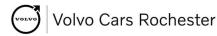

# WHERE THE DREAMS THAT YOU DARE TO DREAM REALLY DO COME TRUE

The 1939 MGM film *The Wizard of Oz*, which is the source material for Geva's musical production, is considered by many to be an American classic. Dorothy Gale's blue gingham dress, the Wicked Witch's green skin, the ruby slippers, and more are iconic images. And the movie has inspired incredibly successful adaptations and spin-offs in the literary, film, and stage genres. Some have even gone so far as to suggest that *Star Wars* was inspired by – and has many parallels with – *The Wizard of Oz*.

One of the most memorable moments in the 1939 film comes early in the film, when Judy Garland as Dorothy Gale sings the gorgeous and powerful lament, "Over the Rainbow." It's a moment any one of us – but perhaps no one more than a teenager – can relate to. Dorothy's aunt and uncle have no time for her, she's in the way and in trouble, and the creature that makes her feel most safe, her dog Toto, has been threatened. She reacts by singing a song about a land we yearn to reach, where our troubles melt away and our dreams come true. A safe

space, where we don't have to worry about getting in trouble. This joyous land over the rainbow is where she wants to go, when being at home isn't safe for her.

At some point or another, we've surely all wished for escape, and maybe that's one reason that *The Wizard of Oz* has become such an iconic American story, celebrated by so many people and communities. It's an idea that L. Frank Baum, author of *The Wonderful Wizard of Oz* and 13 other *Oz* novels, surely related to. Born in Chittenango, NY (just outside of Syracuse), Baum was an entrepreneur at heart, not to be held back by his family's unstable finances: his father had invested in oil, built a refinery so successful that he founded a bank in Syracuse and then lost all of their money when stock market crashed in 1871. An unsuccessful venture in chicken breeding (yes, chicken breeding) led Baum to the theatre, where he joined his aunt's traveling troupe, performing Mother Goose stories to children in the area. He bought and managed three theatres, wrote several plays which toured the country (including to Rochester several times), married Maude Gage (the daughter of Matilda Joslyn Gage, activist for women's and Native American rights), moved to South Dakota and then to Chicago. It was in Chicago that he started writing, first a couple of Mother Goose-themed books. And then, in 1900, he published *The Wonderful Wizard of Oz*. He wrote 14 *Oz* books (as well as over 40 other novels, 83 short stories over 200 poems and at least 42 scripts), before his death in 1919, after which Ruth Plumly Thompson took over, writing at least 19 others.

In the introduction to *The Wonderful Wizard of Oz*, Baum wrote, "The story of *The Wonderful Wizard of Oz* was written solely to please children of today. It aspires to being a modernized fairy tale, in which the wonderment and joy are retained and the heartaches and nightmares are left out." His goal was to create pure entertainment, and to leave education, morality and fright for other tales. The story is magical and entertaining, and at the same time, there are messages in *Oz* that have a deep resonance

with many communities. Dee Mitchell, author of *Friends of Dorothy: Why Gay Boys and Gay Men Love* The Wizard of Oz, discusses this phenomenon: "The meaning of a work does not simply reside within it; rather, it emerges from the readers' or viewers' interactions with the work, both at the time that they initially experience it in a particular setting and afterward." The motifs in any version of the *Oz* story – of finding your power within yourself and beating the bad guys at their own game, acceptance, being kind to strangers (who might just end up being your best friends), nontraditional gender roles, escape, creating your own meaning of home – all of these are deeply connected to marginalized communities.

In fact, the novelist Salman Rushdie, in a 1992 *New Yorker* article analyzing the film, wrote this about the movie's featured song: "'Over the Rainbow' is, or ought to be, the anthem of all the world's migrants, all those who go in search of the place where 'the dreams that you dare to dream really do come true.' It is a celebration of Escape, a grand paean to the Uprooted Self, a hymn – the hymn – to Elsewhere."

