

Acronychia laevis (Hard Aspen)

Shrub or small tree often along watercourses. It is a rainforest plant in the citrus family, growing in eastern Australia. Its attractive fruit and flowers have horticultural appeal (star-shaped cream flowers to 10 mm in summer, pinkish-purple 4-angled fruits). Fruit is edible to humans, although described as too pungent to be palatable, and have even been likened to turpentine. Leaves are aromatic when crushed.
