THE TEN COUNT

- ◆ With wins in 3 of its last 4 contests, Missouri State closes out January with a trip to Murray State on Saturday (1 p.m., MVC-TV Network). The Bears and Racers are meeting for the first time as MVC foes, but have split six previous meetings, including postseason meetings in the NAIA National Tournament (1943 and 1952), NIT (2011) and CIT (2014).
- ◆ During coach **Dana Ford's** tenure as MSU's head coach, the Bears have won more MVC road games (**24**) than any other Valley program. Under Ford, the Bears are **24-17** on The Valley Road over the last 5 seasons (3-2 this year).
- ◆ Over the last 3 games, **Alston Mason** (So., Overland Park, Kan.) is averaging **13.7** points while converting 14-of-16 (.875) free throws. His start against UIC on Tuesday was his first since Dec. 16, and he responded with career highs in points (**19**), rebounds (**5**) and assists (**5**) in the home win over the Flames.
- ◆ **Dalen Ridginal** (Sr., Kansas City, Mo.) will be playing in his **50th** DI game on Saturday. During his time at Georgia and Missouri State, he has racked up 202 points and 175 rebounds in 49 contests. In true road games this season, Ridginal is shooting **50.0** percent (14-of-28) from 3-point range and averaging **8.0** points per game.
- ◆ **Jonathan Mogbo** (Jr., West Palm Beach, Fla.) is the only Bear to start each of the last 10 games. In that span, the Bears are 7-3, and Mogbo is averaging **9.6** points, **7.1** rebounds, **2.3** steals and **1.3** blocks with 6 double-figure scoring games and 3 double-doubles. He is the only MVC player to rank in the top-5 in the league in steals (2nd) and blocks (5th).
- ◆ **Bryan Trimble Jr.** (Sr., Kansas City, Mo.) is averaging **12.8** points per game over the last 4 contests, while converting 14-of-33 (.424) 3-pointers and 9-of-9 (1.000) free throws. He ranks **79th** among active DI players in 3-pointers with **218**.
- ◆ The Bears rank **41st** nationally -- and tops in the MVC -- in bench points per game (**25.95**). MSU also ranks **8th** nationally in bench minutes (**42.2** pct.) with Bear reserves scoring at least 20 points in **15-of-21** games this season and combining for 30 points on 7 occasions. MSU's bench has outscored its opponent's reserves **18** times this year.
- ◆ **Donovan Clay** (Sr., Alton, Ill.) has posted an assist in **22** straight games and has led MSU in assists **13** times this season, including **3.9** assists per game in MVC games. His **76** assists this season is a new career best and is on pace to become MSU's first 100-assist performer since 2018-19 (Josh Webster).
- ◆ Since returning to the starting lineup on Jan. 1 (8 games), Clay is averaging team-highs with **16.1** points, **3.9** assists and **36.9** minutes per game. Sunday is Clay's **22nd** birthday.
- ◆ **Damien Mayo Jr.** (Fr., St. Louis, Mo.) has recorded multiple rebounds in 9 of his last 10 appearances while firing at a 50-percent clip (19-for-38) from the field in that span.
- ◆ MSU ranks **28th** nationally in scoring defense, allowing just **62.5** points per game this season (**61.9** in MVC games).
- ◆ Despite early-season difficulties at the free throw line, Missouri State is shooting **75.8** percent from the charity stripe (47-of-62) over its last 4 games, which is **4th** in the MVC in that span.
- ◆ **Kendle Moore** (So., Danville, Ill.) needs **ONE** 3-pointer to reach 200 in his career (141 games), which currently ranks **107th** among active DI players. He also needs **18** points to reach the 1,200-point milestone in his collegiate career.

HEAD COACH DANA FORD

Dana Ford (Illinois State, 2006) is **83-61** (.576) in his fifth season as Missouri State head coach, including a **50-19** (.725) ledger at Great Southern Bank Arena, 26-31 record in away games, and 7-11 mark at neutral sites. He is now **140-126** (.526) in his ninth season as a head coach, including four seasons at Tennessee State. Ford is also **51-32** in Valley games (27-15 at home, 24-17 away).

Coach Ford is **2-4** vs. Murray State (1-1 as head coach of the Bears and 0-3 at CFSB Center).

He picked up his **100th** career victory on Feb. 7, 2021 with a Bears' win at Illinois State (72-62) and coached his **100th** game at Missouri State on Dec. 15, 2021 vs. South Dakota State. His win over Oakland on Nov. 27 in The Bahamas was his **75th** victory at MSU, while his OT victory at Drake (1/18/23) was his **50th** MVC win.

CBS Sports' Jon Rothstein listed Missouri State head coach Dana Ford among his "20 coaches on the rise entering the 2022-23 college basketball season."

In a breakout 2021-22 campaign, Missouri State finished the season as one of the nation's most-efficient offensive teams, ranking 2nd nationally in free throw percentage (.797), 14th in field goal percentage (.482) and 23rd in 3-point FG percentage (.374) -- the only DI team to rank in the top 25 in all three. KenPom also rated the Bears 21st in effective FG percentage (54.6) and 23rd in adjusted offensive efficiency (113.2). MSU led the MVC in all of those metrics, except 3-point percentage, while also leading The Valley in scoring (77.3) and turnovers per game (10.6), which ranked 38th and 34th in the country, respectively.

Likewise, the 2021-22 Bears finished as runners-up in the Missouri Valley Conference, racking up a 23-11 overall record and 13-5 record in the league. The Bears' season win total was the program's most since 2011 and the 10th-best in team history. The squad advanced to the MVC Tournament semifinals for the third straight year and also represented The Valley in the NIT in Ford's first postseason tournament showing at MoState. The Bears also set team records for 3-point field goals (283) while boasting two first-team all-conference players in the school's all-time best scoring tandem -- Gaige Prim and Isiah Mosley -- while Donovan Clay earned MVC All-Defensive Team honors, Isaac Haney landed on the MVC All-Freshman Team and Jaylen Minnett was on the MVC All-Bench squad.

For the third time in his career, Ford was a finalist for the Ben Jobe Award at the conclusion of the 2021-22 season.

He was introduced as Missouri State's 18th men's basketball coach on March 22, 2018 after coaching the previous four seasons at Tennessee State. The native of Tamms, Illinois was 57-65 (.467) at Tennessee State, including a 52-39 ledger in his last three seasons in Nashville. He coached five All-OVC players and two OVC All-Newcomer Team selections during his tenure at TSU. Under his leadership, TSU doubled its home attendance average and twice earned votes in the AP Top 25 poll in 2016-17.

Ford, 38, earned the Ben Jobe Award in 2016 as the nation's top Division I minority coach. That same year, he was named Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year and NABC District 19 Coach of the Year after engineering one of the biggest turnarounds in NCAA history, from a 5-26 record in his first season to a 20-11 mark in 2015-16.

He has served as an assistant at Tennessee State, Wichita State and Illinois State and was responsible for recruiting future NBA talents such as Robert Covington (Trail Blazers) and Fred Van Vleet (Raptors).

THE SERIES

The Bears and Racers have six times previously -- four in the postseason -- with the series tied, 3-3.

The clubs met twice in the NAIA national playoffs with Murray State winning an opening-round game in 1943, and the Bears returning the favor in the 1952 national championship game. Also in the postseason, Missouri State defeated Murray State, 89-76 in the first round of the NIT at Great Southern Bank Arena (3/15/11). The Racers avenged the loss in the second round of the 2014 CIT, defeating the Bears, 66-63, in Springfield (3/19/14).

In Dana Ford's first season at Missouri State, the Bears and Racers played in Murray (11/24/18). Ja Morant scored 29 points, snagged 13 rebounds, tallied 12 assists and knocked down 6 3-pointers to lead the Racers to a 77-66 win. The Bears got 18 points from Jarred Dixon and 11 from Kabir Mohammed (4-of-7 FG) while Tulio Da Silva snagging 11 boards.

The next season in Springfield (12/3/19), Keandre Cook scored 9 of his 15 points in the final 93 seconds of the game to help lead Missouri State to a thrilling 71-69 victory. Three of Cook's scoring chances in the final minute-and-a-half restored the lead for MSU. His two free throws with 3.7 seconds remaining put the Bears up 71-66 and essentially put the game out of reach, despite a buzzer-beater from 35 feet from the Racers to trim the final margin to two points. Tulio Da Silva led the Bears with 16 points and a game-high 11 rebounds for his second double-double of the season. Gaige Prim also accounted for 10 points off the bench for the Bears who were playing their first home game in three weeks.

BEARS ON THE AIR

All games air live on the Bears Radio Network with Springfield flagship station KWTO (93.3 FM) providing the feed to the five-station network and online at RadioSpringfield.com.

Play-by-play duties this season will be split between **Don West** and **Corey Riggs** with former MSU great **Mike Keltner** (1970-74) providing color commentary.

Missouri State hall of fame broadcaster **Art Hains** continues to recover from a serious health threat. Hains has spent 41 seasons as the Voice of the Bears and celebrated his 1,000th MSU basketball broadcast on Jan. 2, 2013 and his 2,500th MSU event on Nov. 9, 2019.

CLAY HITS 1,000-POINT MILESTONE

With his hook shot off the glass with 8:21 left in the second half, **Donovan Clay** (Sr., Alton, Ill.) eclipsed 1,000 career points in Missouri State's win over Drake on Jan. 1. Clay reached the **1,000-point** club in his **111th** career game (48th at MSU). Clay also racked up his 50th career double-figure scoring game in the win with 15 points.

