

Graptophyllum ilicifolium (Holly-leaved Fuchsia)

Vulnerable plant found in fairly dry rainforest areas or along creek banks. Leaves are broadly egg-shaped or oval, to 5cm x 3cm, with toothed margins. They are borne alternately on the stem but opposing the leaf is a flower cluster usually accompanied by a small leaf bract which has the appearance of a dwarf leaf. Bright scarlet flowers occur in spring and early summer and are borne in pairs or clusters along the stems.



Type: Shrub 3-5m
Aspect: Part Shade
Soil: Well-drained
Habitat: Dry Sclerophyll