So maybe it is unsurprising that *The Wizard of Oz* has, for many members of the LGBTQ+ community – white gay men especially – become a touchpoint. The rainbow is perhaps one of the most recognizable symbols of the gay rights movement. An historic euphemism to refer to gay men was "friends of Dorothy." Glinda's line "Come out, come out, wherever you are" is especially meaningful to the Queer community on National Coming Out Day in October. There are gay establishments all over the country with references to Oz – names like The Magical Land of Oz, Dorothy, Auntie Em's Lounge, Emerald City Cyber Café, and Over the Rainbow are just a few examples.

All of those symbols are signals to members of the LGBTQ+ community that they are entering a safe space. While public perception has changed dramatically over the last couple of decades, and LGBTQ+ rights have expanded, we've seen over the last several months that there continues to be a need to create and support safe spaces. The vision for this production of *The Wizard of Oz* is, in part, a response to this need. LGBTQ+ rights – especially those of transgender youth to receive gender-affirming care like hormone blockers – are up for debate in elections around the country. Even entertaining events like Drag Queen Story Hours – where a drag queen reads a children's book and the children who attend make an art project and have a dance party – are the subject of major protests, including right here in the Rochester area. As a result, the yearning for safe spaces and supportive families remains critical, even though a great many people are more accepting than they used to be.

In *The Wizard of Oz*, Dorothy learns that she has power – she takes control of the situation, stands up for herself and her friends, and fights enemies who, at first glance, are much more powerful than she is. And yet, at the end of the story, she repeats the magic phrase, "there's no place like home" and chooses to leave the fantastic land of Oz and return to Kansas, where she didn't originally feel safe and supported. What has she taken away from the experience, and how will it change her life in back in Kansas? The 1992 *New Yorker* Salman Rushdie article analyzing the film offers us a suggestion about that very question.

In the end, Rushdie says, "The imagined world becomes the actual world, as it does for us all, because the truth is that, once we leave our childhood places and start to make up our lives, armed only with what we know and who we are, we come to understand that the real secret of the ruby slippers is not that 'there's no place like home' but, rather, that there is no longer any such place as home – except, of course, for the homes we make, or the homes that are made for us, in Oz. Which is anywhere – and everywhere – except the place from which we began."

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Geva Theatre Center is a not-for-profit theatre company dedicated to creating and producing singular theatre productions and programs that serve the Rochester region and beyond, by illuminating the fullness of our many human experiences.

Founded in 1972 by William Selden and Cynthia Mason Selden, Geva was originally housed in the Rochester Business Institute building on South Clinton Avenue. In 1982, Geva purchased and converted its current space – formerly a NYS Arsenal designed by noted Rochester architect Andrew J Warner and built in 1868 – and opened its new home at the Richard Pine Theatre in March 1985. Geva operates two venues – the 516-seat Elaine P. Wilson Stage and the 180-seat Ron & Donna Fielding Stage.

As one of the country's leading theatre companies and a member of the national League of Resident Theatres, Geva produces a varied contemporary repertoire from musicals to world premieres celebrating the rich tapestry of our diverse community. We draw upon the talents of some of the country's top actors, directors, designers, and writers who are shaping the American Theatre scene.

Geva's Education Department serves thousands of students annually through student matinees, in-school workshops, the acclaimed Summer Academy training program, and other programs. Geva's New Play Development Programming offers new and established writers a nurturing environment from which to take their work to the next level. Geva has presented approximately 400 play readings and workshops since its inception. Nearly 70 Geva-developed plays have had subsequent productions around the country. Geva's Engagement Department produces multifaceted programs such as Geva *Insights* that deepen the appreciation of the work on our stages, provide opportunities for regional dialogues, and help fulfill Geva's anti-racism commitments through collaborative programming.

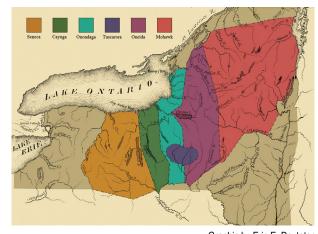