RIDGINAL EARNS MVC NEWCOMER OF THE WEEK HONORS ON JAN. 2

Missouri State forward **Dalen Ridginal** (Kansas City, Mo.) was named the Missouri Valley Conference Newcomer of the Week, the league on Jan. 2 after leading the Bears to a 2-0 week, including a victory over the MVC preseason favorite Drake and a rare road win at UNI. For the week, the Georgia transfer averaged **16.0** points and **7.5** rebounds, both team highs, while squaring up **7-of-14** 3-pointers (.500) and 11-of-19 (.579) field goals.

Ridginal began the week with a game-high and career-high 24 points at UNI on Dec. 28 to give the Bears just their fifth win ever at McLeod Center in Cedar Falls. He also snagged a game-high 11 rebounds in the victory at UNI for his first career double-double and just the second by a Bear this season. He finished 5-of-9 (.556) from 3-point range and 8-of-13 (.615) overall from the field with a block, a steal and an assist in 34 minutes.

He followed the UNI game with another solid effort in MSU's win over Drake on Jan. 1, finishing with 8 points, 4 rebounds, a pair of threes, a block and a steal.

BEARS AND BEARKATS CANCELED

Missouri State's game versus Sam Houston, scheduled for Dec. 22 at Great Southern Bank Arena, was canceled due to the threat of extreme winter weather in the Springfield area. The game was not rescheduled for this season, although the goal is to complete the home-and-home series in Springfield next season.

ROAD WARRIORS

MSU is one of just 12 Division I teams that played on the road in four different time zones during the non-conference portion of its 2022-23 schedule. MSU's trips to BYU (Mountain), Nassau (Eastern), Saint Mary's (Pacific) and Oral Roberts (Central) highlight a non-MVC slate that took the Bears some **11,812** air and ground miles.

ROAD WARRIORS II

Over the last 3 seasons, the Bears are **16-7** in Valley road games and **18-12** in true road games. Likewise, during **Dana Ford's** five seasons as head coach at Missouri State, the Bears have won a league-high **23** MVC road wins.

NUMBER 750

Missouri State captured its **750th** victory at the Division I level with a 79-67 win at UNI on Dec. 28. The Bears are in their 41st season as an NCAA DI program (since the 1982-83 season).

NEAR-RECORD COMEBACK AT ORU

The Bears nearly matched a club record at Oral Roberts on Dec. 18 for largest deficit overcome for victory (23 points). MSU fell behind 60-37 with 15:53 to go, then reeled off a 24-4 run over the next seven minutes to close its deficit to 64-61 with 9:15 remaining. The Bears tied the game twice from there, then captured a 75-73 lead on a layup by **Damien Mayo Jr.** with 1:34 left. ORU ultimately closed out the game on a 7-2 run to capture an 80-77 decision.

THREE-POINT DEMO

The Bears shattered the program and arena records for 3-point field goal attempts on Dec. 10 by launching **41** shots from downtown against visiting Purdue Fort Wayne, making 7. The previous record of 38 was achieved twice.

THE APPEAL OF THE STEAL

The Bears posted back-to-back games with 10 or more steals for the first time since Feb. 29 to March 6, 2020 after securing 11 takeaways at UIC (Nov. 30) and 10 vs. Bradley (Dec. 3).

ACADEMIC STANDOUTS

Eight basketball Bears were recognized on Jan. 24 for their academic excellence during the fall 2022 semester. **Dawson Carper**, **Matthew Lee**, **Alston Mason**, **Damien Mayo Jr.**, **Jonathan Mogbo**, **Kendle Moore**, **Tommy Pinegar**, and **Dalen Ridginal** all achieved a 3.0 GPA or higher for the term, earning a spot on the Athletic Director's Honor Roll, which included a record 276 student-athletes (fall 2022).

HAZING THE NEW KIDS

Missouri State ushered in UIC's membership in the Missouri Valley on Nov. 30 with a 66-51 win road win over the Flames at the Credit Union 1 Arena. **Donovan Clay** (Sr., Alton, Ill.) and **Chance Moore** (So., Brookhaven, Ga.) led MSU with 17 points apiece, while **Jonathan Mogbo** (Jr., West Palm Beach, Fla.) secured a team-high 10 rebounds. Clay also dished out a game-high 7 assists and blocked 3 shots in the victory.

MSU finished with 11 steals, 10 blocks and out-rebounded the Flames by a 50-40 margin.

BEARS PICKED FOURTH IN VALLEY POLL

The Missouri Valley Conference released its preseason poll and all-conference team on Oct. 19, and Missouri State was predicted to finish fourth in the 12-team league.

Drake received 52 of the 54 possible first-place votes and 646 total points to earn the coveted position as MVC preseason favorite with Bradley (542) and Southern Illinois (537) each picking up one first-place vote in the second and third positions, respectively. **Missouri State** (418) edged out defending champion Northern Iowa (416) for the No. 4 position with Valley newcomer Belmont (388) tabbed sixth. The remainder of the poll includes Indiana State (344), Murray State (324), Valparaiso (234), Illinois State (186), UIC (109) and Evansville (68) in positions 7-12.

CLAY EARNS VALLEY PRESEASON HONORS

One of the league's top lock-down defenders, **Donovan Clay** (Sr., Alton, Ill.) was named to the *Preseason All-MVC* second team, the league announced Oct. 19. It marks Clay's second Preseason All-MVC honor of his career, also garnering preseason laurels in 2020-21.

Last season, Clay earned *MVC All-Defensive Team* honors after compiled 36 blocks and 21 steals, ranking 4th in the MVC in blocks and tied for 5th in rebounding (6.2). He made 34 starts, averaging 8.4 points with a 53.7 FG pct.

NEW FACES LEAD THE PACES

The Bears have one of the "newest" teams in all of Division I basketball with just 3 returning players from last season (one returning starter) and 12.5 percent of the team's scoring). The new-look roster this winter includes 14 newcomers -- including 7 Division I transfers, 1 juco transfer and 6 freshmen.

BAHA MAR NASSAU CHAMPIONSHIP RECAP

MSU finished 1-2 and took seventh place at the Baha Mar Nassau Championship, Nov. 25-27, in The Bahamas. The Bears opened the tournament with a 68-54 loss to eventual champion UNCW, a game in which MSU led by 8 midway through the first half. UNCW pushed ahead 54-43 with 9:12 to go, but **Bryan Trimble Jr.**'s two free throws at the 3:11 mark trimmed MSU's deficit to 6. **Kendle Moore** scored 12 points to lead the Bears.

On day two, there were 5 ties and 6 lead changes against Ball State, but Missouri State had an 11-minute stretch without a field goal that pushed the Cardinals ahead 66-56 with a minute to go. The Bears made a run at it, getting within 66-64 with 10 seconds left, but could not close out the "magic minute" in a 67-64 loss.

In the finale, five Bears scored in double figures to top Oakland, 76-64. **Trimble Jr.** had a team-high 14 points behind four triples. MSU had 19 assists and its 38-13 run over a 14-minute stretch helped MSU seal the win.

TAKE A CHANCE ON ME

Arkansas transfer **Chance Moore** (So., Brookhaven, Ga.) was MSU's top scorer in the team's season opener vs. Missouri S&T on Nov. 9. Moore was 6-of-10 from the field, 3-of-5 from 3-point range and 3-for-4 at the stripe for a game-high 18 points in the 35-point Bears' victory. He followed that up with a double-double at BYU on Nov. 16, scoring 18 points and snagging a game-high 11 rebounds in Provo and then went 8-for-9 from the field for a game-high (and career high) 19 points vs. Middle Tennessee on Nov. 19. He played a total of 8 minutes (over 5 games) at Arkansas as a true freshman last season before coming to Springfield.

LEE TO MISS REMAINDER OF THE SEASON

Head coach Dana Ford announced Nov. 19 that senior point guard **Matthew Lee** (San Juan, P.R.) will miss the remainder of the season after suffering a torn Anterior Cruciate Ligament (ACL) in the second half of the team's game at Brigham Young. A transfer from Saint Peter's University, Lee started both of MSU's first two games of the season and led the team in assists both times (4.0 per game) while also averaging 5.0 points, 2.5 rebounds and 19.0 minutes per game. Lee would have his additional Covid (fifth) year of eligibility remaining for next season.

BEARS FALL TO BYU ON BUZZER BEATER

On Nov. 16, a jumper off the glass from Dallin Hall with 1.5 seconds to go lifted Brigham Young to a 66-64 win over visiting Missouri State. The game featured 11 ties and 14 lead changes before 12,587 fans at Marriott Center. **Chance Moore** led Missouri State with 18 points and 11 rebounds off the bench while contributing three treys. Bryan Trimble added 11 points, also with three triples, for the Bears. MSU trailed by 10 points with 12:47 to go, falling behind 50-40. But the Bears then exploded for a 15-3 run over the next three-and-a-half minutes to take the lead and later tied the game on a bucket by **Alston Mason** with 7.2 seconds to go.

EXHIBITION RECAP

Behind a 20-point performance from Akron transfer **Bryan Trimble Jr.**, Missouri State coasted to a 78-58 victory over Newman in exhibition play on Nov. 5. Trimble finished 7-of-13 from the field and 6-of-12 from 3-point range to pace the Bears, who led by as many as 24 in the second half. **Donovan Clay**, the club's only returning starter, posted a double-double with 15 points and 10 rebounds.

