
CAUTION concerning the Power Cord

Power Save Mode - OPTIONAL

You can set up the unit into an economic power save mode.

In power-on status, press and hold POWER $(^{()}/\mathbf{I})$ button for about 3 seconds.

 Nothing is displayed in the display window when the unit is turned off.

To cancel, press $^{\bigcirc}/I$ (POWER), CLOCK, TIMER or PLAY MODE(DEMO).

In addition, this unit can play a DVD±R, DVD±RW, SVCD, and CD-R or CD-RW that contains audio titles, MP3, WMA, JPEG or DivX files.

<u>Notes</u>

- Depending on the conditions of the recording equipment or the CD-R/RW (or DVD±R/RW) disc itself, some CD-R/RW (or DVD±R/RW) discs cannot be played on the unit.
- Do not attach any seal or label to either side (the labeled side or the recorded side) of a disc.
- Do not use irregularly shaped CDs (e.g., heart-shaped or octagonal). It may result in malfunctions.

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Regional Code


This unit has a regional code printed on the rear of the unit. This unit can play only DVD discs labelled as the same as the rear of the unit or "ALL".

Notes on Regional Codes

- Most DVD discs have a globe with one or more numbers in it clearly visible on the cover. This number must match your unit's regional code or the disc cannot play.
- If you try to play a DVD with a different regional code from your player, the message "Check Regional Code" appears on the TV screen.



Remote control battery installation



Detach the battery cover on the rear of the remote control, and insert two R03 (size AAA) batteries with • and • aligned correctly.

<u>Caution</u>

Do not mix old and new batteries. Never mix different types of batteries (standard, alkaline, etc.).



Connecting to a TV

Make one of the following connections, depending on the capabilities of your existing equipment.

<u>Tips</u>

- Depending on your TV and other equipment you wish to connect, there are various ways you could connect the unit. Use one of the connections described below.
- Please refer to the manuals of your TV, VCR, Stereo System or other devices as necessary to make the best connections.

Caution

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- Make sure the unit is connected directly to the TV. Select the correct AV input on your TV.
- Do not connect your unit to TV via your VCR. The DVD image could be distorted by the copy protection system.

Video connection

Connect the VIDEO OUT jack from the unit to the VIDEO IN jack on the TV using the video cable supplied **(V)**.

Component Video (Color Stream®) connection

Connect the COMPONENT VIDEO OUT (PROGRES-SIVE SCAN) (Y PB PR) jacks from the unit to the corresponding jacks on the TV using a Y PB PR cable (C).


Progressive Scan (Color Stream® pro) connection

- If your television is a high-definition or "digital ready" television, you may take advantage of this unit's progressive scan output for higher video resolution.
- If your TV does not accept the Progressive Scan format, the picture will appear scrambled if you try Progressive Scan on the unit.

Connect the COMPONENT VIDEO OUT (PROGRES-SIVE SCAN) (Y PB PR) jacks from the unit to the corresponding jacks on the TV using an optional Y PB PR cable (C).



Connecting to Antenna


Connect the supplied FM/AM antennas to listen to the radio.

- Connect the AM loop antenna to the AM antenna connector.
- Connect the FM wire antenna to the FM antenna connector.



Connecting to Auxiliary Equipment

You can use VCR or other unit connected to the AUX connector.



PREPARATION

Connect a VCR or auxiliary device, etc to the AUX connector.


Press the AUX button on the front panel or the remote control until the "AUX" indicator is displayed in the display window.

<u>Notes</u>

- To prevent noise pickup, keep the AM loop antenna away from the unit and other component.
- Be sure to fully extend the FM wire antenna.
- After connecting the FM wire antenna, keep it as horizontal as possible.

USB Function

You can enjoy the media files such as tunes (MP3/WMA) saved in an MP3 player or USB memory by connecting the storage device to the USB port of this unit.



Compatible Devices

- 1. Devices which require additional program installation when you have connected it to a computer, are not supported.
- 2. MP3 Player : Flash type MP3 player. The MP3 player requiring installation of a driver is not supported.
- 3. USB Flash Drive : Devices that support USB2.0 or USB1.1.

