to be easy, but the guys really were up to the challenge. I thought we played much better doubles today than we have been, and we were able to win some good matches late and clinch a good victory."

The Bulldogs started off strong in snagging the early doubles point with wins at Nos. 2 and 3. First off the court was the team of Garrett Brasseaux and Nathan Pasha at No. 2, defeating Yale Goldberg and Maciek Romanowicz, 6-3. They were shortly followed by the No. 3 team of Eric Diaz and Austin Smith, who posted a 6-4 victory over Trey Strobel and Jamin Ball to give Georgia the early 1-0 lead. The No. 1 match was unfinished with Georgia's 12th-ranked pairing of Ben Wagland and Hernus Pieters leading 4-3.

The squad took a 3-0 lead overall in the match with quick singles wins from Wagland and Pasha. Wagland defeated Strobel, 6-4, 6-1, at No. 3, and Pasha handed Daniel Ho a 6-0, 6-3 loss at No. 1 to leave Georgia just one win shy of the clinch and the berth.

But Stanford got on the board with a victory at No. 2, as Romanowicz beat Smith 6-4, 2-6, 6-2 to cut it to 3-1. Then, after dropping a close first-set tiebreaker earlier, it would be Brasseaux who would provide the decisive fourth point for UGA, as he posted a 5-6(5), 6-4, 6-4 win over Anthony Tsodikov at No. 4 to seal it. The Nos. 5 and 6 matches were unfinished with Pieters and Wood both up sets and breaks on their courts.

UGA men's tennis sweeps ETSU

The fourth-ranked Georgia men's tennis team won the doubles point and never looked back en route to a commanding 7-0 sweep of No. 67 East Tennessee State on Thursday afternoon.

The Bulldogs (3-2) responded from their first two losses of the dual match season last weekend to earn the shutout effort, with the clinch coming from sophomore Ben Wagland at No. 3 singles. Senior Hernus Pieters bounced back from a loss in the first set to win at No. 5 and seal the sweep over the Bucs (2-6).

"Our guys played hard," Georgia coach Manuel Diaz said in a release. "They came out well-focused. ETSU is a very good team. They competed hard at every spot. This was a great match for us as we try to prepare for Houston (ITA National Team Indoor Championships) next week, and this was just what we needed. Hernus found himself down a set against a very good player, and that was an important win for him. He did a great job coming back for the victory. I am very pleased with our effort today."

The Bulldogs claimed the early 1-0 lead with doubles wins at Nos. 1 and 3. The team of Nick Wood and Nathan Pasha — playing together for the first time this year — were first off as they won 6-3 at No. 3. They were shortly followed by 12th-ranked Hernus Pieters and Ben Wagland at No. 1, who also won 6-3 to clinch the doubles point.

Georgia men's tennis overcomes doubles loss to beat Mississippi State

Short-term memory loss can be a side effect of spring break alcohol abuse, among other things. For the Georgia men's tennis team, however, having a short-term memory is perfect for the small time lapse between doubles and singles.

No. 16 Georgia (6-5, 2-0 SEC) cruised to a 4-1 win against No. 17 Mississippi State (12-5, 2-1 SEC) on Friday at the Dan Magill Tennis Complex. The win marked Georgia's third straight win and second straight Southeastern Conference win over a top-20 team. But the three and a half hour victory did not come easy for Georgia.

As a shanked overhead flew onto the court next to him, Nathan Pasha hung his head in frustration, wishing he had not lost the clinching tiebreak point on such a high-percentage shot. After Hernus Pieters and Ben Wagland lost 8-3 and Austin Smith and Eric Diaz won 8-6, the tone-setting doubles point had come down to Pasha and Garrett Brasseaux on court two.

Pasha and Brasseaux had fought back from a 7-6 deficit to force a tiebreaker, fighting off two match points in that game. After crawling back slightly from a 5-1 tiebreak deficit and fighting off a third match point, Pasha's mishit gave the visiting Mississippi State Bulldogs a 1-0 match lead.

But as emotionally draining as the hour-long doubles point was, players had to forget it happened and move on.