Matthew Lee and **Chance Moore** also scored in double figures for Dana Ford's squad with 12 and 10 points, respectively. MSU had 30 points in the paint and shot 48.3 percent from the field with 10 3-pointers.

JOHNSON ACTIVE IN NBA, GETS TIME WITH TEAM USA

Former Bear standout Alize Johnson (2016-18) is in his fifth season in the NBA, signing a one-year deal with the San Antonio Spurs in November. Johnson has played in 5 games this season (scoring 7 points and snagging 10 rebounds in 30 minutes on the floor). Also in November, Johnson was one of the forwards who represented USA Basketball in the World Cup qualifier, Nov. 11-14 in Washington, D.C. The second-round draft pick of the Pacers (2018) has also played for the Pacers, Nets, Bulls and Pelicans in his pro career. The two-time All-MVC first-team selection was named MVC Newcomer of the Year in 2017 and finished second in the MVC Player of the Year voting his senior year. He scored 982 points in two seasons with the Bears (14.9 ppg) along with 735 rebounds (11.1 rpg), currently ranking 32nd on MSU's career scoring list and 6th on MSU's all-time rebounding chart in just two seasons.

REDSHIRTS ANNOUNCED

Bears head coach Dana Ford announced that freshmen **Kanon Gipson** (G, Rogersville, Mo.), **David Hill** (G, Williamsport, Pa.) and **Tommy Pinegar** (G, Springfield, Mo.) will redshirt during the 2022-23 season. These players will have four seasons of eligibility remaining.

LEE CARRIES ON FAMILY LEGACY

Point guard **Matthew Lee** (Sr., San Juan, Puerto Rico) made national headlines last season after helping lead Saint Peter's to the NCAA Elite Eight. After guiding his club to NCAA wins over Kentucky, Murray St. and Purdue, Lee landed on the cover of *Sports Illustrated*, some 45 years after his father, Butch Lee, was on the cover. Butch is the only Puerto Rican to win both NCAA (Marquette) and NBA (Lakers) basketball titles.

KEEPING TALLY IN THE VALLEY

Since **Dana Ford** took the helm in 2018, the Bears have reeled off four straight Valley seasons with a .500 record or better, including 10 or more wins three times. MSU last reached four straight .500 league seasons in a six-year stretch from 2001-02 to 2006-07, some 15 years ago. The Bears have also finished second or third in the MVC standings in three of Ford's first four seasons at the helm.

BEARS BASKETBALL HISTORY

The Bears have an all-time record of **1739-1038 (.626)**, now in their 111th season; a **755-521 (.592)** ledger in their 41st Division I season; and a **320-265 (.547)** mark in their 33rd season in the Missouri Valley Conference. MSU is also **161-71 (.694)** in its 15th season at Great Southern Bank Arena.

During the Division I era, MSU has made NCAA Tournament appearances in 1987, 1988, 1989, 1990, 1992, and 1999. With NCAA Tournament wins over Wisconsin and Tennessee, the 1999 Bears advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 for the first time in program history. The Bears have appeared in the National Invitation Tournament 10 times -- 1986, 1991, 1993, 1997, 2000, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2011 and 2022. The 1986, 1993 and 2006 squads all reached the NIT quarterfinals. MSU has also appeared in the CIT twice -- 2010 (champions) and 2014.

MSU won NAIA national championship titles in 1952 and 1953 under the late coach Bob Vanatta, while making six NAIA national tournament trips from 1939-1954. MSU also appeared in the NCAA Division II Tournament 10 times, finishing as national runners-up four times -- 1959, 1967, 1969 and 1974.

MSU has won 24 regular-season conference titles, including the 2010-11 MVC championship. The Bears have also recorded 28 seasons of 20 or more victories, including 15 in the Division I era.

FIFTY-ONE STRAIGHT WINNING SEASONS AT HOME

With its win over Evansville on Jan. 29, 2022, the Bears secured their **51st** straight winning season at home. Missouri State has been over .500 in home every season since 1971-72, encompassing three different home venues. Now in its 15th season at Great Southern Bank Arena, MSU is **161-71 (.694)** all-time at "The Vault."

MISSOURI STATE UNIVERSITY

Missouri State University is a public, comprehensive university system with a mission in public affairs, whose purpose is to develop educated persons while achieving five goals: democratizing society, incubating new ideas, imagining Missouri's future, making Missouri's future, and modeling ethical and effective behavior.

MISSOURI VALLEY CONFERENCE

In 2018, Loyola University of Chicago advanced to the Final Four, giving the MVC a representative on the biggest stage in college basketball for the second time in six seasons (Wichita State, 2013). The MVC also boasts tradition from the likes of Hall of Famers Larry Bird and Oscar Robertson among a list of more than 260 players drafted to the NBA.

Newcomers Chance Moore and Alston Mason paced Missouri State's scoring with 18 and 13 points, respectively, to help lead the Bears to an 82-47 opening-night win over visiting Missouri S&T here Wednesday.

Fellow MoState newcomer Jonathan Mogbo added 11 points and 7 rebounds with Preseason All-MVC standout Donovan Clay also snagging a game-high 7 boards in the winning cause.

Coach Dana Ford's Bears doubled up the Miners on the glass, out-rebounding the visitors by a 46-23 margin and holding them to just six second-chance points. The Bears also shot 55.2 percent from the field with 11 3-pointers.

Missouri State's wealth of new talent was evident early with Matthew Lee scoring the first points of the season in the opening minute. Fellow transfers Jonathan Mogbo, Kendle Moore and Bryan Trimble Jr. then pitched in buckets before the first media timeout. By halftime, 10 of the 11 players who saw action found the scoring column, and the Bears held a 51-25 lead.

MSU shot 69 percent from the field in the opening 20 minutes and carried that momentum into the second half. Coming out of the first media timeout of the second stanza, five different Bears scored as part of a 16-0 run that pushed the home side ahead 71-31 with 12:37 to go.

Less than three minutes later, Trimble knocked down back-to-back 3-pointers to make it a 77-33 game and provide the Bears with their biggest cushion of the night.

Missouri S&T was led by Ikenna Okeke and Andrew Young who each contributed 14 points while combining for four of the Miners' five 3-pointers.

Aside from the rebounding advantage, the Bears held Missouri S&T to 30.6 percent from the field (19-of-62), forced 13 turnovers and racked up 6 steals and 5 blocks. Mogbo rejected three shots to lead all players.

Brigham Young 66, Missouri State 64

A jumper off the glass from Dallin Hall with 1.5 seconds to go lifted Brigham Young to a 66-64 win over Missouri State in a game that featured 11 ties and 14 lead changes before 12,587 fans at Marriott Center.

Chance Moore led Missouri State with 18 points and 11 rebounds off the bench while contributing three treys. Bryan Trimble added 11 points with three triples.

Noah Waterman was the leading scorer for BYU (2-1) with 15 points, all on 3-pointers, while Spencer Johnson scored 10.

Missouri State trailed by 10 points with 12:47 to go, falling behind 50-40 on Waterman's fifth trey of the game. But the Bears then exploded for a 15-3 run over the next three-and-a-half minutes to take the lead.

Donovan Clay's layup at the 7:56 mark gave MSU a 55-53 lead. Shortly thereafter, Bryan Trimble Jr.'s free throw gave MSU a 56-53 advantage.

Down the stretch, Trimble's three off the glass with just under three minutes to go gave the Bears a 62-61 lead. The Bears came up with clutch plays from there, none greater than Alston Mason's layup with 7.2 to play that knotted things up 64-64.

After Hall's key bucket, the Bears had 1.5 seconds for a desperation shot, but couldn't pull off the road upset to fall by two.

MSU finished 24-of-61 (.393) overall, including 7-of-22 (.318) from long range and 9-of-16 (.600) at the line in a violent environment. MSU finished with just 9 turnovers and snagged 6 steals with Lee dishing out a team-high 4 assists.

BYU was 23-of-56 (.411) overall and 9-of-25 (.360) from long range and 11-of-20 (.550) at the stripe with a 42-37 rebounding advantage. BYU* blocked 9 shots and matched Missouri State's 16 second-chance points.

In the opening half, there were eight ties and six lead changes with BYU's 7-0 run just before the intermission giving the home side a narrow 36-35 advantage at the midway point.

Chance Moore's 10 points led the Bears, and his streak of seven straight points midway through the opening stanza gave MSU a 30-29 lead with 4:21 to go in the half. But after a Lee jumper gave the Bears a 32-29 advantage, BYU reeled off seven unanswered. Lee ended the half with a banked-in 3-pointer to cut the MSU deficit to 36-35 at the break.

Missouri State 75, Middle Tennessee 51

Missouri State shot 50 percent from the field and went 12-for-27 from 3-point land for a 75-51 victory over visiting Middle Tennessee.

Chance Moore scored a career-high 19 points off the bench and made his first eight shots before finishing 8-for-9. Alston Mason added 16 with four triples, and Donovan Clay scored 15 with a career-best 9 assists as the Bears dished out 20 helpers on 28 made baskets.

It marked the most assists by a Missouri State player since Gaige Prim handed out 9 dimes vs. Northwestern State on Dec. 19, 2020.

Missouri State took the lead for good during a 14-3 run in the opening minutes, with Mason hitting a pair of 3-pointers and Kendle Moore capping it with another for a 19-8 advantage with 11:26 on the first-half clock.