To Remove the USB from the unit

- 1. Choose the other functions except USB
- function in order to remove the USB.
- 2. Remove the USB from the unit.

Besides Basic Playback, if you want to operate other functions, see the CD Playback section.



Connecting to Optional Equipment

You can use an optical output of a Digital Device to the **OPTICAL IN connector.** This unit receives the optical digital signal from optional

equipment.




Connect an optical output of DVD Player (or Digital Device etc) to the OPTICAL IN connector.

- Press the AUX button on the front panel or the
- remote control until the "AUX OPT " indicator is displayed in the display window.

Speaker System Connection

Connect the speakers using the supplied speaker cables by matching the colors of the terminals and those of the cords. To obtain the best possible surround sound, adjust the speaker parameters (distance, level, etc.).



<u>Notes</u>

- Be sure to match the speaker cable to the appropriate terminal on the components: + to + and to -. If the cables are reversed, the sound will be distorted and will lack base.
- If you use front speakers with low maximum input rating, adjust the volume carefully to avoid excessive output on the speakers.

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• Connect the Front Left/Right speaker correctly. If it is reversed, the sound may be distorted.

Volume Adjustment

- Turn VOLUME knob clockwise to increase the sound level, or counterclockwise to decrease it.
- Press VOLUME + to increase the sound level, or use VOLUME - to decrease it on the remote control.

MUTE

Press MUTE to turn off the sound, press again to restore.

""indicator flashes in the display window.

Headphone Jack

Connect a stereo headphone plug (\emptyset 3.5mm) into the headphone jack.

The speakers are automatically disabled when you plug in headphones (not supplied).

EQUALIZER Effect

You can choose 8 fixed sound impressions and adjust the BASS, MIDDLE and TREBLE.

 You can select a desired sound mode by using EQ. button on the front panel or the remote control.
 When you want to change a sound mode press the EQ. button repeatedly within 3 seconds.

Each time you press the button the setting changes in the display window as shown below.

You can set the BASS, MIDDLE and TREBLE on the USER EQ mode.

- 1. Select the USER EQ mode by using **EQ**. button. "USER EQ" will be displayed in the display window.
- 2. Press the SET/CDII button on the front panel when "USER EQ" is displayed in the display window. "BASS 0" will be displayed in the display window.
- Select the BASS, MIDDLE or TREBLE you want by pressing the **PRESET (-/+)** buttons on the front panel.
- Press the **TUNING (-/+)** buttons on the front panel to set the sound level you want. (MIN, -4 ~ +4, MAX steps)
- 5. Repeat the 3-4 steps as above.
- 6. When the sound level is completed, press the the SET/CDII button on the front panel.

XDSS (Extreme Dynamic Sound System)

Press **XDSS plus** to reinforce treble, bass and the surround effect. The "XDSS ON" or "NORMAL" indicator lights.

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MP3 Optimizer

This function optimizes for compressed MP3 files. It improves the bass sound to make sweet sound. Each time you press " **XDSS plus** ". The setting changes in the following order.

XDSS ON \rightarrow MP3 -- OPT ON \rightarrow NORMAL

XTS pro

This unique sound quality developed by our technology creates the optimum sound for you to play the perfect playback of the original sound and to feel the living sound source.

Each time you press **XTS Pro** the setting changes in the following order.

The XTS Pro function will not be operated when a headphone has been connected.

3D STEREO

Realtime 3D positioned sound rendering technology with stereo sources, optimized for stereo speakers. Listeners may experience amazing virtual surround effects with their own multimedia players.

Multichannel sound

The Multichannel sound changes the sound in 5.1 ch into a virtual one in the 10.1 ch so that it provides such a feeling that you listen to the sound simultaneously from the right and left speakers and center speaker.

Sound Mode

You can enjoy surround sound simply by selecting one of the pre-programmed sound fields according to the program you want to listen to (2 ch. sound only).

Press SOUND button repeatedly.



Setting the Clock

Press CLOCK.