Even though the players did a tremendous job of forgetting their doubles woes, head coach Manuel Diaz is not any less concerned about some of the recurring issues in doubles.

"We gotta make more first serves," Diaz said. "We're in good position to finish points and we're just not finishing points at the net. We're just making some unforced errors."

While doubles may still be a work in progress, the short-term memory loss, or "resilience," as players and coach Diaz calls it, is a major strength of this Georgia squad moving forward.

"I'm really proud of the way our guys are showing resilience and came back very strong in singles," Diaz said.

Georgia has one day to prepare for Ole Miss on Sunday. The match will be played at 1 p.m. at the Dan Magill Tennis Complex.



Georgia Knocks Off No. 1 Ohio State, 4-3, In Marathon Match

ATHENS-----Hernus Pieters defeated Hunter Callahan in a second set tiebreaker to lift No. 16 Georgia to a thrilling 4-3 victory over top-ranked Ohio State in a marathon match Wednesday night at the Lindsey Hopkins Indoor Facility.

The five and a half hour match was moved indoors due to high winds and ended with Georgia's first win over a No. 1 ranked team since the Bulldogs defeated Virginia in the semifinals of the 2008 NCAA Championships. Georgia (8-5) extended its home winning streak to 21 matches, while handing Ohio State just its second loss of the season. The Buckeyes (17-2) were winners of the ITA National Indoor Tournament last month in Houston.

After going ahead 2-0, Georgia fell behind 3-2 with Nick Wood at No. 5 and Pieters at No. 6 still remaining on the courts. Wood lost his first set to Ralf Steinbach and led 4-3 in the second set when Pieters trailed Callahan, 6-3, in the first set tiebreaker. Pieters then stormed back to take the first set 7-6(6), and seconds later Wood broke for a 5-3 lead, swinging the momentum in Georgia's favor.

Wood went on to cruise to a 5-7, 6-3, 6-2 victory to tie the match at 3-3. Pieters and 88th-ranked Callahan went to another tiebreaker in the second set, and the Georgia senior prevailed 7-6(6), 7-6(6) to give the Bulldogs their fifth straight win.

"I can't say enough about our last two guys out there on the court," said UGA head coach Manuel Diaz. "I'm sure they felt a lot of pressure. For the first three and a half hours of singles, Ohio State was so clutch in pressure situations. It got to the point where I thought we were in deep trouble. To see Hernus win the tiebreaker in the first set at the same time that Nick was breaking, it seemed to change the momentum of the match for us."

Georgia took the doubles point with wins at Nos. 1 and 3 to take a 1-0 lead. Ohio State won the first completed match at No. 2 as Callahan and Steinbach beat Garrett Brasseaux and Nathan Pasha, 8-4, but the Bulldogs responded at No. 3 where Eric Diaz and Austin Smith downed Mark Goles-Babic and Herkko Pollanen, 8-4. UGA clinched the point at No. 1 where the No. 21 team of Pieters and Wagland topped Ohio State's fourth-ranked tandem of Peter Kobelt and Kevin Metka, 8-6.



Georgia Downs Gators, Wins Seventh Straight

ATHENS, Ga. --- The Georgia men's tennis team got the clinch from red-hot sophomore Austin Smith in a 4-3 victory over No. 17 Florida on Sunday afternoon at Linder Stadium at the Ring Tennis Complex in Gainesville. The win was Georgia's seventh in a row, moving the team to 10-5 overall and a perfect 5-0 in conference play. It also marks the seventh straight singles win for Smith.

"It's another great win for our guys," said head coach Manuel Diaz. "I feel great about this match, because Florida played well enough to win. As a team, we're getting better every day and we're getting tougher, and that's the difference right now. We are finding confidence to raise our game in the tough matches. Right now, the important thing is for the guys to get some rest after playing five matches in 10 days. This was a grind, but it has made us better."

Georgia started out with another doubles-point win, as the Bulldogs' Nos. 1 and 2 teams prevailed over the Gators to push the squad out to a 1-0 lead. First off was the No. 2 team of Garrett Brasseaux and Nathan Pasha, who defeated the team of Mike Alford and Florent Diep, 8-5. They were followed by the 21st-ranked team of Ben Wagland and Hernus Pieters, who posted a tiebreak victory over No. 11 Elliott Orkin and Gordon Watson, 8-7(5), to seal it.