Chance Moore hit all three of his long balls in a 14-2 MSU run for a 37-20 margin with 1:32 left in the opening half, and Mason beat the halftime buzzer with a layup for a 41-22 Bears advantage at intermission after the home club went 8-for-14 deep and 16-for-28 overall in the opening 20 minutes.

Another Kendle Moore triple put the Bears up by 20 for the first time at 44-24 early in the second half, and Middle Tennessee (2-2) would get no closer than 15 from there as the Bears' lead grew to as many as 29 in the waning minutes.

Missouri State's defense held the Blue Raiders to 34 percent overall and 3-for-19 from long range while grabbing 9 steals and forcing 16 MTSU turnovers. In his 100th career game, Clay had three of those thefts while Kendle Moore, Chance Moore and Dalen Ridginal nabbed two apiece.

Clay's five rebounds were a team high with nine players grabbing multiple boards, and the Bears made all seven of their free throw attempts.

UNC Wilmington 68, Missouri State 54

A key 7-0 run midway through the second half gave UNC Wilmington the game's first double-digit lead, and the momentum swing pushed the Seahawks to a 68-54 win over Missouri State here Friday in the opening round of the Baha Mar Basketball Nassau Championship.

The Bears held a share of the lead all but one minute of the first half but could only convert seven field goals over the game's final 20 minutes to let their early advantage slip away. Still, MoState trimmed an 11-point deficit down to six with 3 minutes, 11 seconds remaining after a pair of technical free throws by Bryan Trimble Jr. made it a 59-53 contest.

But UNCW closed out the game on a 9-1 run, getting a back-breaking three by Donovan Newby that gave his team its biggest lead of the night, 66-53, with 1:43 to play.

Trazarien White led UNCW with 16 points and a game-high 11 rebounds, while Jamari Thomas added 13 points, and Newby scored 11.

Kendle Moore was Missouri State's top scorer with 12 points, while Dawson Carper added 10 points off the bench.

Donovan Clay led the Bears in rebounds (6) and assists (3), while Chance Moore finished with 7 points and 6 boards.

On a tough shooting day, the Bears couldn't find their touch from most areas, finishing just 2-of-19 (.105) from 3-point range, 18-for-34 (.529) from the foul line and 17-of-45 (.378) overall from the field. Despite the difficult shooting metrics, the Bears out-rebounded UNCW by a 35-34 margin, allowing just six second-chance points.

Missouri State trailed 29-28 at the intermission, however its deficit grew to seven before the first media timeout. But coming out of the first break of the second half, Trimble drained a three, and Kendle Moore's running one-hander with just under 15 minutes to go made it a two-point game.

Midway through the final period, Nick Farrar's jumper, Newby's three, and Shy-keim Phillips' fast-break bucket capped a 7-0 run by UNCW, giving coach Takayo Siddle's a 54-43 led with just over nine minutes to go.

In the opening half, the Bears held an eight-point advantage midway through the stanza but after Kendle Moore's transition layup gave MSU a 15-7 lead, MSU managed just two field goals over a nine-minute stretch. A corner three from Kendle with five seconds left in the half trimmed UNCW's lead to one at the break.

Ball State 67, Missouri State 64

In a wild, roller-coaster second half, Missouri State came up just short against Ball State, falling 67-64, despite a courageous effort in the game's final minute. With 59 seconds to go, the Bears trailed by 10 and had not made a field goal in 11 minutes. But then something clicked.

Alston Mason's spinning layup at the 54-second mark ended the dry stretch for Missouri State, then Jonathan Mogbo's dunk after a Ball State turnover made it a 66-60 game. The Bears then took the ball away again with Mason snagging a steal and layup with 31 ticks to go.

Donovan Clay then snatched another Bears' steal on the ensuing play, but couldn't capitalize. However, a Ball State traveling call with 16 seconds left in the game gave the Bears the ball back, and this time Clay converted with a put-back off a Mason missed three to make it a 66-64 game.

Needing to foul with just under 10 seconds left, the Bears put 50-percent foul shooter Payton Sparks on the line. Sparks made one of his two charity shots to make it a three-point game and keep MoState in the game on its final possession.

But the final-minute magic ran out on the Springfield team on its final possession of the afternoon. Clay's drive to the rim with two seconds to go certainly drew contact. But with no whistle, the missed layup led to a scrum for the rebound, and ultimately left Kendle Moore with the ball in no-man's land. Unable to get the ball behind the arc to attempt a three, the Bears ran out of time and the clock struck zero in a hard-fought, three-point defeat.

Chance Moore scored 14 points in just under 14 minutes to lead MSU (2-3), while Mason added 12 points.

Sparks led Ball State with 24 points and 12 rebounds, while Jarron Coleman and Demarius Jacobs added 10 points apiece for the Cardinals.

The Bears led by three at the intermission, and held the advantage until the 8-minute mark when Clay's free throw made it a 53-53 game. Ball State then throttled the momentum away, going on a 12-3 run over the next six minutes to lead by nine and then taking a 66-56 lead on a Sparks free throw with 59 seconds left.

In the first half, Missouri State shot 58 percent and connected on 7-of-10 threes to take a 38-35 advantage into the break.

The Bears answered a Ball State 10-0 run midway through the opening stanza with an 8-0 run of their own moments later. Threes by Trimble and Chance Moore preceded a layup by N.J. Benson to push MSU back on top 30-23 with 4:44 to go before the intermission. Later, Moore's back-to-back scores gave the Bears their biggest lead of the half, 38-27, with just under two minute on the clock.

Missouri State 76, Oakland 64

Five Missouri State players scored in double figures, and the Bears shot 56 percent from the field in the second half to dispatch Oakland, 76-64, in the seventh-place game of the Baha Mar Hoops Nassau Championship.

The Bears (3-3), who ran into second-half scoring droughts in their first two games of the tournament, left nothing to risk Sunday. After going into the half tied, 33-33, MSU opened the second stanza on an 18-3 run, forcing two Oakland time-outs and seizing a 15-point lead for the first time on a three from Kendle Moore less than six minutes into the final period.

Missouri State racked up a dozen threes on the afternoon, including four from Bryan Trimble Jr., who reached career trey No. 200 in the win. He finished with a team-high 14 points, while Moore scored 13, and James Graham added a career-high 13 in reserve.

Donovan Clay added 11 points in the win, and Alston Mason scored 10 while sharing the team lead in assists with four. Damien Mayo Jr. and Kendle Moore also dished out four assists apiece as part of a 19-assist game for the maroon side.

With just under eight minutes to play, Graham's dunk sparked another MSU run as Mason tacked on a pair of treys, and Clay racked up two high-percentage shots at the rim to give MSU a 72-51 advantage with 4:46 remaining.

The 10-3 mini-run covered three minutes and put the icing on the cake for the Missouri State victory.

From there, former Bear Keaton Hervey scored Oakland's next 11 points with the game already in hand, giving him a game-high 24 points to lead the Golden Grizzlies (2-6) from the Horizon League.

Missouri State just missed a 50-percent shooting effort, firing 30-of-61 (.492) overall and 12-for-29 (.414) from long range. MSU also owned a 33-28 rebounding advantage.

The Bears collected 36 points in the paint, their most since opening night, and posted 19 points off 14 Oakland turnovers.

Oakland was 23-of-50 (.460) overall, 10-for-25 (.400) from downtown and 8-of-12 (.667) at the line.

In the first half, the Bears got off to a slow start, making just two of their first 11 shots, but finished the opening stanza with some momentum. After trailing 23-13 with 8:39 left in the period, MSU outscored Oakland by a 20-10 margin down the stretch, making 10-of-18 shots in that span, to knot things up, 33-33.

Kendle Moore and Trimble Jr. each scored eight points in the opening half, with Graham burying a pair of key 3-pointers in the final two minutes to stage the comeback.

Missouri State got 17 points apiece Donovan Clay and Chance Moore, dominated the glass and used a solid defensive effort to turn back home standing UIC, 66-51, in the Missouri Valley Conference opener for both clubs.

The win marked head coach Dana Ford's 22nd conference road victory during his tenure at MoState, the most by any Valley team in that span.

The Bears racked up 11 steals, 10 blocks and out-rebounded the Flames by a 50-40 margin to overcome a rough shooting effort. But with wins on The Valley road appraising so high, Ford says the sweet taste of victory goes well at the end of a long road trip.

The Bears scored 42 points in the paint and registered 14 points on fast break situations to keep the home club at arm's length most of the second half.

UIC was led by Jace Carter's 15 points, while Jalen Jackson scored 14. Toby Okani also had a game-high 12 rebounds for the league newcomers.

MSU was supported with a 9-point, 10-rebound effort from Jonathan Mogbo, while N.J. Benson matched his season high with 8 points.

The Bears extended their six-point halftime lead to double figures right after the intermission, getting a transition bucket from Mogbo and a layup from Chance Moore to lead 36-26. Later, a Clay-led 6-0 run quieted the home crowd after UIC had trimmed MSU's lead to seven. Clay's dunk with 10:28 remaining in the game capped the stretch and extended the Bears' lead to 50-37.

By the seven-minute mark, Mogbo's close-range finish gave the Bears a 55-39 lead, which was its most to that point. Only Kendle Moore's final layup of the night put the visitors up by a greater margin at 17.

The Bears were 27-of-73 (.370) overall from the field, 6-for-23 (.261) from long range and 6-of-13 (.462) at the line with just 8 turnovers and 14 assists.

