B. Trauma Subcommittee Dr. Doug Shuerer, Chair	 Reported the MHA had a meeting in January with several individuals and changes were made to the proposed Trauma Rules & Regulations. MHA did not publically announce the meeting and many throughout the state were unaware that changes were being recommended. Physician education will now be under the Board of Healing Arts. No CME requirements for Emergency Medicine physicians included. The Trauma Subcommittee will write a letter citing areas of support/concern and request Board of Heating Arts address the issues. Essentially throws out all of the work being done in trauma for the last several years. Removed the reqirement that the emergency physician director shall be board certified, removed ATLS requirement. There has been little action on the trauma regulations for five years, however MHA is suddenly making changes on TCD regs. It is recognized elimination of CME and Board certification for ED physicians probably was not the intent. All other physicians working in the ED have CME requirements.