"The guys did a great job coming back from down a break at No. 1 doubles," Diaz said. "Our No. 3 team was battling hard again, but it was No. 2 who were able to get that solid victory and reestablish themselves and play well today. Our No. 1 doubles team is on a bit of a roll now, they're more comfortable and they're serving and returning well, so it's nice to develop some consistency there."

Heading to singles, the Bulldogs and Gators would split first sets evenly at three apiece, while Brasseaux led Georgia to a 2-0 lead as he won his No. 4 match, 6-3, 6-3, over Lipman. Wagland then fell at No. 2 to Diep, 6-1, 6-1, as the Gators trimmed the lead to 2-1, but Nick Wood gave the Bulldogs a 3-1 lead with a 7-6(7), 6-4 win over Orkin at No. 6.

With Georgia in need of just one more point for the victory, Florida won the next two matches as Alford beat Pieters, 6-4, 4-6, 6-4 at No. 5 to make it 3-2, then Watson edged Pasha on a pair of tiebreakers, 7-6(5), 7-6(3), to tie it 3-3 with just Smith remaining on court for Georgia at No. 3.

Senior Bulldogs close out regular season home schedule with win over LSU

Hernus Pieters walked onto the tennis courts at the Dan Magill Tennis Complex and was welcomed with the applause of the Bulldog faithful. His career achievements were announced as he strolled to the center of the court to meet with the coaches and his teammates.

But unlike Garrett Brasseaux, who had preceded him, the South-African native was unable to walk with his family. Instead, he chose two of his academic advisers to walk beside him as he was honored as one of two seniors on Georgia's roster of eight.

"I figured that I couldn't ask anyone better to be with me if I couldn't ask my family," Pieters said.

And just as the banking and finance and risk management and insurance double-major has likely made his advisers proud with his strong work ethic off the court, Pieters continued to make his coaches and fans proud as he turned in another solid performance on Sunday.

No. 8 Georgia men's tennis (14-6, 9-1 SEC) secured its second-consecutive 4-0 shutout on Sunday on senior day as the team defeated No. 54 LSU (11-12, 2-9 SEC). Both Brasseaux and Pieters were a part of two dramatic victories in doubles that propelled the team to its seventh shutout of the season.

LSU gave Georgia all it could handle in doubles. That much was clear when Austin Smith and Eric Diaz lost their first doubles match in well over a month at No. 3 doubles. This 8-6 defeat meant Pieters and Ben Wagland had to win at No. 1 doubles and Brasseaux and Nathan Pasha had to win at No. 2 doubles.



Diaz Wins 600th As Georgia Clinches Share Of SEC

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. --- On an eventful night in Tuscaloosa, the ninth-ranked Georgia men's tennis team posted a 4-0 shutout of No. 33 Alabama to hand head coach Manuel Diaz the 600th win of his storied career. Coupled with a loss for Texas A&M - with whom Georgia entered the night tied for first place in the conference - the Bulldogs also used the victory to clinch at least a share of the program's 37th Southeastern Conference championship.

Georgia tonight improves to 15-6 (10-1), and can secure the SEC title outright on Sunday with a win at No. 29 Auburn.

"It's most meaningful for a lot of little reasons," said head coach Manuel Diaz. "We had three guys who went to the doctor last week and played through a tough, difficult week. To me that really shows the heart of this team. The things they have worked hard for came through today by cinching at least a tie for the SEC championship. I know they don't want to settle for a tie, so we'll try to have a great performance on Sunday. I really enjoy this group of guys. They are coming together and playing their best tennis of the season, and we want to keep that going."

The teams played a tight doubles point to start the match, with Georgia ultimately emerging with the early point thanks to two tiebreaker victories at Nos. 1 and 3. The No. 1 team of Hernus Pieters and Ben Wagland were first off, winning 8-7(3) over Becker O'Shaughnessey and Daniil Proskura, before the No. 3 team of Eric Diaz and Austin Smith posted an 8-7(5) win over Andrew Goodwin and Nikko Madregallejo to clinch it.