UIC was held to 30.2 percent on 16-of-53 field goal attempts. The Flames were also 7-of-21 (.333) from distance and 12-of-19 (.632) at the line with 15 turnovers.

Missouri State also converted its 19 offensive rebounds into 21 second-chance points on the night. It marked the first-ever November conference game in program history.

In the opening half, the home club made four of its first seven shots, while the Bears had trouble finding their mark. But after working through an early 11-2 deficit, Missouri State embarked on an impressive 11-0 outburst in the span of two minutes to capture the lead and never looked back.

Benson had four points on the decisive run, while Clay had seven, and the Bears wouldn't trail again, leading by as many as seven before the breaker after Clay's layup at the 5:52 mark.

In its long-awaited return to Great Southern Bank Arena on Saturday, Missouri State ran into a determined Bradley squad and couldn't seem to gain a foothold against the more-experienced Braves in a 58-40 MVC setback.

The Bears shot just 31.4 percent from the field but made up for it early with several key defensive stands and solid rebounding. The game was tied, 8-8, eight minutes in, before the visitors ultimately used the three ball to gain separation and take a low-scoring 26-18 lead into the intermission.

Jonathan Mogbo, who had a dunk for the first points of the game, led the home side with five points in the opening stanza. Bradley's only two treys of the opening period came in the final four minutes with Christian Davis and Connor Hickman giving the Braves (6-3, 2-0 MVC) an 11-point lead at the 2:32 mark with back-to-back triples.

Bradley went to all-conference post Rienk Mast early and often in the second half as the 6-foot-9 junior accounted for six of the Braves' first eight points of the final period and pushed them up 34-22 with his hook shot at the 17-minute mark.

Missouri State seemed to steady its ship shortly thereafter as Kendle Moore and Bryan Trimble Jr. hit back-to-back 3-pointers to get the Bears back within 36-28. At the midway point, Moore's steal and layup preceded a layup by Dawson Carper that cut MSU's deficit to 39-32.

But Bradley would bury five 3-pointers in the next seven minutes to take away any momentum the Bears had. By the time, the dust settled, Bradley finished out a 19-4 run with Hickman's second triple of the evening, giving the Braves their largest lead of the night, 58-36.

Alston Mason scored Missouri State's final four points to trim the game's final margin.

Coming off a four-game, nine-day road swing, Missouri State finished 16-of-51 from the field, 2-of-15 (.133) from long range and 6-of-11 (.545) at the line with 13 turnovers.

Bradley out-rebounded the Bears by a 22-12 margin in the second half and 39-27 overall.

Mast was the game's only double-figure scorer with 15 points on 6-of-11 from the field, while Malevy Leons tallied 8 points and 10 boards for the visitors.

Kendle Moore and N.J. Benson led Missouri State with 7 points apiece, while Donovan Clay's 6 rebounds was tops among all Bears.

Missouri State, which swept Bradley each of the past two seasons, snagged 10 steals for the second game in a row.

Saint Mary's 66, Missouri State 46

Missouri State trailed Saint Mary's by five at the midway point and showed the defensive intensity it needed to stay in the game early. But the home-standing Gaels outscored the visitors by 15 in the second half and used a physical inside presence to gain separation down the stretch in a 66-46 road loss.

Saint Mary's collected 48 points in the paint and shot 51 percent from the field while outscoring Missouri State by a 29-15 margin over the last 14 minutes.

Alston Mason and Chance Moore led MSU's scoring efforts with 12 points apiece, both accounting for two 3-pointers.

It marked the Bears second trip to Moraga in as many seasons to take on the nationally-prominent Gaels squad.

The Bears used a scrappy defensive effort to stay within 26-21 in the first half, getting within one point of the lead on three occasions. But after a layup from Donovan Clay opened up the second half, SMC went on a 7-0 run to lead by double figures for the first time, 33-23, and forced a Bears timeout with 16:44 remaining.

Back-to-back MSU 3-pointers by Chance Moore and Mason brought the visitors back within 37-31, at the 14:27 mark, but that was as close as the Bears would get. Saint Mary's allowed MSU just two field goals over the next eight minutes – a three by James Graham and a transition bucket by Dawson Carper – while the Gaels' lead ballooned to 18.

Mitchell Saxen was part of the SMC size that gave the Bears fits. He made 7-of-10 shots in the first half and finished with 19 points. The Gaels' other big man Alex Ducas scored 9 points, all in the second half, to contribute to the inside threat by the home club.

The Bears were out-rebounded, 31-26, but allowed just 6 second-chance points on the evening with the Gaels collecting just five offensive caroms.

MSU finished 17-of-47 (.362) overall from the field, while converting 7-of-20 (.350) from long range and 5-of-10 (.500) at the foul line with 13 turnovers. MSU also had just 6 second-chance points and racked up 5 blocked shots.

In the first half, SMC led 12-4 just four minutes into the game, but MSU unreeled a 12-5 run over the next six minutes to close the gap to 17-16 after back-to-back buckets from Donovan Clay. With less than three minutes to go in the period and MSU trailing 22-19, Clay hit the deck on a jumper from the right-side, but with no call, the Gaels found an easy layup on the other end by Logan Johnson to extend their advantage to five. The clubs traded buckets from there to give the home side a five-point lead at the break.

Clay and Carper led the Bears with 6 rebounds apiece on the night, while Dalen Ridgnal snagged 5 boards.

Missouri State's steal and fast-break dunk by Chance Moore with 1:58 to go tied the game and erased what was once a 10-point second-half deficit against visiting Purdue Fort Wayne. But the Mastodons outscored the Bears 8-4 in the final two minutes, including 4-of-6 free throws, to steal a 65-61 victory.

The Bears were led by 23 points and 6 rebounds by Chance Moore in his first collegiate start, while Alston Mason scored 14 and dished out 3 assists. Donovan Clay also pitched in 6 rebounds and 3 assists for MSU.

MoState also broke a school record for 3-point field goal attempts with 41, the fifth most in Missouri Valley Conference history.

Meanwhile, the Bears held PFW to 5-of-19 (.263) from downtown after the Mastodons came in averaging 10.6 threes per game.

After trailing by one at the half, the Bears came out the second half with quick buckets from Mason and Clay to tie things up, 33-33. But the visitors responded with their best surge of the night, reeling off 10 unanswered points over the next three minutes to lead 43-33, the largest margin of the night for either team.

MSU responded immediately with James Graham hitting a triple off the bench ahead of Mason's first of two treys. Chance Moore's runner at the 12-minute mark closed MSU's gap to 43-41 and set the pace for a back-and-forth ending.

Down the stretch, Moore took over for the Bears and used a layup and four free throws to bookend a 3-pointer by Dalen Ridgnal, which ultimately knotted things up, 50-50, at the 7:39 mark.

MSU would throttle control back from there with Mason hitting a step-back jumper and then another clutch triple that gave the Bears a 55-52 advantage with just under five minutes on the clock. PFW then got a controversial three-shot foul opportunity on its next possession as Jarred Godfrey tied it up with three makes, and then gave the Mastodons the lead with another bucket before the media break.

But Chance Moore's fast-break dunk with 1:58 to go tied the score for the eighth and final time as the sophomore threw down his fourth slam of the game in making it a 57-57 contest.

In crunch time, Godfrey scored again before Ra Kpedi's dunk gave the visitors a four-point cushion. Then with 35 seconds to go, Clay went to the line a chance to pull the Bears closer. But he missed the front end of the one-and-one, which forced MoState to foul.

In the first half, the Bears pushed ahead by eight after Chance Moore's third dunk of the half made it 27-19 with just over five minutes left in the period. MSU cooled off to the tune of 1-of-8 field goals in a critical stretch before the intermission, while the Mastodons ended the period on an 11-2 run to lead 30-29 at the midway point.

Down by 23 points with just under 16 minutes to go, Missouri State used a young rotation that never left the floor and eventually took the lead with 94 seconds to go. But home standing Oral Roberts narrowly beat the shot clock on a game-winning dunk with 19 seconds remaining to steal an 80-77 victory.

Jonathan Mogbo led the Bears with a career-high 14 points. His two free throws with 49 seconds remaining got the Bears back within 78-77 before the Golden Eagles ran a give-and-go play to 7-foot-5 Connor Vanover for the dunk as the shot clock expired. Damien Mayo Jr.'s desperation three for MSU from the left wing as time expired was on-line but came up just short in the final moments of an otherwise uplifting stretch for the MoState.

In addition to Mogbo's effort down the stretch, Dalen Ridgnal (13) and Raphe Ayres (10) also tallied career highs for the Bears as part of their second-half resurgence. James Graham and Damien Mayo Jr. each added 9 points as part of the "youth movement" MSU used over the last 16 minutes.

Mayo's layup with 94 seconds to play broke a 73-73 tie and gave the Bears their only lead of the night. ORU (9-3) responded with a 5-0 run on a layup from Kareem Thompson and a traditional three-point play from Patrick Mwamba at the one-minute mark that gave the home side a three-point lead heading down the stretch.

Mogbo's two free throws at the 49-second mark trimmed the deficit to one, but MSU couldn't close out what would have tied a school record for the largest deficit overcome for victory.

Missouri State had its best offensive effort since opening night, converting 28-of-52 field goal attempts for 53.8 percent, while matching a season-high with 12 triples, including three apiece by James Graham and Ridgnal.

In the first half, ORU made 8 of its first 9 shots and ended the stanza at 69 percent from the field with three players in double figures while capitalizing on a chilling foul discrepancy to lead 45-32 at the midway point.