- (If the clock requires setting, press and hold CLOCK for more than 2 seconds.)
 - The hours display begins to blink.

2 Select either the 12 hour cycle or the 24 hour cycle by turning MULTI JOG.



Press SET/CDII to confirm the selected hour cycle.

Use MULTI JOG to set the current hour.

Press SET/CDII.

Use MULTI JOG to set current minutes.

Press SET/CDII and the correct time is shown in the display window.

Sleep Timer Function

When the sleep timer is set, the unit automatically turns off after the specified time has elapsed.

To specify the time delay before the power is turned off, press SLEEP.

In the display window you can see *SLEEP 180* for about 5 seconds. This means that the system turns off automatically after 180 minutes.

2 Each time you press SLEEP the setting changes in the following order.

SLEEP 180 \rightarrow 150 \rightarrow 120 \rightarrow 90 \rightarrow 80 \rightarrow 70 \rightarrow 60 \rightarrow 50 \rightarrow 40 \rightarrow 30 \rightarrow 20 \rightarrow 10 \rightarrow OFF (No display) \rightarrow SLEEP 180...

To check the remaining time until the power is

turned off. While the sleep function is active press **SLEEP** briefly. The time remaining until the unit turns off is displayed for about 5 seconds.

Note

If you press **SLEEP** while the sleep time is displayed, the SLEEP time is reset.

To cancel Sleep Timer setting

If you wish to stop the function, press the **SLEEP** button repeatedly until "*SLEEP 10*" appears, and then press **SLEEP** once again after "*SLEEP 10*" shows on the display.

Using Microphone (OPTIONAL)

You can sing to a music source by connecting a microphone to the unit.

Connect your microphone to the MIC1/ MIC 2 Jacks.

S " will be shown in the display window.

Play the music you want.

Sing along with the accompaniment.

Adjust the microphone volume by turning MIC volume knob. (MIN,1 - 14, MAX steps)

Note

- When not using the microphone, set the MIC VOL. volume knob to minimum or turn off the MICs and remove the microphone from the MIC Jacks.
- If the microphone is set too near the speaker, a howling sound may be produced. In this case, move the microphone away from the speaker or decrease the sound level by using the MIC VOL. volume control.
- If sound through the microphone is extremely loud, it may be distorted. In this case, turn the MIC VOL. volume control toward minimum.

To Adjust ECHO Volume

You can give an echo effect to the sound from the microphones.

Press ECHO VOL. (\bigcirc / \bigcirc) on the remote control to increase the echo volume or decrease it. (MIN,1 - 14, MAX steps)

DIMMER

This function dims the LED (Light-emitting diode) of front panel by half in power-on status.

Press **DIMMER** once. The LED (Light-emitting diode) of front panel is turned off and the display window will be darken by half.To cancel it, press **DIMMER** again.

DEMO

Press **PLAY MODE** in power off state to demonstrate the function in the display window. To cancel it , press **POWER** (() / **I**) or **PLAY MODE** again.

Timer Function

With the TIMER function you can have the radio reception, CD play, USB play and TAPE play turned on and off at the desired time.

Press CLOCK to check the current time.

For your reference

If you don't set clock, timer function doesn't work.

Press TIMER to enter the timer setting mode.

"TUNER→DVD/CD →USB→TAPE" flash in the display window in turn.

For your reference

If you want to correct the previous memorized TIMER setting, press and hold the **TIMER** button for more than 2 seconds.

- If you want to check the previous memorized TIMER setting, press **TIMER** button briefly.
- The previously memorized time and "^C" indicator appears in the display window.

Press SET/CDII when the desired function flashes.

1. a. When you select TUNER function, 'PLAY' and 'REC' indicator flash in the display window alternately for about 3 seconds. 'PLAY' indicator : TUNER play only 'REC' indicator : TUNER play and recording

- b.Press SET/CDII when the desired function flashes.
- c. Select the previous memorized preset number with MULTI JOG on the front panel and press SET/CDII.

'TIME ON' indicator appears for about 0.5 seconds in the display window and then disappears.