The Bulldogs then cruised in singles, winning five of six first sets. Georgia jumped to a 2-0 lead as Nick Wood beat Goodwin, 6-2, 6-0, at No. 5, and the lead moved to 3-0 when Wagland defeated Stuart Kenyon, 6-3, 6-4, at No. 4. The clinch then came from Pieters - his team-leading fifth of the season - as he defeated Hayes Brewer, 6-2, 6-3, at No. 6 to seal the 4-0 sweep and the historic night for the program.

Alabama drops to 11-13 (4-7) on the season, while UGA improves to 52-6 all-time vs. the Crimson Tide.

A win for Georgia on Sunday would give the Bulldogs sole possession of the regular season championship - the program's league-leading 37th overall title, 28th regular season title, and Diaz's 24th.

Unmatched focus helps Pieters leave a footprint at UGA

They were cold. Freezing, actually.

The Georgia men's tennis players had just finished ice baths, an unpleasant experience familiar to any serious athlete. They are especially loathed on cold days.

The players began to trickle out of the tennis facility after their late-afternoon arctic dip.

They were wet, they were cold, pangs of hunger had started to set in, but tutors awaited. Maybe a quick, monotonous dining hall meal could be squeezed in before the learning session began.

And then news broke.

An evening off.

"We all had the option of either getting free dinner to eat out, not at the dining hall, or go to tutors," Georgia junior Nathan Pasha said. "I mean, nobody was choosing tutors. We're all pumped, excited not to go tutor."

Most herded out of the facility, turning one way, brand new duffle bags rolling behind them, leaving one man behind.

Hernus Pieters gathered his things and exited the complex. His worn bag, marking him as a team veteran of four years, hung from his lanky frame. Pieters turned in the opposite direction of his teammates — ready to grind out a study session.

all every time he's out on the court. He's been one of our hardest workers throughout his career at Georgia."

At Georgia, Pieters has enjoyed success from the start. He earned All-America honors his freshman season with doubles partner Javier Garrapiz. That same season, he was also voted to the All-SEC freshman team and was named the 2011 Intercollegiate Tennis Association Southeast Region Freshman of the Year.

His junior season, he and Wagland finished the year ranked No. 5 in doubles and played in the NCAA individual tournament, reaching the quarterfinals. Pieters finished his junior year ranked No. 16 in singles.

Georgia started to pursue Pieters after calling to his juniors coach to see if she had any players interested in college. And although he was younger than normal recruits, one look at his impressive juniors résumé and he was invited to Athens for a recruiting trip.

At just 16 years old, he was working his way through two majors in Georgia's Terry College of Business — finance and risk management — along with practice. He was also a bit farther than a short airplane trip or drive up the interstate away from home.

Pieters' story starts on a farm in Pretoria. He was born and raised in a rural area of the country; there happened to be a tennis club, where his parents happened to play.

It was there that Pieters would embark on his journey to Athens, picking up a racket one weekend afternoon during his childhood.

Pieters began to practice diligently, wins motivating him to work harder, prompting him to practice more, a cyclical pattern of motivation and success that led him to compete as the No. 1 player in the nation at five different age-group levels as he progressed.

"That's what makes him stand out," Pasha said. "His determination to do everything he wants to do. That's why we all know he'll be successful. It's not a matter of if he'll be successful, we know he will just because he's so determined."

Not only is Pieters gifted with resilience but he is humble to boot.

"I'd like to think I work very hard, but there are other people that can tell you more about it," Pieters said, the expression on his face more serious than sheepish. "That's honestly one of the things that I grew up with. My family values work ethic, so I've kind of grown up with that mentality. It comes naturally to me, to work hard."

The Georgia men's tennis team is the only team in the field of 64 who knows it will not have to play another away match for the entire tournament.

The road to the national championship will go through Athens.