Chance Moore's 8 points in the first half led Missouri State as he was one of seven Bears to hit a 3-pointer on the night and joined Graham and Ridgnal with multiple treys.

MSU outscored the home side by a 45-35 margin in the second half with the Bears racking up a season-high 55 bench points to ORU's 8. Missouri State also owned a 30-26 rebounding advantage, allowing just 8 second-chance points.

The Golden Eagles finished 29-of-52 (.558) from the field, 6-of-18 (.333) from distance and 16-of-25 (.640) at the stripe with MSU whistled for 20 fouls.

All ten players who saw action for Missouri State landed in the scoring column as the Bears dispatched visiting Central Michigan, 79-58.

Dalen Ridgnal scored 16 points and snagged a game-high 8 rebounds in his first MSU start, while Jonathan Mogbo and James Graham added 12 points apiece for the winning side, which shot an even 50-percent from the field and trashed a four-game losing skid.

It was the first career starts for Graham as well as third-year squadman Raphe Ayres, who finished with 7 points, while the rest of the new-look starting lineup included Damien Mayo Jr., Mogbo and Ridgnal. Mayo tallied 8 points and dished out 4 assists to help the winning cause.

Missouri State built off a 10-point halftime lead with a 10-2 surge in the first four minutes of the second half to extend its lead to 18. Near the midway point in the half, the Bears used a 13-0 run over a three-minute stint to stretch their lead from 16 to 29. Kendle Moore started the rally before three straight 3-pointers by Graham and Alston Mason ahead of a pair of free throws from Donovan Clay made it a 66-37 game.

Graham's final 3-pointer of the night made it a 76-44 game with 4:26 to go – Missouri State's largest lead of the night – to put the contest out of reach.

The Bears held Central Michigan to 36.4 percent from the field on 20-of-55 attempts, 7-of-22 (.318) from 3-point range and 11-of-15 (.733) at the line. CMU scored six of its 10 second-half field goals in the last five minutes of the game.

Reggie Bass scored a game-high 18 points for the Chippewas, while Brian Taylor scored 12 for the visitors.

MSU posted its second-straight 50-percent shooting game, racking 26-of-52 field goals, while dropping in 10-of-26 (.385) 3-pointers and 17-of-26 (.654) at the stripe. The Bears also out-rebounded CMU by a 41-26 margin, their second-largest margin of the season, to go with 15 second-chance points.

Led by 3 rejections from Mogbo, the Bears also blocked 8 shots, while dishing out 18 assists, including 4 apiece from Mayo and Clay.

In the first half, a Ridgnal-led 10-0 run midway through the opening stanza catapulted the Bears to a 26-20 lead and swelled to a 12-point advantage just before the half. Ridgnal finished the half with 16 points and 6 rebounds to lead MSU's efforts, while marking the most points by a MoState player in a half this season.

Missouri State 79, Northern Iowa 67

Missouri State got 24 points and 11 rebounds from Dalen Ridgna and shot 55 percent from the field to dominate home-standing Northern Iowa, 79-67.

The Bears (6-7, 2-1 MVC) also got double-figure scoring efforts from Kendle Moore with 15 points, Chance Moore and Damien Mayo Jr. with 13 apiece, and Jonathan Mogbo with 10 points and 4 assists.

The Panthers saw their two-game win streak end with Bowen Born scoring a team-high 21 points, while Tytan Anderson scored 15 points and snagged 6 boards

The Bears extended an 11-point halftime lead with a three from Ridgna and a layup from Mogbo that ultimately led to a quick timeout by the Panthers. Less than five minutes later, Mogbo forced another UNI timeout on back-to-back layups that pushed the Bears up 55-37 with just under 12 minutes to play.

The Bears burned a timeout with 9:45 to go, but after the timeout, Ridgna lit up two more 3-pointers to give MSU its biggest lead of the night, 64-42, and matched that on a steal and dunk by Donovan Clay with 3:08 remaining that made it 76-54.

Down the stretch, the Panthers were active in the back court and racked up three of their six steals in the game in the final three minutes to chip away and use a 9-0 run to make it 76-63 inside two minutes.

But the Bears weathered the storm with Kendle Moore and Ridgna hitting clutch free throws to put the win on ice.

It marked MSU's 23rd MVC road win of the Dana Ford era and the 750th win for the Missouri State program since the move to Division I status in 1982-83.

Missouri State hit the 50-percent mark for the third straight game, making 29-of-53 (.547) shots overall and burying 11-of-24 (.458) from long range. The Bears were also 10-of-14 (.714) from the line with 14 assists and 9 steals.

UNI finished 26-of-55 (.473) overall, 6-of-21 (.286) from downtown and 9-of-14 (.643) at the stripe. The Panthers out-rebounded the Bears by a narrow 30-29 margin and committed 15 turnovers.

In the first half, both teams shot 60 percent from the field, but Kendle Moore's 11 points and no second-chance points for the Panthers led to a 40-29 Bears advantage at the midway point. Missouri State turned a four-point advantage into a nine-point lead late in the opening half with a 10-2 run that started with a three by Kendle Moore and ended with five points from Chance Moore.

Coming out of an MSU timeout with 2:39 to go in the half, MSU exploded for another 7-0 outburst to push ahead by 14, its largest of the stanza. An alley-oop dunk to Ridgna kicked off the outburst before Mayo scored from close range, and Kendle Moore's third trey of the half made it a 40-26 contest.

Born, who came into the night leading the league in scoring, ended the first half with a contested three from the right wing to make it a 40-29 contest at the half.

Missouri State 52, Drake 49

Donovan Clay scored three points in the final 77 seconds and finished with a team-high 15 points on the afternoon to lift Missouri State to a 52-49 home win over visiting Drake.

Clay's jumper with 1:07 to go erased Drake's narrow one-point lead, and pushed the Bears ahead 50-49. That score held until Clay attacked the rim with 21 seconds left in the game and got fouled before making one-of-two at the line.

Missouri State's defense then stepped up big, forcing the Bulldogs (11-4, 2-2) to miss their last four field goal attempts of the night, while Jonathan Mogo's free throw with 3.8 seconds remaining pushed the home club up by its final winning margin of three.

Mogbo's defensive rebound off a miss from Sardaar Calhoun moments earlier was his eighth of the game, matching Clay for team-high rebounding honors, and was one of the biggest caroms of the ball game.

It took nearly four minutes to sort out the game's final three seconds, but in the end, Drake's Roman Penn lost the ball in the corner, and the Bears secured their third straight victory.

Kendle Moore joined Clay in double figures for Missouri State with 13 points off the bench, while Chance Moore scored 9. Clay also dished out a team-high 5 assists, blocked 4 shots and eclipsed 1,000 career points in the victory.

Drake was led by Tucker DeVries with 20 points, while D.J. Wilkins scored 11, and Darnell Brodie snagged a game-high 13 rebounds.

The Bears shot an even 40 percent from the field (20-of-50) overall and 8-of-24 (.333) from distance, including three triples by Chance Moore. MSU was 4-of-9 at the line (.444), while matching DU on the glass, 35-35.

Drake finished 20-of-57 (.351) overall, 5-of-13 (.385) from downtown and 4-of-8 (.500) at the line with 10 turnovers. The Bulldogs secured 11 second-chance points off 10 offensive rebounds, compared to MSU's 2 second-chance points.

The victory marked Missouri State's third in the last four meetings with Drake. The teams will square off again in Des Moines on Jan. 18.

In the first half, the Bears took it to the Valley preseason favorites from the jump, pushing ahead by seven early on a steal and dunk by Dalen Ridgna. Chance Moore's first 3-pointer of the day then pushed MSU up 17-7 to give the home club a double-figure lead for the first time.

Drake would cut the Bears' lead to four on two occasions before the break, but in both instances, MSU had an answer. Clay's driving layup ended an 0-for-6 stretch for the home club with six minutes left in the stanza and started a 5-0 mini-run. Later, Chance Moore's second triple of the period and Clay's late layup pushed MoState ahead 30-21. DeVries' jumper at the buzzer got the Bulldogs back within 30-23 at the midway point.

Missouri State 85, Evansville 62

Missouri State had four players score in double figures, including a double-double from Jonathan Mogbo, to score an 85-62 conference win over visiting Evansville, extending the Bears' win streak to four in a row.

Mogbo's 14 points and 10 rebounds marked his first Division I double-double, while Chance Moore poured in a team-high 19 points on five 3-pointers. Missouri State (8-7, 4-1 MVC) also got 17 points and 9 boards from Donovan Clay, while Dalen Ridginal added 14 points and 9 rebounds in a wire-to-wire MSU victory.

Evansville got a game-high 22 points from Marvin Coleman and 18 points from Kenny Strawbridge in the third straight Valley loss for the Aces.

Missouri State took a double-figure lead less than eight minutes into the game, using an 8-0 surge to push ahead 22-10 at the 11:47 mark of the first half. Chance Moore, Damien Mayo Jr., Clay and Ridginal each score baskets in the run.

Later in the half, a Clay-led 6-0 mini-run gave MoState a 39-23 lead just before the intermission, their largest of the period for the home side.

The Bears, however, put things out of reach in the second half. A free throw from freshman N.J. Benson, who scored a season-high 9 points, at the 15:49 mark gave the home side a 47-27 lead for its first 20-point lead.

