

Cryptocarya erythroxylon (Pigeonberry Ash/Rose Maple)

This is one of the largest laurels in Australia. The trunk is often buttressed, and the grey or white cylindrical trunk is a conspicuous feature in the rainforest. Leaves are 6 to 13 cm long, white and veiny underneath. The small cream flowers form in early summer, the fruit is a black drupe maturing in the cooler months.



Type: Tree to 15+m
Aspect: Part Shade
Soil: Well-drained