The NCAA Selection Show was on Tuesday, and Georgia found out it was going to be a 10th seed in the tournament. The Bulldogs will host Jacksonville State in the first round. If Georgia makes it past the first round, it will face the winner of NC State versus Oregon in the second round. After the first two rounds, Georgia will host the top 16 teams in Athens.

"It's what I've almost dreamt of when I was younger, playing here in front of this crowd," sophomore Austin Smith said. "I'm just excited. I know it's going to be loud. I know there's going to be a lot of people. I'm just going to really just go out there and try to embrace it."

Smith has not yet played in front of the home crowd during the national championship; the last time Georgia hosted the NCAA championships was in 2012. But in order for Smith to be able to do this, Georgia first has to prove itself worthy of being one of the top 16 teams.

"I don't need to say anything," head coach Manuel Diaz said. "I think they know what's at stake."

When the announcement was made on NCAA.com, there was no screaming or excitement from the team. Instead, the team knew it got what it was expecting.

"We kind of anticipated the kind of draw that we would get and they were right," junior Nathan Pasha said.

As a 10th seed, Georgia is not nearly as high as the No. 3 ranking it received in the preseason. But the team is confident it is still good as any team in the country, even after losing in the quarterfinals of the Southeastern Conference tournament.

"There are so many good teams that seeding is really just a number," Pasha said.



Men's Tennis Jumps To No. 8 Entering NCAAs

ATHENS, Ga. --- The Georgia men's tennis team jumped two spots to No. 8 in this week's Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) team poll, it was announced Thursday – the final edition prior to next week's NCAA Championships first and second rounds.

Southern California again holds the top spot, followed by Oklahoma, Ohio State, Virginia, UCLA, Baylor, North Carolina, Georgia, Texas, and Texas A&M to round out the top-10.

Georgia (16-7) will open tournament play on Sat., May 10 at 1 p.m. vs. Jacksonville State at the Dan Magill Tennis Complex in Athens. With a win, the Bulldogs would take on the winner of the Oregon-NC State first round match in Sunday's second round with a berth to the NCAA round of 16 on the line. Georgia is hosting the team championships as well as the singles and doubles tournaments May 15-26.

In the singles poll this week, Austin Smith leads the way for the Bulldogs at No. 23, while Nathan Pasha came in at No. 30, Garrett Brasseaux at No. 70, and Ben Wagland at No. 82. In doubles, the team of Wagland and Hernus Pieters is No. 8 this week.

Smith and Pasha were selected last night to the NCAA singles field, while Pieters and Wagland will play in doubles. The individual portion is set for May 21-26, following the conclusion of the team tournament. By virtue of being seeded at No. 5-8, the Bulldog doubles duo earns automatic All-America honors.



Resilient Georgia men's tennis team mentally prepared for NCAA tournament

Being a student athlete is no simple task when it comes to time management. But when the time to be a student is over, athletes, especially those on the Georgia men's tennis team, love the feeling of being able to devote all of their time to their sport.

"With finals you have to stay up late studying," junior Nathan Pasha said, "and you're still trying to train hard at the same time to get ready for NCAAs, so it's a major grind in both aspects but school is over now so now all we have left is tennis."

For Georgia men's tennis, the end of finals allowed the team to have a few days of strong practice without having to worry about schoolwork before entering their first round match of the NCAA tournament.

No. 10 Georgia (16-7) will face Ohio Valley Conference champion Jacksonville State (17-7) at 1 p.m. on Saturday at the Dan Magill Tennis Complex in Athens. Coach Manuel Diaz said he is proud of how the team maintained its high level of training while still devoting time to finishing finals week strong.

"It's been a challenge," Diaz said. "But guys have been extremely good with it, and have done a fabulous job keeping up with their fitness."

Georgia hopes its training over the days leading up to the event will have given the team a good shot to take home a national championship. But players and coaches said they realize it is not only what is ahead that gives them a strong chance to win it all.

However, most of what prepared Georgia to take home the school's seventh national championship is what the team has already been through. Tough losses at both the National Indoor Championships early in the season and the Southeastern Conference tournament in April showed this team that one of its strongest attributes is resilience.