After Evansville cut its deficit to 16, the Bears turned to Moore who scored eight points as part of a 15-5 Missouri State run over the next four-and-a-half minutes. Ridginal also had four points during that stretch that culminated in a 66-40 lead for MoState with 9:23 to play.

The Bears would match that 26-point advantage twice more before the final horn and cruised to their fifth home victory of the season.

Clay led all players with 6 assists, marking the sixth straight game he has led Missouri State in that category. Mogbo was equally strong in filling the box score with a game-high and season-high 5 steals.

For the ball game, MSU finished 32-of-65 (.492) from the field, 9-of-23 (.381) from distance and 12-of-18 (.667) at the line with a 41-24 rebounding margin – their largest since opening night. As a team, the Bears racked up 15 assists and 11 steals on the night.

Evansville was a respectable 23-of-47 (.489) from the field and 6-of-10 (.600) from distance, while converting 10-of-18 (.556) free throws with 16 turnovers. Yacine Toumi snagged 4 of the visitors' 11 steals on the night with Coleman racking up 8 rebounds and 4 assists for the Aces.

The victory marks the second time in three seasons the Bears have started 4-1 in Valley play under Dana Ford, who earned his 80th win at Missouri State in the contest.

Donovan Clay posted 20 points for Missouri State, but the visiting Bears committed a season-high 17 turnovers and were unable to stop a hot-shooting Belmont squad in a 74-61 setback here Saturday in Missouri Valley Conference play.

In the first-ever meeting between the two teams, the home standing Bruins turned MSU's mishaps into 23 points off turnovers and buried 11 threes to snap MSU's four-game MSU win streak.

Cade Tyson led Belmont with 20 points behind three triples, while Ben Shepherd scored 17, also with three treys.

The Bears shot an efficient 45 percent on the offensive end and connected on seven 3-pointers of their own. However, an eight-and-a-half minute scoring drought for the visitors midway through the second half was pivotal.

After Chance Moore's 3-pointer with 15:10 to play pulled the Bears within 47-43, the only scoring Missouri State did during the ensuing stretch was four free throws from Moore. Meanwhile, Belmont pushed ahead 61-47 with 7:26 to play.

Moore was the only other Bear in double figures with 12 points.

Clay, who scored a season-high and was just two points shy of his career high, posted three field goals in the last four-plus minutes of the contest to help MSU finish strong. Belmont's largest lead, 74-59, with 1:17 remaining, was answered by a basket by Clay and a pair of free throws from Raphe Ayres in the final minute to cement the final margin.

The Bruins finished 26-of-56 (.464) overall from the field and 11-of-26 (.423) from distance while converting a perfect 11-of-11 at the stripe.

The Bears out-rebounded Belmont by a 33-30 margin, led by 8 caroms from Clay. Jonathan Mogbo accounted for 3 of the visitors' 7 blocks and led MSU in assists with 3.

In the first half, the Bears fell behind by as many as eight points twice but rallied both times and used a 14-5 run late in the period to take a 32-30 lead on a Kendle Moore layup with 2:37 before the intermission. Belmont responded with a 7-0 outburst to retake the lead, but a long trey by Ayres with 19 seconds to go pulled MSU within 37-35 at the midway point.

Missouri State shot 63.6 percent from the field in the opening stanza (14-of-22) but its 9 turnovers led directly to 14 Bruins points in that span to keep the visitors from leading by more than two at any point.

Illinois State 76, Missouri State 66 (ot)

Illinois State made all 10 of its free throws in overtime and 29-of-32 (.906) for the game to help the home-standing Redbirds secure a 76-66 win over visiting Missouri State in a Valley gut-wrencher.

With the score tied at the end of regulation, the Bears (8-9, 4-3 MVC) missed a pair of close-range shots before the buzzer, but jumped out to a 64-61 lead in the extra period thanks to three free throws from Donovan Clay.

But the rest of the OT period belonged to the Redbirds (8-10, 3-4 MVC) who only made two field goals in extra time, but capitalized on their free throw chances when it counted. ISU pulled ahead by two on a pair of foul shots from Kendall Lewis with 2:16 to go and extended their lead on a triple from Luke Kasubke moments later. From there, the home club made all eight free throws in the final 83 seconds to cap a 13-0 run and put the game on ice

Seneca Knight's 22 points led five Redbirds in double-figures with Malachi Poindexter adding 16 points, Lewis scoring 12 and Kasubke adding 11. Darius Buford added 10 points for ISU which also snagged 9 steals as a team.

Chance Moore led MoState with 17 points, while Dalen Ridgnal scored 14 points behind three treys. Clay and Jonathan Mogbo each added a dozen points for the visitors with Mogbo tacking on 12 rebounds, 3 assists, 2 blocks and 2 steals before fouling out.

The Bears committed a season-high 27 fouls and matched ISU's 26 points in the paint. Four MSU players fouled out.

Missouri State made 21-of-62 (.339) overall from the field on the night but made just 1-of-15 field goal attempts in the final three minutes of regulation and overtime. Alston Mason's uncontested layup with 30 seconds left in OT ending an 0-for-12 stretch that covered more than eight minutes.

MoState finished 8-of-34 (.235) from 3-point range, 16-for-26 (.615) at the line and a 41-36 rebounding advantage.

At the end of regulation, Ridgnal made 3-of-4 free throws over a 45-second stretch to push Missouri State ahead 61-59 with 28 seconds to go. The Redbirds called timeout and seemed to be in trouble late in the clock before Lewis bailed out ISU with a layup with 6 seconds remaining. In the final moments, Mason's drive to the rim was knocked away, but Mogbo snagged the rebound, and his last-second jumper rimmed out to end regulation, 61-61.

In the first half, Moore led the Bears with 10 points as five different MSU players hit 3-pointers to push the visitors to a 34-30 at the midway point. A 10-2 run by the Bears late in the half, led by Moore and Mogbo, gave MSU a 33-24 lead with less than two minutes left in the opening period. But ISU hit a pair of late threes themselves, both by Poindexter, to cut into MoState's lead late.

Missouri State 64, Indiana State 62

Led by 21 points from Donovan Clay and 20 from Bryan Trimble Jr., Missouri State led wire to wire and turned back visiting Indiana State, 64-62.

The visiting Sycamores came into the game with a comfortable lead in The Valley standings and left town locked into a three-way tie for the league lead with Belmont and Southern Illinois.

In his longest appearance of the season, Trimble saw 33 minutes off the bench and went 5-of-10 from 3-point range and a perfect 5-for-5 at the line to give MSU a needed offensive boost. On the inside, Clay and Dalen Ridgnal showed up strong, with Clay coming up one point shy of a career high and finishing 7-of-15 from the field with a pair of threes. Ridgnal narrowly missed a double-double with 9 points and 10 rebounds, while securing a key late-game block.

After leading by four at the midway point, the Bears came out strong in the second half, getting back-to-back buckets from Kendle Moore ahead of a triple from Trimble Jr., and a traditional 3-point play from Clay. Before the under-12 timeout, the Bears had extended their lead to 47-37.

From there, Trimble splashed home his fifth trey of the night with just under 11 minutes to go, and Clay's two free throws at the 10:26 mark gave MoState its largest lead of the game at 52-39.

But the experienced Sycamores responded with a 13-4 run over the next seven minutes and turned to Cameron Henry and Courvoisier McCauley to make it a 56-52 game with 3:23 remaining.

Coming out of the final media timeout, Jonathan Mogbo's putback off a Ridgnal miss and Clay's layup a minute later gave MSU an eight-point cushion with a minute-and-a-half to play.

Down the stretch, ISU got a second-chance 3-pointer from Henry, a short hook shot by Robbie Avila and a layup by Cooper Neese to make it a 60-59 game. But when the Bears finally got to the foul line with 18.3 seconds to go, Trimble converted two foul shots to put MSU up by three, and later Ridgnal made it 64-59 with 4.9 left to put the game out of reach.

Neese's desperation three from 30 feet out at the buzzer splashed home to make the final margin two points.

MSU shot a season-best 94.1 percent from the foul line, making 16-of-17, while going 20-of-52 (.385) from the field and 8-for-22 (.364) from distance. The Bears out-rebounded the Sycamores by a 32-26 margin and registered 24 bench points.

Clay and Trimble each scored a dozen points in the first half with the Bears shooting an even 50 percent from the field. Trimble's second three of the half with 13:09 to go gave MSU a 21-11 advantage, their largest of the half.

Missouri State overcame a 14-point deficit and clipped Valley preseason favorite Drake, 65-62, to sweep the season series from the Bulldogs.

Missouri State got 16 points apiece from Donovan Clay and Bryan Trimble Jr., while Alston Mason tacked on 13.

The Bears trailed 32-18 with 3:03 left in the first half and were down 34-21 at the half. The Bears took their first lead of the game with 5:10 left in regulation on a 3-pointer from Clay. Drake was 21-of-54 (.389) overall, 6-for-25 (.240) from distance and 14-of-15 (.933) at the stripe with a slight 30-29 rebounding advantage. DeVries finished 7-of-18 from the field.

DU set a blistering pace from the jump, turning an early 11-8 lead into a 21-11 advantage less than nine minutes into the contest. Missouri State trimmed an 11-point deficit to just two in the final minute but ultimately could not catch visiting Southern Illinois, falling 61-57 to the first-place Salukis as both teams reached the midway point in the Valley race.

SIU had four players score in double figures, including a team-high 11 points from Lance Jones who knocked down three 3-pointers. But it was Xavier Johnson who hit the game's biggest shot, burying a mid-range jumper on SIU's final possession to give the visitors a four-point lead.