2. When you select DVD/CD, TAPE or USB function,

'TIME ON' indicator appears for about 0.5 seconds in the display window and then disappears.


5 Set the turn on hour turning MULTI JOG.

Press SET/CDII to confirm the turn on hour time.

Set the turn on minutes time turning MULTI JOG.

Press SET/CDII to confirm the turn on minutes time.

'TIME OFF' indicator appears for about 0.5 seconds in the display window and then disappears.



Press SET/CDII.



Set the turn off minutes turning MULTI JOG.



Adjust the volume level turning MULTI JOG.

Press SET/CDI.

" $^{\mbox{\tiny G}}$ " appears in the display window and the timer setting has been completed.



Turn the system off. The selected timer functions are automatically switched on and off at the preset times.

To cancel or check the timer

Each time the **TIMER** button is pressed you can select the timer set or cancel. You can also check the timer setting status.

To activate or check the timer, press the **TIMER** button repeatedly so that "^C" appears in the display window.

To cancel the TIMER, press the **TIMER** button repeatedly so that "^(D)" disappears from the display window.

<u>Note</u>

If you insert the DVD,VCD or DivX except audio CD/MP3/WMA on the unit, the timer function will be operated to the TUNER.

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Displaying Disc Information On -screen

You can display various information about the disc loaded on-screen.

Press DISPLAY to show various playback informa-1 tion.

The displayed items differ depending on the disc type or playing status.

You can select an item by pressing \triangle / \heartsuit and

- \mathbf{Z} change or select the setting by pressing \mathbf{Q}/\mathbf{D} • Title (Track) - Current title (or track) number/ total number of titles (or tracks).
 - Chapter Current chapter number/ total number of chapters.
 - Time Elapsed playing time.
 - Audio Selected audio language or channel.
 - Subtitle Selected subtitle.
 - Angle Selected angle/ total number of angles.
 - Sound Selected sound mode.

<u>Note</u>

If any button is not pressed for a few seconds, the onscreen display disappears.

Initial Settings

By using the Setup menu, you can make various adjustments to items such as picture and sound. You can also set a language for the subtitles and the Setup menu, among other things. For details on each Setup menu item, see the pages 13 to 16.

To display and exit the Menu:

Press SETUP to display the menu. A second press of SETUP will take you back to the initial screen.

To go to the next level:

Press **>** on the remote control.

To go back to the previous level:

Press **q** on the remote control.

GENERAL OPERATION

Press SETUP. The Setup menu appears.

- Use \bigstar / \bigstar to select the desired option then press b to move to the second level. The screen shows the current setting for the selected item, as well as alternate setting(s).
- Use $(\mathbf{A} / \mathbf{\nabla})$ to select the second desired option 75

This unit is equipped with RDS (Radio Data System), which brings a wide range of information from FM radio. RDS is a system for transmitting station call signs or network information, a description of station programme type text message about the station or specifics of musical selection and the correct time.

RDS Tuning : OPTIONAL

When a FM station containing RDS data is tuned in, the unit will automatically display the station's call sign and the RDS indicator will light in the Display Window as well as indicators for the programme type recognition (PTY), Radio Text (RT), Clock Time (CT) and RDS services programme (PS) if transmitted by the station.

RDS Display Options : OPTIONAL

The RDS system is capable of transmitting a wide variety of information in addition to the initial call sign that appears when a station is first tuned. In normal RDS operation the display will indicate the station name, broadcast network or call letters. Pressing **RDS** on the front panel enables you to cycle through the various data types in the sequence:

Some RDS stations may not choose to include some of these additional features. If the data required for the selected mode is not being transmitted, the Display Window will show a **PTY NONE, RT NONE, CT NONE, or PS NONE** message.

Programme Search (PTY) : OPTIONAL

A major benefit of RDS is its ability to encode broadcasts with Programme Type (PTY) codes that indicate the type of material being broadcast. The following list shows the abbreviations used to indicate each PTY along with an explanation of the PTY.

You may search for a specific Programme Type (PTY) by following these steps:


