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From the Kitchen...

As we all know, the current market trend is upwards when we discuss cost of goods. The rising costs of labor, supplies, energy and gas are impacting businesses across the globe with no signs of leveling off. Food prices have climbed at least 7.9% over the last year, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics' Consumer Price Index. But not all menu items have felt the inflationary effects to the same degree. Some items have doubled in cost... A 35# container of canola frying oil that was \$23, is now \$48 for the same product. Nitrile food service gloves that were \$33/1000ct went as high as \$180/1000ct during the pandemic, but have now leveled off at \$95/1000ct. Needless to say, prices won't get back close to their pre-pandemic structure.

Monthly, I supply management (and the Board) with inflation percentages on roughly twenty of our high volume items. It presents a snapshot of what is happening in the world today.

In the current state of economics, at times product is not available: PepsiCo not being able to acquire bottle caps for Gatorade, Coke minimizing product lines to be able to produce the more popular items – thus not producing items like Sprite Zero; fresh chicken was tough to find, cream cheese was scarce during the holidays, etc. We have done (and will continue to do) the best sourcing possible so it doesn't affect your experience here at the Club; as well as give alternate items of interest on the menu.

Commodity pricing changes numerous times a month based on supply vs. demand. Therefore, requiring us to adjust our pricing on items accordingly (features, events, themed buffets, banquets, etc.) to be in line with the current market. In the private club sector, Food and Beverage outlets are considered a subsidized amenity. Our margins have remained as constant as possible, and we will continue to do so with our new menu pricing structure.

News from the Golf Shop..

Our new carts are equipped with some new technology called, Geofencing. Geofencing allows us to control cart traffic with a touch of a button on the computer. Although Geofencing can be used anywhere on the course, our purpose in getting this technology is to keep carts from the Links parking lot. As of June 1, the carts will no longer be able to go into the parking lot.

Carts in the parking lot are a huge safety issue for our members and their guests. It's not a matter of if there will be an accident but when. The Geofencing will allow you to use the paver crosswalk through the parking lot to go to the course or driving range and return to the cart barn after play is finished. If you try to travel in the parking lot, your cart will slow down and then cut off. Your only option is wait 30 seconds and then return to the paver path and proceed from there.

Members are expected to exercise reasonable prudence and common sense when severe weather, e.g., thunder or lightning, is reported or observed in the area.

Both golf courses have sirens that will sound to notify all members on the golf courses, practice facilities, croquet lawns, pool and tennis facilities that dangerous weather is in the area. Immediately upon hearing the siren sound (one long blast), all members must leave their outdoor activities and seek appropriate shelter.

The siren will sound again (three short blasts) when it is safe to resume to outdoor activities. Members who fail to exercise prudence and common sense by evacuating the golf course when lightning is observed or reported, may be subject to Board discipline.

The golf course weather feature on the Club App is available to all members and will indicate when it is safe to resume outdoor activities.