"We just kept working through it and fighting to get back to where we wanted to be and we feel like we're getting there," sophomore Austin Smith said. "But we still have a few more days to put in some more work."

Anytime Georgia has lost a match or string of matches this season, the team has bounced back and beat strong competition to once again prove it is one of top teams in the country. The resilience Georgia displayed throughout the season was built on a foundation of shared confidence in the team's talent and camaraderie.

"When we get knocked down we get right back up and it really doesn't bother us," senior Garrett Brasseaux said.

But from now on, Georgia must win out on its home court for a chance to win the national championship. The winner of Georgia's match against Jacksonville State will play the winner of unseeded Oregon and NC State.

Georgia's quadrant of the bracket also features No. 2 Oklahoma, No. 7 North Carolina and No. 15 Kentucky, a team Georgia beat earlier in the season. The competition will not be easy from here on out, but Brasseaux said one huge advantage Georgia has over the other teams is the team's success at home.

"We haven't lost at home all year so hopefully we can keep that streak going," Brasseaux said.

The players and coaches said they believe they belong to a small group of teams with a legitimate shot to win the national championship. It is a belief rooted in a high level of confidence and faith that their training and the season's experiences makes Georgia one of the most dangerous teams in the field.

Brasseaux, along with fellow senior Hernus Pieters, could be playing his last match on Saturday if Georgia gets upset by Jacksonville State. But he's not worried about that. When Brasseaux was asked if he believed he and his teammates will win the national championship, he had a short and simple answer.

Yes.

Bulldogs Punch Ticket To Round of 16

ATHENS, Ga. --- The 10th-seeded Georgia men's tennis team used a 4-1 second round win over 26th-ranked NC State Sunday afternoon at the Dan Magill Tennis Complex to advance to the NCAA Championships round of 16 for the 11th straight season and the 12th time in 14 tries under the current format. Today's win comes after yesterday's first round win over Jacksonville State, with Georgia now boasting an all-time NCAA Tournament record of 98-31.

The Bulldogs (18-7) won the doubles point, then found three singles wins to down the Wolfpack (18-10) and advance. UGA is hosting the round of 16 through the finals of the team tournament on both the men's and women's sides, as well as the singles and doubles individual tournaments May 15-26 - the 31st time the event has resided in Athens.

"This win today was great for our kids with the way they overcame adversity," said head coach **Manuel Diaz**. "We are missing **Nathan Pasha** from the lineup [due to injury] and it was tough to get the guys to focus there in the beginning, but everybody pulled together. I was amazed with how well we played in doubles. Our guys are going to fight, and we have a great group of kids. NC State has a great team, and it was a tremendous challenge, especially without one of our top players in the lineup. I'm really pleased with the outcome today."

Georgia claimed the doubles point and the early 1-0 edge for the 19th time this season, getting wins at Nos. 1 and 3. The brand new pairing of **Garrett Brasseaux** and **Nick Wood** - playing in Pasha's place - were first off with an 8-2 win over Simon Norenus and Austin Powell, and the clinch came when eighth-ranked **Ben Wagland** and **Hernus Pieters** defeated No. 29 Robbie Mudge and Ian Dempster, 8-5. The Bulldogs were also leading 7-5 at No. 2 when that match was suspended.

Georgia won four of six first sets in singles action, but the Wolfpack tied things up at 1-1 when Thomas Weigel defeated **Eric Diaz**, 7-5, 6-2 at No. 6. The Bulldogs went back on top at 2-1 when Wagland posted a 6-3, 6-3 decision over Nick Horton at No. 3, and it moved to 3-1 after a 6-3, 7-6(5) win for Brasseaux over Powell at No. 2. Georgia then got the clinch moments later from **Austin Smith** at No. 1 as he defeated Mudge, 6-4, 1-6, 6-3 to seal it and hand the Bulldogs the 4-1 win and the place in the round of 16.

The Bulldogs will take on the winner of today's second round match between North Carolina and South Carolina on Fri., May 16 at 4 p.m. Georgia is making its 36th overall appearance in the NCAA Tournament and 31st in a row. The Bulldogs reached the semifinals in 2013, and have six NCAA titles to their name.