The Bears tried to answer with a jumper from Bryan Trimble Jr., but SIU gathered the rebound and ran out the clock to end MSU's comeback hopes. MoState never led in the contest.

Chance Moore's 3-pointer by the Bears drew the home club within 45-42 with 9:25 to go. But the Bears went cold for the four minutes, while a 10-2 run by SIU in that span put the Salukis ahead 55-44, their biggest lead of the game.

After getting a defensive stop on SIU's next possession, the Bears turned to Kendle Moore for a huge three from the right wing to make it a 59-57 contest with 42 seconds left.

But as the shot clock expired on SIU's next trip down, Johnson's jumper found its mark and pushed SIU into at least a share of first place in the MVC standings at the midway point in the league standings.

Mogbo scored a game-high 14 points for the Bears on 6-of-9 field goals to go with 11 rebounds in securing his third double-double of the year. Trimble was also in double figures for MSU with 12 points, all in the first half, while Donovan Clay had 9 points, 5 rebounds and 4 assists.

MSU finished 21-of-52 (.404) overall from the field, 8-of-24 (.333) from distance and 7-for-12 (.583) at the line with a 36-28 rebounding advantage. Mogbo snagged 7 offensive rebounds on the afternoon, helping the Bears rack up 14 second-chance points.

The Salukis were 23-of-51 (.451) overall, 10-for-26 (.385) from three and 5-of-6 (.833) at the stripe with 7 steals. SIU standout Marcus Domansk scored 10 points on 3-of-12 field goal attempts, while Johnson and Jawaun Newton also racked up 10 points for the visitors.

In the first half, early turnovers put the Bears in an eight-point hole eight minutes into the contest, but Trimble helped the home club rally. He finished with 12 points in the opening stanza, but SIU scored the last four points of the period to lead 30-25 at the intermission.

The Missouri State trio of Jonathan Mogo, Chance Moore and Alston Mason each had big moments in the game's final minute to lift the home-standing Bears over visiting UIC, 63-59.

Mason tallied career highs in points (19), rebounds (5) and assists (5) to pace a MoState squad that trialed with just over two minutes to go. Donovan Clay also pitched in 19 points and 7 boards, while Mogbo added 12 points.

After five unanswered points by UIC's Filip Škobalj erased a three-point Bears lead with 2:04 remaining, Clay tied the game, 56-56, with a pair of free throws at the 1:21 mark. The Flames regained the advantage briefly on a free throw by Tre Anderson, but Chance Moore gathered in the rebound on Anderson's second shot, giving the home team the ball down by one and less than a minute remaining.

Moore then stepped up with one of the Bears' biggest shots of the night, a 3-pointer from right wing that rattled home to give the Bears the lead for good with 48 ticks showing on the clock. After Christian Jones missed a 3-pointer on UIC's next possession, the Bears secured the victory at the foul line. Mogo and Mason combined to go 4-for-4 at the line down the stretch to keep UIC just out of reach and push Missouri State to victory.

The Bears overcame a rugged shooting night by going 14-of-18 (.778) at the free throw line, including nine straight makes to end the game – five by Mason. Missouri State was 22-of-58 (.379) overall from the field and 5-for-25 (.200) from long range. MSU also out-rebounded the visitors by a 38-34 margin, allowing just three second-chance points on the evening.

UIC was led by 19 points and 11 rebounds by Jace Carter with Škobalj pitching in 18 points, and Anderson adding 11. Carter's double-double was just the third against the Bears this season.

The Flames finished 17-for-48 (.354) overall from the field, 10-of-27 (.370) from distance and 15-for-22 (.682) at the stripe.

The victory pushed the Bears to 7-3 at Great Southern Bank Arena for the season and handed fifth-year head coach Dana Ford his 50th home victory (50-19).

In the first half, the Bears built a 29-21 lead after a drive and bucket from Mason with 4:15 to go before the intermission. But the Flames rallied after the under-four media timeout, splashing home three unanswered 3-pointers from Carter and Škobalj to give the visitors a 30-29 lead at the break.

The Bears got 10 points and 4 assists from Mason in the opening stanza before going into the intermission on a 1-for-13 stretch.

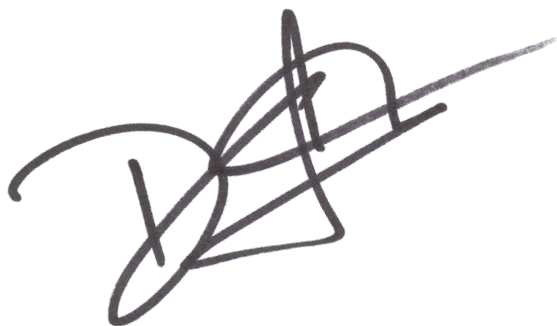

A new era for Missouri State men's basketball officially began on March 22, 2018 with the introduction of Dana Ford as the program's 18th head coach.

In a breakout 2021-22 campaign, Missouri State finished the season as one of the nation's most-efficient offensive teams, ranking 2nd nationally in free throw percentage (.797), 14th in field goal percentage (.482) and 23rd in 3-point FG percentage (.374) -- the only DI team to rank in the top 25 in all three. KenPom also rated the Bears 21st in effective FG percentage (54.6) and 23rd in adjusted offensive efficiency (113.2). MSU led the MVC in all of those metrics, except 3-point percentage, while also leading The Valley in scoring (77.3) and turnovers per game (10.6), which ranked 38th and 34th in the country, respectively.

Likewise, the 2021-22 Bears finished as runners-up in the Missouri Valley Conference, racking up a 23-11 overall record and 13-5 record in the league. The Bears' season win total was the program's most since 2011 and the 10th-best in team history. The squad advanced to the MVC Tournament semifinals for the third straight year and also represented The Valley in the NIT in Ford's first postseason tournament showing at MoState. The Bears also set team records for 3-point field goals (283) while boasting two first-team all-conference players in the school's all-time best scoring tandem -- Gaige Prim and Isiah Mosley -- while Donovan Clay earned MVC All-Defensive Team honors, and Isaac Haney landed on the MVC All-Freshman Team. Jaylen Minnett was also named to the MVC All-Bench squad.

For the third time in his head coaching career, Ford was a finalist for the Ben Jobe Award at the conclusion of the 2021-22 season.

During his third season in Springfield in 2020-21, the Bears matched a school record with seven conference road wins and finished third in the MVC standings, going 17-7 overall and 12-6 in the league. The Bears advanced to the MVC Tournament semifinals for the second straight season and became the first Valley team since 2015 to post two players on the All-MVC first team without being a league champion or runner-up. Isiah Mosley was the Bears first-ever MVC scoring leader and was also the top vote-getter on the Valley's Most-Improved Team, while Gaige Prim also earned All-MVC first-team laurels after finishing 10th nationally in field goal percentage (.599) and earning a spot on the MVC All-Defensive Team. MSU also boasted a player on the MVC All-Newcomer Team in point guard Demarcus Sharp.

Ford was also a national finalist for the Ben Jobe Award and Skip Prosser Award at the conclusion of the 2020-21 campaign.

In 2019-20, Ford engineered a solid season finish that saw the Bears go 9-9 in the Missouri Valley Conference and upset third-seeded Indiana State in the MVC Tournament quarterfinals. The Bears matched or out-rebounded 24-of-33 opponents, including nine of their last 10, to finish 25th nationally in rebound margin (6.2). The Bears also posted their second-best free throw percentage (.749)

of the program's Division I era and had their highest scoring average in league games (71.6) in 10 years. Despite eight losses by four points or less, MSU boasted two All-MVC performers for the second year in a row with second team selection Keandre Cook and third-teamer Gaige Prim, who also was recognized on the MVC All-Newcomer Team.

In his first season at Missouri State in 2018-19, Ford began the year as the fifth-youngest Division I coach in the nation (33) and helped guide the Bears to a third-place finish in The Valley. In addition to pushing the Bears to their first winning conference record (10-8) since the 2010-11 campaign, two MSU players earned All-MVC honors, including the 2019 MVC Newcomer of the Year, and three players who landed spots on the Valley's All-Newcomer team.

Ford orchestrated one of the best turnarounds in NCAA history when he accepted the Tennessee State job in 2014-15 as the nation's youngest Division I head coach at the time. The Tigers went from a 5-26 record his first season to a 20-11 ledger in 2015-16. He earned Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year, NABC District 19 Coach of the Year and the Ben Jobe Award for his outstanding efforts that season.

Over his last three years in Nashville, Ford led the Tigers to a combined 52-39 record and coached five All-OVC players in addition to two players recognized on the OVC All-Newcomer Team. Under his leadership, Tennessee State also doubled its home attendance average and twice earned votes in the Associated Press Top 25 poll during the 2016-17 season.

A native of Tamms, Ill., Ford is a 2006 graduate of Illinois State University where he was a four-year letterman for the Redbirds under coaches Tom Richardson and Porter Moser from 2002-06. He was a regular starter and led ISU in steals as a senior.

He went on to successful assistant coaching stints at Winthrop and Wichita State under coach Gregg Marshall and later as associate head coach at Illinois

Mo., and Chicago, Ill.

Ford has also received recognition from numerous civic organizations, including a Citizen Service Commendation by the Springfield Police Department in June of 2021 for his help in creating the Bears, Badges and Kids program. Bears, Badges and Kids provides community-wide, basketball-centric events for youth that center on community unity and education.
